ROBINSONS FROM OHIO

From History of Ohio by Charles B Galbreath, 1925.

JAMES HARVEY ROBERTSON -- his gr-gr-grandfather was John Robertson who was born in Scotland and settled in County Tyrone, Ireland. The grandfather of James Harvey was Denny Robertson, a son of William Robertson. Denny Robertson was born in County Tyrone, 12 January 1784. Six of his brothers came to America and became pioneers in several states. Denny Robertson arrived in this country in 1816, and after five years in Western Pennsylvania wettled in Stark County, Ohio, where he lived until his death in February 1829. He had accumulated about 600 acres of land. He was a Presbyterian. His wife, Eleanor McConkey, also a native of County Tyrone, died in the same year as her husband. They left a family of 8 children, their son James being only 8 yrs of age at that time. James Robertson was born in Sandy Twp, Stark Co, Ohio on 22 September 1821 and devoted his life to farming. He died in June 1900. In 1847 James was md to Margaret Sickafoose, youngest child of George and Margaret (Wagoner) Sickafoose, pioneers of Stark County. She was a descendant of Johann Jacob Zigenfuss, who came from Germany to Pennsylvania in 1751. Jacob Zigenfuss, grandfather of Margaret Robertson, was a soldier in the Revolution...her father George was a soldier in the War of 1812. Margaret died in 1898. James Harvey Robertson was born in Sandy Twp, Stark Co, Ohio 23 Jan 1862. He md 7 October 1899 to Miss Gertrude S Shaffer, dau of Jacob and Mary (Reese) Shaffer of Stark County.

FANNY ROBINSON - md in 1796 to Judge William Florence who was born at Warrenton, Va and who came to Ohio about 1806 and settled in Pickaway County. Their oldest child was Col Elias Florence who was born in Va on 15 February 1797. Elias died in 1881 at age 84. Elias' wife was Elizabeth Radcliffe of Kentucky. Their son was Ezra Florence, grandfather of Gen George Florence. Ezra was born in Pickaway County and died at 29 years of age. Ezra's wife was Sarah Ann Renick and she was born in Pickaway Co in 1828, the daughter of Jonathan and Lucinda (Sudduth) Renick. Their son was Elias Florence and he was born in Pickaway Co on 28 September 1845. He md Catherine Fitzgerald in 1868. She was the dau of Judge Edward Fitzgerald, a native of Virginia. They had 2 children - George and Anna.

THOMAS - Roxbury, propr. about 1636; wife Silence member church. Removed to Boston. Sold all his remaining right and interest in lands at Roxbury on 11 November 1662.

Thomas, mariner, Boston, sold the Speedwell to Thomas Witherley of Southwark, Co Surrey, 27 May 1640. Children Ephraim d 22 September and Samuel died 16 January 1661/2. He declined to administer on estate of his son Samuel R, 28 October 1662, and the trust devolved on his son John. He made his will 17 March 1665, probated 27 April 1666. Beq. to wife; to ch. Thomas, James, Joseph and Mary R; son John supposed to be in England; to bro. Joseph Rocke. Peter Oliver and Joseph Rock, admins. petition Gen. Court for leave to sell a house and land in 1667.

(compare with following)

THOMAS - gentleman, Scituate, bought house and land in 1642. Com. of town, 1643. Acct. with widow Alice Thompson 2 September 1640. Juryman 1644; took oath of fidelity 3 March 1644/5; prop. freeman 4 June 1650. Bought houses and land in Boston 29 August 1654. He md in Boston 10 November 1652 to Mary, dau of John Cogan and widow of John Woodey. She died 26 October 1661. He md Elizabeth, widow of Richard Sherman.

"ROBINSON" - that lived at Little Waldenfield, England, came with wife and 6 children in company with Mr Nathaneil Rogers in 1636.

WILLIAM - husbandman, yeoman, Dorchester, rented premises 30 July 1639. Freeman 27 December 1642. With wife Margaret sold land October 1664. He md/2 Ursula, widow of Samuel Hosier. Ch. _____, Samuel bapt 14 April 1640, Increase bapt 6 January 1642, Prudence bapt 17 October 1643 md John Bridge of Roxbury, Waiting bapt 26 February 1646 md Joseph Penniman. His will not dated, was probated 31 July 1668, by consent of widow Ursula and ch. Samuel and Increase R, John Bridge and Joseph Penniman; beq. to the ch. above-named and to his wife's daughter Mary Streeter.

WILLIAM - tailor, Salem, freeman 18 May 1642; propr. 1637; another grant to him and his son in 1649. Sold land in 1660. Wife Isabel member church 1637. Ch. Anna bapt 3 October 1637; Samuel bapt 26 October 1639, Mary bapt 12 January 1642/3; Timothy bapt 28 Apr 1644, Mark b and d 1645, Hester bapt 28 March 1654. Will dated 9 February 1676/7; probated 29 September 1678. Son Joseph at Barbadoes; sons Samuel and John execs.; dau Sarah Newbury; gr-child Timothy R.

