Introduction

This volume is based mainly upon the work of three gentlemen; Alden Sherman and Frank Rathbun, who did separate compilations of Sincerbeaux family history back in 1955, and Howard Thomas, who collaborated with both gentlemen, and who has done much to update the material. In addition, many letters have been written back and forth to make the information as current as possible.

Frank Rathbun's work was more comprehensive than the present volume in that it traced all known Sincerbeaux lines. Individual numbers, assigned later by Mr. Thomas and retained here, only went up to the 400's.

Alden Sherman's narrative history included persons presently numbered in the 900's though with many gaps to be filled in. In this work, the source of the information has been indicated in a reference notation. FR means material from the Rathbun work while AS indicates material from Alden Sherman. Other names, unless otherwise indicated, assume a letter from that individual, along with the date of that letter.

Gaps in the numbering have been left in later generations to allow for possible expansion to include all Sincerbeaux lines. (The line that Frank Rathbun married into, for example, is not included here). This writer has no plans for such an expansion.

It is hoped that the small type will not prove too serious an obstacle to using the book. There was so much material that to have reproduced it in regular typewriter sized print would have resulted in an unwieldy and expensive volume.

To find your place in the history, first turn to the index at the back. This is arranged firstly alphabetically by surname - then alphabetically by given name. Married women are indexed under their maiden names.

There are many variations of the Sincerbeaux spelling (Sincerbeaux, Sincerbox, Sencibaugh, etc.) These variations have all been rather arbitrarily grouped together under the heading "Sincerbeaux and variants".

The index lists first the individual's number, then the given name. Next a generation number is given (from 1-11) showing the generations from Jan Philip, the immigrant ancestor. Lastly, the spouse's surname is shown. In the case of married women, this would be her married name. It was felt that including generation number and spouse's surname would cut down on the confusion between the many similar names.

Next, with the individual's number, locate the person in question at the front of the book. If this person was known to have raised a family, he or she will have his or her own entry. If a separate family is not involved (or known about), then that person will be treated as part of the parental entry. In either case the numbers go consecutively so there should be no difficulty in locating people.

In a few cases, information was received after the numbers had been assigned. Here, letters had to be added after numbers in order to differentiate between people.

The parent in direct line is listed (along with their number), so that it is an easy matter to trace backward along a line as well as forward. All lines trace back to #1, Jan Philip.

Introduction to the 2nd Edition

There are several changes in this edition. The most striking, of course, is the cover, for whom I am deeply indebted to my wife, Marilyn, a professional artist, who gave up considerable time from a busy schedule to design it.

The top right structure on the cover is the castle of Castletown, County Kildare, as it appeared in 1771. This was the seat of the Dungan family, maternal ancestors of the Sincerbeaux family. Their arms appear below Castletown. For those interested in heraldry, the lower section of the shield is blue with six silver circles. The upper part is gold with a red lion. The wreath alternates gold and blue. The globe is silver with golden bands, and a golden cross on top.

Howth Hall, seat of another maternal ancestry, the St. Lawrence family, appears in the lower left section. Their arms appear above the castle. Howth is located nine miles northeast of Dublin, Ireland. The shield is red with silver roses and silver swords with gold handles. The wreath is silver and red and is topped by a silver and purple sea lion.

Within the main body of the text, there have been many additions, as a glance at the index will show. I have kept individual numbers the same, with the exception of several at the very end of the book. This was necessary to avoid some very complicated inter-numbering.

In the index, women have been included under their married names as well as their maiden names, as it was felt that this would lead to more rapid identification of individuals who might be known only by their married names.

At the end of the index I have included a list of zip codes that were missing from addresses given by Rathbun and Sherman. Addresses for the following individuals have been found to be obsolete: #594 - Mrs. Francis G. Sincerbox, #767 - Mrs. Doris S. McGuire, #768 - Mr. Ronald G. Sherman, #984 - Mrs. Joan G. Truman, and #990 - Mr. Donald B. Chamberlain. It is to be assumed, of course, that some of these individuals have passed on, but no information has been received.

I would like to thank all those who have contributed material, both old and new, and who have taken time to point out errors and misprints in the first edition. I will be pleased to continue to receive new material on family history, though a third edition is not planned for the near future. Send material to Walter Corey, 32 W. I would like to thank in particular Mr. Howard A. Thomas, who - though a Sincerbeaux only by marriage - has been most influential in shaping this volume. It has been mainly through his research that the early history of this family, as recorded in the appendices, has been so well documented. He has patiently and repeatedly answered the many questions and problems that a relative newcomer to genealogy has had in the preparation of this material. Without his help it would have been impossible.

A. Hans Sensbach, a possible father of the immigrant ancestor, Jan Philip. His b. and d. dates unk. He m. Margaretha Herbolt. He was an attorney at Ober-Schonbrunn, a small town near Haag, Germany. There is a considerable difference of opinion as to whether he could have been the father of Jan Philip. If Hans Philip (below) is the same as Jan Philip (#1), he would have been in his sixties when fathering children. This is not probable, but is entirely possible. It is the names of his siblings that lead some to conclude that the two men were identical. (See the first section of the appendix for further consideration of this.) They apparently moved to Montgomery, Ulster (now Orange) Co., N.Y. about 1740 where records are found in the Montgomery Reformed Church. B - The Colonial Background of Ruth Draper and Elizabeth Austin - both women come from a rich colonial background, descending from people who left the harsh Puritanism of Massachusetts and Connecticut for the freer religious climate of Rhode Island

Explanation: vertical lines indicate descent, while double horizontal lines indicate marriage; I/A means "immigrant ancestor"; dates in parentheses are birth-death dates (+ after a date means that date or later while - indicates some time around the date given); one and two digit numbers refer to sources at the top of each chart; surnames are written out only for the final person in each line - above these the same name is indicated by a capitalized initial and a dash; most town names, if not obviously from other countries or colonies are Rhode Island names

C - The Medieval Ancestry of Ruth Draper. In addition to her rich colonial background, Ruth Draper boasts impressive ancestry going back to medieval nobility and royalty. This line is well documented.

