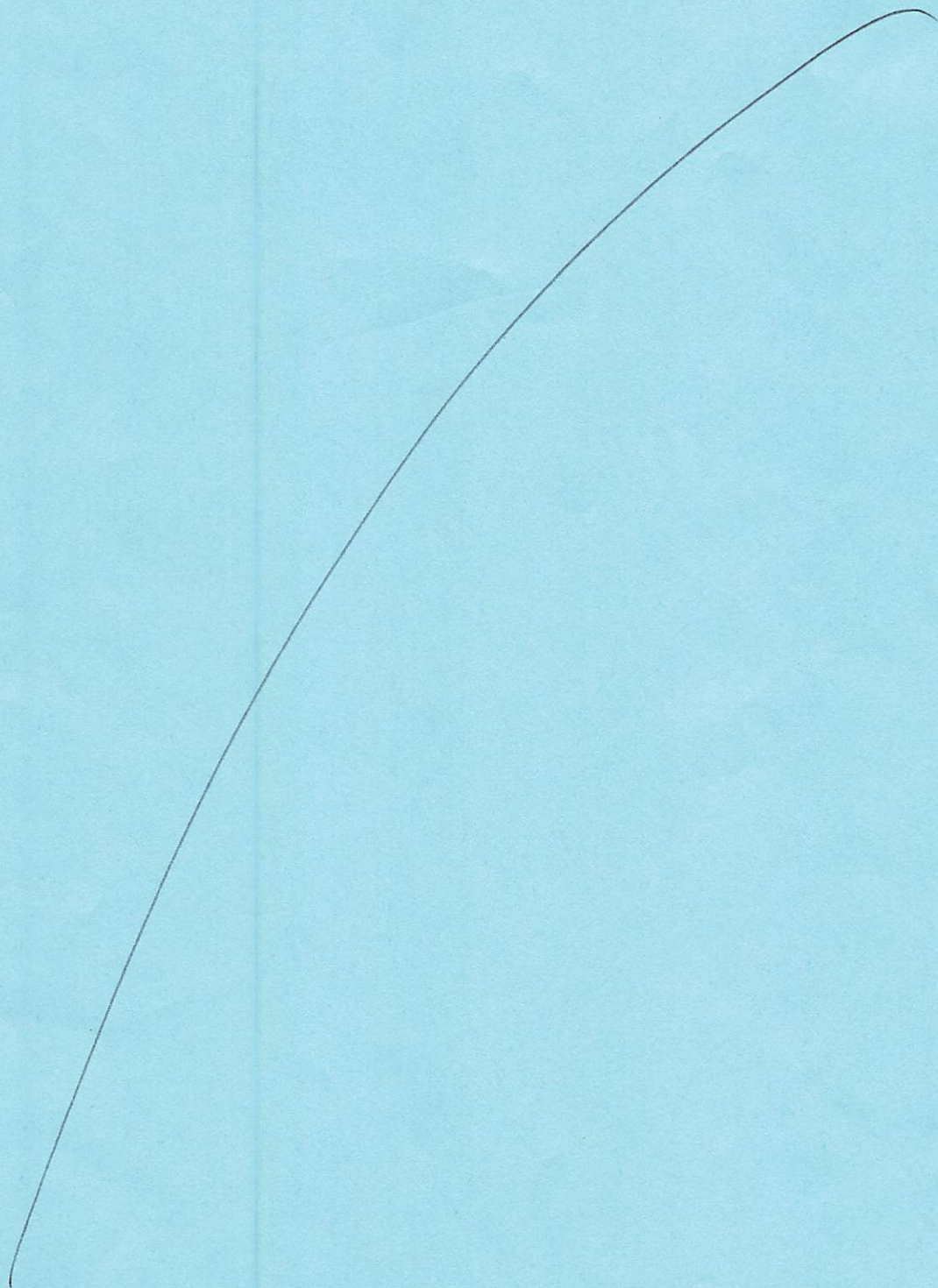

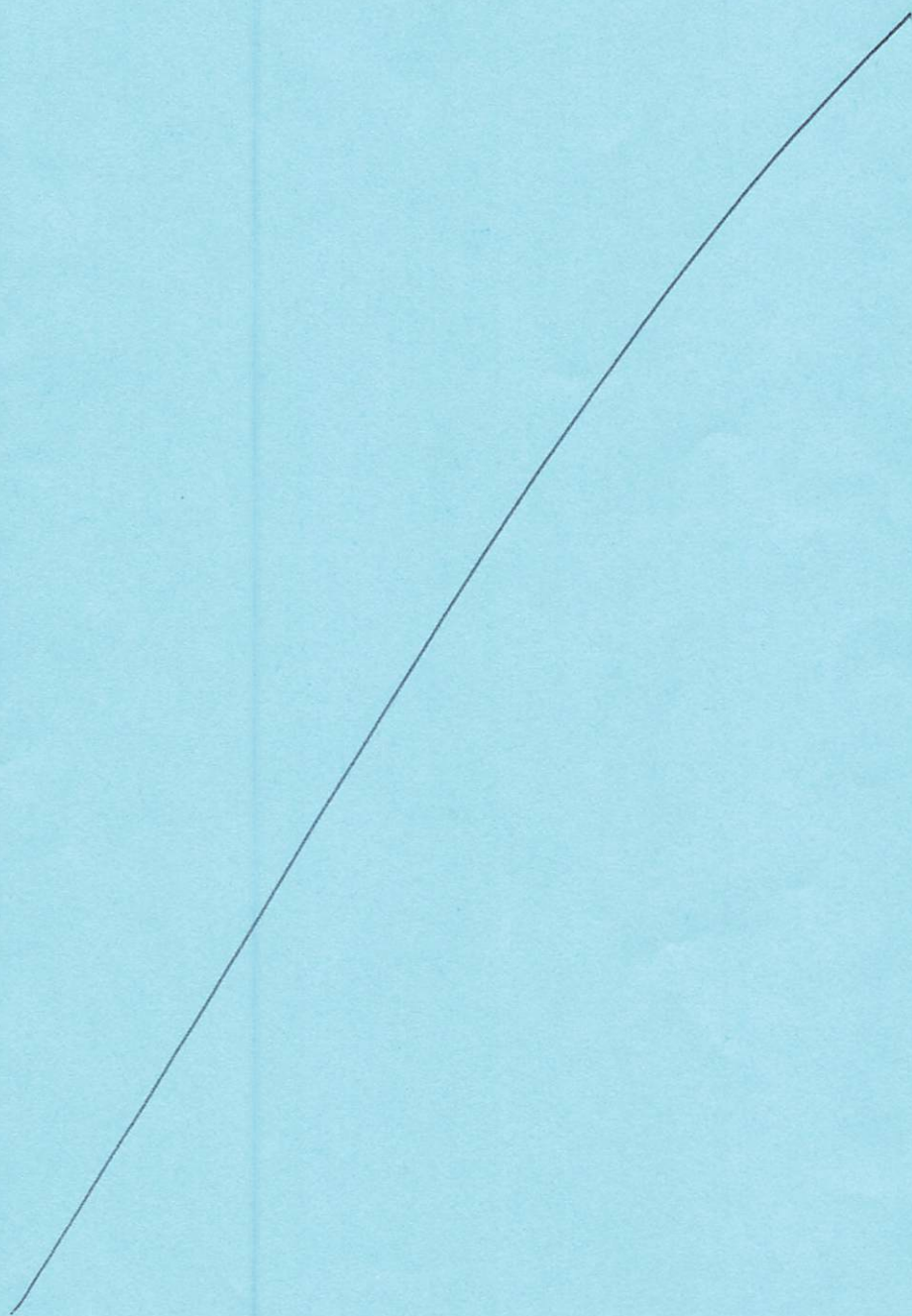

## 16 KILLED IN COALHURST BLAST FIRST MINE BLAST IN HISTORY OF LETHBRIDGE COAL FIELD

This was the headline in the Lethbridge Herald, Dec. 10, 1935. The explosion occurred Monday afternoon, Dec. 9 about 4:30 p.m. The blast and cave-in took place about 1 mile from the bottom of the shaft, the shaft being 564 feet deep. Rescue teams reached the cave-in area between 8 and 9 p.m. Monday. Following are the names of the 16 men who lost their lives in the blast:

