1837 LAND DEAL BETWEEN RUDOLPH SAD(D)LER
& SPRINGHILL TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DIRECTORS

From Deed Book "W," pages 246 & 247:

This indenture made the fifteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven Between Rudolph SADDLER (Farmer) of the County of Fayette and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania of the one part and John MORGAN, George POUNDSTONE, Gideon WAY, Joseph BOWERS, David PATTON and Lee TATE, Directors of Common Schools for Springhill Township County and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth: That the said Rudolph SADDLER for and in consideration of the sum of two dollars to him in hand paid by the said directors, the receipt whereof he does hereby acknowledge, has granted bargained and sold and by these presents does grant bargain and sell unto the school directors and their successors or whomever the laws of Pennsylvania may hereafter appoint for such trusts a piece or parcel of land situate lying and being in the Township County and State aforesaid Beginning at a post in the line of SADDLER and SERGENT thence North thirty eight degrees West six perches and sixty five hundredths to a post in SADDLERS land, Thence South fifty two degrees West six perches in SADDLERS land, South thirty eight degrees East six perches and sixty five hundredths to the line of SADDLER and SERGENT, thence with said line North fifty two degrees East six perches to the Beginning Containing thirty nine perches and nine tenths strict measure. Together with all and singular, the rights, liberties, privileges here adaments and appertaining whatsoever there unto belonging or in anywise _____, and the remainders and revision, rents issues and profits thereof. To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land hereby granted with the appertainences unto the said School directors of Springhill Township and their successors in office or whomsoever the laws of Pennsylvania may hereafter appoint in trust for the use of common schools forever or so long as the said Directors their successors shall occupy the said piece or parcel of land as a scite for a school house for the use of common schools, and for no other purpose whatsoever - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written
