Quaker Obituaries

I thought I'd run some more of the wonderfully descriptive obituaries that ran a long time ago in "The Friend" and "Friends' Review". These give a glimpse into a part of the lives of our ancestors.

Died Second Month 19, 1922, near Springille, Iowa, **Thomas E. Stanley**, in his seventy-fifth year; a member and Elder of Springville Monthly Meeting.

Stanley - On Third Month 23, 1931, **William P. Stanley**, of Pasadena, California.

Stanley - In the New Rochelle Hospital, New Rochelle, N.Y., Eighth Month 21, 1932, **Helen M. Stanley**, wife of **Rupert H. Stanley**, aged forty-three years.

Stanley - In Los Angeles, Calif., on Eight Month, 11th, **James W. Stanley**, aged eighty-one years; for more than fifty-five years a member of Friends Monthly Meeting at Westfield, Indiana.

Died, in Dublin, Ind., on the 3d of 5th mo, 1865, **Daniel W. Stanley**, son of **Ira and Elizabeth Stanley**, in the 30th year of his age; a member of Milford Montly Meeting. In the early part of his illness he was impressed with the belief that he would not recover, but having left the preciousness of a Saviour's love, he could cheerfully resign himself to the will of his Heavenly Father, and through mercy his faith remained unclouded.

Died, on the 7th of the 5th month, 1865, **Mary D.**, wife of **John Stanley**, in the 52d year of her age; a member of Spring Creek Montly Meeting, Iowa. She expressed, during a short but painful illness, that she gave up all with joy and not with grief, and that she could see a place prepared for her; leaving the consoling evidence that her end was peace.

Died, on the 15th of the Sixth month, 1866, at the residence of her son-in-law **Joshua Shreeve**, at Ohio, **Mary Stanley**, in the 70th year of her age; a much esteemed member of Upper Springfield Monthly Meeting, Ohio. Her disease was of such a character that it prevented her from any conversation, yet it is believed her end was peace.

Died on the 13th of Third month, 1866, near Pleasantview, Iowa, **Anna G. Stanley**, wife of **Temple B. Stanley**, aged 58 years and 4 days. She suffered a long and very painful sickness, but her frineds have the consoling reflection, and humble trust that she is now with the dear Saviour. She said she was willing to die, and saw nothing in her (can't read).

Died, on the 2d of Fourth month, , 1866, **Asenath Stanley**, daughter of **Isaac and Elizabeth Stanley**, in the 29th year of her age; a member of Upper Sprinfield Monthly Meeting, Ohio. She bore a painful illness with patience and resignation, and was impressed with a sense of the near

approach of her close for several weeks previous thereto, and frequently expressed her wish to depart, though in submission to the Divine will therein, saying her heavenly prospects were bright, and saw nothing in her way.
["Friends' Review" 1866, Vol 19, page 681]

Died on the 10th of Fourth month, 1867, **Mary Stanley**, wife of **Amos Stanley**, aged 32 years and 25 days; a member of Damascus Monthly Meeting, Ohio. She was mercifully kept in calmness, submission and unfailing patience during the whole of her protracted illness, and her expressions were such to evince that her peace was made.
["Friends' Review" 1867, Vol 20 page 633]

Died on the 17th of Fifth month, 1867, **Rebecca**, wife of **Levi A. Stanley**, and daughter of **Benjamin** and **Nancy Hinshaw**, in the 31st year of her age; a member of South River Monthly Meeting, Iowa. She received the cup of affliction sweetly from her Heavenly Father's hand, saying, "If it be his will to restore me to health, I would serve him more fervently; nevertheless, not my will, O Lord, but thine be done. And when in answer to her fervent prayers she was granted a foretaste of the promised glory, she said, "It is all through the mercy of my dear Redeemer, and to Him be all the praise." As her ransomed spirit passed into the rest prepared for the redeemed of the Lord, her last words were, "All is perfect peace and happiness and eternal rest."