(It must be pointed out that Ruth Draper herself is somewhat of a mystery, being born after her parents left Rhode Island for the Pennsylvania and New York wilderness. Of the fact that she was Simeon Draper's daughter there seems little doubt, though no birth records have been found to date. This assumption rests on a footnote in the respected "Harvey Book" and a turn-of-the-century newspaper article by a noted DAR genealogist, John Pearson, both of which attest to the relationship. Further evidence comes from the naming of Andrew and Ruth Sincerbeaux's children. Their oldest born son (#60) is named Philip, after his paternal grandfather, while their second son (#82) is named Simeon Draper, after his maternal grandfather. This was a fairly common practice.)

It should be noted that while the numbers in the Sincerbeaux section ran from #1 (Jan Philip) down to the present, the numbers in this appendix refer to the number of generations back from Ruth Draper.

Three varieties of numbers have been used: numbers with nothing after them, indicating an acceptable genealogical source (see below); numbers followed by a question mark, indicating a source that is primarily historical rather than genealogical; numbers followed by an "x", indicating little evidence either historically or genealogically to support the information. The generations in question come from myths or legends. The last two categories, while in many cases extremely interesting, must be used with great caution.

The lines drawn show line of direct descent from one generation to another - some names, whose direct line is not followed up in a particular chart will be traced in a subsequent chart. In that case the notation... "See...(followed by a chart number)" will be found. (It was impossible to follow out every line as there are simply too many. Ancestral Roots - see below - is an excellent source for those who'd like to follow out these lines in more detail.)

The last column of each chart gives the source of each generation. As indicated above, not all of these have the same genealogical value. I have used Ancestral Roots, below, as my main source, although that volume is intended primarily as a guide to primary sources. It might be noted, in this bicentennial year, that a number of prominent Americans - including many presidents - can also claim descent from some of the same sources, and are thus, in a very distant sense, "cousins" to Ruth Draper Sincerbeaux. Among those with a legitimate claim to royal ancestry are George Washington, John Quincy Adams, William Henry and Benjamin Harrison, and Theodore and Franklin Delano Roosevelt. Presidents whose lines need more authentication include Jefferson, Monroe, Polk, Buchanan, Lincoln, Cleveland, Garfield, Taft and Nixon. Ironically, since the British royal line is unbroken, these people would also be distant cousins of King George III.

D - Some Notes on the Charts - this is a potpourri of facts and legends about some of the medieval ancestors of Ruth Draper Sincerbeaux. The numbers should correspond with those in the previous section. No attempt has been made at complete biography, as this can done by consulting the encyclopedias or biographical dictionaries available in many libraries.

It seems probable that the many branches of the Sinsabaugh-Sensabaugh-Sincerbeaux-Sincerbox-etc. families living in the United States today are all descended from an emigrant or emigrants who came to the New World in the early 1700s from that section of Germany along the Rhine River known as the Palatinate.

The name, which appears most often in early American records as Sensebach or Sensenbach, is most likely derived from the town of Ober-Sensbach, 30 kilometers northeast of Heidelberg in Kreis Erbach, the old Bessian province of Starkenberg.

The earliest known record of the family in America is found on Staten Island, where, on May 11, 1729, Altje (Alice), the daughter of Hans Philip and Julie Catherine Fickerling Simeonbach, was baptized at the Reformed Church of Staten Island, at Fort Richmond.

This couple had other children baptized at the Fort Richmond Church, and their names appear in the church records until 1739. They apparently moved about 1740 to Montgomery, in Ulster (now Orange) County, New York, where other members of the family had been as early as 1735. Philip Sensbach was admitted to the Montgomery Reformed Church on September 7, 1742, and his wife, Julianna Catherine Bickerling, on May 22, 1744.

She apparently died shortly thereafter, and Philip evidently was married again to Maria Catherine Slemmer, for on August 12, 1746, their daughter, Elizabeth, was baptized at Montgomery. Maria was possibly the daughter of Matthias and Anna Veronica (Bush) Slemmer, born May 21, 1714 at Kingston, New York, and married first to Hermonious Waller in 1733.

Either Philip or a son of the same name was naturalized as a citizen of New York on October 18, 1750, as "Philippus Sensebach, farmer, of Ulster County."

Philip and Maria were sponsors for a baptism in 1759, the last time his name appears in the Montgomery Church records.

Research in Germany has yielded the name of Hans Philip Sensbach, one of several children of Hans and Margaretha (Herboldt) Sensbach, who was baptized August 11, 1682, at the Evangelical Parsonage at Haag, Kreis Heidelberg. Hans, the father, was an attorney of Ober-Schönbrunn, a small town near Haag.

This would appear to be too early for the birthdate of the American emigrant, who was apparently fathering children in 1746, when he would have been 64 years old. The secret of the family's European origin, however, undoubtedly lies in some musty church records somewhere nearby.

Several other members of the family appear in the Montgomery records during the 1730s. Jacob Sinsabach was naturalized in October, 1735, with other early Montgomery residents. Frederick Sinsabaugh purchased land at Montgomery in 1735, and is listed among the arms-bearing residents in 1738. He was naturalized between June, 1740, and June, 1741, and his name then disappears from the records. Christian Sensebach was admitted to the Montgomery Reformed Church in April, 1738, and was naturalized with Frederick between 1740 and 1741.

Nothing further is known of Frederick or Christian, who may have been brothers of Philip. Jacob apparently moved to Pennsylvania, where a Jacob Sinsenbach owned land in 1736 in Northampton County. He later owned property in Berks County, at Heidelberg, and he is probably the ancestor of the numerous Sinsabaugh families of Pennsylvania, Maryland, Tennessee and Virginia.

The Sinsabaugh, Sincerbox and Sincerbeaux families of New York State are probably all descended from Philip.

