THE TREVITT FAMILY OF MARBLEHEAD AND LYNN

Henry Trevitt of Marblehead is one of only two known Trevitts in the Massachusetts Bay Colony. There was a Robert Trevitt, who lived at Charlestown and married at Reading, 8 March 1716, Martha Chadwick. They had five children: Robert, Samuel, Samuel again, Soloman and Mary (1719-1756). There is no connection between Robert and Henry Trevitt of Marblehead, ancestor of the Lynn Trevitts. No published accounts of Henry Trevitt have been found.

1. **HENRY¹ TREVITT** was born, presumably in England, in 1624, according to testimony on 28: 1: 1674, in which he gave his age as 50 (see below). He died, probably at Marblehead, after 1684 (Thomas Gray, *The Founding of Marblehead* [1984], 125). Henry married, probably at Marblehead, about 1660 (first known child born about 1662), a wife whose name was MARY (surname not determined). She was born in 1629, according to her testimony in 1674 in which she gave her age as about 45 (see below). No death record has been found for either Henry or Mary Trevitt.

Henry was a fisherman by occupation. The first record found is in a court case dated September 1646, when Henry Trevitt testified in a case against "goodwife James," claiming she had the powers of a witch (*Records and Files of the Quarterly Courts of Essex County*, hereafter EQCR, 1:108). On 28: 9: 1656, Mary Trevitt was a witness in an assault case. She testified in the case of Elizabeth Legg of Marblehead, for "perniciously belying the wife of John Clements in the matter of the birth and death of Elizabeth's child" (*ibid.*, 2:10). On 24: 7: 1662, "Mary Trevitt and Mary White went to the assistance of two women who were helping goody Smith who cried out from pain in her back" (*ibid.*, 2:444).

On June 22, 1672, John Newhall and Henry Trevitt deposed in a case against John Hathorne for serving strong waters to Indians (*ibid.*, 5:63). On 3 June 1673, John Roades, Sr., sued Henry Trevett for debt. The suit was withdrawn (*ibid.*, 5:197). On the 10th of June 1673, Henry Trevitt sued John Rhodes for "breaking bulk and illegally disposing of the fish or part of their voyage of fish, in which said Trevitt is interested as partner in the voyage, without his knowledge or consent." The suit was withdrawn (*ibid.*, 5:185).

On 28: 1: 1674, Henry Trevitt, aged about 50, deposed that "the land where Mr. Lattamore's house now stands," was fenced in twenty-four years ago and planted by deponent **and Mr. Pitt's man**, and he had known a house inhabited upon the same land twenty-six years ago. He further deposed that **he had lived in the town of Marblehead upward of twenty-six years**, had cut firewood and timber, kept hogs and cattle for his own use on that tract of land called the town common without molestation by any during twenty-one years" (*ibid.*, 5:256). The same day, **Mary Trevitt, aged about forty-five years, deposed** that she had known the land where Mr. Lattamore now lives, occupied by a dwelling house for twenty-three years, and **she was Mr. Pitts' servant** in it (*ibid.*).

On 26 February 1677, Henry Trevitt took the Oath of Fidelity **at Lynn**, sworn before Capt. Thomas Marshall. Henry was listed in "John Fuller's and Matthew Farrington's Squadron," with other men from Lynn (*ibid.*, 6:399). This is the only record of Henry Trevitt in Lynn.

Probable children:

- i. HANNAH, b. c1662; m. at Marblehead, 20 Oct 1684, GEORGE PICKE. No further information found. The name is perhaps Pickle, or Pike, or Peak.

- 3. iii. HENRY, b. c1668; m. (1) ELIZABETH ---; m. (2) MARY (HITCHINGS?) HALLOWELL; m. (3) ELIZABETH NEWHALL.



2. **CAPT. RICHARD² TREVITT** (Henry¹) was born, probably at Marblehead, about 1664, and died there after May of 1731, when he made a codicil to his will. He married at Marblehead, 13 October 1685, **MARTHA JACKSON** (Marblehead VR). Her parents are not given in the records. She was perhaps the daughter of John and Margaret Jackson, who came to Salem as early as 1636, when Margaret was age 36 and her son John was age two. John Jackson's wife was Mary in 1655 (Sidney Perley, *History of Salem*, 1:387-8). Capt. Richard and Martha Trevitt named a son John.