Stanley - On the 3d of Tenth month, 1868, at his residence in Damascus, Ohio, **Benjamin Stanley** in the 78th year of his age. This dear Friend was from his early manhood a faithful laborer in the Society of Friends. He bore a protracted and painful illness with Christian fortitude, expressing at different times "that he was thankful that his sufferings were no worse." A few days previous to his close, after returning thanks to our Heavenly Father for the favors and enjoyments of the day, he said he had an evidence that there was a home prepared for him in heaven; that should he live, it would be to magnify and adore the great name of the Lord. At another time, admonishing those about him to faithfulness in handing forth a word to others as ability was afforded, he said that he had felt that he had sustained a loss by thus withholding, - that we do not know the good we may thus do. His close was peaceful, and his family and friends have the consoling evidence that their loss is his eternal gain.

Stanley - On the 21st of Third month, 1868, **Lewis**, son of **Joel** and **Clotilda Stanley**, in the 24th year of his age; a member of Damascus Monthly Meeting, Ohio. The tender and affectionate traits of his character and dutiful attention to all his relatives were exemplary. Above all, his love was strong for his dear Saviour, by faith in whose Name he was

enabled to lay hold upon and appropriate himself his "exceeding great and precious promises."

Stanley - At Plainfield, Ind., on the 4th of first month, 1869, **Matthew Stanley**, aged 69 years a member and esteemed elder of Plainfield Monthly Meeting. The Christian virtues were remarkable blended in the character of this dear Friend. His gifts being recognized by the Church, they were made in many ways contributive to the service of Truth, the more so, because, in meekness and quietness of spirit, he maintained the simplicity of a child. Thus was he qualified to approach and speak kindly to the trembling lambs who longed to find a shelter in the arms of the Good Shepherd - to secure, through the Saviour's mercy the pardon of sin. The Christian principles and doctrines of our early Friends were very dear to him and his earnest belief in them was often expressed during his painful illness. A glorious prospect was given him of peace and joy beyond the tomb. The day before his departure he said, "I would not give my bright prospects for a long life of pleasure here." Again: "It is a solemn thing to be born into the world and it is a solemn thing to die." Some one alluded to his exemplary and useful life; but he humbly replied that it was not through any works of righteousness that he had done, but of the Lord's free mercy that he was accepted.

Stanley - On the 24th of Eight month, in his 75th year, **Samuel Stanley**; a member and valued elder of Grove Monthly Meeting, Ind.

Stanley - At his residence near Xenia, Miami Co., Ind., on the 15th of Eighth month, 1870, **Isaac Stanley**, in his 87th year; a member and Elder of Pipe Creek Monthly Meeting. For some months previous he was confined to his room from old age, waiting for the summons which he believed to be near. No doubt is entertained that he has entered into the rest prepared by his Lord.

Stanley - At Spiceland, Ind., on the 9th day of 3d month, 1870, in the 62d year of her age, **Mahala**, wife of **Aaron Stanley**; a member of Spiceland Mo. Meeting; resigned to her Heavenly Father's will, and feeling her Saviour to be near.

Descendants of Elijah Stanley

1. **Elijah Stanley**, son of **James and Catherine (Hutchins)** Stanley was born October 7, 1750 in Virginia. He was married to **Hannah Mills** on 8-18-1768 at the New Garden Monthly Meeting in Guilford county, North Carolina. Hannah was the daughter of of **John Mills and Sarah Beals**. She was born circa 12-4-1737 in Guilford county, North Carolina. She died 3-4-1824. Sarah Beals was a noted minister in the New Garden Meeting, in North Carolina. Elijah and Hannah and their families both belonged to this parish before they began moving around. The Quaker records trace their movements from the New Garden meeting to Mt. Pleasant Monthly Meeting in Grayson county, Virginia. From there they joined the Fairfield Monthly Meeting meeting in Highland county, Ohio. Then they went to the Center Monthly Meeting in Clinton county, Ohio. Hannah died here, and is buried in Clinton county. *[Note: I am using the dates from the Quaker books as they are written month-day-year. They began their year on a different month than others around the country at that point, so I didn't want to put down the wrong month.]*

Children of Elijah and Hannah (Mills) Stanley:

1.A. **James Crew Stanley** was born 7-8-1769 in Guilford county, North Carolina. He was married possibly first to an **Edith** (last name unknown) who died 6-22-1796, and second possibly to an **Agnes or Agatha Stanley**. He went to Wayne county, Indiana.

