THIS little book is only intended to include a full account of those Stimmels known as the Yost Stimmel branch in Virginia, dating from 1740 down to and including the names of the fourth generation. It is impossible for me to carry it down any further; this is only a foundation for others who may feel an interest in taking up the thread and carrying it on down.

My object is to give a true and correct account of the older families mentioned herein.

There are a few persons of whom it is impossible for me to give a very full account, and quite a number of dates I failed to get, but in the main I think it will be found very near correct.

Wherever the Stimmels, Plums and Shoafs, are so connected by marriage I deemed it best to give their history all in full to the best of my ability. I am very thankful to all of my friends and correspondents for much valuable information received through their kindness.

I wish to refer the reader to the following letter which I take the privilege to insert here, as I consider it very valuable as regards another branch of the Stimmel Family; and especially do I appreciate it, coming as it does, from an aged and venerable gentleman, who has lived out his four score and six years:

WOODSBORO, MD., JAN. 29, 1902.

MR. JOHN STIMMEL, COLUMBUS, OHIO.

DEAR SIR: Your letter of recent date at hand. In regard to the Stimmel ancestry would say Yost Stimmel was my grandfather. He died in 1865.

Peter Stimmel, an uncle to my father, was drowned in the Monocacy River.

Daniel Stimmel went to California many years ago. I have never heard from him since.

Michael and Joseph Stimmel, cousins of my father, died many years ago. There are three Stimmels buried in Taneytown, Maryland. Their names are Jacob, Mary and Margaret; they have been dead many years.

John B. Stimmel was my father; he died in this county, Frederic, in 1883, aged 92 years.

My age at this writing is 86 years.

This is all I can learn concerning the Stimmels.

I was very glad to learn of you, and any further information you can give will be appreciated. We are all well at present. Hoping you are enjoying good health, I remain,

In answer to this letter I stated that the two Yost Stimmels must be first or second cousins. It will be seen by the above letter that John B. Stimmel died in 1883, age 92 years; taking 92 from 1883 would make John B's birth in 1791. Then suppose Yost, his father, to be 23 years old at John B's birth, would make Yost's birth 1768. Father Yost died 1865, age 97 years. Son, John B., died 1883, age 92 years. Grandson, Edward H., age 86 years, still living.

MICHAEL STOKER'S FAMILY.

No. 1. **Michael Stoker** was of German descent. They came from Alsace Loraine, between France and Germany. Michael lived in Frederic County, Maryland, from about 1735 to 1790. He was married three times. From these unions there were eleven children, namely: By first wife, Michael, Hannah Magdalene; by second wife, Salome, John and Barbara; by third wife, Margaretta, George, Catharine, Mary, Jacob and Charlotte. Hannah Magdalene was born 1760. She married Yost Stimmel. Charlotte married a Mr. Binckley; they came to Ohio many years ago and settled in Perry County, near Somerset. I received the above largely from Mrs. Binckley, when she was 70 years old. John and Jacob Stoker also came to Ohio and settled at Rushville, Perry County. The Stoker family, formerly of Circleville, are descendants of Jacob.

No. 11. Elizabeth, born 1820. She married John Rohr. From this union four children, namely: Catharine, Clarinda, Etta, one son died in infancy. John died 1900, age 82 years. Elizabeth, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 12. Mary Ann, born 1822. She married Eli M. Lisle. From this union, one son and one daughter, namely: Emily and Samuel. Eli M. died 1872, age 52 years. Mary Ann, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 13. John, born 1825. He married Nancy Elizabeth Hendren. From this union six sons and four daughters, namely: John Turner, Thomas Randall, William Smith, James Howard, Sarah Elizabeth, Mary Katharine, Ella Louise, May Hendren, George Lintner, Branson Cloud. They lived on the home farm until 1889, when they removed to Columbus, Ohio. John died —, age — years. Nancy E., his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 14. Mary H., born 1829. She married Jacob Linderman. From this union no offspring. Jacob died —, age — years. Mary M., his wife, died —, age — years.

