There is no record of the birth of our Abraham II in
those records received from Bruhl; he came to America
at age 18 and would then have been the first child, born
in 1718. Some early data in Pa. indicated there may have
been, also, a David and a George who came to America in
1736, but these names were not found in Bruhl. It seems
possible that the surviving twin, John William, was
William of Westmoreland who was under 18 yrs. of age
in 1736 and whose line carries on the name of Daniel.
Three daughters may have perished on the long voyage to
America.

Her brother-in-law, John Bradley acted as her counsel. In 1887 he returned to her old home in La Porte for a visit. As the years passed she spent her time between the two places. They had four children.

In 1966 Celia still headed the household and kept accounts for the orange grove, but had decided that at 85 yrs. she would retire from active management. The old home in its setting of magnolias, palms and rare trees and shrubs secluded from the "bustle" of Orange, was a place of contentment. All children b. in Orange Co., Calif.

During WW II when Celia and Donald had eight sons in the war, they received the following letter:

The Secretary of War
Washington, D.C.

August 14, 1945

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Clark:

My attention has been called to the fact that eight of your sons are now in our armed forces, and I have asked that their names be furnished to me from the files of the War and Navy Depts. where they appear as

I can realize the pride which you feel in these fine young men. For my own part, I should like to assure you of the deep appreciation of the nation which has accepted their service with gratitude and a strong sense of responsibility. In these anxious months when all our resources must be directed toward victory over our enemies, you have given yours in abundance.

I am sure it is a source of deep satisfaction to you, as it is to me, that these boys are playing so great a part in the restoration of peace to a troubled world.