(+) 1.B. **Jesse Stanley** was born 1-19-1771. He died 5-8-1843, and is buried in the Old Blue River cemetery.

1.C. **Sarah Stanley** was born 9-14-1772. She was married to **William Holloway** on 7-19-1790. The South River monthly meeting in Virginia reported her marriage, and mentioned she was of Bedford county, Virginia.

(+) 1.D. **Joseph Stanley** was born was born 12-4-1774. He died 8-24-1840.

(+) 1.E. **John Stanley** was born 3-16-1777, in Stokes county, North Carolina.

1.F. **Martha Stanley** was born 3-16-1777. She may have married a **Mr. Gallimore**.

1.G. **Mary Stanley** was born circa 1779 in Stokes county, North Carolina. She married **John Unthank** in 1803.

1.H. **Catherine Stanley** was born 8-20-1782.

1.I. **Elijah Stanley** was born 5-14-1784. He died 5-31-1784.

(+) 1.J. **Hannah Stanley** was born 5-13-1785. She died 7-18-1840.

*** SECOND GENERATION ***

1.B. **Jesse Stanley** was born 1-19-1771. He died 5-8-1843, and is buried in the Old Blue River cemetery. He was married to **Huldah Coffin** on around November 28, 1793 in Guilford county, North Carolina. I have this date for them, but haven't determined if this is the license date or the marriage date. They were both condemned by the church for marrying out of unity (with out permisison), Jesse on 9-1-1794 and Huldah on 10-6-1794. Huldah was born 1-15-1776, and she died 1-20-1858, and is also buried in the Old Blue River cemetery. Huldah was the daughter of **Barnabas and Phebe (Marshall)**

Coffin. Jesse and Huldah took their family to Indiana around the year 1814. The Deep River Monthly River in North Carolina records certificates for the family on 10-3-1814 to Lick Creek Monthly Meeting, in Indiana territory. They moved to Indiana, and their certificate was recorded at Lick Creek, but the area they moved to was closer to the Blue River Monthly, Meeting, so they became members there. In 1828, the meeting recorded that the family had basically been disowned for joining the Hicksite Friends. The Hicksite meeting also records them as being disowned for joining the Separatist. I haven't discovered which church they belonged to after this point.

1.B.5. **Huldah Stanley** was born 10-7-1806 in Guilford county, North Carolina. She married a **Mr. Reyman**. Huldah died 4-18-1881, and is buried in the old Blue River Cemetery in Washington county, Indiana.

(+) 1.B.6. **Barnabas C. Stanley** was born 8-24-1809 in Guilford county, North Carolina. He died January 16, 1897. He is buried in the Highland Creek cemetery.

1.B.7. **Mary Stanley** was born 3-22-1801 in Guilford county, Indiana.

(+) 1.B.8. **Abel C. Stanley** was born 7-17-1812 in Guilford county, North Carolina. He died October 19, 1886. He is buried in old Blue River cemetery.

(+) 1.B.9. **Rhoda Coffin Stanley** was born February 16, 1817 in Washington county, Indiana.

1.D. **Joseph Stanley** was born 12-4-1774, and he died 8-24-1840. He was married to **Phebe Rich** on October 6, 1803 in Guilford county, North Carolina. Phebe was born 9-19-1769, and she died 3-17-1849 in Guilford county, Indiana. She was the daughter of **Samuel and Dinah Rich**.

Children of Joseph and Phebe (Rich) Stanley:

(+) 1.D.1. **William Stanley** was born 2-20-1793.

