

-Lovell analysis #1:

-Eustacia Lovell b. ca. 1811-15 TN, m. ca 1827-32 Maury Co TN? Littleberry Mangrum. The first Census available for TN (1820) listed 15 Lovell(s) in the following Cos Sumner (5), Overton (3), Davison (3), Rutherford (1), Williamson (1), Giles (1), and Robertson (1). Of all these, 11 had daughters under 10 (Eustacia's age then). One, George of Giles Co. is reported to be the father of Eustacia. Giles, Sumner, Davison and Rutherford Counties are fairly close to Maury Co.

-In 1830 TN, Gilley Lovell lived in Maury Co. pg. 338, but the daughters were 1-under 5 and 1-5 to 10; none were old enough to be Eustacia. Nearby lived James Mangrum, pg.365, Littleberry, pg.369, Edwin, pg. 386 and William, pg.386. This Littleberry was not the husband of Eustacia, but his uncle b. 1780. All the others were sons of Isham; Edwin was 20 and had 2 small children. William was 24-28 with a wife, but no children. James was only 18-20, but married and the head of his household. In this household was an older brother, age 20-30, possibly Isom Green (Single) and 2 younger brothers ages 10-15. Your Littleberry was 15-16. Also in this house were an older sister, about 30 (or their father's 2nd wife) and three younger women- 2 age 5-10 and 1 age 10-15. It is possible that Littleberry and Eustacia were already married or that she was a domestic in the house.

-In 1840 TN John J., James and William Mangrum headed families in Maury Co, but Edwin and Littleberry were not there. However, in Shelby Co. pg. 230 was a "B" Mangrum. I'll get the Census data later, but I'll bet it was Berry (Littleberry) and Eustacia. There were no Lovells in Maury or Shelby Co. but George W. was in Washington Co. pg. 251.

-In 35,000 TN Marriages, Vol 2, pg. 313, George W. Lovell m. Elizabeth Hunter 16 Dec 1847, Dickson Co. This may be George of 1820 with a 2nd wife or a new one

-Tracewell analysis #1:

-In Mangrum #3 we find that in 1850 IL, only St. Clair Co. had both Tracewell and Cox families. In looking for the ancestors of Orville Tracewell Cox, it is safe to assume that Tracewell was a maternal name- the maiden name of his mother, a grandmother, or a great grandmother. Orville was b. Feb. 1898 in White Co. AR. a son of William H. Cox b. Jun 1862 IL (both parents b. IL) and Susan _____ b. Oct 1872 AR (both parents b. TN).

-In a book detailing the 1850 Census of St Clair Co. IL were the following: Artimacy Tracewell was 25 b. Ohio, single, pg. 325x. Edward Tracewell was 52 b. VA. pg. 388, and was possibly the father or uncle of Artimacy. His wife was Margaret 38 b. TN with sons: William R. 11, George 9, Thomas 8, and St. Clair 6, all b. St. Clair Co. IL. Older daughters 15 and 17 were also b. St. Clair Co. So the family was there well before 1840. Several Cox families also lived in St. Clair Co. in 1850. The older ones included Charles 58 b. VA and John A. 40 b. TN. Others were from PA, NY and IL. I found no Tracewells in 1840 IL, but Edward had to be there. In 1830 VA 2 Arnolds and 2 Edwards headed families on pg. 402 Wood Co.(now W. VA.) near the Ohio border and William was on pg. 84, Shenandoah Co. on the boarder next to W. VA. In 1830 OH Benjamin was on pg. 16 Richland Co.(N. Central). In 1820 OH, Elizabeth Tracewell was on pg. 185A Richland Co.

-In 1820 VA, Ann Tracewell headed a family in Kanawah Co. (near Wood Co.) W. VA. and Darcus headed one in Shenandoah Co. Although I found no Tracewells in 1810. 1800 or 1790 VA. these are not reliable. A search of all other states that existed in 1820, 1800 and 1790 led to no Tracewells.

-My conclusion is that the Tracewells started in the mountains of W. VA where Edward of 1850 IL was b. ca. 1798. They migrated to Ohio (1820-30) and to IL (1830-50). Edward was still in W. VA in 1830, although his kin, Benjamin, had already gone to OH. Edward may have visited his uncle in OH on his way to IL by 1830-33.