PETER STIMMEL'S FAMILY.

No. 15. Peter Stimmel, born 1788, in Frederic County, Maryland. He married Elizabeth Landes, daughter of Samuel Landes, in Hamilton Township, Franklin County, Ohio. They lived one mile north of Lockbourne on the Landes Homestead during their life time. From this union five sons and three daughters, namely: Jacob, John, Samuel, Mary, Peter, Hannah, Michael and Lydia. Peter died 1844, aged 55 years. Elizabeth, his wife, died 1855, age 63 years.

To Whom Married:

No. 16. Jacob, born 1818. He married Sallie Lawrence. They lived about seventeen years in Franklin County, then about 1880 they removed to Illinois and settled on a farm, about twenty miles north of Peoria. From this union three sons and two daughters, namely: Jacob, Isaac, Frank, Missouri and Jennie. Jacob died —, age —. Sally, his wife, died —, age —.

No. 17. John, born 1819. He married Mary Miller, of Fairfield County, Ohio. They always lived on the home farm. From this union two sons and five daughters, namely: William, Edward, Elizabeth, Anna, Netta, Delphene and Nelly. John died 1871, age 52 years. Mary, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 18. Samuel, born 1821. He married Mary Plum, daughter of Michael Plum. They lived about fifteen years in Franklin County, Ohio, then they removed to Illinois, and settled on a farm about twenty miles north of Peoria. From this union three sons and three daughters, namely: Washington, Joseph, Carrie, Ollie; two died in infancy. Samuel died —, age — years. Mary, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 19. Mary, born 1822. She married Abram Hughes. They soon afterwards went to Narrowsburg, New York, where they remained about nine years, when they returned and settled in Groveport, where Abram died. From this union three sons and two daughters, namely: Edward M., Virginia H., Milton J., Charles S., and Mary S. It is proper to state here that Edward M. Hughes was in the service of the United States Navy and was Lieutenant Commander of the Gunboat Petrel at the battle of Manila under Commodore Dewey. He is now commander of the training ship Saratoga. Abram died 1868, age 49 years. Mary, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 20. Peter, born 1824. He married Catharine Hulvy. They lived a few years at Lockbourne, then removed to Shadesville, Ohio, where they remained until Peter died. From this union two sons and four daughters, namely: Henry F., Carrie A., Arabell H., Effie

G., Lydia G., and Earl H. Peter died 1874, aged 50 years. Catharine, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 21. Hannah, born 1825. She married Solomon Woodring. They always lived at Groveport, Ohio. From this union no offspring. Solomon died —, age — years. Hannah, his wife, died 1900, age 75 years.

No. 22. Michael, born 1828. He married Anna Graff, at Kenton, Ohio. They remained there while Michael followed his profession—M. D. From this union three sons and three daughters, namely: Effie, Marcus G., Williard P., Lulu, Eleonor M., and Charles H. Dr. Michael died 1884, age 56 years. Anna, his wife died —, age — years.

No. 23. Lydia, born 1829. She married Milton Hoffman. They lived in Franklin County, Ohio. From this union one daughter, Ida Augusta. Milton died —, age — years. Lydia, his wife, died 1855, aged 26 years.



DANIEL STIMMEL'S FAMILY.

No. 24. Daniel Stimmel, born 1791, in Frederic County, Maryland. He came to Ohio in 1812 and soon afterwards enlisted in the service of the government in the war of 1812-13 as a private. A large number of soldiers had their headquarters at Franklinton, now West Columbus. The late Colonel John Cochran of Pickaway County, was the recruiting officer at that time. Daniel served out his term of enlistment and received a grant of 160 acres of military land for his service.