(+) 1.D.2. **Mary Stanley** was born 8-23-1804.

1.D.3. **Phebe Stanley** was born 1-15-1807. She married a **Mr. Iddings**.

1.D.4. **Rebecah Stanley** was born 10-29-1808.

1.D.5. **Samuel Stanley** was born 2-1-1811.

1.E. **John Stanley** was born 3-16-1777 in Stokes county, North Carolina. He married **Elizabeth Dicks**, daughter of **Joshua and Elizabeth (Baldwin) Dicks** on 11-18-1807. Elizabeth was born 12-5-1786 in Stokes county, North Carolina. She died 10-9-1852, and is buried in the Duck Creek meeting in Henry county, Indiana. John and Elizabeth moved quite a few times, going first to Fairfield Monthly Meeting in Highland county, Ohio, then to Whitewater Monthly Meeting in Wayne county, Indiana. The next move was to Cherry Grove Monthly Meeting in Randolph county, Indiana. They then moved to the Honey Creek Monthly Meeting in Vigo county, Indiana. From there they joined the Bloomfield Montly Meeting in

Park county, Indiana. John and Elizabeth finally came to the Duck Creek Montly Meeting in Henry county, Indiana where they lived out the remainder of their days.

(+) 1.E.1. **Mahala Stanley** was born 1-6-1809 in Stokes county, North Carolina. She died 1-9-1870 in Spiceland township, Henry county, Indiana, and is buried in Circle Grove cemetery.

John was the son of **Mark and Elizabeth (Lamb) Pearson** and he was born 9-29-1780 in North Carolina. He died 11-23-1859 in Greene county, Ohio. Hannah and John lived in Grayson county, Virginia, and Clinton and Greene counties Ohio.

1.B.6. **Barnabas C. Stanley** was born 8-24-1809 in Guilford county, North Carolina. He died January 16, 1897. He is buried in Highland Creek cemetery. He married **Martha Hitchcock** on 12-4-1831 in Washington county Indiana.

Trial of Burke

For the Killing of Little

[Continued from last issue]

Synopsis of the Evidence of the Principal Witnesses

A.J. Blake

I was at the depot on the night of the affray. I saw some one toss the coat into Burk's arms. We, Burk and Tetherington left the depot - coming up street. Little passed us and said "Boys don't hurt me." We stood on corner of Main and Hamilton streets. Burk said, "Pass on Mr. Little." Little said "I will make this damned hot for you." Nothing was said to this. Little came up to Skehan's and stopped and got a rock. We were about as far as across the street behind Little. Little then walked on rapidly and got out of our sight. We went to corner U.S. building and I went down street.

Dr. R.C. Reid

Saw Little when he was hurt. Little came in bar room much excited: had a stone in his hand. I said "Well, John." He paid no attention. I made the remark to get his attention, "Let us kill him." He replied "There will be hell to pay here directly," or something to that effect. The next think Lew Tetherington stopped in and was trying to get the stone away from him. Little remarked, "Keep away," and shoved him back with his hand. Lew jumped up and both took off their coats and Lew mad the remark, "John do you want to fight me?" About that time a party came in from behind and used a billy. It was a party I did not know. He struck Little. Tethering[sic] did no striking. The man that struck Little was at his back. He struck four or five times, very rapidly. I thought they were pretty hard blows. Could hear them around the room. Saw no other licks struck. Nothing said about a coat as I recollect. The man that struck Little went out pretty soon. Little's face was bleeding. He remarked, "What did you want to fight me for?"

Crossed-examined. This was about midnight. McAllister was not in the room that evening whilst I was there, if he had been I would have seen him. When Little shoved Tetherington his foot caught in the apron of the stove and he fell. Little made no effort to get at Lew. When Lew fell the first thing I saw was the stranger when he struck Little.