The origin of the family name remains obscure, even if one accepts Hans Philip Sensbach as the founder in America. A visitor to the office of Chauncy M. Sincerbeaux, then of New York, claimed to be of the same family and gave the origin as a small hamlet of that name in France. Diligent search has failed to locate this place, but it may be noted that a town named St. Cere appears in southwest France. According to Lippincott's Gazetteer, the population is about 2,500, location 19 miles northwest of Figaniac, Department of Lot. A 16th century castle stands nearby.

On the map of Switzerland near the French border appears the name of a hamlet, Soncabez, the only European place name that has a phonetic resemblance to the family name. The original Latin name, dating from the 9th Century, was Sunnvalle ("Highest Valley") and evolved through the centuries to its present form. An inhabitant could easily travel down the Rhine and settle in France or Germany. The persistent tradition of remote French ancestry could possibly stem from this source.

The Channel Islands have been mentioned by living descendants, and the French St. Aubin is known by the Centabar clan of Vermont as their ancestral name. The Island of Zanzibar (from an old Persian word meaning "Land of the Blacks") off East Africa would appear to be an accidental similarity.

From the standpoint of etymology, it may be noted that the words Sinn and Zins in German are derived from Latin: Sinn - Sense (compare sensible, sensitive, etc.); Zins - French Cens - Latin Cent (ground rent); Zinsbar - Subject to rent; Zinsbauer - Person who pays rent, tenant farmer.

An alternative would be to identify the prefix Sin/Sen with the French Saint, as in Sinclair for St. Clair, Sention for St. John, etc., thus giving credence to St. Aubin.

Obviously the answer must await further research or accidental discovery.



CHART I

- 28 - El Cid Campeador - "The Lord Champion"...great Castilian hero who won fame fighting the Moors...as a mercenary, he sometimes fought on their side...much legend has been attached to his name
- 24 - Alfonso VIII - surnamed "The Noble" and "The Good"...established at Palencia the first known Spanish University
- 23 - Louis VIII The Lion...crusader...invaded England upon request of Barons...after King John died he lost support and returned to France
Blanche of Castile - one of history's most interfering mothers-in-law...wouldn't let her son and his wife be alone together. Their wagers would signal to them when the Queen-mother was approaching
- 22 - Louis IX - one of the great Capetian kings...often held court under an oak tree in a Vincennes park where he would listen to his subjects' problems...went on 2 crusades - during the last he died of typhus...called the "prototype of the humanitarian knight-king"...St. Louis, Mo. named for him
- 21 - Philip III - although surnamed "The Bold" he was a weak ruler...inherited county of Toulouse, which was added to the crownlands
- 20 - Edward I - one of the great warrior kings of England...defeated Saracens at Haifa...annexed Wales...defeat of Wallace and the Scots led to several centuries of conflicts with that country...surnamed "Longshanks" because of his great frame

CHART II

There is a legend about Howth Castle, the ancestral home of the St. Lawrence family. It concerns Granuel, the Sea Queen, who came to call one night and found the gates locked tight. Angry, she used magic powers to enter and abduct the young St. Lawrence heir. She said she would return him only when the gates were kept open to travelers and strangers. To this day, there is always a place set at the great dining table, and the gate is always open to weary travelers.

CHART III

- 31 - Godiva - the horsewoman of legend, who rode the streets of Coventry to reduce taxes. She is usually portrayed sidesaddle, a style of riding that wasn't introduced until later. Legend aside, she was known as a woman of great beauty and piety, and a benefactress of many churches and monasteries.
Leofric - one of the three great earls, along with Godwin and Siward, who had the main control of the kingdom...his character was described as "temperate, patriotic, and religious"...his part in his wife's legend is absurd and completely out of character

CHART IV

- 31 - Brian Boru...of the "Tribute" (refers to an ancient tribute levied against Leinster)...one of Ireland's great kings...killed at Clontarf fighting the Danes...subject of a play by James S. Knowles
- 26 - Diarmait MacMurchad - also called Dermot MacMurrough of Okmerslegh...helped King Henry II bring the English into Ireland, thus setting up problems that have lasted to the present
- 25 - Richard de Clare - "Strongbow"...went to Ireland with a large force to aid Diarmait (abv) who was being driven from his kingdom. He captured Waterford and Dublin
- 24 - William Marshall - a holder of huge amounts of land in Ireland, Wales, and Normandy...regent of England who served 4 kings...admitted to Knights Templars...founded Tintern Abbey in Wexford (see Wordsworth poem)...the Archbishop of Canterbury said at his funeral, "Behold all that remains of the best knight who ever lived"...according to Harold K. Bowen the ancestor of James Monroe, James Knox Polk, James Buchanan, and Theodore Roosevelt