PIONEERS OF MASSACHUSETTS

ABRAHAM - fisherman, Cape Ann, Gloucester, part owner of a boat in 1641; propr. before 1649. Abraham R, "son-in-law" of William Brown of Gloucester, under 21 years of age in 1662. Was he not a son of this man? Abraham, Sen, died 23 February 1645.

ANNA - widow, member church Salem 1637.

ANTHONY - before the Gen. Court 6 October 1636.

ELLEN - passed exam. 11 April 1637, to go to New England.

ISAAC - son of the beloved pastor of the Pilgrim church at Scrooby and Leyden, Holland, came to New England in 1631. He was born in Leyden in 1610; resided at Plymouth a short time, but removed to Scituate. Freeman 1633. Removed with the church to Barnstable in 1639; deputy, collector of excise, juror. He married 27 June 1636 to Margaret, dau/o Egglin Hanford. She was buried 13 June 1649, and he md/2 whose name name is unknown. Ch. Susannah bapt 21 Jan 1637/8, John bapt 5 Apr 1640, Isaac bapt 7 Aug 1642, Feare bapt 26 Jan 1644 md Isaac Baker, Mercy bapt 4 July 1647, Israel bapt 5 Oct 1651, Jacob bapt 15 May 1653.

ISAAC - age 15, came in the Hopewell in Sept 1635. Settled in Lynn. Servant of Mr Wood. In Court in 1637.

JANE - before Gen. Court 3 Oct 1639, regarding her house.

JOHN - millwright, Ipswich, propr. 1635-1639. Will dated 27 February 1657, probated 30 March 1658, beq. to Alice, wife of Thomas Howlett and to Thomas Howlett, Jr.

JOHN - blacksmith, Haverhill, bought house and land of Joseph Merry in 1644. Bought house and land in Exeter 20 December 1651. Residing in Hav. sold house and land there 5 August 1651; wife Elizabeth joining.

JOHN - late servant to our bro. Newgate, Boston, had grant of a house-plot 28 August 1639. Perhaps he is the person called John Robertsonne, to whom a lot was granted 27 February 1640. It is not unlikely that he is the John Robison, servant to Wm Philips, who made will 2 June 1652, probated 9 June following, and bequeathed to his mother and sister in case they be alive and claim it; otherwise to W P and Robt ffeild.

JOHN - Salem, propr., member church 1639. Lawsuit in 1641. Witness 1647. Will dated 22 September. Inventory taken by Elias Stilleman and Richard Prince 28 September 1653. Bequeathed to wife Eleanor for her life; then to the first one of his kindred that shall come to seek it; beq. to Elder Samuel Sharpe, and John Jackson of Boston.

ROBERT - age 41, came in the Christian 16 March 1634.

William M md Hanna Crawford, a daughter of James Crawford, a farmer, and they became the parents of four sons and three daughters, namely: William H, Martha A, Tabitha who md Marshall Winget, Rufina, Marietta who md John Moore, Calvin, Warren and William, the last three served in the Civil War.

At Thayer, Kansas on 24 November 1872, Eben C md Miss Kate Elizabeth Stall, daughter of David Stall. They had three sons and two daughters, namely: Calvin L who md Mary Summers, Arthur D who md Martha Pullen, Frederick M who md Lenore Clayball, Cora and Lena who md W B Christian.

OMAR E ROBINSON - was born upon a farm in St Clair County, Missouri on 16 December 1868; son of George W Robinson who was born in Virginia and came to Missouri at an early date. The wife of George W was Cornelia Beckwith who was born in Kentucky. George and Cornelia had six children...Omar E being the eldest.

In 1898 Omar E md Miss Ida Coche, daughter of Benjamin Coche, early settler of St Clair County.

DR G WILSE ROBINSON - was born in St Clair, Missouri in 1871; son of George W and Cornelia (Beckwith) Robinson and is the brother to Omar E, above. Dr Robinson md Miss Olive Bradley.

THE LADIES IN FRENCH CANADA by Peter Kalm (1749)

All the women in the country, without exception, wear caps of some kind or other. Their jackets are short, and so are their petticoats, and they have a silver cross hanging down on the breast. In general they are very industrious; however, I saw some, who, like the English women in the colonies, did nothing but chatter all the day.

When they have any thing to do within doors, they (especially the girls) commonly sing songs, in which the words amour and coeur are very frequent. In the country, it is usual, that when the husband receives a visit from persons of rank, and dines with them, his wife stands behind and serves him.

...The heels of their shoes are high, and very narrow, and it is surprising how they walk on them.