Jacob Etchison

Am not related to Little. First saw little after he was hurt. He was at the hotel. After he went to his room he sent me down to get half a pint of whiskey. He took one or two sups of it, not over a spoonful. Wm. Jackson brought up some more whiskey but I did not see him drink any. Stanley and myself drank up the half a pint, McAllister drank some of the whiskey Jackson brought up.

Johile Stanley

Little married my sister. I was with him the night he was hurt. We had been in Indianapolis. I was in Trueblood's saloon when Little was playing pool - went in between 10 and 11 o'clock. Got a drink at Henry Burk and Little paid for it. After Little played pool awhile and took several drinks we went to Billy Ryan's, where he and Brunt engaged in shooting. He was drunk and could not steady himself. He took two coats into Ryan's. After he got through shooting, he attempted to put on the coat and it was too small. He pulled it off and threw it back on a bench where Billy Ryan sat. I handed him his own coat and we went to the depot to take the train. Brick, Tetherington and Burk came down there - came in a kind of a hurry. Brick came up and said to Little you have stole my coat. John said "The devil, I am above stealing." Brick rubbed his breast and said it was getting cold and said "It sets hard with me to go without a coat tonight." He was in his shirt sleeves. I was carrying a coat - and said it was not the one. He looked at it and said "No, this is not the one." I told them of the one John had left at Ryan's, which he carried from Trueblood's. They laughed it over and appeared satisfied. I thought the matter was settled. They went away but came back in twenty

minutes, and Burk wanted to know where the coat was I had. I said "If you claim this coat you can have it," and handed it to him. He put it on. John said "Hold on boys; you are not going to take that coat. We bought it today and paid the money for it." He started after the boys, as they were leaving. I waited awhile and finding we would be left I went up town to find John and met McGraw and Fesaler bringing the doctor. I held the lamp while Dr. dressed Little's head. We sat in the bar-room until 4 or 5 o'clock before Little went to bed. I got half pint of whiskey and we all drank - McGraw, John, man at hotel, Tetherington and myself. In twenty minutes we all drank again. At 8 or 9 o'clock next morning Trueblood carried up glass two-thirds full to Little. Can't say he drank it all. The next whiskey was brought in by Gus McAllister and I took some. Can't say John drank then. Gus drank 3 or 4 times in 20 minutes, and drank most of it himself. Little might have drank half pint in all.

Cross-examined. When I got to the hotel McGraw and the Clerk were leading Little to the Dr.'s office, and I went with them.

James McGraw

Saw Little at hotel on the night he was hurt. When he came in Dr. Reid, Gus McAllister, Wm. McNeery and I were eating sandwiches. Reid said, "Damn it, let's murder him." Don't know whether Little said anything until Reid made this remark. He then said, "Take care boys, there will be hell here directly." About that time Tetherington and Burk came into the room, and Jack Blake stood in the door. Burk walked to south door of room. Tetherington was in front of the stove. Little turned around and stepped up to Burk and took hold of him with his left hand, and said he wanted that coat. Tetherington stepped over to Little and said "John, give me that rock" Little either let go of the rock or Tetherington twisted it out of his hand and it fell on the floor. Little let go of Burk and pushed Tetherington across the room. His foot struck a hearth of the stove and he fell down. Tetherington got up and commenced to pull off his coat saying "John, damn you, I can whip you" Little took off his coat and threw it on the bench. I stepped in and said "boys, you must not fight here" Little did not attempt to fight Tetherington, but went to Burk. Little was between me and Burk, and the next I saw was Burk backing towards the door and striking Little. I thought Burk used a "billy" or club. Little advanced towards Burk with his head down. Can't say he was striking but seemed to want to get hold of Burk. Tetherington did not interfere any time. Burk had one or both feet on the pavement when he struck Little the last blow. I told Burk not to strike him again. I am night watchman.

Cross-examined. Could not swear to stone Burk kept backing out until he struck the last blow. In the direction of the door. Little had his head down. The "billy" looked like a policeman..."