CHART V

- 327 - Hengwulf...the Book of Adam (by Harold K. Bowen) rather fancifully extends his line back through Wittekind, who led the Saxons against Charlemagne, Hengist, joint founder with Horsa of the Kingdom of Kent, Bran the Blessed, who discovered a mystic vessel adorned and with traditions like the Holy Grail, and from thence back into the Biblical genealogies leading back to Jacob, Nosha, and Adam. There is nothing given to support any of this.
- 317 - Hrolf the Ganger (Hrolf the Walker) so called because he was such a giant of a man that no horse could carry him
- 27 - Robert I, The Devil...This line went from "The Good" to "The Devil" in one generation...supposedly got his dukedom by poisoning his older brother...died returning from a pilgrimage to Jerusalem - possibly poisoned by his servants. His heroic deeds and penance have led to many legends about him. Meyerbeer wrote a grand opera, "Robert le Diable" about him
- 26 - William I The Conqueror...grandson of a duke and a tanner...The Norman"....conquered England in 1066 but made few changes in English law...brought England into close contact with the continent and introduced continental feudalism...abolished the great earldoms that rivalled the king, and prevented his barons from becoming too strong by scattering their varied estates...completed the Doomsday Book...spent most of his reign suppressing Saxon uprisings, fighting the King of France, and quarreling with members of his own family
- 25 - Henry I - surnamed Beauclerk ("Fine Scholar") because, as the youngest son, he was destined for the clergy instead of the throne...usurped throne while brother Robert was on Crusade...conquered Normandy (and his brother) in 1106
Matilda of Scotland...described as "pious and learned...had great influence on the life of the time"...founded first Austin Priory in England (1108)
- 24 - Geoffrey V Plantagenet - so called from his habit of wearing a branch of broom, plante de genat, in his cap...he was also surnamed "La Bel"
- Matilda/Maud...known as Empress Maud or Lady of the English...the rightful heir to the throne usurped by Stephen...she invaded England, captured Stephen, and was acknowledged "Lady of England and Normandy"...she misused her power, was driven from London, and fled to Oxford...her most noted exploit was her escape from Oxford with three of her knights at Christmas time. They dressed themselves in white and fled over the frozen river and through Stephen's camp
- 23 - Henry II - surnamed "Curtmantle" because he wore the short Angevin cloak rather than the long Norman robes...cropped his hair supposedly because he feared baldness...One of the great English kings...demolished many castles which were becoming hotbeds of anarchy...revived trial by jury...by the Constitution of Clarendon he extended the court's jurisdiction to the clergy - this brought him into conflict with Thomas-a Becket (See "Murder in the Cathedral" by T.S.Eliot, "Becket" by Jean Anouilh, etc.)
- Eleanor of Aquitaine...the "Damsel of Brittany"...most famous for poetry festivals...Courts of Love" (see "Eleanor and the Four Kings" by Amy Kelly - 1950)

CHART V - Continued

- 22 - John - called "Lackland" or "Softsword"...one of England's all time unpopular kings...he lost many of the privileges he thought were his rights by signing Magna Charta...lost England by handing it over to the church (by acknowledging the Pope as his feudal overlord)...captured Maud de Braose and her son (see III-24) and imprisoned them for spreading rumors about his supposed murder of Prince Arthur - their bodies discovered 11 days later in a horrible condition
- 21 - Henry III - became king at 9...his regent, William Marshall (IV-24) defended him against the barons and the King of France...his reign was not a success...of his French possessions he could keep only Aquitaine and Gascony...his misgovernment and favoritism toward foreigners provoked the barons again who forced on him the Provisions of Oxford (1258)...when he repudiated this he was captured and held prisoner by the barons until he was rescued by his son at the Battle of Evesham (1265)
- Eleanor of Provence - wasn't much more successful than her husband...at one time a London crowd wanted her drowned as a witch...she ended her days as a nun

CHART VI

- 487- Morovich - gave his name to the line of Merovingian rulers...these kings believed, like Samson, that long hair was the source of their power...when they were deposed (which was often) their heads were shorn
- 477- Childeric I - his tomb was discovered at Tournai in 1653 and contained his seal ring and a number of gold bees. This suggested to Napoleon I the adoption of the bee as an imperial symbol
- 467- Clovis I - defeated the Alamanni in 496 and was baptised a Christian in fulfilment of a vow made during the battle...fixed his court at Paris (507)...made the Salic Franks a major power
- 457- Clotaire I - one of the major sources of trouble all throughout the middle ages was the practise of dividing a kingdom up among all the sons. Clotaire did this...Clotaire, with a fair amount of violence managed to depose his brothers and reunite his father's dominions
- 447- Chilperic I - called by Bishop Gregory the "Nero and Herod of his Age"...he was brutal, cruel, cunning and superstitious...Once, it is said, he became involved in alphabet reform and ordered everybody to write the new way - or have their eyes put out...murdered his wife Galswintha, sister of Brunhild of Austrasia, in order that he might marry his mistress, Fredegunde. This brought on a protracted war with the husband of Brunhild, his brother Sigebert I
- Fredegunde - carried on a lifetime war with Brunhilda after being deeply involved in the murder of Galswintha...She became regent for her son Clotaire II...She finally attacked and defeated Brunhild in 596
- 427- Dagobert I - founded the abbey of St. Denis...reduced to writing the customary laws of the barbaric tribes in his kingdom...During his reign the Frankish Empire attained a very wide extent - from Weser to the Pyrenees, and from the Western Ocean to Bohemia
- 40 - Dagobert II - two French dioceses keep the Feast of St. Dagobert II but there seems to be no reason why he should be regarded as a saint...While in exile as a young man he became friendly with St. Wilfrid of York...he married an Englishwoman...his murder in 679 was popularly construed as martyrdom
- 26 - Stephen - usurped the throne from Matilda (V-24)...because of this his reign was very disturbed - marked by two invasions on Matilda's behalf - by King David, Maud's uncle, and by Maud herself...The Treaty of Wallingford gave him the right to rule till death, at which time Henry, Maud's son, would take over as his "heir"...He was a brave knight but a weak and ineffective ruler...he was the first king to allow and encourage tournaments
- Matilda of Boulogne - in the civil war following the Empress Maud's invasion, she took the field of battle in person, and after her husband's imprisonment was instrumental in driving Maud from London. She founded the Hospital of St. Katherine by the Tower of London

CHART VII

- 32 - Robert I - chosen king in opposition to Charles the Simple in 922
- 30 - Hugh Capet - founder of the Capetian dynasty...elected King upon the extinction of the direct line of Charlemagne...he found himself powerless to resist the great feudatories who surpassed him in military power and in extent of territory
- 29 - Robert II - surnamed The Pious...during his reign the kingdom suffered from an insurrection of the serfs and from famine
- 27 - Philip I - excommunicated because of "marriage irregularities"
- 25 - Louis VII - in 2nd crusade...Ripley's Believe it or Not (7/11/76) states "Received a dowry of two French provinces upon his marriage to Eleanor, dau. of a French duke in 1152, but when he shaved off his beard after the wedding, Eleanor divorced him, married King Henry II of England, and demanded return of the dowry! To regain the provinces, King Henry declared war on France, and the fighting continued for 301 years"
- 24 - Philip II Augustus - one of the chief consolidators of the French monarchy...conquered many of the English possessions in France...during his reign serfdom disappeared

