## Yeager Bible

*The Holy Bible containing The Old and New Testaments: Together with the Apocrypha: Translated out of the Original Tongues, and with The Former Translations Diligently Compared and Revised; with Came's Marginal Notes and References* (New York: Collins and Co., 1816).

On the inside cover of the Bible the following is written "Presented to Edward Yeager Grissim B Katherine Logue Aug 12<sup>th</sup> 1911."

The entries seem to have been made by at least two different hands. The marriage, first birth, births from John Yeager (1754) to Edward (1811), and deaths of John Yeager, John Hay, Catharine Yeager, Joseph Yeager, William Yeager and Harriet Carver appear to be the same person. All others with the exception of Maria Logue, appear to be from a second hand. The Maria Logue death entry is written in pencil, and is probably from a third hand. With the exception of the Maria Logue death entry, all other entries were made with in ink.

There were four loose papers found in the Bible which can be found with the Bible pages.:

- Coal receipt from Hilles Brothers, Frankford, Philad's 6/6/1885
- Handwritten copy of poem *Better Land*
- printed copy of poem *Original Lines on Physiognomy*, by John J. Logue
- printed copy of *Written on the death on a Beloved Wife. To Maria In Heaven*, by John J. Logue, Philadelphia, Pa., 1878.

## AN OLD DOCUMENT

S.D. Ely, of Vandalia, sends the *Record* several papers found among the effects of his father. Among the papers are some that belonged to his grandfather and great grandfather. One was dated Oct. 31, 1818. It was a note for the sum of L. O.9.11, signed by Byrd Goodwin. The note is still running. Several receipts for Ralls County taxes are among the lot. A receipt for \$3.19 1/4 to Isaac Ely from the Sheriff of Clark County, Ky., 1817 is among the papers. There is a tax receipt for \$6.85 3/4 from C. Carstarphen, Collector Ralls County, to Isaac Ely for taxes of 1837. In 1832 D. Jones was Collector of Ralls County. In 1828 Isaac Ely paid \$8.74 taxes to J.C. Fox, then Collector of Ralls County. On Jan. 14, 1829, Isaac Ely sold 11,666 pounds of pork and 300 pounds of lard to W.G. Draper, of Hannibal, for two cents per pounds-- \$239.32--taking pay in goods. The balance due Mr. Ely at end of September in that year was to be paid in cash. A note for \$12.78, signed by Alvin H. Cartmell and Blueford Bethell, is among the collection. John N. Reavis was holder of the note. It is dated Jan. 1, 1859. In 1838, Harrison Glascock, of New London, was agent for the *Journal*, a newspaper printed at Bowling Green by M.J. Noves. Benjamin Ely, Jr's., receipt for \$3 paid to that paper is among the number. In 1863 Stephen D. Ely owned 200 acres of land in Ralls County and a receipt shows he paid \$3.13 to Sample Orr, Register of Lands at Jefferson City, for "state, Lunatic asylum and county taxes." In 1824 Isaac Ely paid \$8.56 3/4 taxes to Wm. W. Smith, Collector of Ralls County. Isaac Ely in 1816, paid Thomas Scott, Sheriff of Clark County, Ky., \$1.74 taxes. The rate of taxes was 6 1/4 c on the hundred dollars. According to a receipt among the papers dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of January 1846, Isaac Ely paid \$6 taxes on 440 acres of land in this county. The receipt was signed by John Jamison, Collector of Ralls County. An aged yellow slip shows that in Clark County, Ky., in 1816, Isaac Ely paid a direct tax of seven dollars, sixty-four cents and four mills. In 1836 Benjamin Ely paid Dr. J.L. Gyre 75c for medical attendance upon his black boy Jackson. So says the receipt. In 1859 G.G. Muldrow was collector of Ralls County. To him Stephen D. Ely paid \$3.75 for state, county, railroad and state lunatic asylum tax for the year 1859. In 1865 Stephen D. Ely paid Sam Smith, Collector of Ralls County, \$6.50 bounty tax, and \$6 commutation tax. These receipts bear 2 c stamps. A receipt dated Jan. 1, 1811, shows that Isaac Ely paid James Hampton, Sheriff of Clarke County, Ky., \$1.12 taxes on 180 acres of land, 8 horses and 25c for a militia fine. Isaac was late at muster, hence was fined. During Vol. 3 of the Hannibal Missouri Courier Joseph P. Ament was editor and the paper sold at \$2 per year.

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**OBITUARY of Hurt Yager 1804 - 1887**

**YAGER** - Died, at his home in Ralls county, Mo., December 23, 1887, after a lingering illness. Hurt Yager, age 83 years, 2 months and 3 days. Deceased was born in Madison county, Va., October 19, 1804, and emigrated to this state in 1836, and has lived in Ralls county ever since, except one year which he spent in Pike county, this state. He raised a large family, some of whom have gone before, also leaves a large circle of friends and relatives and was respected by all. He had been justice of the peace for more than 40 years, and was noted for his integrity and love of truth and justice and his correct renderings of the law. During his long term of office there were a great many cases tried in his court and many appeals from that to circuit court, yet he was heard to say, recently that he did not know of a single one of his decisions being reversed by the higher courts, which is very remarkable for so long a career. He suffered much toward the close of his life, but remained consciousness to the last and slipped away comparatively easy.