William McNeery

I was in hotel on the evening of the difficulty. Little came in and the conversation stated by Dr. Reid took place. Then Burk and Tetherington came in. Little turned towards Burk

and caught him by the coat collar, and told him to give up that coat. Little drew up a rock in his hand as if he was going to strike Burk. Tetherington grabbed Little's arm and he dropped the rock. Little then shoved him back over the stove. Then they pulled off their coats...stepped in between them and told them they must not fight. Little turned around and started towards Burk, and struck at him. Burk knocked his blow off and pulled the club out of his pocket and commenced to strike him over the head - going towards the door and Little following him. Burk went out the door. Little did not take a seat when he came in. Neither Burk nor Little said anything during the struggle.

Stanley's in History

Benjamin F. Stanley

Benjamin F. Stanley, who conducts a good farm in the town of Harrison, was born in York County, Maine, December 5, 1830, son of Benjamin and Lydia E. (Thompson) Stanley. His father was a native of Sanford, Me., born July 26, 1799. In early manhood he worked for a time in Cambridge; but in 1832 he settled upon a farm in Harrison, where he followed agricultural pursuits until 1863, when he enlisted as a private in Company G, Twenty-ninth Maine Volunteers. He died June 29, 1864, while on his way home from New Orleans by water, and was buried at sea. His death was a loss to the town as a useful and esteemed citizen. His wife, Lydia E. Thompson, who was a native of Sanford, became the mother of five children, as follows: Benjamin F., the subject of this sketch; Harriet, born October 27, 1832, married I.P. Roberts, and resides in Milwaukee, Wis.; Cyrus K., born February 10, 1835, is now deceased; Lydia, born March 4, 1839, died February 28, 1855; and Martha L., who was born April 18, 1841, married J.F. Wight, and resides in Wellesley Hills, Mass. The mother died November 22, 1889.

Benjamin F. Stanley obtained his education in the common schools of Harrison, and at the age of eighteen found employment as a hotel clerk in Harmony, Me. In 1851 he went to Bangor, this State, where he was employed in the saw-mills upon the Penobscot River, remaining there until 1853, when he returned to Harrison,

and with his father, settled upon his present farm. They considerably improved the property before his father's death; and Mr. Stanley now owns one hundred acres of valuable land, which he devotes principally to the cultivation of hay and corn. He is an admirer and breeder of good stock, raising some fine specimens of Hereford and Durham cattle.

On September 21, 1851, Mr. Stanley was united in marriage to Elizabeth Graves, who was born in Athens, Me., daughter of Thomas Graves, her father being no longer living. Mr. and Mrs. Stanley have two children, namely: Fanny L., born December 19, 1852, resides with her parents; George F., born December 10, 1854, married a Miss Burke, of Rowley, Mass., and also at this date resides at home.

Mr. Stanley is widely known and equally esteemed by his fellow-townsmen, among whom he occupies a prominent position; and he is a leader in all matters relative to the general welfare of the community. Though not an aspirant for political honors, he takes a lively interest in public affairs, and supports the Republican party at the polls.

Henry C. Stanley

Henry C. Stanley, born August 27, 1838, in Edwards county, Illinois, was the son of William and Maria (Gum) Stanley, pioneers of Edwards county. William Stanley was born in Washington county, Ohio, removed at an early age to Edwards county, where he held the office of justice of the peace for twenty years, and where he died, February, 1892, being at the time of his death in his seventy-seventh year. His wife was native of Wabash county, Illinois, lived for a time in Ohio, and died about five years ago in the same county as did her husband, and at about the same age.

Mr. Stanley grew to manhood in the county of his nativity, where he attended school held in a primitive log house, one of his schoolmates being Elmina Gould, to whom, August 30, 1859, he was married. Mrs. Stanley's father was Philander Gould, born in West Virginia, but reared in New York. At the age of nineteen he removed to Edwards county, where he spent the remainder of his life, dying in his seventy-fourth year, in 1890. Mrs. Stanley's mother, Sarah Knowlton in single life, was born in Amherst, Massachusetts, in 1816, raised a family of ten children, to whom she was ever a faithful and devoted mother, and died in 1876. Both she and her husband were ambitious, energetic and relentless workers throughout their lives.