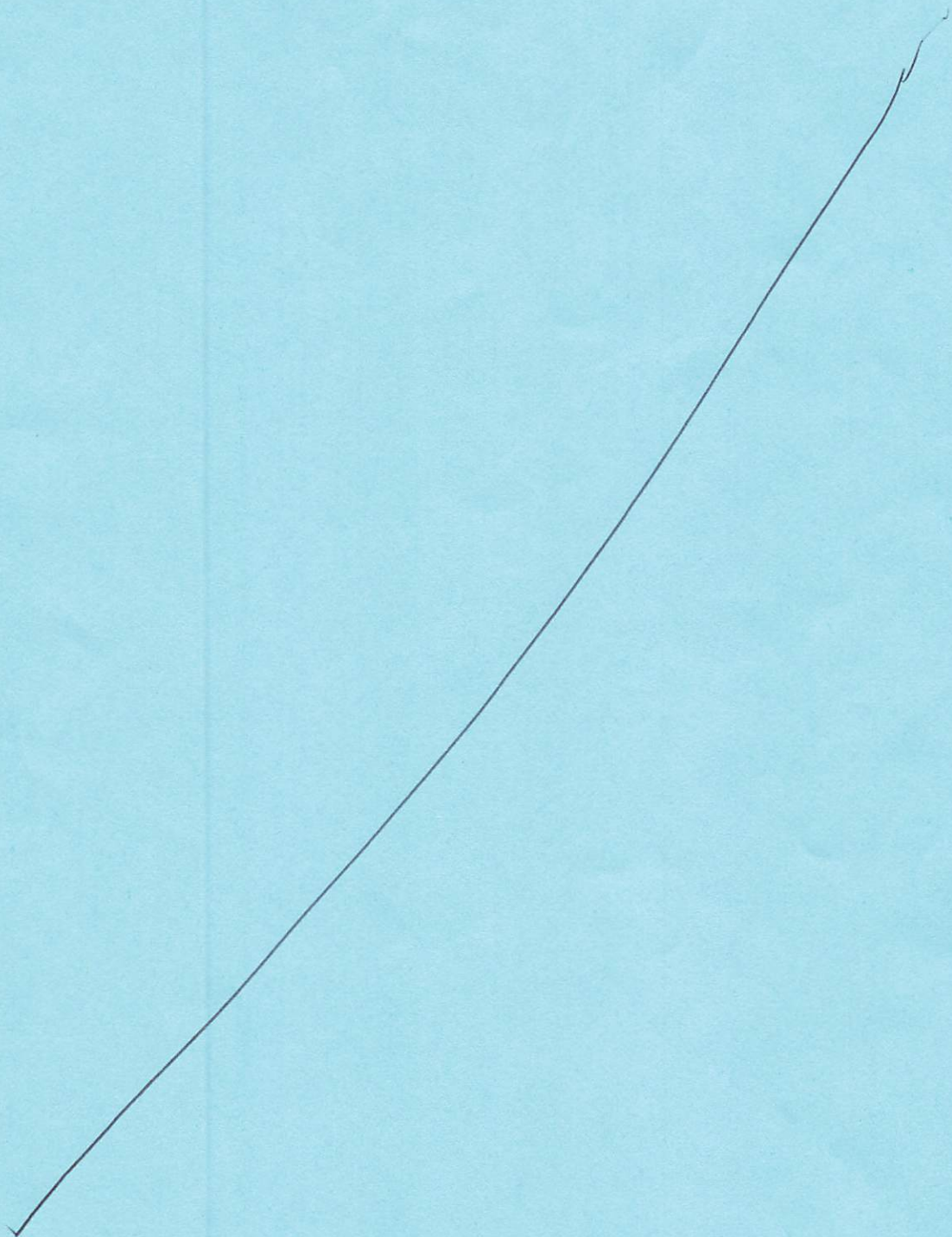

## SIR ALEXANDER GALT MUSEUM & ARCHIVES

(this information is taken from their brochure)

