HISTORY NOTES ON THE WILLOUGHBY FAMILY, COMPILED BY JULIUS EBBER  
WILLOUGHBY, OF WILMINGTON, NORTH CAROLINA, ABOUT 1930

JOSEPH WILLOUGHBY

1. Joseph Willoughby, immigrant to Virginia about 1748, was, according to the traditions in the families of North Carolina and Alabama, the younger son of Lord Willoughby and was kin to the royal family of England. I follow Isaac J. Greenwood's argument in fixing Kent as the ancestral home of Joseph Willoughby.

2. Joseph Willoughby came to Virginia with one of his brothers, whose name I do not have. This brother did not settle in Virginia but continued his journey to New England, presumably to join relatives there. Joseph Willoughby settled in Spotsylvania County, Virginia. The records of this county show that there were living in the county:

- a. Thomas Hammond, Jr. October 1, 1723
- b. John Hammond Febry 19, 1731
- c. John Griffen, Jr. Febry 5, 1748

*See note on last page*

The Virginia Hammonds and Griffens were relatives of the New England Willoughby family.

3. Joseph Willoughby must have married in Virginia because the tradition is that he came to Virginia with a brother. His wife, Elizabeth, could not write. Had the educated Joseph Willoughby taken wife in Kent, he would probably have selected a woman of his own social position and one who could write. I fix the year of his marriage in Virginia as 1750 or 1751.

4. The male children of Joseph and Elizabeth Willoughby were:

- \*Edlyne, born in Spotsylvania County, Virginia, 1752, died in Wadestoro, N. Carolina, 1839. Fought in the Revolution,
- Thomas, born---? was accidently killed while hunting.
- Henry, born 1759
- William, born---

5. There is no information at hand relative to female children. Edlyne Willoughby had as a member of his family in N. Carolina Patty Castle, a niece, who would be a daughter of Edlyne's sister, or of a sister of his wife, named Eleanor Sparks

6. Joseph Willoughby carried his family about the year 1755, to the Cheraw District, South Carolina, during the great migration from Virginia and Pennsylvania to the Welsh Neck, a bend in the Great Pee Dee River near Society Hill, South Carolina. His part in the colony was that of school teacher. The French and Indian war caused such restlessness, and there were attacks on the outlying settlements in S. Carolina by the Carolina Indians in 1758-59, so that Joseph Willoughby returned to Spotsylvania County, Virginia. The records of that county show him as a witness to a deed conveying land in the county, dated November 25, 1760; and they show that Joseph leased, on November 11, 1762, land in that county from Joseph Hubbard. The purpose of the lease was "by these presents and of the statute for transferring uses to possession", which leads me to believe that Joseph was using the land and some contention arose making advisable a written lease. The lease was for one year. The early records of Spotsylvania County indicate that Joseph Willoughby was a man of standing in that county, being an educated man in an illiterate colony. He was called as witness to many legal papers. He was a farmer and land owner of moment.

\*Edlyne is the ancestor of Willis, John Hinkley, Cyril Latimer, and Claude Houston Willoughby - (4 generations) Names of C. H. Willoughby direct ancestors are capitalizd.

In 1780 he sold 100 acres in Spots. County for a consideration of 2000 lbs. and in 1782 he acquired 300 acres in that county for a consideration of 1000 lbs. He is recorded as the owner of two slaves.

7. Of the three sons, Edlyne Willoughby, after marrying in Virginia, moved to what is now Richmond County, N. Carolina. My inquiries have been directed toward the descendants of Edlyne Willoughby, and not those of William and Henry Willoughby. William and Henry probably lived out their lives in Spots. County. All three sons were able to write, from which I assume that Joseph Willoughby gave personal attention to their education. None of the sons seem to have attained the relative position in their respective communities as was enjoyed by Joseph Willoughby. Edlyne and Henry were both soldiers of the Revolution, and each drew pensions during the latter years of their lives.

EDLYNE WILLOUGHBY

1. Born in Spotsylvania County, Virginia, in 1752. Married, probably in 1782, in Spotsylvania County, to Eleanor Sparks, born 1758. (The family name, Sparks, is the recollection of Henry J. Willoughby, when he was 24 years old, and may be in error.) (Henry J. Willoughby was a grandson of Edlyne Willoughby).