Soon after their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Stanley migrated to Clay county, Illinois, and in 1877 to Murray county, Minnesota, where they continued to make their home until coming to Lincoln county, Washington, in 1892. Arriving here they at once settled on their present farm, seven miles north and two miles east of Mondovi, which at that time was unimproved railroad land. With the scanty means at his command, Mr. Stanley at once began earnestly to improve his land, and as times permitted added to his original holdings until he now has four hundred acres, for the most part agricultural land, adorned with a good seven-

room house, commodious barn, outbuildings, etc., all of which represent the work of his own hands. Besides his home, he has a quarter section of land near Fruitland, Stevens county.

Nine children, six of whom are living, have been born to Mr. and Mrs. Stanley. The names of those living are: Ira P. and William T., of Stevens county; and Edson G., Elmer C., Florrie E Reynolds, and Rollo C., all of Lincoln county.

Both the parents are devoted members of the United Brethren church and are actively interested in educational matters.

Mr. Stanley served in the Civil war, enlisting in Company F, One Hundred and Forty-third Illinois Regular Infantry, in April, 1864, and was given an honorable discharge in the fall of the same year, his service having been chiefly in the states of Tennessee and Arkansas. Mr. Stanley cast his first vote for Abraham Lincoln, in 1860, and has since been an unswerving Republican.

Zachariah J. Stanley

Zachariah J. Stanley was born in Harrison township, Union county, Indiana, on July 3, 1819, a son of Zachariah and Mary (Bedwell) Stanley, who were natives of Guilford county, North Carolina, where they were married. In 1812 they made their home as pioneer settlers of Harrison township, and passed long and useful lives there as successful farmers and rearing to maturity thirteen children. They were birthright Friends, Joseph Stanley (father of Zachariah and son of Thomas Stanley, the emigrant to North Carolina in 1700) being a minister of that sect. The children were named respectively: Pleasant, James, Jonathan, Sarah, Tempy, Jehu, Synthia, Eliza, Mary, Zachariah J., Elizabeth, Joseph and Esther.

Z.J. Stanley is one of the leading men of this county, and his landed estate includes hundreds of broad acres. He has ever been an agriculturist, progressive and thoughtful, and success has come to him in a large degree as the result of his well-directed efforts. His home has always been in the near vicinity of his birthplace and he is now hale and hearty at more than eighty years. In 1874 he married Martha Williams, daughter of Benjamin and Margaret Williams, a native of Wayne county. Their children were William H. and Mary M. (Mrs. Isham Esteb). The character of Mr. Stanley has been well summed up by an able writer in these words: "Though a Democrat in politics he has never taken an active part in political campaigns and has never aspired to any office or political honor, but on the contrary has avoided public notice or notoriety, this being characteristic of the Stanley family. He is public-spirited and all improvements find in him a strong advocate and liberal supporter. It has long been known to his intimate friends that he is ever ready to give of his bountiful wealth to the establishment of any public institution in

this vicinity when the security of such is guaranteed. He is a man of warm, friendly feeling, and when once a friend to any person he is ready, even at personal sacrifice, to confer a favor or a continuation of favors. He possess excellent judgment and his opinions carry great weight. Through good management and skillful financiering and economy, he has become one of the wealthiest individuals of Union county. He is a strong friend, a kind neighbor and an upright citizen. He has long been a member of the Masonic fraternity and stands high in the regards of his brethren.

Mrs. Z.H. Stanley

The Woman's Christian Temperance Union, of Union county, Indiana, is in a very healthy condition, and to no one is its progressive activity more due than to the Christian lady whose name heads this reading. She has been its president since its organization in 1891, and it is eminently proper that a brief sketch of her active and useful life should accompany this notice.

