

A notable arrival of this year was John Harris Strong. He came to act as a land agent for Connecticut owners of big tracts of real estate in this vicinity. He settled in Euclid, but was so identified with the business interests of Cleveland, that he was considered a resident of the town. Some of his children settled on Euclid Avenue below E. 107th Street, within a few years of their arrival here.

John H. Strong was the son of Deacon Josiah and Mary Harris Strong, and was born in Middleton, Conn., in 1762. At 20 years of age he married Elisabeth Cary of Chatham, Conn., two years his junior. She was a sister of Mrs. Timothy Doan, a pioneer of 1802.

Mr. and Mrs. Strong brought a family of 8 children with them, the oldest of whom was a son 27 years old, and the youngest, also a son, four years of age.

Mr. Strong became a judge of the common pleas of this county in 1817, and served until 1823, the year he died, at 61 years of age. He was one of the incorporators of Cleveland's first bank in 1816.

Judge Strong owned much real estate in Euclid and East Cleveland. All the south side of Euclid Avenue, between E. 107th and E. 79th Street, at one time belonged to him. A part of this property is still in the possession of his grandchildren.

James Strong, oldest child of John H. Strong, was 35 years old when in 1819 he married Ann Eliza Baldwin, 16 years his junior. She died eight years later, leaving a young son and a daughter, James H. and Ann Olivia Strong.

Mr. Strong's second wife was the daughter of the famous pioneer, Lorenzo Carter, and the widow of Erastus Miles of Newburgh. By this marriage he had three daughters.

James Strong's life in Cleveland was mostly spent on Euclid Avenue, near East 107th Street. He was one of the early sheriffs of this county.

(2) Mrs. Walter Strong was the daughter of Samuel and Ruth Smith of East Cleveland. Her sister was the wife of Jarvis Clark, son of David the pioneer. The Walter Strongs, the Smiths and the Clarks removed in the 40s to Elkhart, Ind., where they became very important and valuable pioneers of that town.

Freeman. Esther died in 1826, and Theron in 1830, leaving six young children. Two others had died in infancy.

The children were: *Samuel, John, James, Josiah, Sarah, and Esther Freeman.*

(4) A Rodney Strong was living in 1856 on Pittsburg Street (Broadway). His occupation that of farmer.

(5) John Harris Strong and his wife, Mary Taylor Strong, had five children. Mary died, and Rodney Strong married a second time and had two more children.

(6) Mr. Josiah Strong's wife was the daughter of Deliverance and Mary Brown. He died in 1829, leaving two little sons. She died in 1835, six years later. The children were: *George Clark Strong, and Edwin Miles Strong.*

(7) Thomas Jefferson Strong married a daughter of Abram and Anna Freeman Bishop. They had two sons and five daughters. Thomas J. Strong, Jr., the second son, was killed at Stone River, Tenn., in the Civil War.

(8) John Cone, the first husband of Mary Ann Strong, died in 1835, leaving four children. She married 2nd, in 1836, Hiram Brooks. She had four children by this marriage. She died in 1863.

(9) Mrs. James M. Strong was the daughter of Edward and Patty Brush of Willoughby, O. Mr. and Mrs. Strong had nine children, two of whom died in infancy. The oldest, John Harris Strong, lived in Berea, O.

1811

RUMMAGE

Thomas Rummage, who came to Cleveland from Pennsylvania in 1811 and married "Polly" Johnson, a sister of Captains Levi and Jonathan Johnson, left a lasting impression on the town through his own strong personality and that of his sons, also long and prominent citizens and lake captains.

He owned two or more acres of land on the south side of Euclid Avenue, including the Opera House site, and extending nearly to the Taylor Arcade. He also possessed a large farm on the West Side along West 25th Street, and spent his time alternately between the two places.

He was one of the early builders of boats, and was associated with his brother-in-law, Capt. Levi Johnson, in the latter's first ventures in that line.

Capt. Rummage was one of the first victims of the cholera epidemic of 1832, dying in a few hours after being stricken with the disease, and was buried on his farm. His oldest son was but 13 years of age at the time. Capt. Rummage's widow lived some years after his death, at 27 Euclid Avenue.* Her grave is in Erie Street Cemetery.