Daniel married Rachael Shoaf about 1820 in Hamilton Township. From this union one daughter Juliann. The mother died 1823, aged 22 years, and Juliann died 1834, aged twelve years. Daniel's second wife was Mary, daughter of Benjamin Landes, but not related to Samuel and Rudy Landes. Daniel and Mary soon afterwards went to Madison County, Ohio, and remained there until the death of Mrs. Stimmel. Daniel then with the rest of the family returned to Franklin County, where he lived the remainder of his life. From this union five sons and two daughters, namely: Benjamin, Peter, Francis M., Daniel W., David, Eliza, and Mary Ann. Daniel died 1863, age 71 years. Mary, his wife, died 1840, age 35 years.

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 25. Benjamin, born 1827. He married Charlotte Smith. They lived a few years in Franklin County, then removed to Tazewell County, Illinois, where they raised a family of sons and daughters. Benjamin died 1893, age 66 years. Charlotte, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 26. Peter, born 1828. He married Mary Frettinger. From this union four sons and four daughters, namely: Daniel C., Rebecca J., Edward Y., Mary C., Anna B., Franklin, Isaac and Manda. Peter lived a few years in Franklin County, then removed to Wood County, Ohio. Peter died —, age — years. Mary, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 27. Francis M., born 1829. He married Mary J. Roberts of Galena, Delaware County, Ohio. From this union two sons, namely: Jay C., and Guy H. They always lived in Franklin County. Francis M. died —, age — years. Mary J., his wife died —, age — years.

No. 28. Daniel W., born 1832. He enlisted in the Union army and served about three years. During that time he was captured and was kept in prison at Shreveport, La., for a period of fourteen months before being exchanged. He married Addie Tripplett. From this

union one son and one daughter, namely: Rodney and Effie. Daniel, Jr., died —, age — years. Addie, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 29. Eliza, born 1834. She married Joseph Miller. They soon afterwards went to Bloomington, Illinois. From this union no offspring. Joseph died —, age — years. Eliza, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 30. David, born 1836. He enlisted in the Union army and during his service he was taken sick with the measles, and died in the hospital at Memphis, Tenn., in 1863, age 27 years.

No. 31. Mary Ann, born 1837. She married William Rathmell. They soon afterwards went to Kansas, where they remained several years. They now live in Normal, Illinois. From this union no offspring. William died —, age — years. Mary Ann, his wife, died —, age — years.

ELIZABETH STIMMEL'S FAMILY.

No. 32. Elizabeth Stimmel, born 1793 in Frederic County, Maryland. She married Peter Sain in 1816. They went to Rushville, Perry County, Ohio, and lived here until Mrs. Sain died. From this union one son, Daniel, and one daughter, Corilla. The mother died soon afterwards; the son and daughter then came to Franklin County, and lived among their relations. I have no knowledge as to where or when Peter Sain died.

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 33. Daniel S., born 1817. He went west and died in 1895.

No. 34. Corilla, married John Earhart. They soon afterwards went to Illinois and settled about twenty miles north of Peoria. They raised a family of sons and daughters. Mrs. Earhart with a granddaughter was killed at a railroad crossing in 1889. John died —, age — years. Corilla, his wife, died 1889, age 67 years.

JACOB STIMMEL'S FAMILY.

No. 35. Jacob Stimmel, born 1796, in Hampshire County, Virginia. He married Mary Landes, daughter of Samuel Landes, in Hamilton Township, Franklin County, Ohio. They settled on a farm on the west side of the Scioto river, about four miles south of Columbus, in Franklin Township, where they lived the remainder of their lives. From this union five sons and four daughters, namely: Seymour, Samuel, Jacob, John, Peter, Margaret, Mary, Sarah and Eliza. Jacob died 1853, age 57 years. Mary, his wife, died 1853, age 55 years.

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 36. Seymour, born 1818. He married Eliza White. From this union one daughter, Emma. The mother died soon afterward. Seymour died —, age — years. Eliza, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 37. Samuel, born 1820. He married Mary E. Holton. From this union four sons and six daughters, namely: Jacob, John, Frank, James, Anna, Elizabeth, Margaret, Sarah, Arabella and Lulu. Samuel died 1891, age 71 years. Mary E., his wife, died 1895, age 70 years.