On the 25th of June 1693, Martha Trevitt brought to the 1st Church at Marblehead, for baptism, her first five children: Benjamin, Henry, John, Martha and Richard.

Will of Capt. Richard Trevitt

(Written 26 July 1727; proved 18 May 1731 (Essex Probate, 28145; copy books, 319:7-10).

"In the name of God Amen ... I, Richard Trevitt in Marblehead ... am in bodily health and perfect memory make this my Last Will ... first being penitent and sorry for all my sins, most humbly desiring forgiveness... I request my just debts be paid by my Executors (my two sons Richard and John Trevitt) and I make the following bequests:

I **acquit my son Benjamin** of all that he has rec'd of me and give to his son **Russell Trevitt** 20 shillings to be paid on demand. There was due from my son **Henry** when he died about 80 pounds which he had about the time of the building of his house. My will is that his son **John Trevitt** have that out of his father's house and land ... to my grandson **Richard Stacey** all my meadow east of Prichards, and if he should die without issue, then to his brother **Benjamin Stacey**... to my son **Richard** the land that joins Mr. Stephen Minoti's land and along by the highway to the westernmost part of to the walk by Thomas Martin's meadows ... with a dwelling house on it, with two cows which are in the great neck in Marblehead. Two lots of land joining to Mr. Sinnet's land to the westward, bounded by John Trevitt's land to the east of the harbor, west by the sea. Also all my right in the **Meeting House where the Rev. Edward Holyoke teaches**... to my son **John** a piece of land on the path to the wall by Richard Trevitt's land ... and on to the wall by Martin's meadow. Also to John I give my 2 lots of land on the Great Neck that I had of John Calley, Esq. by exchange with all the common rights and privileges belonging. Also the land belonging to his house ... and land that joins. Also to my son John all my rights in the **Old Meeting House**... to my son **Joseph Sweat**, that piece of land from John Trevitts to the westward... to my son **Joshua Ward** of Salem, 100 pounds to be paid within 6 months after my wife's decease... to dau. **Mary Ingalls**, 60 pounds to be paid 12 months after my wife's decease... to **Eleazer Trevitt and Mary his sister, children of my son Henry, dec'd**, each of them 30 pounds... to **Rev. Holyoke**, 10 pounds... to my Executors the remaining Real Estate to be equally divided between them to enable them to pay my just debts, funeral charges and legacies. Signed Richard Trevitt. Witnesses: Andrew Tucker, Samuel Harris, Greenfield Hooper.

Codicil ... signed the --- day of May 1730: the 100 pounds to my son-in-law Joshua Ward ... if my Executors think fit, he shall receive the same in a part of my homestead land to that value.... My bequest of 60 pounds to my daughter Mary Ingalls I revoke and in lieu thereof do give her all that part of that house behind my homestead where she now lives; the whole new part of said house with land on which it stands together with all that part of the garden behind my homestead which she does now possess and enjoy The legacies bequeathed to Eleazer and Mary Trevitt, children of Henry Trevitt deceased, be paid them in twelve months... ten pounds.... Finally, If I should survive my wife, then the legacies shall not be paid, but in the like time after my own decease, my will is that all things in the codicil be performed as if the same had been written in my Will.... Same 3 witnesses. On 17 June 1731, an inventory of the estate of Capt. Richard Trevitt was taken on 17 June 1731. It included the homestead and mansion house and the house that Mourney lived in with all the buildings and land (700 pounds); one house and land joining the land of Stephen Onimal, Esq. formerly called Bessens, (200 pounds); house and land given to Mary Ingalls (200 pounds), 4 common rights on the neck (200 pounds), one small spot of land adjoining above (60 pounds), and a barn (20 pounds); household goods, including pewter, silver, etc. and 1 pew in the New Meeting House. Total 1604+ pounds; signed John Palmer, John Homan and Andrew Tucker.