CHART VIII

- 307- Sancho III Garcés the Great - his realm ultimately included Castile, Leon, Navarre, and Aragon
- 29 - Ferdinand I the Great - fought with great success against the Moors...reduced to vassalage the rulers of Toledo, Saragossa, and Seville...assumed title of Emperor of Spain in 1056
- 28 - Alfonso VI - surnamed "The Valiant" - reigned during time of El Cid (I-28)

CHART IX

- 27 - Gospafrio - in conflict with Bishopric of Durham...went barefoot to the "Holy Isle" to seek pardon of St. Cuthbert, who'd "pronounced woe" on him according to a priest's dream

CHART X

- 21 - William de Beauchamp - according to Harold K. Bowen an ancestor of Pres. U.S. Grant

CHART XI

- 23 - Jean de Brienne - participated in 5th Crusade...Latin Emperor of the East...defended Constantinople against the Bulgars and the Greeks...a hero of the ballet "Raymonda" by Glazunov

CHART XIII

- 337- Hywel Dda - known as "The Great Lawgiver"

CHART XIV

- 217- Honor of Mowbray - a crusader - founded a leper hospital

- 22 - William de Mowbray - founded the Chapel of St. Nicholas

- 20 - Peter III de Mowbray - became a Marshall of England...styled himself "Lord of the Isle of Axholme and of the Honour of Gower and Bramber"...died of the plague

- 19 - John I de Mowbray - After a fight with Hugh le Despenser over Gower, he was condemned to be drawn by horses and hung at York. There is a ghostly legend of his armor cracking at midnight

CHART XXVII

- 33 - Rurik - reputed founder of the Russian Empire - sometimes called "First Czar" - Scandinavian origin... Some scholars identify him as Rorik of Jutland - one of three brothers invited by Slavs to help them against the Varangians. First est. his seat of power in Ladoga, then in Novgorod after his brothers' sudden deaths - apparently a harsh ruler - House of Rurik reigned until 1598
- 32 - Igor/Ingvar - "Song of the Band of Igor", the most ancient of the Russian medieval epics, describes his struggles with pagan hordes (who finally captured him and killed him by springing him between two tied down saplings)
- St. Olga, possibly a princess of Pskov - regent for her son - embraced Christianity, but was unable to impose her beliefs on Kiev and on her son...feast day Jul 11
- 31 - Sviatoslav - killed by hostile forces - tradition says his skull was overlaid with gold and made into a drinking cup - His death marked the end of the Rus Imperial dream...last of the pre-Christian rulers of Kiev
- 30 - St. Vladimir - gained throne at expense of his brother, who was slain by Varangian mercenaries - said to have been completely hedonistic before his conversion - had seven wives and 800 concubines. He created safety and stability in Kiev by defeating many of its enemies. It is said he held a banquet each week for those of his subjects who could come, and sent food and supplies to those who couldn't all paid for by a very efficient taxing system...First of the Christian rulers, though this religion was imposed by very unchristian means
- 29 - Jaroslav I - surnamed "The Wise" - His reign was Kiev's Golden Age - Built the Great Wall of Kiev with its famous Golden Gate, the Cathedral of St. Sophia - Issued Ruskaja Pravda...the first codified civil law of the Kievian state...Through marriage, he tied his family to the ruling heads of Poland, Germany, Byzantium, Norway, France, Hungary, and Sweden...Under him the Varangians, Slavic race, became unified into a Russian state

CHART XXVIII

- 19 - Robert de Clifford - one of the greatest barons of the age...made various raids into Scotland and became (1308) Captain and Chief Guardian of all Scotland on either side of the Firths...was Marshall of England...slain in the great Battle of Bannockburn

CHART XXIX

- 23 - Saher de Quincy - credited with writing the Magna Charta, using the Henry I Charter and the old Anglo-Saxon code

CHART XXX

- 31 - William de Warenne - Carried off Isabel de Vermandois from her first marriage even though her husband was still alive...left eight children by that union

CHART XXXI

- 25 - Alfonso I - had to fight his own mother to secure his throne...an early conservationist - decreed that whoever cut down a tree must plant another one in its place

- 24 - Fernando II - his repudiation of Urraca of Portugal involved him in a war with Alfonso I (XXXI-25) whom he defeated and captured (1157)...brilliant victory over the Moors at Santarem (ca. 1181)... the great military order of Alcantara was chartered during his reign

- 23 - Alfonso IX - won a brilliant victory over the Moors ca. 1230

CHART XXXII

- 36X - Siegmond and Siegfried (35X) as well as their wives were prominent characters in the Niebelung legend, used by Richard Wagner in his "Ring Cycle" music-dramas...these characters are based upon real people but have become extremely distorted

- 34X - Ragnar Lodbruk "Leather-Breathes" - a semi-legendary Norse Viking who was supposed to have invaded England toward the end of the 8th century. He would have had to have lived several lifetimes to have done all that was attributed to him...One story has it that he was thrown into an adder pit by King Aelle of Northumberland. He was protected by a magic coat that his wife gave him...when this was taken from him he was killed by the snakes...His death song was supposed to have gone, "I have fought 50 battles and won, I never thought I would die in a snake pit...How the young pigs would grunt if they knew of the old boar's plight!"

