The Search Rooms are open from 9-30 am to 5 pm on Mondays to Fridays and from 9-30 am to 1 pm on Saturdays.

Persons wishing to use the records should complete an application form for either (a) A Reader's Ticket, valid for 3 years; this requires the recommendation of someone to whom the applicant is known personally. Persons not of British nationality should furnish themselves with a letter of introduction from their embassy or legation in London, or from some recognised institution... (b) A Temporary Permit, valid for one week only. At the end of the week, one is expected to apply for a Reader's Ticket.

There are three Search Rooms: the Round Room, the Rolls Room, and the Long Room. It is the Long Room for CENSUS RETURNS & PASSENGER LISTS. The CARD-INDEX CATALOGUE OF LISTS & INDEXES is kept at the entrance to the Round Room.

Their collection consists of 3,600 oil paintings, 28,000 prints and drawings, nearly 200,000 photographs, 900 ship models, 50,000 books and a collection of manuscripts occupying three-quarters of a mile of shelving. There is a staff of 130 to answer the questions that are sent in from all over the world.
