One of six children, Mr. Steen was born Oct. 4, 1920, in Long Beach, Calif. He was the son of Elijah Daniel and Mary Elizabeth Hartman Steen. Mr. Steen attended local schools and graduated from Polytechnic High School in 1939. He worked in the shipyards in San Pedro, Calif. During World War II, he joined the U.S. Navy in 1942 and received his honorable discharge in 1945.

On Dec. 21, 1946, he married Barbara Durkin in Riverside, Calif. He worked for Pacific Bell Telephone for several years. Later he worked for the Los Angeles Unified School District before moving to Twin Falls and then to College Place in 1964.

Mr. Steen worked at various occupations at a number of businesses in the area including Rogers Cannery, Birds Eye and Price's IGA. He also worked for the College Place School District. When he retired he was working in the construction business.

Mr. Steen was a member of the College Place Village Seventh-day Adventist Church, past-member of the American Legion and Elks Lodge No. 868 of Long Beach, Calif.