...However, they seem rather remiss in regard to the cleaning of the utensils, and apartments; sometimes the floors, both in the town and country, were hardly cleaned once in six months.

Well sis I am just waiting for the day to come when they will say pack up and then we start for a port That sure will be a real happy day for this old soldier, But the happiest day will be when I hear them say all out for Jaxon. I had some made by myself and they sure are good and just as soon as he can print them I will send you all one of them. Well I am closing and hoping to hear from you all real soon so bye, bye. and a good night kiss for you all. From your Big Slim bud.

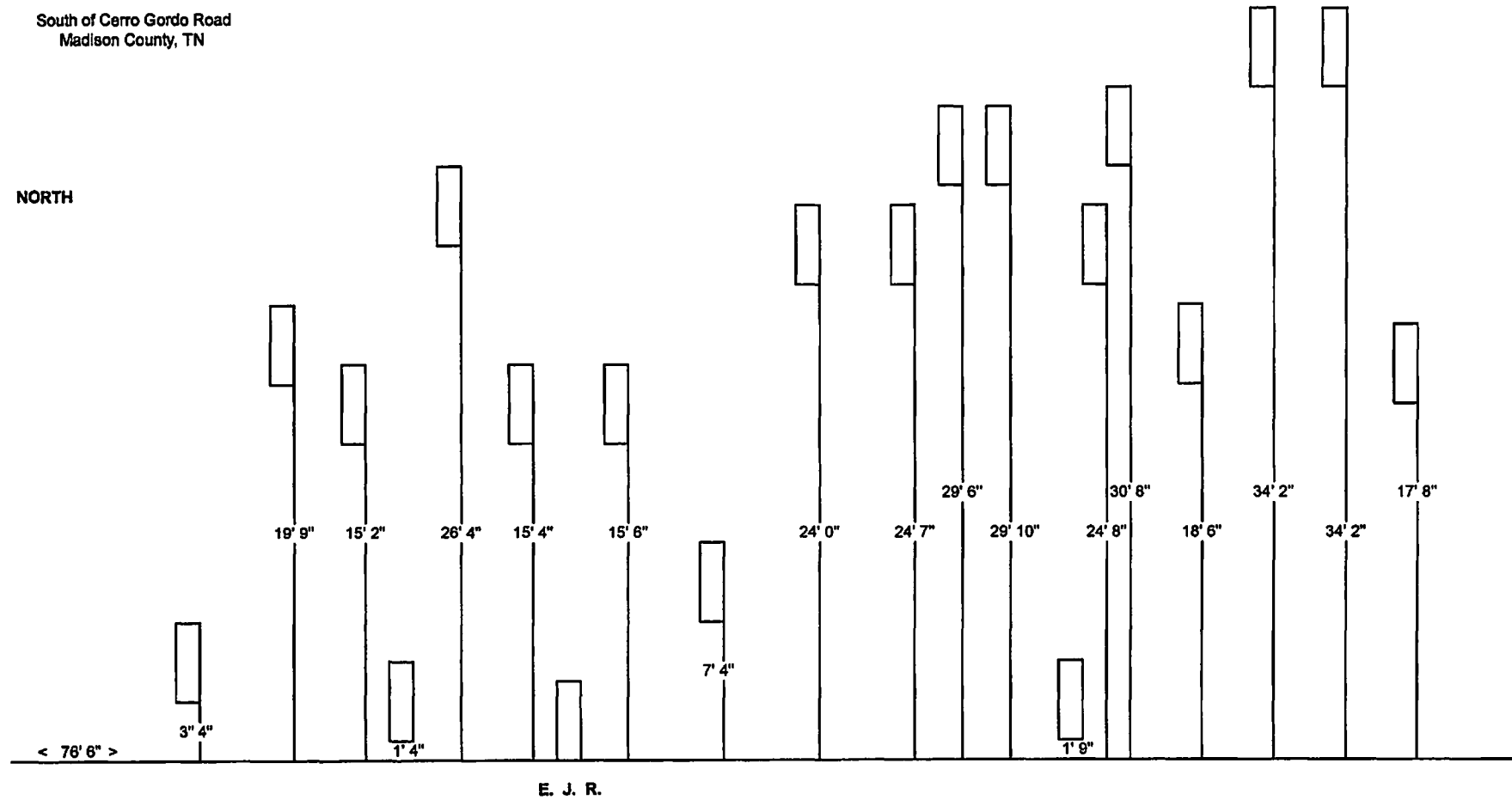

Located on the south side of Cerro Gordo Road about 1.2 miles west from the intersection of Cerro Gordo and Wells and Lassiter Road, which runs from Steam Mill Ferry Road to Boone Lane. Only one broken tombstone without a name has been found at the head of a grave. This grave has a footstone with the initials E.J.R. inscribed. This is probably the grave of William Robinson's (1798-1873) sixth child, Emily Jackson Robinson b. 12 Dec-1830 d. -1849 at the age of nineteen. This William Robinson was the first Robinson from Kentucky and Smith County Tennessee to receive a land grant farm in Madison County in 1826, signed by Governor Sam Houston.