NOTABLE STRONGS

The following article is from the 11 May 1992, Daily Messenger, Canandaigua, NY. It was provided by Alan S. Cook of Westport, CT to Jarvis Strong of McLean, VA.

This article provides update information on the Jedediah Line, on Corrin Strong, #10-47-100, page 536, Strong Family History Update, Volume I, Jedediah Strong and his Descendants, Gateway Press, 1989. Corrin Strong is a member of the Jedediah line from Elder John Strong that we heard so much of at our Rochester, NY National Meeting in August 1985.

Corrin Strong to explore state Assembly bid

Corrin Strong of Caledonia confirmed today that he has been exploring making a run for the Republican nomination for state Assembly in the newly redrawn 136th District.



Strong, 41, is publisher of *The Clarion*, a weekly newspaper serving northern Livingston County with offices in Avon.

He also operates a 600-acre commercial grain farm in Caledonia.

"It looks like there may be an open seat in the Assembly," Strong said. "I have been contacting Republican leaders in all three counties, letting them know of my interest. So far the response has been very positive."

The new district stretches from Pittsford and Henrietta in Monroe County to Belfast in Allegany County, taking in 10 towns in Livingston County.

The two incumbents, Assemblyman John Hasper of Belfast and Jim Nagle of Pittsford, are considering mounting campaigns for state Senate, rather than compete in the newly drawn district.

Strong ran in a Republican primary in 1986 against John Hasper the last time the seat was open. At that time he received 45 per cent of the Livingston County vote, winning eight of the 17 towns in Livingston County despite running without the Livingston County Republican designation, Strong said.

Strong is a 1968 graduate of the Haverford School in Haverford, Pa. He received a bachelor's degree in history from SUNY Geneseo in 1977. In 1980 he earned a law degree from Albany Law School. Admitted to the bar in 1981, he has not engaged in the private practice of law since 1986.

Strong has been active in tourism development in the Finger Lakes region, serving as chairman of the Livingston County tourism committee that produced the first county travel guide. He also represented Livingston County on the board of directors of the Finger Lakes Association.

Strong is married to the former Judith Allen of Albany. They have four children, ages 3 to 11. The three oldest attend Allendale Columbia School in Pittsford.

The following letter was from Henry Butler of Bower Chalke, England to his sister, Anna Maria Butler Smith of Boone, Iowa.

Bower Chalke
Nov. 1st, 1882

My Dear Sister,

It is a long time since I have heard anything of you and yours. We hope you are all well - We have only just divided the little that was left of Father's money. We met in Bath on Wednesday last and paid it. Benjamin and Myself are Excutors, it is not an enviable position to fill each one had L56-15. Benjamin and I sent you L50 each some years ago and we were to be paid from what Father left but we give you that and will send you the L56-15 through a Banker I suppose will be the best way. Benjamin says I must send the money - but I do not see any need of the receipt until we send the money - on hearing from you - how you would like it sent and if I have the right address you may expect it sent.

We shall be pleased to have all the news you can give us - how all your children are if they are married etc. etc. We hear you have been having good times for farming the last three years, I hope you have found it so.

Our Children are eight in number, Nellie the eldest married a Wesleyan Minister 1 year ago - Harry the 2nd, has been very poorly for nearly 12 months not able to do anything he is better now and I suppose will be married soon. Charlie (no. 3) has been very poorly but he is also better and is gone to Australia as a Wesleyan Minister he had been in the Institution (Theological) at Didsbury two years came home last Xmas for the Holiday had fever and did not get over it for a long time the Dr. thought the best thing he could do would be to go to a warmer climate his lungs not being very strong - The Rev W. Lait came from Australia for 12 young Ministers and charlie went for one of the 12. He expects to arrive there about the middle of this month we have heard from him four times since he left. He is enjoying the voyage very much and is not quite well he says. Richard (no. 4) has been in the Bank five years and gets L120 a year. Walter (no. 5) is at Barnstaple with an Architect will be out of his time next May 12 months - is doing very well they say - Dick and Walter both intend to go out to Australia in a year or as soon as Walter is out of his time. Lizzie and Florence are both at home. Herbert is at school will finish this Xmas.