No. 38. Margaret, born —. She died aged about 11 years.

No. 38. Jacob, born —. He died aged about ten years.

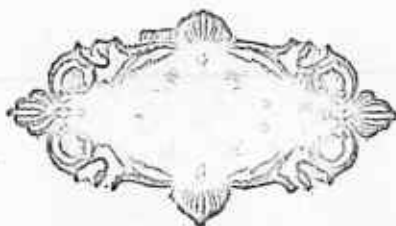
No. 40. John, born 1825. He married Charlotte Sloan. From this union one son, Edward, died aged three years. Charlotte died in 1871, aged 43 years. John's second wife was Mary Miller. From this union no offspring. John died 1890, age 65 years. Charlotte, his wife, died 1871, age 43 years. Mary, his wife, died 1892, age 43 years.

No. 41. Mary, born 1827. She married William Vause. From this union one son Willie, deceased, aged one year. William died 1852, age 33 years. Mary, his wife, died 1893, age 71 years.

No. 42. Peter, born 1833. He died when about sixteen years old, from a wound received by the accidental discharge of a gun.

No. 43. Sarah, born 1837. She married John Holton, M. D. From this union two sons and two daughters, namely: Edward, Harry, Florence and Emma. They lived at Mt. Sterling and also at London, O., where the doctor died. Dr. John died 1871, aged 42 years. Sarah, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 44. Eliza, born 1840. She married Washington T. Reese. From this union one son and one daughter, Bess and Ned. They always lived in Franklin County. Washington T, died —, age — years. Eliza, his wife, died —, age — years.



CATHARINE STIMMEL'S FAMILY.

No. 45. Catharine Stimmel, born 1798 in Hampshire County, Virginia. She married Benjamin Johnson, in Perry County, Ohio, at the home of her sister, Mrs. Peter Sain, December 28, 1817. They soon afterward went to Hocking County, and settled on a farm about fifteen miles south of Logan, where they lived the greater part of their lives. From this union five sons and four daughters, namely: Peter, Jacob, Isaac, William, John Y., Susan, Mary Ann, Elizabeth, and Hannah Magdalene. Benjamin died 1833, age 43 years. Catharine, his wife, died, 1886, age 88 years.

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 46. Susan, born 1818. She married Christopher Weymer. From this union eight sons and two daughters, namely: Joseph, Benjamin, Eli, Isaac, Jacob, George, Erastus, William, Mary Ann, and Elizabeth. Christopher died —, age — years. Susan, his wife, died 1876, age 58 years.

No. 47. Peter, born 1820. He married Julia Fate. From this union two sons and three daughters, namely: Jacob, David, Corilla, Mary Ann and Elizabeth. Peter died 1851, age 31 years. Julia, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 48. Mary Ann, born 1822. She married William Harden. From this union four sons and five daughters, namely: Henry, Ephriam, Jasper, Hiram, Lavina, Harriet, Catharine, Lucinda and Emily. William died —, age — years. Mary Ann, his wife, died 1893, age 71 years.

No. 49. Jacob, born 1824. He married Mary C. Kennard. From this union three sons and two daughters, namely: John, Benjamin, Abram, Lutitia and Rosa. Jacob died 1893, age 69 years. Mary C., his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 50. Isaac, born 1827. He married Mary Relick. From this union seven daughters, namely: Lavina, Martha, Catharine, Eliza, Harriet, Ann and Buna Vista. Isaac died —, age — years. Mary, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 45. Elizabeth, born 1829. She married David Johnson. From this union, one son, two daughters, namely: Isaac, Emily and Louisa. David died —, age — years. Elizabeth, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 46 William, born 1833. He married Martha Bond. From this union four sons and two daughters, namely: Hiram, William, John, Benjamin, Mattie and Eliza. William died 1901, age 68 years. Martha, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 47. Hannah, born 1836. She married Samuel Cook. From this union two daughters, namely: Catharine and Sarah. Samuel died —, age — years. Hannah, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 48. John Y., born 1838. He married Catharine Lauk. From this union one daughter, Nettie. John Y. was in the Union army and was killed at the battle at Murfreesborough, Tenn. John Y., died 1863, age 25 years. Catharine, his wife, died —, age — years.