She is of English and German ancestry. Her paternal great-grandfather was William Tipton, who was one of Lord Culpeper's British company of soldiers who settled in Virginia at the close of the Revolution. He and his decendants have been historic characters in Virginia, Tennessee and Indiana. A brother of William, John Tipton, settled in this state and Tipton county bears his name. Jacob, another brother, made his home in the fertile Shenandoah valley. John Tipton, son of William, settled early near Knoxville, Tennessee, where he had large estates. His son, Colonel J.W. H. Tipton, was born on the east Tennessee homestead and was educated for military life. He was a colonel in the Mexican war, fought at Cerro Gordo, Vera Cruz, and was among the American forces that captured Santa Ana's carriage, treasury and wooden leg. On his return to civil life he married Katrina Freschour, and was an extensive stock raiser and dealer until his death. His wife was a daughter of George Freschour, a son of Hans Freschour, the emigrant, who was born near Wurtemberg, Germany, and came to this county about the latter part of the eighteenth century. He located in east Tennessee, where his decendants are numerous and valuable citizens. Mrs. Stanley was the fifth of the eleven children of her parents, and only two of this number have died.

Mrs. Elizabeth (Tipton) Stanley's early life was passed among the mountains of east Tennessee, and she received the benefits of a classical education at that noted Presbyterian institution, Maryville College, at Maryville, Blount county, Tennessee. After her college days were over she taught for some time near Asheville, North Carolina. She had a great desire to enter foreign missionary work and had been accepted by the Holston conference of the Southern Methodist Episcopal church and commis-

sioned for that field, but her parents were so grieved at the thought of her crossing the seas for so long an absence that she relinquished the plan. About this time, in 1881, while on a visit to her parents at the old home, she met a young, brilliant business man of the north who was engaged in lumbering operations near their residence. The result of this meeting was her marriage on November 15, 1883, her twenty-fourth birthday, to this gentleman, who was Zac H. Stanley, of Liberty, Indiana, a son of Joseph and Jane (Moon) Stanley, and grandson of Zachariah Stanley, the early emigrant to Indiana.

Mr. Stanley was born in Harrison township, November 23, 1855, educated at Liberty high school, and for eight years was a popular teacher of Union county. Mr. and Mrs. Stanley first made their home in Boston, Wayne county, Indiana, and both taught school for several years, after which Mr. Stanley became a dry-goods merchant at Liberty, which became the family home. In 1894 they purchased the Keeley Institute, that had been conducted at Liberty, removed it to Richmond, where they accomplished much good work until 1896, when they disposed of it to allow Mrs. Stanley time to devote herself to the education and care of their interesting family of children. Removing to Liberty, Mr. Stanley engaged in the sale of agricultural implements, in which he is conducting a large trade.

From childhood Mrs. Stanley has been an active worker in Sabbath-school and church circles. After making her home in the north she became convinced that the saloon stood as the great opposition to the progress of all that is good, but the law stood back of the saloon, and therefore woman's ballot was necessary to give strength to make new laws. For about ten years she has been engaged in this suffrage movement and in temperance reform activities. She has organized Woman's Christian Temperance unions in the northern and southern parts of the state, and not a union she organized has ever gone down. She has an energetic and magnetic personality and is a power for good. She organized the Willard Memorial Union of Franklin county in 1898. This has already nearly quadrupled its membership. On June 8, 1898, the temperance people of Franklin organized a Loyal Temperance Legion, naming it Ross Stanley Legion, in honor of a bright little child of Mrs. Stanley, who, by a mysterious dispensation of Providence, was called from earth to be a perpetual inspiration to his loving mother in her work of alleviating the sorrows of earth. This legion has already quadrupled its membership. Mrs. Stanley always represents her county union at state conventions, and represented this district at the national convention at Atlanta in 1891 and at the one held at Seattle in 1899. Her family consists of three children, - Grace Tipton, Earle Morris and Zac J. Stanley, besides the babe Ross, whose beautiful features and precocious intellect made so many friends in its brief residence here before it was called in so strange a manner to join the galaxy of cherubs in the upper world.