- 33? - Ivar Beinlos ("The Boneless") - The story goes that when Ragnar married Ivar's mother, she begged him to wait three days before consummating the marriage as "a spell was on her". Ragnar refused and their first child was in consequence born with gristle instead of bone

- 30 - Olaef Kvaaean...name means "of the sandal"

- 27 - Conan/Cynan - was considered to be very bloodthirsty - many murders and mutilations on his bands... preserved the independence of Gwynedd from Norman aggression...one of his sons, Madog, is fabled to have discovered America

- 26 - Griffith ap Cynan - described as being of "low stature, yellow hair, round face, large eyes, beautiful eyebrows, a fine beard, fair skin, and strong limbs...for awhile lived the life of a wandering viking, constantly taking refuge in Ireland or Man...during his reign a good friend of the clergy who built many churches...his Irish education thought to have led him to introduce bagpipes into Wales...Ordericus calls him "Princeps Brittonum" and Henry I (V-25) "Princeps Anglorum"

CHART XXXIV *

- 34 - Henry I the Fowler - his surname comes from an unauthenticated legend that the princes who notified him of his election as king of the Germans found him at fowling...his father had likewise been offered the kingship but had refused...thoroughly reorganized German defenses, building fortified cities and fortifying others (another of his nicknames is "Founder of Cities")...didn't technically have title of emperor but is considered to be the real founder of the medieval German empire. He is recognized as a wise ruler and skillful military leader

- 33 - Otto I - His union of Germany with Italy (which he invaded and captured) resulted in the creation of the Holy Roman Empire, thus reviving Charlemagne's office...at once was the greatest political and military power of the West...succeeded in putting an end to the divided allegiance of his clergy between church and state

- 32 - Otto II - surnamed "The Red"...was the first joint emperor (with his father) in German history...In 970 he repelled a French invasion...In turn he unsuccessfully besieged Paris...thru his wife he claimed parts of southern Italy - this was resisted by the Greeks, and with the assistance of the Saracens they totally defeated him near Cetrone, Calabria...escaped with difficulty on a vessel and died before plans for a counter-attack could be carried out

- 30 - Misaco II - his reign marked by conflict with neighbors

- 29 - Casimir I - surnamed "The Peaceful" and "The Monk"...also called the "Restorer of Poland"...had fled Poland because his mother's German leanings caused an uprising...recalled in 1040 and restored Christianity to the country

CHART XVI

- 25 - Ramon Berenguer IV - his four daughters all married kings: Margaret m. Louis IX (I-22); Eleanor m. Henry III (V-21); Sancha m. Richard, K/Normans; Beatrice m. Charles, K/Sicily.
26 - Alfonso II - noted as a patron of Provencal poetry

CHART XIX

- 41 - St. Arnulf - Bishop of Metz...spent last years in hermitage with St. Romaric...feast day July 18...
Mayors of the Palace were the virtual rulers - the Merovingian kings having become by this time
little more than figureheads...Harold King Bowen (again rather fancifully and without foundation)
carries his line back many generations to Coelus ("Old King Cole"), through many more generations
to Friar, King of Troy, and again back to the Biblical genealogies
- 40 - St. Begga - sister of St. Gertrude...spent most of her long life as a nobleman's wife "in the world"...
On becoming a widow in 691, she established and ruled over a convent...feast day Dec 17
- 38 - Charles Martel - Illegitimate...his name was an old Teutonic word for the lowest class of freeman, but
he covered the name with such glory that many kings used it...defeated the Saracens between Poitiers
and Tours in 732...This has long been considered a turning point of history, though present day his-
torians think that the Saracen drive was running out of steam anyway
- 37 - Pepin III, the Short, would probably be considered one of the great kings if he hadn't been overshadowed
by his son, Charlemagne. He started off as Mayor of the Palace, but later, with the Pope's blessing,
became king in his own right. Later, in "The Donation of Pepin" he gave the Pope certain territories
in Italy. These became the foundations of the Papal States
- Bertha - called "Bertha of the Big Foot" or "Queen Goose-foot"-a possible prototype of "Mother Goose"
- 36 - Charlemagne - usurped entire kingdom at Carloman's death (768)...conquered and incorporated into his
Kingdom Saxony, Lombardy, Bavaria, the Avars...remembered mainly for his one defeat - at the Pass of
Honsavalle (The Song of Roland)...crowned Holy Roman Emperor on Christmas Day (800)...used his
prestige to bring learning and literature to the continent
- 35 - Louis I, surnamed "Le Pieux" and "Le Debonaire"...reign marked by the rebellions of his sons, and by
assaults by the Northmen
- 34 - Lothair I - defeated by his brothers at Fontenay 841...consented to Treaty of Verdun whereby he kept
the title of Holy Roman Emperor and the territory between the Alps, the Rhine, the Meuse, the Saone,
and the Rhone
- 30 - Berengarius II - became a feudatory of Germany upon the invasion of Otto I (XXXIV-33)...was eventually
dethroned...died in prison

CHART XX

- 30 - Siward - another of the three great earls (see Isolfric III-31)...appears in "Macbeth" by Shakespeare...
according to legend he was descended from a white bear and a lady...supposedly sailed to the Orkneys
and overcame a dragon...on his deathbed he said he regretted dying "like a cow", and so dressed in
armor and died standing up
- 29 - Waltheof - condemned to death for conspiracy against William the Conqueror (V-26)...was saying The
Lord's Prayer when beheaded...onlookers claimed that the severed head finished the prayer...his
penitence and death caused him to be venerated as a saint and martyr by the English...his coffin
was moved several times...in 1092 the coffin was opened and, according to the story, the body was
undecayed and the head united...miracles began to be worked at the new tomb
- 28 - St. David I - founded bishoprics, monasteries and royal burghs...his friend, St. Aelred, bore witness
to the virtue of his life and the justness of his rule...invaded England to overthrow King Stephen
(VI-26) but was defeated at the Battle of the Standard (1138)...feast day May 24

CHART XXI

- 31 - Samuel - proclaimed himself ruler of the Bulgars...extended his territory to the Black Sea
- 28 - Alexius I Comnenus - reigned during time of 1st Crusade...defended his empire against Turks, Normans,
and others...The Alexiad, his biography, was written by his daughter, Anna Comnena
- 25 - Isaac II Angelus - succeeded Andronicus Comnenus who was overthrown by a popular revolt...was de-
throned and blinded by his own brother, Alexius III...when the latter fled before the crusaders
Isaac and his son, Alexius IV, regained the imperial throne...in turn were supplanted by Alexius V
(1204)...rule considered corrupt