JOHN PLUM'S FAMILY.

No. 49. The Plums are of German descent. I am not able to give their history any further back than my grandfather on my mother's side. His name was John Plum, who was born 1740, but where I am unable to say. Rachel Temple was born 1743 on the Atlantic Ocean, and her mother died a few days afterwards and was placed in a coffin, weighted down, and dropped in the ocean. John Plum and Rachel Temple were married about 1765. They lived in Hampshire County, Virginia, about ten miles west of Romney, on Patterson Creek. From this union four sons and four daughters, namely: Jonathan, Abram, Jacob, Henry, Nancy, Rachel, Susan and Catharine. They were all married in Virginia except Henry.

John Plum and all of his family came to Ohio in the fall of 1812, except Jonathan and Abram, they remained in Virginia the remainder of their lives. John Plum bought 200 acres of land in Hamilton Township, Franklin County, now known as the William Riley and Frank Stimmel farms, where they lived the remainder of their lives. They were buried on their farm in what is now known as the Riley graveyard. John died 1815, age 75 years. Rachel, his wife, died 1838, age 95 years.

JONATHAN PLUM'S FAMILY.

No. 50. Jonathan Plum, born about 1768. He married Elizabeth Crabill. From this union three sons and three daughters, namely: Isaac, Jonathan, Jr., John, Nancy, Susan, the youngest one, name forgotten. Jonathan died about 1815. His widow then, with six children, came to Ohio and settled in Clarke County, on what is known as the Buck Creek Valley. Some years later they removed to Logan County, Ohio, where the mother died. Jonathan, Sr., died 1815, age 47 years. Elizabeth, his wife, died —, age — years.

To Whom Married:

No. 51. Isaac, born —. He married Sarah Strange. From this union one son and six daughters, namely: James, Emma, Alice, Elenora, Lillian, Julia and Sallie. Isaac died —, age — years. Sarah, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 52. Jonathan, Jr., born —. He married Sallie McKennon. From this union six sons and four daughters, namely: John, William H., Isaac N., Winfield S., Milton, Lewis S., Nancy, Elizabeth, Eliza and Kittie. Jonathan, Jr., died —, age — years. Sallie, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 53. John, born —. He died aged about twenty years.

No. 54. Nancy, born —. She married a Mr. Dalrymple. They went to Illinois many years ago.

No. 55. Susan, born —. She married Joseph McLaughlin. From this union two sons and three daughters, namely: Isaac, John, Ellen, Elizabeth and Caroline.

The family of the one whose name is unknown now live in Iowa.



ABRAM PLUM'S FAMILY.

No. 56. Abram Plum, born about 1771 in Hampshire County, Virginia. He married, but whom I am unable to say. From this union there were at least three sons and four daughters, namely: John, Abram, Samuel, Elizabeth, Susan, Rachel and Mary. Abram died 1855, age 84 years. —, his wife, died 1854, age 78 years.

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 57. John, 1798. He married Nancy Singleton. They came to Ohio about 1840, and lived in Franklin County a few years, then removed to Iowa with all of his family except the oldest daughter. From this union four sons and seven daughters, namely: Singleton, John, Abram, Aaron, Margaret, Susan, Orelela, Francis, Martha, Caroline and Mary.

No. 58. The other two sons, Abram and Samuel, I am unable to say what became of them.

No. 59. The daughters all remained single but one. They all lived and died near Ridgeville, Mineral County, West Virginia.

NANCY PLUM'S FAMILY.