Died in 1839, in Wadesboro, N. Carolina and is buried beside his wife, Eleanor, (died 1825) in the town cemetery at Wadesboro.

2. Enlisted 1775 in Spotsylvania County, Virginia, with Captain Spencer, for a term of two years, as a private. Was placed under the command of General Washington, and was in battles of White Plains, Trenton, Princeton, Brandywine and Germantown. After serving the two years for which he was enlisted, he re-enlisted in the camps called White March for a term of three years under Captain Burley, Seventh Virginia Regiment under command of Col. McClannan, brigade of General Woodford. He was in battles of Stony Point, and Monmouth. He was placed in Capt. White's company, first regiment of Virginia, Line commanded by Cols. Russel and Ball, brigade of General Woodford; marched south to join the main Southern Army under Gen. Lincoln, and was captured at the fall of Charleston. He was sent by sea from Charleston, S. C. to Norfolk, Va., in 1782. For military services he received on May 27, 1829, the military land warrant from State of Virginia, No. 1731 for 100 acres of land, and a pension under act of Congress of May 15, 1828.

3. After marriage and after the birth of Willis Willoughby in 1785 at Lynchburg, Va., Edlyne Willoughby moved to what is now Richmond County, N. Carolina, probably following the 1785 route of Joseph Willoughby on the move to the Welsh Neck. Edlyne Willoughby was seeking tobacco land. He was in Richmond County, N. Carolina census of 1790, [there being recorded four males under 16 years of age;] and was living in Richmond County in 1800 His family then consisted of five males and one female in addition to his wife. From Richmond County Edlyne Willoughby moved first to Montgomery County, N. Carolina, for a short time and then to Anson County, N. C.

He was living in Anson County in 1810. Among the lands owned in Anson county was the Lanier plantation four miles out from Wadesboro, from which plantation he moved into Wadesboro.

4. The children of Edlyne and Eleanor Willoughby were: Joseph, born about 1783 in Virginia; married probably in Montgomery County; died leaving one son, George W. Willoughby, born 1847. Geo. W. Willoughby accumulated a good deal of property in and about Wadesboro, but the value thereof was materially impaired by the results of the War Between the States. Joseph had one daughter who

3. married a man of the name Fankpy, and went with him to Missouri about the time of the outbreak of the Civil War; and one daughter who died quite young.

WILLIS, born 1785 at Lynchburg, Virginia; married (1) (name unknown) probably in Richmond County, North Carolina, to whom were born Jackson, Edward, Rachel; (2) Mary Collins, probably in Richmond County, N. C., in 1815, to whom were born John Hinchy, William ~~Halstead~~, Elizabeth, Eleanor, and Harrington; (3) Polly M. Jolly, probably in Anson County, N. C. in 1828 to whom were born Frank, ~~Ed~~ Harriet, Mary Ann, Henry James, Lagenia, and Joseph. Died 1871 near Hamlet, N. Carolina, and is buried in McIntyre graveyard two miles from Hamlet, beside his third wife. The second wife, Mary Collins, is buried in ~~Walls~~ Walls graveyard near Rockingham, N. Carolina. I have no information as to the first wife. Mary Collins was a daughter of John and Elizabeth Hinchy, and had married Collins, with issue of Jared and Caleb. ~~Walter~~ M. Jolly was born Polly McCoy and had previously married Jolly with issue Nancy and Patsy. Willis Willoughby raised Jacob Willoughby, son of Nathan Willoughby.

Nathan, born \_\_\_\_\_ married before 1820, died \_\_\_\_\_. There was one daughter, Phoebe, who was given to Mrs. Harriet Strong on the death of Nathan Willoughby's wife. Phoebe married a Williamson who was educated by Mrs. Strong to be a physician. Phoebe Williamson moved with her husband to Alabama before the outbreak of the Civil War. After the war, Mrs. Strong went to join Phoebe in Alabama and there died, leaving Phoebe her property. Phoebe then returned to Richmond County, N. C. and there died. There were three sons, Jacob, Eli, and Wyatt. Jacob Willoughby was raised by Willis Willoughby; married Judy West and emigrated to Mississippi.

Charles, born \_\_\_\_\_ married about 1818, died \_\_\_\_\_. The children were: Zane, Roxy, Sarah, Martha, Mary, Hiram, and Raiford. Hiram and Raiford enlisted in the Confederate States army and were probably ~~lost~~ lost in the war between the States. Neither returned after the close of that war.