CHART XXII

- 43X - Ottar and his son Adils (42X)...two kings mentioned in the medieval epic Beowulf
- 38X - Inglefild Illrredi ("ill counsel") - the most famous of the Ingling kings...increased his dominions by
inviting other petty kings to a feast and then burning down the hall with them inside
- 33? - Hareld Fairhair - completed the conquest of the petty kings, or jarls begun by his father...his
repressive measures led many vikings to migrate to Iceland, Normandy, and beyond
- 32? - Eric Bloodaxe - became overlord to his brothers...was later exiled...went to England where he became
King of Northumbria...was slain in battle

CHART XXIII

- 27 - Fulk V - married the daughter of Baldwin II, King of Jerusalem, and took over the reign upon his
father-in-law's death

CHART XXIV

- 27 - Adela of Normandy - noted for her beauty and valor...called her father's equal in bravery...called
upon to settle many disputes...became a pupil of Anselm so she could in turn teach her children...
Chartres Cathedral rebuilt in stone through her energy and beneficence...When her husband came back
from Antioch in disgrace she urged him to return there and pick up...He did so and was slain (1101)

CHART XXV

- 45 - Aedan - crowned by St. Columba at Iona (574)...declared the independence of his kingdom in 575
- 36 - Kenneth MacAlpin I - in 843 he established his rule over Alban, the United Kingdom of the Picts and
Scots...fixed his capital at Scone
- 33 - Malcolm I - annexed Morey to his kingdom (943)
- 32 - Kenneth II - consolidated and defended the central districts of Scotland
- 31 - Malcolm II - gained throne by defeating and killing Kenneth III (1105)...annexed Lothian and Cumbria
north of the Solway
- 29 - Duncan I - assassinated by Macbeth near Elgin ca. 1040...appears in Shakespeare's play
- 28 - Malcolm III Canmore - appears in Macbeth...through his wife, St. Margaret, the Roman ritual was intro-
duced to Scotland...defeated and slain by Morel of Bamborough near the Alne, which was thereafter
called "Malcolm's Cross"

CHART XXXV

- 39 - Peppin of Heristal - became major domus over all the Franks by his victory over the major domus of Neustria...thereafter he styled himself "Dux et Princeps Francorum"
- 32 - Berengar I - following his repulsion of the Saracens in southern Italy, he was crowned Emperor of Rome...Hodolph II (XXXIII-31) of Burgundy contested with him for the throne...forced Berengar to flee to Verona where he was assassinated
- 30 - Berengerius II - regained his grandfather's throne in 950, though had to acknowledge Otto I (XXXIV-33) as his liege lord...later he lost his territories to Otto...following this he barricaded himself in the fortress of St.Leo and defended himself bravely until famine forced him to give up. He was held prisoner at Bamberg and died there.

CHART XXXVIII

- 37 - Louis II, The German - he is traditionally regarded as the founder of the German Kingdom
- 30 - Conrad II The Salic - the founder of the Franconian or Salian dynasty...made several invasions of Italy but with mixed results...made himself master of Burgundy (Aries)...recovered Lusatia from the Poles
- 29 - Henry III The Black - also surnamed The Old and The Pious...curbed power of great feudatories by keeping them for himself or his own underlings when they became vacant...forced Duke of Bohemia and King of Hungary to become imperial fiefs...during an expedition to Rome deposed three Popes who were fighting for recognition and appointed Clement II in their place...Clement crowned him Holy Roman Emperor on Christmas Day, 1046...was a patron of arts...founded numerous schools...built the cathedrals of Worms, Mainz and Spiers
- 28 - Henry IV - crowned emperor by Clement III whom he had elevated to the Papacy in opposition to Gregory VII...principal occurrence was his continual struggle with Pope Gregory who excommunicated Henry for sacrilege and oppression several times...Henry in turn declared Gregory's deposition...a fierce struggle ensued in which Henry's sons allied with the Pope and for a time imprisoned their father...was finally forced to abdicate
- 25 - Frederick III Barbarossa (#I as German Emperor)...most noted of the Hohenstaufen line of Holy Roman Emperors...reign occupied by constant wars with the German nobility and by six expeditions to Italy to restore the imperial authority...by the Peace of Constance (1183) he renounced his rights in Italy...surname means "Hedgebeard"...joined 3d Crusade but drowned in Asia Minor under mysterious conditions...churchmen, nobles and peasants alike regarded him as "the perfect knight"

CHART XXXIX

- 36 - Charles II the Bald...usurped the throne from his brother Louis, the rightful heir...reigned during time of the Norman invasions
- 35 - Louis II Le Bègue (The Stammerer)...was forced to give up Provence to Boson, who made it into a kingdom
- 34 - Charles III Le Sot (The Simple) - posthumous son of Louis...ceded Normandy to Helle...his vassals rebelled, proclaimed Robert (VII-32) King of France, and imprisoned him in the fortress of Peronne...was freed just a short while before his death
- 33 - Louis IV D'Outre-Mer...surname means "From-Over-the-Sea" as his mother, the sister of Athelstan, had taken him into exile in England when his father died...during his reign the country was, for all practical purposes, governed by Hugh the Great (VII-31)

CHART XL

- 31 - Geoffrey I Grisegonelle ("Grey Tunic")...had a wife, so the story goes, known as "The Demon Countess" ...one night she was seized as she left mass...she slipped out of her cloak, flew out the window, and was never seen again...St.Bernard, in reference to this story, maid of the Plantagenets - who descend from Geoffrey - "From the Devil they came, to the Devil they will go"

