The 7th Day of the First Month, 1638.

We whose names are underwritten do hereby solemnly in the presence of Jehovah incorporate ourselves, lives and estates unto the Lord Jesus Christ, the King of Kings, and to all those perfect and most absolute laws of His given in His Holy Word of Truth, to be guided and judged thereby.

## THE WILL OF JOHN SANFORD

The original will of John Sanford has never been found. There is however a true copy filed in the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Newport County, Newport, R. I. This copy was filed at the time of the case of Samuel Sanford, hatter, vs. William Wood and John Allen and others, regarding land Samuel believed belonged to him. The complete will is given in the New England Historical Genealogical Society REGISTER of Oct. 1950, contributed by G. Andrews Moriarty through the courtesy of Francis Richmond Sears.

The will, in part, leaves to wife Bridget, "my new dwelling in which I live, with all and every chamber or room therein and half the cook room and all the houses on the north side of the cook room, all my right in the great orchard, land on the north side of my new dwelling, meadow and 1/3rd of all cattle and movables for life."

To son John he left certain land and the ferry, the old house, half the cook room and two houses on the south side of a certain path. He also left him a great roan mare, 5 ewe lambs and a sow, a feather bed, cutlass, and great fowling piece.

To Samuel he left the 40 acres at Black Point, 4 oxen, 2 cows, brown mare, 5 ewes, 5 ewe lambs, a sow, spanish gun, sword, belt, best cloak and hat, feather bed and Great Bible.

To Peleg, at age, he left 20 acres at Black Point, 2nd roan mare, 5 ewes, 5 lambs, 2 cows, a sow, French gun and other items. To Restcome, William, Esbon and Elisha were also left land at Black Point. Eliphah was left £100, of which £60 was to be hers at marriage and £40 at her mother's marriage or death. Annie received £60 at marriage.

"And I do bequeath my children unto my wife, next to God, entreating that they may be carefully provided for and tenderly brought up as hitherto they have been, and that they may be well educated and brought up in the fear of the Lord."

The witnesses were John Browne; Myree Standish; William Brenton; William Baulston; Samuel Hutchinson Senr. and William Freeborne.

## THE SANFORD FAMILY

1 JOHN SANFORD was son of Samuel and Ellenor, of Alford, Lincolnshire, England. He came over in "Ship Lyon", arriving in Boston, November 3, 1631, and is numbered 115 on the list of church members. He was made a freeman of the colony, April 3, 1632, and the same year commander at the fort. He was one of the fifty-eight disarmed church members in 1637; (being a supporter of Mr. Wheelwright and Mrs. Hutchinson); he came to Rhode Island in 1638; he was one of the nineteen signers of the civil compact dated March 7, 1638 for the settlement of Aquidnook, now the island of Rhode Island. He was Constable, Secretary, Treasurer and General Recorder, 1647 and 1649; he was president of the colony in 1653; he died sometime between June 22, 1653 and November 16, 1653. His will bears the former date and was proved on the latter date. He married 1st, Elizabeth Webb; 2d, Bridget, a

2. JOHN SANFORD (1<sup>st</sup> Jno.), born June 4, 1633, was baptised at First Church in Boston, July 26, 1633. May 17, 1653, he was received at the Gen. Assembly at Newport as freeman from Portsmouth. May 22, 1655, he was chosen Gen. Treasurer of the colonies. May 20, 1656, he was chosen Gen. Recorder and Treasurer, and served the colony in these offices till May 22, 1662, he was chosen Assistant Gen. Treasurer. May 22, 1663, he was chosen Gen. Attorney. March 1, 1664, he was Deputy to Gen. Assembly. May 3, 1665, he was chosen Assistant. May 2, 1666, he was Deputy to Gen. Assembly. May 1, 1667, he was chosen Gen. Recorder. March 25, 1687, he was appointed one of Andros council, but would not serve. His will was probated in Sept. —, 1701. His first wife was Mary Brenton, a daughter of William, by whom he had three children—all died young. He married 2d, Dec. 1, 1674, Mary, a daughter of William Coddington and Ann, his wife.