Will of Martha (Jackson) Trevitt, wife of Capt. Richard Trevitt
(written 24 July 1734; probated 2 Sept 1734; Essex Probate, 28144; Copy Books, 320:253-5)

I, Martha Trevitt, being sick and apprehensive of the approach of death make my last Will and Testament, and make my son in Law Joshua Ward of Salem my Executor.... My wearing cloths (shall be) equally [divided] between my daughters Mary Ingalls and Sarah Ward, and my granddaughter Martha, daughter of Joseph Swett ... to Russell Trevitt, my grandson, 10 pounds ... to my 3 grandchildren, John, Eleazer and Mary, children of Henry Trevitt, 10 pounds to be divided between them ... to my son John Trevitt, 5 shillings.... All the remainder ... to my three children, viz: Richard, Mary and Sarah, and to my 4 grand children, viz: Richard Stacey, Benjamin Stacey, Martha Swett, and Samuel Swett, children of my daughter Martha Swett, dec'd. to each of my said children, 1/4 part and to my grandchildren the other quarterpart to be equally divided between them. Witnesses: Daniel Felton, Benjamin Henly (or Healy), Robert Hooper, Jr.

- viii. MARY, bpt. 8 Sept 1700; m. at Marblehead, 15 Jan 1718/19, JOSEPH INGALLS, who was bpt. at Marblehead, 21 Mar 1696/7, son of Eleazer (Robert,² Edmund¹) and Mary (Hendley) Ingalls. Joseph Ingall's estate was administered by his wife Mary on 13 July 1744. An inventory (taken by William Goodwin, Ebenezer Kenny?, Benjamin Fellows) totalled 29 pounds (Essex Probate 14532; Copy Books, 326:216. No children listed at Lynn or Marblehead.
- ix. SARAH, bpt. 22 Feb 1701/2; d. bef. 1744; m. at Marblehead, 27 Sept 1722, JOSHUA WARD of Salem, b. at Salem, 15 Aug 1699, son of Miles Ward (George A. Curwin, "Materials for a Genealogy of the Ward Family of Salem," *Essex Inst. Hist. Collections*, 5:207). Joshua Ward m. (2) 21 Jan 1744, widow Lydia (Burrill) Hawkes. He m. (3) Ruth Woodward of Gloucester, who d. 5 June 1787, age 73; no issue. Joshua Ward d. 29 Dec 1779 (ibid.). Children, by 1st wife, Sarah Trevitt (surname Ward): 1. Joshua, b. 13 Mar 1723; m. Susanna Shores. 2. Daniel, b. 25 Oct 1725; lost at sea in 1746. 3. John, b. 25 June 1729; m. Abigail Phippen. 4. Sarah, b. 16 Aug 1733; d. 18 July 1737. 5. Martha, b. 29 May 1735; d. 27 Nov 1736. 6. - x. EDMUND, b. & bpt. 14 May 1704; no further information.

3. **HENRY² TREVITT** (Henry¹) was born about 1670 and died, probably at Lynn, after 1701 (birth of last child). He married, first, **ELIZABETH** ---- (surname not determined), who died at Lynn as "wife of Henary" 23 October 1694. Henry married, secondly, at Lynn, 31 May 1695, **MARY HALLOWELL**. She was perhaps the Mary (Hitchings) Hallowell (widow of Joseph Hallowell), who was born about 1660, daughter of Joseph and Mary (Edmonds) Hitchings. She had 3 grown step-children, and 2 young sons, John and Edward Hallowell, ages 9 and 11 (Henry H. Hallowell, "Joseph Hallowell of Lynn," *TEG*, 11 [1991]: 218). Mary Trevitt died after giving birth to one daughter. Henry Trevitt married, thirdly, at Lynn, 14 June 1698, **ELIZABETH NEWHALL**, who was born at Lynn about 1668-1678, the daughter of John² (Anthony¹) and Elizabeth (Normanton) Newhall (Henry F. Waters, "The Newhall Family of Lynn," *Essex Institute Historical Collections*, 18 [1881]: 18-20). Waters gives the date of marriage of Henry Trevitt to Elizabeth Newhall as 1688, but Lynn Vital Records gives 1698, which must be correct.

- i. **ELIZABETH**,³ b. 19 Aug 1692; died young, as 2nd Elizabeth b. 1701.

Child by 2nd wife, Mary Hallowell (perhaps Mary [Hitchings] Hallowell), b. at Lynn:

- ii. **MARY**, b. 23 July 1697; m. at Lynn, 13 Oct 1716, **EBENEZER NORWOOD**, b. at Lynn, 5 May 1694, son of Thomas and Mary (Brown) Norwood. Mary prob. d. soon, as Ebenezer Norwood m. (2) 2 Nov 1717, Mary Newhall (Lynn VR), and had Ebenezer Norwood (who m. Jerusha Gross) and Mary Norwood (who m. Ebenezer Mansfield and had a son named Trevitt Mansfield) (James G. Dempsey, *Norwoods of Gloucester, Mass.* [1979], 1:10:28).