CHART XLI

- 48 - Cerdic - a Saxon Ealdorman...founded a settlement at Hampshire...proclaimed himself King of the West Saxons...defeated the Britons at Charlford (519) but was in turn defeated at Budbury the following year...conquered Isle of Wight (530)...regarded as the ancestor of the English royal line...he, as did many kings to claim legitimacy, claimed a lineage going back to the Norse gods
- 46 - Casswlin - fought in the Battle of Barbury Hill (566)...defeated the Kentish Jutes...defeated three British kings (577) but six years later was defeated by the Britons...in 591 he was driven from the throne by a popular revolt
- 37 - Eberht - received the submission of Mercia and Northumberland (627) and became lord of all England
- 36 - Aethelwulf - beaten by the Danes at Charmouth but in turn slaughtered them 9 years later at Ockley in Surrey (851)
- 35 - Alfred the Great - called one of history's greatest men...said to have founded the navy and organized the militia, compiled a code of laws, brought in scholars and did some translations of the classics himself, built schools and monasteries, and forced the Danes to be baptised and to retreat to the Danelaw (north of Watling Street)...the subject of a historical play by J.Sheridan Knowles
- 34 - Edward the Elder - completed the conquest of the Danelaw...at his death he ruled - Wessex, Kent, and Sussex by inheritance; Mercia, Essex, and East Anglia by conquest; and Northumbria, Wales, Scotland and Strathclyde as overlord...husband of St. Alfgifu
- 33 - Edmund the Magnificent - subdued Cumbria (945) which he bestowed on Malcolm I of Scotland...killed by a robber named Liofa, who'd entered his dining hall unbidden...he came to the aid of the cup bearer who was trying to eject him and was stabbed to death
- 32 - Edgar the Peaceful - his surname comes from the fact that his rule was quite tranquil in contrast to those that had gone before...is said to have ceded Lothian (N. Bernicia) to Kenneth of Scotland
- 31 - Aethelred the Redelass - surname means "lacking counsel" or "the unready" - with John (V-22) one of the least highly regarded of English monarchs...instituted the payment of Danegeld (991) but ordered the general massacre of Danes in 1002...deposed in 1013 but restored a year later
- 30 - Edmund Ironside - surname came from the iron armor that he wore...famous for great physical strength and courage...had many victories over the Danes - but finally had to divide his kingdom with Canute, with a proviso that the surviving king inherited all...Edmund died first, probably by natural causes, though there has been suspicion of foul play...Canute then took possession of the whole kingdom
- 29 - Edward the Atheling - went into exile on the continent
- 28 - St. Margaret - instrumental in bringing the Roman rites to Scotland...helped found Abbey of Dunfermline as well as many other monasteries...feast day Nov 16

CHART XLII

Ancient Irish Tales, ed. by T.P.Cross and G.M.Slover (Holt 1936) gives the following lineage, based on the ancient stories, that is a little more complete than that shown in the charts; Angus Torbach, Eann Agnach, Eochtaot, Blathacht, Rigan, Rogan Ruad, Finnugain, Finnen, Finn, Eochaid Feidlich (E/Ireland ca 3 B.C.), Bres (or Nar or Lothian - triplets), Lugaid Sribn ñerg ("Of the Red Stripes" - foster son of CuChulinn - m. Dervorgil, dau. of Ruad, King of the Isles), Crimthann Niadair, Ferdach Findfechtach, Tuathal Techmar, Feidlim/Ferdiach Rechtmar, Conn Cead Cathach (E/Ireland from 177 - m. Ethna Taobhfaid, dau. of Brislinn Binn, N/Norway), Art Confer (r. 220-254), Cormac Ulfada, Cairbre Lifencher (r. 277 -), Fiachru Roptine, Muiredach Tireach - father of Eochaid Mugmedon (XLII-49)

- 57X- Tuathal Techmar "The Desired"...recalled from British exile...had to fight 133 battles before secure on throne...est. Province of Meath which became High King's province...est. the Boru (or Cow) tribute after his 2 daughters were shamed by the king of Leinster - a crushing tribute which lasted for 500 years and was the cause of many battles
- 56X- Feidlimid Rechtmar "The Lawgiver" - est. "Lex Talionis" (an "eye for an eye") which was finally ended by St. Patrick...died "on his pillow" - most unusual for a king of those times
- 55X- Conn of the Hundred Battles...after many battles had to divide Ireland in half with Mogh Nuadat, though he finally defeated Mogh...later assassinated at Tara by about 50 cutthroats disguised as women
- 54X- Art the Lonely (or The Lone One)...so called after his two brothers were slain by their uncle...another story is that his brother Connla sailed away to Mag Mell - the Eternal Lands - and was never seen again
- 53X- Cormac MacArt...the subject of a series of fictional romances by A.J.Offut...according to one of the old historians was "the greatest king that Ireland ever knew...in his reign no one needed to bolt the door...guard the flock...nor was any one...distressed for want of food or clothing"...brought Tara to its greatest glory...founded a university with 3 colleges...abdicated after he lost an eye as no one with a personal blemish was supposed to rule...three books attributed to him in retirement: Instructions of a King; Book of Aosull; Psaltair of Tara...said (with his father) to have been a Christian seven years before his death

CHART XLIII

- 30 - Olaf Skotkonung - name means "The Tax King"...also called "The Lap-King"...the first Christian ruler of Sweden

CHART XLVI

- 27 - Hugh Magnus - leader of 1st Crusade...not to be confused with Hugh the Great (VII-31)

CHART XLVII

- 27 - St. Leopold III - surnamed "The Good"...according to "The Dictionary of Saints" he married Agnes, a widow and Imperial princess, and had 18 children...three of his monastic foundations (Mariazell, Klosterneuburg, Heiligenkreuz) still stand...feast day Nov 15

CHART XLVIII

- 30 - St. Stephen (Istvan in Magyar)...the Patron Saint of Hungary...feast day Sep 2...established the diocesan organization of Hungary...his religious and political policies welded the Magyars into a unity but his last years were clouded by intrigues at his court for the succession...His crown a recent political issue

CHART L

- 33 - St. Pietro Orseolo - at 20 was an admiral of the Venetian fleet...appointed Doge following the murder of Peter (Pietro) Orseolo IV and guided Venice through a grave political crisis...disappeared two years later, but eventually found at the Abbey of Cuxa (between Spain and France) where he continued to live in complete solitude until his death

CHART LII

- 29 - Iziaslav - had to flee his throne several times because of popular uprisings
- 28 - Sviatopolk - seized throne in 1093 - faced repeated attacks from Polovetsians and allied tribes of Turkish nomads