No. 60. Nancy Plum, born 1774. She married Rudy Landes, brother of Samuel Landes. They came to Ohio in 1812 and settled on a farm on the north line of Pickaway County. From this union four sons and seven daughters, namely: Joseph, Solomon, Felix, Rudy, Margaret, Catharine, Elizabeth, Mary, Susan, Eliza and Rachel. Rudy Landes and all of his family, (except Joseph) removed to Carroll County, Indiana, in the fall of 1833, and settled on a farm about ten miles southwest of Logansport, Indiana. Rudy died about 1837, age 65 years. Nancy, his wife, died about 1848, age 74 years.

No. 61. Joseph, the oldest son went from Ohio in 1832 to Tazewell County, Illinois, and located on a farm about six miles south of Peoria, where he raised a large and respectable family. Joseph died —, age — years. —, his wife, died, age — years.

No. 61. Solomon, died when a young man.

No. 62. Felix married and settled on his father's farm. He raised a large family of sons and daughters.

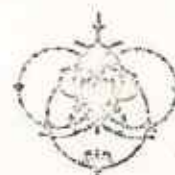
No. 63. Rudy, Jr., died aged about twenty years.

No. 64. Elizabeth married a man by the name of Nichols.

No. 65. One of the daughters married a Mr. Bell.

The other daughters were still single in 1845.

No. 66. Jacob Plum, born 1782. He married Hannah Magdalene Stimmel in Hampshire County, Virginia. They came to Ohio in the spring of 1812, and settled on a farm just north of Lockbourne. It will be proper to state here that her christian name Hannah was changed at her marriage and Mary substituted. From this union five sons and three daughters, namely: Michael, Henry, John, Jacob, James, Mary, Eliza and Rebecca. Jacob, Sr., died 1851, age 69 years. Mary M., his wife, died 1839, age 51 years. — *listed Hannah in 1850 Census - aged 50 - (N.H.)*

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 67. Michael, born 1806. He married Marie Swisher. From this union five sons and four daughters, namely: John, William, Augustus, James, Levi, Mary, Phebe, Ollie, and Carrie. Michael died —, age — years. Maria, his wife, died 1892, age 80 years.

No. 68. Henry, born 1803. He married Catharine Duvall. From this union, five sons and four daughters, namely: Seymour, William, John, Henry, Goodale, Eliza, Nancy, Catharine and Rebecca. Henry died 1867, age 59 years. Catharine, his wife, died 1871, age 51 years.

No. 69. John, born 1812. He married Jane Moore of Virginia. They had a small family when they removed to Tazewell County, Illinois, about the year 1844. John died —, age — years. Jane, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 70. Jacob, born 1815. He died 1837, age 22 years.

No. 71. Mary, born 1818. She married James Fleming. From this union two sons, namely: James and Robert. James, Sr., died a few years later. Mary then married Robert Fleming, a brother of James. They went to Iowa; from this union no offspring.

No. 72. Eliza, born 1820. She married John Windsor. From this union one son John, Jr. Mrs. Windsor died soon afterwards, and a few years later Mr. Windsor with his son went to Saginaw, Mich., where John Jr., grew up and married. He now resides in Toledo, Ohio. John, Sr., died —, age — years. Eliza, his wife, died 1844, age 24 years.

No. 73. James, born 1823. He married Phebe Scutt. They soon afterwards went to Tazewell County, Illinois, where they raised a family of sons and daughters. James died —, age — years. Phebe, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 74. Rebecca, born 1826. She married Samuel Rohr. They soon afterward went to Iowa, where they raised a family of sons and daughters. They then removed to Wisconsin where Mrs. Rohr died. Samuel died —, age — years. Rebecca, his wife, died 1901, age 75 years.



HENRY PLUM'S FAMILY.

