David Mast (DAR lineage), son, b. 1760-1, Lancaster Co., m. Nancy Sheets; to Randolph Co., N.C. 1764; moved Sept. 10,1801 and arrived Mar. 20, 1802 Miami Valley, Ohio.

Children: Elizabeth (Studebaker)Fahenstock, 1785 Rebecca(Studebaker)Fahenstock, 1787 Peter(Studebaker) Fahenstock, 1788 Samuel(Studebaker)Fahenstock, 1791 Catherine (Studebaker)Fahenstock, 1792 George(Studebaker) Fahenstock, 1795 Samuel(Studebaker)Fahenstock, 1797.

The old bible was purchased at public sale in York for a few cents and given to the Society.

Story in Studebaker family indicates Hannah, or Susannah, who married Fahenstock was dau. of Henry Studebaker and survived the Indian massacre as she was at the home of her uncle Clements. An infant, she may have been ill or for some reason was in care of Clement's family; after being orphaned she grew up in the home of Clements Studebaker and early census failed to differentiate.

Nancy WILAND was entitled to 1/19th part of estate & all heirs divided the remainder \$4000 except 2 heirs, Catharine PUTTERBAUGH, wife of John of Darke Co, Ohio, and Nancy WILAND. Nancy since has intermarried with Daniel STUDYBAKER and they charge Aaron MILLER,, the exec. with using the money personally.

Answer of John PUTTERBAUGH

He married Catharine, heir of Martin HOOVER, before his death. That Exec. paid his wife, himself and their son \$60, that his wife owed Martin HOOVER some \$20 above the \$60 as listed in Martin HOOVER account book in hands of Exec. and he "thins he has heard the wife of Adam Shock, and the wife of John Metzger, both heirs of said Hoover speak of accounts which said Hoover had against them". /s/ John PUDERBAUGH

Court Answer:

Allow Exec. 6% (\$154.45) exclusive of sum allowed for a journey to Penna. Bal. to distribute \$2156.25
1/3 to widow \$1437.50 for heirs named in will each \$71.87 and due prior to 1822. Court orders Miller to pay: STUDIBAKERS - \$100.97 (\$71.87 / interest)
PUTTERBAUGHS 16.67 (71.87 - 60.00 / interest)
and MILLER pay costs of suit \$21.69

In Book A, pg. 596, Sept. 1829, a continuation of above original suit.

Note: The ~~###~~ above Martin HOOVER was a pioneer in Morrisons Cove, Penna. and on to Montgomery Co., Ohio, where he died leaving 19 children, all important early Brethren pioneers. I would like to know more about this Martin HOOVER, his background, etc. D.B.