Information from the genealogy of W. Harris Robinson and Elizabeth Hoskins Robinson, great grandson of William Robinson, and information given by great grand daughters Bess McCaslin Robbins and Mary McCaslin from memory, and information recorded by Orrin Eaton Robinson (1886-1940) grandson of William Robinson, in his diary on Nov. 30, 1893, listed the following burials:

JOHN ROBINSON, SOLDIER OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION, AND HIS DESCENDANTS
by Margaret Ann Troutman

John Robinson, Revolutionary soldier of North Carolina and Virginia, was born in Mecklenburg, North Carolina, March 7, 1759. He died in Benton County, Arkansas, September 7, 1842. He married (February 3, 1784) Abigail Moore, was was born October 30, 1766, and died July 7, 1846 in Benton County, Arkansas. Abigail Moore was the daughter of Moses Moore, born 1734, and Ann ?, born 1737. Moses Moore came to Mecklenburg County, N.C., from Lancaster, Pa. Moses Moore died Oct. 30, 1785 and Ann died March 3, 1802. Both are buried at the Hopewell Church graveyard near Charlotte, N.C.

John Robinson was allowed a pension on Certificate No. 25096, which was issued November 19, 1833, rate \$65 per annum, act of June 7, 1832, West Tennessee Agency and transferred to Arkansas Agency. His widow Abigail was allowed pension on Certificate No. 7010, issued June 16, 1845, rate \$65 per annum. John Robinson stated that he enlisted in August 1780 and served as a Private in Capt. William Alexander's company, Col. William Polk's North Carolina regiment; length of service, seven months; then enlisted in April 1781 and served ten months as Dragoon in Col. Wade Hampton's regiment.

In 1790 John and Abigail Robinson were living in Mecklenburg County, N.C. In 1802 they moved to Tennessee. (Note that Abigail's mother died March 3, 1802.) They were living in Wilson County, Tenn., in 1806. In 1817 they were living in Bedford County, Tenn., where Sept. 18, 1817 he bought 198 acres of land of Sugar Creek from Elisha Hall, paying \$1,600 for it. In October 1818 he bought 150 acres more in the same location. He later deeded this land to his sons, Moses Moore Robinson, John Brown Robinson and Robert Amzi Robinson. John Robinson was still living in Bedford County, Tenn., in 1820 Census but in 1833 he had removed to McNary County, Tenn., where he applied for and received a pension for his service in the Revolutionary War.

In 1836 he moved to Benton County, Ark., settling where the town of Robinson now is. His son John Brown Robinson came with him, the other sons staying in Tennessee. In the February 1952 issue of FLASHBACK (Washington County Historical Society), in list of "Revolutionary Pensioners Living in Arkansas 1840", you will find John Robinson 81 living with J.H. Morrison (Jane Harris Robinson Morrison). Jane was the first child of John and Abigail Robinson. She was born May 16, 1787 in North Carolina. In 1806 she married Andrew Morrison in Wilson County, Tennessee. Her husband died in Bedford County, Tenn., in 1832. She came to Arkansas with her mother and father, bringing her children with her.

Two of the above boys were killed by the Pin Indians during the Civil War. The battle took place in which is now Oklahoma, just across the line from Arkansas. At that time Andrew Milton Morrison's widow was living near where Highfill, Ark., now is. Margaret Jane and Sarah Emily received word of the death of their brothers, so went after their bodies. They went in a wagon drawn by oxen. They brought the bodies to Thornsberry Cemetery and placed them in one grave, dug by the girls.

Allison Smith was appointed Justice of the Peace and died while holding that office in 1847. At this time they were living in Benton County, Arkansas. Rogers Turned Out in Force

The June 9, 1882 issue of the Rogers Champion (Volume I, Number 11) printed in full the address by the Rev. James McLean at the dedication of the graves of Union soldiers at the National Cemetery in Fayetteville on May 30, 1882.

The Champion also reprinted two items from the Fayetteville Sentinel that read as follows:

"The singing at the decoration yesterday was excellent. The choir consisted of Mr. J.C. Rogers, Dr. L. Rogers, Miss Allie Rogers, Miss Rosie Rogers, Miss Lucie Rogers, and Miss Jennie Rogers. Miss Jennie was the organist."

"There were 55 citizens of that lively little city, Rogers, who came down here yesterday to attend the decoration ceremonies, prominent among whom we noticed J. W. Frye, the efficient and obliging railroad agent; J.H. Rackerby, postmaster; D.W. Hinman, editor of the Champion and one of the orators of the day; Dr. Pennington and W.C. Roberts, an ex-citizen of our town."