Children by 3rd wife, Elizabeth Newhall; b. at Lynn:

- iii. **SARAH**, b. 7 Apr 1699; m. ---- Norwood. John² Newhall (in a deed of gift, 27 Mar 1720) named Sarah Norwood and Elizabeth Trevitt, "having given considerable to their mother in her life time" (Waters, "Newhall," 18: 18-19). Dempsey, "Norwoods" says her husband was Francis,² Norwood, but that has to be an error. Francis m. a Sarah Trevitt in 1708 when this Sarah would have been 9 years old.
- iv. **ELIZABETH**, b. ca 1701; prob. unmarried. On 27 March 1720, John² Newhall (Anthony¹) made a deed of gift to his grandson John Newhall, of Lynn, weaver, in which he instructed him "to pay 10 shillings to Sarah Norwood and 5 pounds to Elizabeth Trevitt, who hath lived long with me, having given considerable to their mother in her life" (Waters, Newhall Family; see above).

4. **HENRY³ TREVITT** (Richard,² Henry¹) was baptized at Marblehead, 25 June 1693, but he was probably the first-born son, born about 1688. He died before 27 August 1716 when his estate was administered (Essex Probate, 28141). Henry married at Marblehead, 19 September 1710, **SARAH INGALLS** (Marblehead VR), the daughter of Eleazer and Mary (Hendley) Ingalls (Charles Burleigh, *The Genealogy and History of the Ingalls Family in America* 1903], 24). Her birth is not recorded. Sarah (Ingalls) Trevitt married, secondly, at Marblehead, 8 September 1719, Deacon John Bayley (ibid.). Children: Sarah, John and Elizabeth Bailey. Sarah (Ingalls) (Trevitt) Bailey was living in 1750 (ibid., *Essex Antiquarian*, 6:139).

Children of Henry Trevitt and Sarah Ingalls, b. at Marblehead, all named in grandfather Richard Trevitt's will in 1727:

Ambrose m. (2) at Marblehead, 17 Jan 1740, Elizabeth Bowden (VR) and had 3 ch. by her: Tabitha, Mary and William James. Child of

Ambrose and Mary (Trevitt) James, b. at Marblehead (surname James): 1. Ambrose, Jr. bpt. 2 May 1736; d. bef. 24 Apr 1794 (will); m. (1) 23 Jan 1773, Tabitha Procter; m. (2) 27 June 1790, Mrs. Rebecca Smith. Ambrose James, Jr., in his will of 1794, named wife Rebecca James, dau. Rebecca Trevitt James, son Ambrose, dau. Tabitha Green, dau. Molly Trevitt James (Essex Probate, 17734).

- iii. **ELEAZER**, b. 8 May 1715; m. "as of Newport R.I.," 15 Mar 1763, **SARAH GALE**. An Ambrose Gale was one of the founders of the church at Marblehead. There are several Sarah Gales and lots of Gales in Marblehead. There is no further information in Marblehead. Ebenezer and Sarah probably settled in Newport, R.I., and perhaps were Quakers.

5. **BENJAMIN³ TREVITT** (Richard,² Henry¹) was baptised at Marblehead, 25 June 1693 (VR), but was probably born about 1689. He died intestate before 25 February 1727 (Essex Probate, 26053). Benjamin married at Marblehead, 23 July 1710, **ELIZABETH RUSSELL**, who was b. at Marblehead, 5 December 1691, "daughter of Elizabeth Russell." Elizabeth married, secondly, 24 December 1733, Capt. Giles Russell (Marblehead VR).