The Sir Alexander Galt Museum is owned and operated by the City of Lethbridge with assistance from the Historical Society, and provides a non-profit educational community service by preserving available artifacts, photographs, and other historical, artistic and scientific items which directly reflect the human history of Lethbridge and Southern Alberta.

The first Lethbridge hospital was a small, wooden building built in 1885 by Sir Alexander T. Galt, G.C.M.G., one of the Fathers of Confederation and president of the Alberta Railway and Coal Co. By 1908, the hospital was no longer adequate. The present building was opened in 1910, by the Prime Minister of Canada, Sir Wilfred Laurier. In 1930, an addition was built onto the west side of the building and the 1891 structures were demolished. In 1955, the hospital was relocated and the building became the Galt Rehabilitation Centre until 1964. The museum came into the building in 1967. In 1984, the 1930 addition was demolished to make way for new construction and redevelopment of the building as a new museum. The new museum was officially opened September 24, 1985, as the highlight of the City Centennial.

The archives contain many original documents, books, and historic photographs relating to Southern Alberta history. These collections are available to serious researchers by appointment for study, reference and copy. The Museum is located at West End of 5th Avenue South, Lethbridge, Alberta. Telephone: (403) 320-3898. The hours for the archives are Tuesday to Friday, 1-4 p.m. and also Wednesday evening 6-9 p.m.

