WILLEM ISAACSEN VAN VREDENBURGH¹ b 1637, The Hague, Holland, s/o Isaac Van Vredenburgh, a well-to-do Burgess; m 16 Oct 1664 APPOLONIA BARENTS (bp 29 Jan 1647, New Amsterdam) d/o Barent Jacobs(z)en and Marretje Leenderts (de GRAU(W)) KOOL. He came 17 May 1658 from The Hague in Holland, in the ship "Golden Beaver" or "Gilded Beaver"; was the first of this name who came to New England. He had a house just outside Fort William Hendrick in New Amsterdam. The Governor decided that the house had to be razed for better defense in the event of attack. Willem was recompensed with land on Broadway between Battery Place and Hector Street and 330 fl., wampum value, to make up the full value. He removed to Ulster Co., NY.

The baptisms of the children are recorded, with the exception of Aaron and Appolonia, at Kingston, NY.

AARON/ARIE VREDNEBURGH³ (Willem^{2,1}) b 1709; m c 1737 SARA (bp Feb 1711, Rochester, Ulster Co., NY) d/o Dirck and Wyntje (KIERSTED) ROSENKRANS. He was the first of the family to settle in the Minisink reion of New York. He lived for a time in Pike Co., PA, probably in the Westfall Township; went from there to Shippekonk, (Montague), Sussex Co., NJ, where he lived on the river road near the "Smooth Rocks." He was an elder in the Machackemeck Church from 1741 to 1764. In 1764 he represented the three Minisink Dutch Churches at the meeting of the Coetus.
