# Mary Yocum—Oregon Pioneer of 1851

Our search ended in a tangle of poison oak and wild blackberries. The broken stone carried a simple inscription:

MARY YOCUM

BORN

Feb. 11, 1791

DIED

Dec. 23, 1864

AGED

73 yrs. 10 mos. & 12 da.

Just the number of her days. Nothing more. No hint of the remarkable life she led. Nothing to tell why she chose the hardships of pioneering, not once, but twice. This is the big question for which I'll never have an answer.

Born Mary BOOTH in Bourbon County, Kentucky, just fifteen years after the Declaration of Independence, she was the daughter of Samuel Booth from Connecticut. She was married in Bourbon County on November 10, 1810 and went to live in Montgomery County. Seventeen years and eleven babies later, she and her husband, Jacob YOCUM, moved into southern Illinois. The following year they moved on to Sangamon County, in the very heart of Illinois, and settled on some of the finest farm land in the country. If the record is correct, she gave birth to baby number twelve the very day they arrived in Sangamon County.

Two more children were added to the family. Of the fourteen children, eleven sons and two Daughters grew to maturity.

The family prospered. Jacob soon owned nearly 1000 acres of rich farmland. When the youngest child was just sixteen, Mary Yocum was left a widow. The year was 1848.

In 1851, when Mary was sixty, three of her sons, including the youngest, had already moved west. When three more sons and a son-in-law responded to the lure of Oregon, Mary Yocom went along. They arrived in Polk County October 4, 1851, after following the Oregon Trail just three days less than six months. She lived another thirteen years in Oregon. Now her bones rest in Pleasant Hill Cemetery, just south of Sheridan in Yamhill County.

Why did Mary Yocom abandon a settled, prosperous life in Illinois to pioneer a second time? She wouldn't have been left without family; six of her children never left Illinois. She didn't need financial support; in 1850 her real estate was valued at \$2000, which was a good amount in those days. Did she have an insatiable ache to see the sons who had gone earlier? Did the unmarried sons who still lived with her persuade her to go, perhaps to finance their trip? Did she sense that her daughter in the party (who would die the following year) was fragile and needed her? Or did she just have a spirit of adventure in her veins? I'll never know.

Mary Yocom's thirteen children were:

1. William, who never came to Oregon; m Sarah J. MERRIMAN.
2. Samuel, who came in 1851 and returned to Illinois in 1853; m. Ann COOPER.
3. George W., who never left Illinois; m. Margaret J. COOPER.
4. Jesse, who came west in 1847 and settled in Yamhill County; m. Minerva COOPER.
5. Sarah, wife of William HUSSEY, came in 1851, died in 1852. Her husband remarried and returned to Illinois in 1864.
6. Stephen, who never left Illinois; m. Martha A. COURIEL.
7. Abel, who never left Illinois; m. Jane ROBINSON.
8. Franklin, who settled in Polk County, and later lived in Salem; m. Nancy Jo DARNALL.
9. Elijah, who stayed in Illinois; m. Caroline A. HIGGINS.
10. Rebecca, who married Clement PASSWATERS and stayed in Illinois.
11. Thomas J., who emigrated to California in 1847, was in Yamhill County by 1851; m. Elizabeth THARP.
12. James P., who came overland in 1851, returned to Illinois in 1875; m. Emmeline HUSSEY.
13. Hathaway, who came to Oregon in 1850; m. Mary THARP.