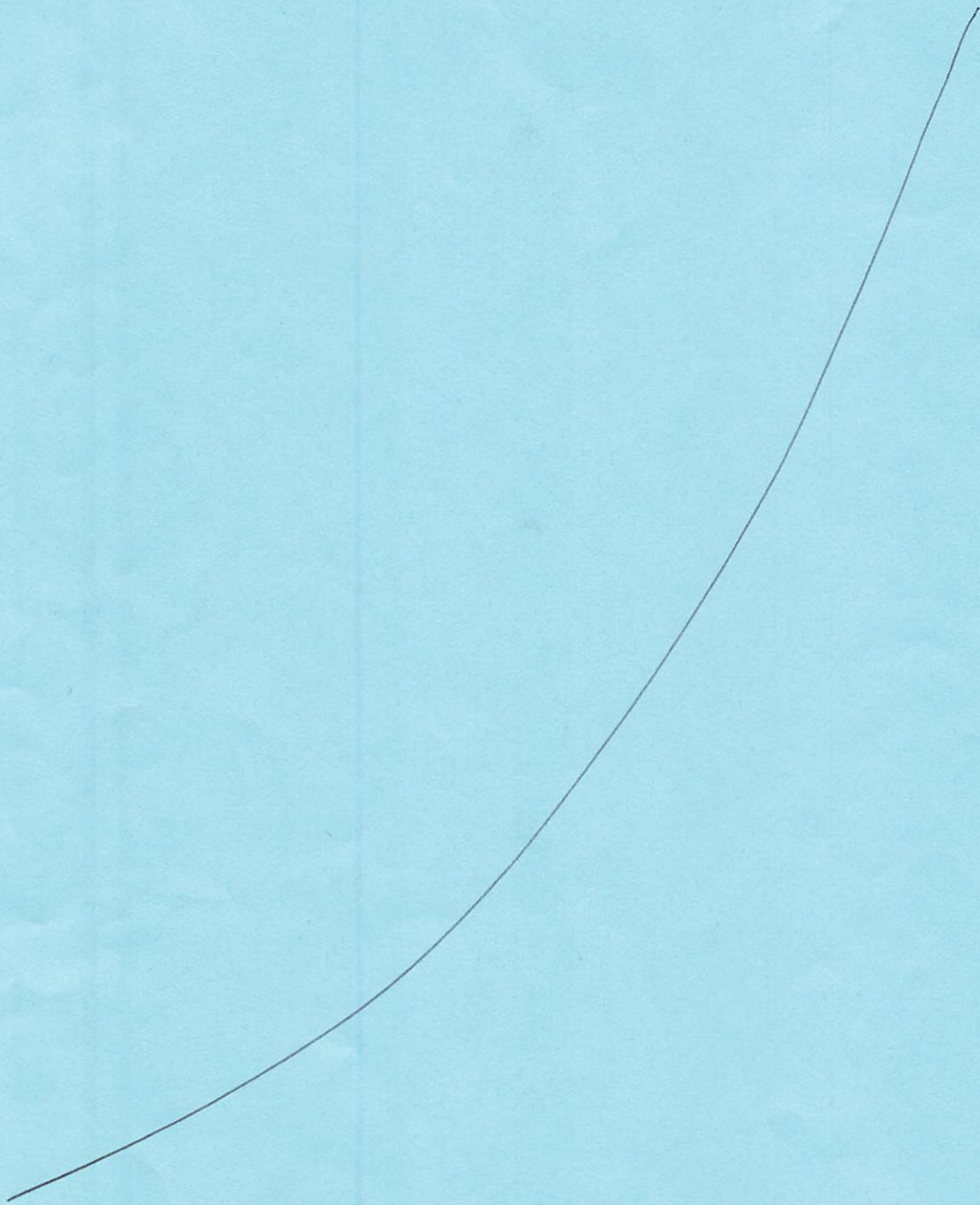

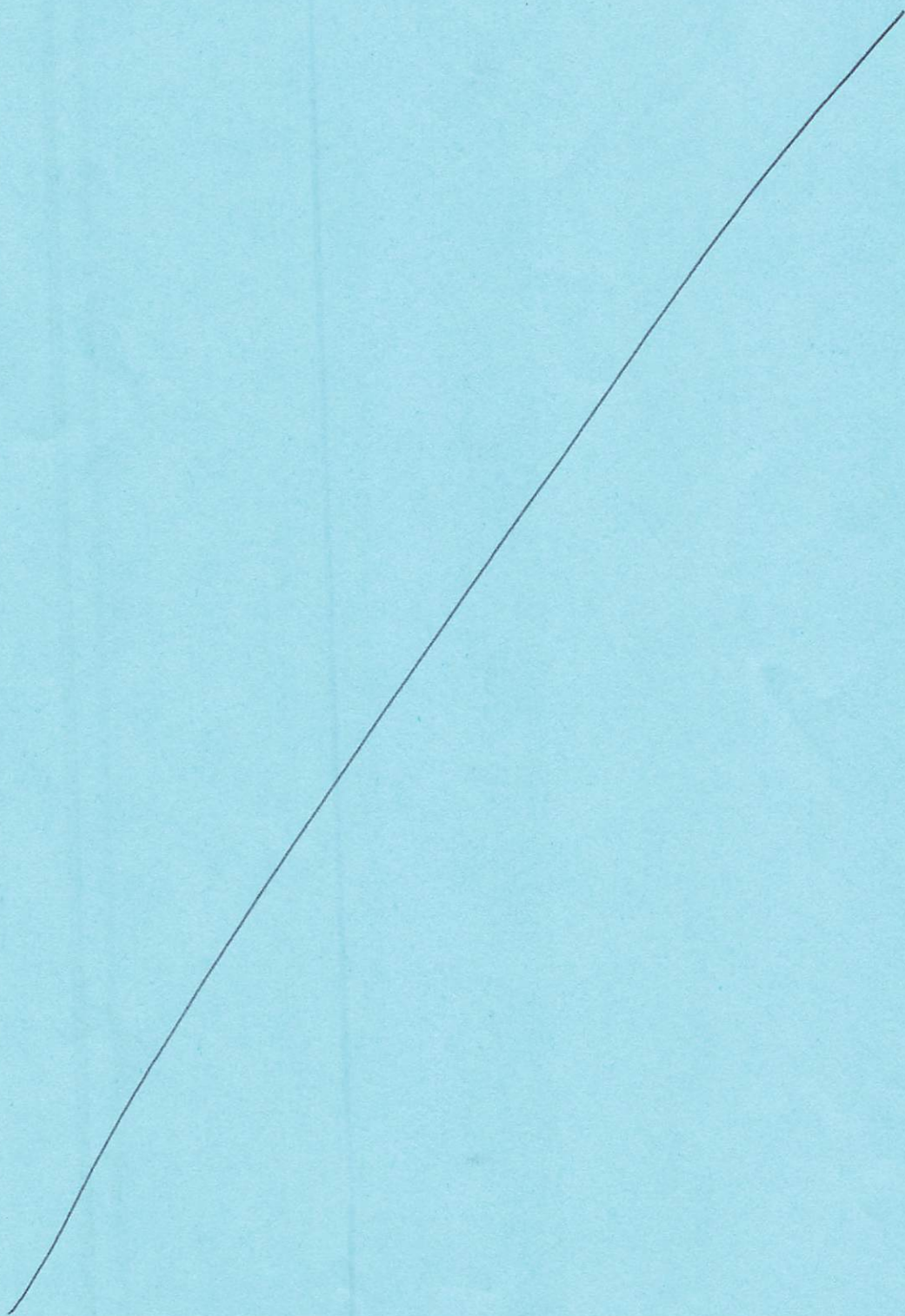

# A DISTINGUISHED CAREER

Each year as November 11th draws near, we gather to remember those that answered the Call to Arms and went forth in service of their country. At this time, questions invariably arise as to the notable service of a family member. They are honest questions, asked in the spirit of the occasion, and always receive the same answer.... "Not in this century, but let me tell you about my Great-Great-Great-Grandfather."

Born in England on 19 January 1825; JOHN PEARSON began his gallant and distinguished career 8 days shy of his 20th birthday. He attested to the 8th Hussars at Leeds in the County of York on 11 January 1844.

The next 24 years, 151 days were spent in the service of his country. Twelve of those years were spent abroad, including time in the Crimea and Turkey; with nine years and eleven months being served in India. His Service Record and Discharge Papers bear witness to his participation in some of history's more famous events as in the case of the "Charge of the Light Brigade" and the "Indian Mutiny". Such stories were told often over the years to various newspapers by his daughter, Selena.

By the time of his discharge on 9 June 1868 at Netley; John Pearson had obtained the rank of Sergeant with the 19th Hussars and had been awarded 5 medals: Sabastopol and Balaclava Clasp, 1854; Turkish Medal; Central India Campaign Medal; the Medal with Annuity; and the famed Victoria Cross. The latter he received for his valiant efforts at Gwalior, India on 17 June 1858, and was dutifully recorded in the London Gazette 20 January 1859.

Little is known about his life following the discharge. He returned to Halifax, Yorkshire and was married to SELINA SMART. They had at least two children, Selena and Mary. Sometime during the early 1880's he brought his family to Canada and settled in Eastnor Twp., Bruce Co. Ontario. It was here he died 18 April 1892.

Of his descendants, I have only obtained a small amount of information on his daughter, SELENA PEARSON.

Born in Ebenezer Yard, Pearson St. Northowram, Halifax, Yorkshire, England on 10 January 1870 (Reg. #R7311), Selena was christened the 20th of February 1870. After coming to Canada with her parents, she later married the first of three husbands. The date of her marriage to John Thomas ENO is not known, but it is believed to have taken place in Ontario. It was the only marriage from which she had children.