5. Edlyne Willoughby was a pioneer in Richmond and Anson counties, N. C. and although he bought and sold land to some extent, he was, at the time of his death, in straitened circumstances. The census of 1830 shows him as owner of two female slaves, one being a child under ten years of age.

WILLIS WILLOUGHBY, son of Edlyne, was born in 1785 at Lynchburg, Va. Died 1871, at Hamlet, N. Carolina and is buried in McIntyre cemetery, two miles from Hamlet. Married (1) \_\_\_\_\_ name unknown; from this union there was issue: Jackson, Edward, and Rachel. Rachel died unmarried and is buried in the town cemetery at Wadesboro. I have no information on Jackson and Edward. Married (2) Mary Collins, in 1815. She was born Hinchy, was a widow with two children, Jared and Caleb. Jared Collins left Wadesboro in 1828 for northern Mississippi. Caleb Collins moved to Marshall County, Alabama, and later to Mississippi. Mary Collins Willoughby died in 1826 and is buried in Walls graveyard near Rockingham, N. Carolina. The issue of this second marriage, all born in Anson County, N. Carolina, were JOHN HINCHY, born 1816, died at Garden City, Alabama, 1891; William ~~Halstead~~, born 1818, married Elizabeth McCoy, moved to Alabama in 1854, then to Illinois (Tamaroa, Perry County, Illinois) in 1864 and there died 1886. Elizabeth, born \_\_\_\_\_; she married a Fort. Eleanor, born \_\_\_\_\_; married a Goodlake and moved to Asheville, N. Carolina. Harrington, born 1825, moved to Hally Springs, Miss. and died there, leaving a wife and children.



Additional information on children of JOHN HINCHBY WILLOUGHBY

Fannie Adelaide, born 1848, married David Preston Rice in Blount County, 1869; died 1912 in Birmingham and is buried at Ricetown cemetery near Blount Springs, Alabama.

Katherine, born 1850 on Sand Mountain; married Marquis L. (Jake) Rice in 1872 in Blount ~~WYATT~~ County, Alabama.

Jared, born 1851 on Sand Mountain, Ala., emigrated to Arkansas and there died in 1914; married

Hamilton B. born 1854 in Wills Valley, Ala., emigrated to Arkansas and there was married. He had two sons. He died in Mississippi.

Sam Edlyne, born 1858 at Gadsden, Ala.; married Emma B. Jones in 1882 in Rutherford, Tennessee.

William Powhatan, born 1858 at Gadsden, Alabama; died 1886 unmarried, at Montgomery, Alabama, and is buried at Arkadelphia, Alabama.

*Catherine (Whaley)*

The children of John Hinchby and ~~Caroline~~ *Catherine (Whaley)* Willoughby, his second wife, were all born at Arkadelphia, Ala. Their names were: Ethyl, born 1876, Married C. L. Jones in 1896; twins, Lewis McPherson and Leonora, born 1877; Lucy Ann, born 1879, died 1887; Mitylene, born 1881; Rufus Cobb, born 1883; Morgan, born 1883, died 1887; an unnamed baby, born and died 1887.

John Hinchby Willoughby left Wadesboro, N. Carolina on the marriage of Willis Willoughby to Polly M. Jolly in 1828, to join his half-brother, Jared Collins, in Marshall County, Alabama. Prior to his leaving N.C. the only schooling he had was that given by a charitable lady at Fayetteville, N.C. His half-brother, Jared Collins, furnished the means for his education in the Cumberland Presbyterian College at Lebanon, Tenn. He was ordained a ~~MI~~ minister of that church, and continued his study in later life of the Greek and Latin languages, and of medicine and the practice thereof. Except for a short period in mercantile business at Galesville, Alabama, his occupation was school teacher, minister of Cumberland Presbyterian Church, practicing physician, and lecturer for the Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. in Alabama (Masonic).

At the outbreak of the war between the States he was designated Chaplain of the 18th Alabama Regiment and served as such throughout the war. He had in the regiment his two sons, John Paul Willoughby, enlisted as a private in 1861, and CYRIL LATIMER WILLOUGHBY, enlisted as a private in 1862. Both of them were honorably discharged May 10, 1865, at Meridian, Miss.