Children, b. at Marblehead (data from published VR unless noted):

- i. **BENJAMIN⁴** bpt. 10 June 1711; died young.
- ii. **RUSSELL**, b. 28 Feb 1714/5; d. betw. 15 Nov 1797 and 6 Sept 1802 (the writing and proving of his will). He m. (1) (int.) 4 Nov 1739, **ANNA POTTER**, who was b. at Lynn, 4 Jan 1720/1, dau. of Benjamin & Ruth (Burrill) Potter of Lynn. Russell m. (2) 21 Mar 1743, **SUSANNA ELLIS** of Beverly. He m. (3) **LYDIA HENCHMAN**. On 16 Oct 1795, **Lydia Trevitt "late Lydia Henchman, now the wife of Russell Trevitt," made her will....** "according to the true intent of the indenture she made 20 Dec 1777 between said Russell Trevitt, the said Lydia and Benjamin Tyler Reed, before my marriage to said Russell... to my beloved granddaughter, Abigail Sewall, wife of Samuel Sewall, all my farm in Chelsea and all my other real estate, after the death of said Russell Trevitt, to whom my real estate is secured by the indenture aforesaid, for his natural life ... my Executors to give in my name to my sister Mary Barnes some piece of my apparel ... and to each of said Abigail's children, a piece of my silver plate. I appoint Samuel Sewall sole Executor. Witnesses: Russell Trevitt, Joseph Sewall, Mary Sewall;" Probated 26 Mar 1795. **Russell Trevitt of Marblehead, gentleman, made his will, 15 Nov 1797; proved 6 Sept 1802.** He named his son **Capt. Samuel Russell Trevett**, dau. **Elizabeth Hooper (wife of Capt. Samuel Hooper)**, his grandson **Russell Trevitt**, children of his late daughter **Susanna Orne**; namely: **Elizabeth Prentice, Aniss Orne and Sally Orne** (Essex Probate, 28147; copy books, 369:506-7). Child, by 1st wife Anna Potter: 1. Susannah, b. 28 Dec 1740; died young. Children by 2nd wife Susanna Ellis: 2. Elizabeth, b. 19 Apr 1744; m. (1) 21 June 1764, Thomas Wendell; m. (2) Capt. Samuel Hooper (named in Russell Trevitt's will). 3. Rebecca, b. 14 Sept 1745; d. 22 July 1747, age 22 m. 8 d. 4. Susanna, b. 28 Dec 1746; died young. 5. Susanna, b. 19 Jan 1749; m. 10 Mar 1772, Joshua Orne (Susanna named in father's will). 6. Capt. Samuel Russell, b. 17 Nov 1751; d. 14 Feb 1840 in Maine; m. 10 Mar 1772, Sarah Wormstead (9 children). Capt. Samuel Russell Trevett was Capt. of Artillery in Col. Richard Gridley's regiment in the Battle of Bunker Hill. In 1814, he had command of a revenue cutter from Pres. Madison & retained the position until his death. He had 2 sons in the U.S. Navy during the war of 1812, one a surgeon, the other a captain (notes of Eleanor Bardin, 29 July 1996). Capt. Samuel Russell's will, written 25 Dec 1828; proved 7 Feb 1832, bequeathed to his son **Robert Wormstead Trevitt**, daughters **Susannah Adams and Sally Bartol**, to son **Michael Trevitt Adams and John Adams**; to grandsons **Michael Trevitt Adams, Samuel R. T. Adams, John Eldrige Trevitt, Samuel Russell Trevitt, Benjamin George Trevitt, Russell**

Trevitt; to daughters Susanna Adams (named Executor), Sally Bartoll; to grandchildren Mary Leary (or Seaver) Trevitt and Elizabeth Ann Trevitt, children of son Benjamin deceased (Essex Probate, 28147).

- iii. BENJAMIN, bpt. 30 Aug 1719; d. 25 July 1720, age 11 m. (Marblehead VR). However, on 5 June a Benjamin Trevitt was placed under guardianship of his mother Elizabeth (Essex Probate 26054).

6. **RICHARD³ TREVITT** (Richard,² Henry¹) was born at Marblehead about 1689; was baptized at 1st Church, 15 June 1693 with four of his siblings. He died intestate, before 30 October 1749 (administration of estate). Richard married at Marblehead, 27 November 1712, ELIZABETH INGALLS (Marblehead VR). She was a daughter of Eleazer and Mary (Hendley) Ingalls, and sister of Sarah Ingalls (wife of Henry³ Trevitt, given above).

Richard Trevitt died intestate and on 30 October 1749, his son Henry was appointed administrator of his estate (Essex Probate, 28146; copy books, 329:57, 114; 331:484). An inventory was taken on 23 November 1749 by William Goodwin, Isaac Mansfield and Benjamin Stacey, Jr. The estate included wearing apparel, land between Boden's and James's, the mansion house and land. Total estate 390 pounds. A committee was appointed to divide the real estate, but the division was not found in the records.