No. 75. Henry Plum, born 1784, in Hampshire County, Virginia. He came to Ohio with his brother Jacob and family in 1812. Henry married Catherine Crabill, who also came from Virginia, at the same time. They settled in Pickaway County, about three miles north of South Bloomfield, where they lived until the year of 1825, when Henry was drowned in crossing the Scioto river after night. From this union two sons and three daughters, namely: Maria, David, Sarah Jane, Thomas, and Mary Elizabeth Ann. Henry's widow some years later married Samuel Phebus. They lived near Williamsport, in Pickaway County, where Henry's children all grew up and married. Henry died 1825, age 41 years. Catharine, his wife, died 1875, aged 91 years.

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 76. Maria, born 1814. She married John Hornbeck. From this union one son and one daughter, namely, Margaret and William. John died —, age — years. Maria, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 77 David, born 1816. He married Miss Funk. From this union two sons and six daughters, namely: Anna, Lydia, Samantha, Lucetta, William, Eliza, Emma,

No. 78. Sarah Jane, born 1819. She married Curtis Hornbeck. From this union four sons and three daughters, namely: Mary, Marquis, Lydia, George W., Jasper, Catharine and John Willis. Curtis died —, age — years. Sarah J., his wife, died 1901, aged 82 years.

No. 79. Thomas, born 1821. He married Catharine Battles, daughter of Dr. Battles, of Illinois. Thomas, was a physician. From this union one child, who died in infancy. His wife died soon afterwards. Thomas enlisted in the Union army and served four years and three months. He was sergeant of artillery in the 12th Ohio Infantry. Thomas died 1870, age 49 years. —, his wife, died —, age — years.

No. 80. Mary Elizabeth Ann, born 1823. She married Willis Cartmell Ferguson. From this union two sons and five daughters, namely: Henry C., Julia Francis, Emma, Ella May, Mary Willis, Bertha and Willis Channing. Mr. Ferguson enlisted in the Union Army as private in Company E, 114 O. V. I. He was promoted to 2nd Lieutenant in said Company. He was mortally wounded in one of the great battles before Vicksburg, Mississippi, May 22, 1863. He died two days later. Willis C., died 1863, age 41 years. Mary E., his wife, died 1901, age 78 years.

SUSAN PLUM'S FAMILY.

No. 81. Susan Plum, born 1786. She married a minister by the name of Kiner. He disappeared soon afterwards. Susan then came with her father's family to Ohio. Samuel Riley came from Virginia in the fall of 1812 with the Plum family. Susan and Samuel Riley were married in 1813 in Hamilton Township, Franklin County. From this union three children, one son William, two died in infancy. Samuel Riley and wife always lived on the John Plum farm. After the death of Mr. Plum he bought 100 acres of said farm; it is still in the Riley name. Samuel died 1859, age 75 years. Susan, his wife, died 1860, age 74 years.

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 82. William, born 1816. He married Isabelle Wright. From this union one son and one daughter, namely: Jennie and Samuel.

JOHN SHOAF FAMILY.

No. 83. John Shoaf, born about 1772. He married Rachael Plum in Hampshire County, Virginia. From this union five sons and five daughters, namely: Abram, Jacob, John, Henry, Joseph, Nancy, Rachel, Catharine, Elizabeth and Mary. They lived in Hardy County, Virginia, on the south branch of the Potomac river, until the fall of 1812. John Shoaf and family came with the Plums to Ohio, and settled in Hamilton Township. Mr. Shoaf returned to Virginia in the fall of 1815 on business. While there he took a severe cold, he returned home and died April, 1816. Mrs. Shoaf was left with ten children. John died 1816, age 44 years. Rachel, his wife, died 1823, age 47 years.

TO WHOM MARRIED:

No. 84. Abram, born 1796. He married Mary Ann Stimmel. From this union no offspring. Abram was thrown from a horse at the corner of Town and High streets in Columbus, O., in July, 1843, and died a few hours afterwards. Abram died in 1843, age 47 years. Mary A., his wife, died 1873, age 75 years.

No. 85. Jacob, born 1793. He married Elizabeth Cole. They went to Indiana.
