Mr. J. P. Trout, age 86, died at 5:00 this morning at his home in the Colbert Community, 3 miles North of Ada. Mr. Trout was a native of Tennessee, near Nashville. In 1877 he moved to Royse, Texas, Rockwall County, coming to Oklahoma in 1903. For the past eleven years he had resided near Ada.

Mr. Trout was a Confederate War veteran and a member of W. L. Byrd Camp. He was a member of the Baptist Church.

TYROLA

This is the story of the Tyrola Community as related by Mr. And Mrs. Henry D. Chandler October 8, 1968, to Miss Anna Cottingham and Mrs. H. C. Hodges.

The first white settlers northwest of Ada to come to this part of Indian Territory was the Kilcrease family about 1886-87. J. Daniel Conn, father of John and Pink Conn, appears to be the first settler, soon to be followed by Tom Myers, A. T. Walkers, the Bowles and Prewitt families.

The small settlement of Tyrola consisted of those families, a store, a Baptist church, and later a post office. The town was moved twice; the last time in 1903. When the railroad was built, the railroad and post office made it a thriving community until the bridge across the Canadian River washed out in 1914, and the railroad trestle burned in 1928.

According to Mr. Chandler, two women, Mrs. J. D. Conn and Mrs. Tom Fullerton of Tyrola, were summoned to help with the delivery of Bob Kerr who was born in a log cabin southeast of Ada, Indian Territory.

The school at Tyrola was in existence in 1908-09 with an enrollment of 65 and one teacher who was paid \$300. Tyrola School was consolidated with new Bethel School in 1924.

Tyrola was located in T-5-N, R-6-E, Sec. 17/ The cemetery markers at Tyrola were copied by Miss Cottingham and Mrs. Hodges and were published in Volume I of Pontotoc County Oklahoma Cemetery Inscriptions.