They are all steady good children and nearly all members of some church for which we are thankful to God and we must pray will be some good to the world they live in.

I dare say Jane and Louisa have told you all the news about our own Family if not I will tell you a little. Stephen is still at Barrowhill married a second wife which I suppose you have heard - she is quite an Invalid and is quite a cripple. Benjamin is still at Newbury. They are all pretty well. He also has married a second wife a very nice woman. John is living near London in a small farm. they are quite well. Joseph is gone with his family to New Zeland has a farm and is doing pretty well we hope. Sarah is still in Bath - three of her daughters at home with her. Jane has been married some years - they are living in Cloncestershire now in a farm milking 40 cows and making cheese. We have a farm here 500 acres milk 30 cows keep 300 ewes - sold 350 Lambs a short time ago.

I do hope you are still walking in the good way striving to glorify God below and find your way to Heaven where we hope all to meet - may God's blessing attend you and your prayers

STRONG MASONS

Edward and Thomas Stronge were two of the grandchildren of Timothy Stronge of Little Barrington, Gloucester, England. In London, May 12th, 1716, Edward Stronge wrote of his grandfather:

"My grandfather Timothy Stronge, as I have been informed, was born in Wiltshire, but settled at Little Barrington, in Gloucestershire, and had those quarries, and those at Teyton, in Oxfordshire, in his possession. He had several apprentices, and kept several masons and labourers employed in those quarries, to serve the Country with what they wanted in his way of trade. And, about the year 1630, he built the South front of the house at Cornbury, in Oxfordshire, with the vaulted cellars, great hall and rooms adjoining the same....."

Their parents were Valentine Stronge and Anne Margetts, daughter of Edmund Margetts. Valentine Stronge was also a mason building houses for William Whitmore, esq, c. 1640, John Dutton, esq. 1651-53, and Andrew Baker, esq, 1661-62. He died before the Baker house was completed and his son Thomas finished it.

Thomas Strong, in 1665, built lodgings for students at Trinity College, Oxford, under the direction of Dr. Christopher Wren, of Wadham College. He also built the part of Cornbury House fronting Oxford and the terrass-walls.

After the fire of London, in 1667, Thomas supplied the stone from his quarries for the repair work and went to London to work on the rebuilding under the direction of Sir Christopher Wren.

Edward Stronge and Thomas Stronge were the master masons working for Sir Christopher Wren, in the building of St. Paul's Cathedral, started in 1675 and finished in 1710, for which the monument in the photo was erected.

The family continued as stone masons and Edward Stronge, Jr. was responsible for the repairing of St. Paul's Cathedral, when the Dome had sunk two to four inches.

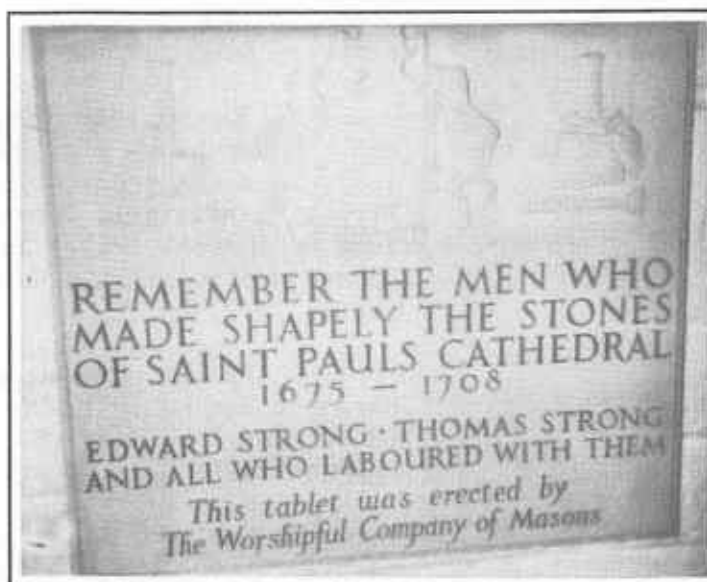
