The Diaries of Dorthea Sophia Rector Spring Part 1

Diaries are special. This is even more true when they span a long period of time. Many individuals have written diaries for short periods of time, and then seem to either lose interest or lack the time to continue. Each of these personally written stories allows the reader to visualize the kind of life the person experienced, and the effects of geography, wars, weather, and other people's behavior on the author. Like a photograph, a diary snaps a picture of the moment and lets it live forever.

Collection 217, the Dora Spring Collection, located in the Grand Rapids Public Library Archives, is a very special and wonderful resource for Family Historians. It consists of diaries spanning the years 1867 through 1928. The diarist rarely missed a day and described life as it was lived. If your ancestor lived in or around Benton, Yates County, New York before 1879, or in the Cannon Township - Rockford area of Kent County, Michigan, from 1879 - 1928, you have an unparalleled view of life as it was by reading the diaries of Dorthea Sophia Rector Spring.

Dorothea Sophia Rector was born 22 November 1852 in Yates County, New York. Her parents were Jeremiah Rector and Artemisa Shaw Rector. In 1879, she married Albert Spring and moved to Michigan. In 1867, when she was 14, she began writing in a diary. She continued writing for 62 years.

Each of the diaries covers one year. They are about three to four inches in width and five to six inches in height, and three-fourths to one inch thick. In general, there is about a one inch space for each day of the year for the writer to use. Some days have only a line or two, while other entries are longer and cover more than one day's allotted space.

Within the collection, there are also some photographs of family members, and 46 letters. There are twelve letters dated during 1874 and 1875 between Dora and her brother Miner in Michigan and several friends and other family members in Yates County, New York.

The majority of the letters are to or from Albert Spring. Dora calls him "Spring," and these letters illustrate how their relationship grows. In the letters between July and October 1878, they cement their commitment to one another.

The collection also includes a number of items of ephemera. Scraps of cloth, invoices, bills, lists of day-to-day needs, membership cards for various organizations, obituaries, etc. help researchers to gain a more clear and visual understanding of life at the end of the Nineteenth and the beginning of the Twentieth Centuries.

From the beginning, Dora lists the marriages and deaths of individuals living near her home. Until 1879, these vital statistics occur in New York. Following her marriage to Albert Spring, she continues this tradition after moving first to Cannon Township and then to the Village of Rockford in Kent County, Michigan.

Many of the earliest entries denote an individual by using only, "Mr. or Mrs." This is understandable as she is only a young teenager. Later, she is more specific and provides genealgists with a resource for vital statistics before the state of New York officially collected that information.

Like any source, the information must be evaluated, and used carefully. The next several pages list a transcription of the vital statistics of Yates County, New York as written by Dora Rector during the years from 1867 -1878. Subsequent issues of Michigana. will continue with those vital records Dora listed while living in Michigan.

In 1884, Dora and Albert Spring had a daughter they named Katherine. Dora writes, "Baby Kate born September 16 in the afternoon, half past 3."

No where in any of the entries for 1884 does Dora mention she is pregnant. Only the above note indicates she gave birth. Katherine is the only child they will have.

No other vital records are mentioned in the back of the diaries for 1884 or 1885. Apparently, Kate took up much more of Dora's time. Rockwell Letters, Ontintued from Page 148

We got our pay this morning, fifty-Six dollars. I will send forty in this letter and it may reach you in safety. We may go into a fight soon and I dont feel safe to carry it in my pocket. I may be wounded and fall into the hands of the enimy and loose it. You do with it as you see fit but I think I would keep it till after the sale of that land and see how that comes out.

I shall rite again soon, so good by for this time from your af-fectionate Husband in the service of our Country to his dear Family in Michigan

I will send twenty Dollars this time for I am afraid it will be lost and more tomorrow. Captain Dutcher is going to Washington in a, few days but I think is as safe to send it by letter. I will try 20 in this andmaybe I will send the rest by express. Write often and I will do the best I can. Give my love to all