At some point the family moved from Ontario and settled near Edmonton, Alberta. John Thomas ENO had a farm near Legal.

After her divorce from John, Selena m 2) Billy RICHARDSON. An article on her father, Sgt. John Pearson, dated May 1939; indicates she and Mr. Richardson were living at 10030-105A St., Edmonton. It goes on to say that Selena was to be presented to Their Majesties on the 2nd of June 1939 in honour of her distinguished father. A further article in the Edmonton Bulletin on Monday, January 12, 1942, shows that she is still Selena Richardson, but her address has changed to 10649-95th St. The story deals mainly with the discovery of her father's grave in Bruce Co. Ontario and mentions that she is the eldest daughter of the family.

Thursday, 10 November 1949; an article headlined **RECALLS FATHER WON EARLY V.C.**, appeared in an Edmonton newspaper. At this time, she is married to 3) Dr. William DEMERS, and living at 10213-106 Ave. Selena is portrayed as a "silver-haired, soft spoken, Edmonton resident of 45 years".

Monday, 5 January 1953, the Edmonton Journal ran an article headlined - **FAMILY OF GREAT-GREAT-GRANDMOTHER** - and shows a photo of Mrs. William Demers (Selena) with 3 generations of her family during a recent visit to their home in Manning, Alberta. With her in the photo are grand-daughter Elaine ENO-SCHOFIELD; Dorothy Schamehorn (d/o Elaine); and Dorothy's two sons Dwight and Brian. The article says that Mrs. Demers has been a resident of Edmonton for 46 years and that she came here a few years after her father's death.

This is the last record I have of Selena and her current husband Dr. William Demers. It is possible that they retired from Edmonton to either Vancouver or Victoria, B.C. As for her descendants, I have been unsuccessful in locating the whereabouts of any of them with the exception of Arthur John, my great-grandfather.

As for JOHN THOMAS ENO, he was later remarried to a widow, Elizabeth COLE. She died after the birth of their daughter, Elizabeth on 23 December 1919 and was buried in the Bon Accord Cemetery Lot 83 Plot 1 on 25 December. The baby Elizabeth, was raised by Arthur John Eno. Following the death of his wife, John Thomas Eno took the two Cole children - Wallis and Hilda - and left the area. To my knowledge, neither he nor the children were ever heard from again.

In writing of this family, it is my hope that someone will recognize the surnames contained herein and be able to provide clues as to what became of them. It is also my fondest hope that I may be able to locate the medals John Pearson so rightfully earned. They were believed to have been placed in a museum for safe-keeping after being carried in the tunic pocket of a nephew serving in France in Col. J.K. Cornwall's Irish Guards. Also missing, is the sword that John Pearson carried with him throughout his distinguished career which is believed to have been in the possession of one of his descendants.

# THEY WERE IROQUOIS . . .

The list of names given in this article belong to my husband, RICHARD WILMOT's, mother's side (Marguerite CLARA WILMOT, nee COURTRELLE, (COURTEORIELLE)). I do have more names, but the ones I listed are more closely connected.

I would welcome anyone who is, or thinks they are, related to write to us. I could use more help and also I am willing to help them.

In the last few years I have read about fifty books pertaining to the Hudson Bay Co., the North West Co., and explorers such as Simon Fraser, David Thompson, Edward Ermintinger, Alexander Henry (the younger), Milton and Cheadle, Palliser and Hector. Family members were voyageurs, trappers, hunters and guides for these people, as well as clerks in the Fur Trade. I have also read books on and by priests such as Father Lacombe, Grandin, Demers, Blanchet, Provencher and Father De Smet, as these priests baptised, performed marriages of and worked with these people. My husband thought they were Cree descendants, however, we have since found out they were Iroquois. They migrated from Caughnawaga (nine miles from Montreal), into the West for the Fur Trade and married into the Cree/French, Nippissings, Sekani, Montagnais Nations and the Court Orielles.

The COURT ORIELLES, as I found out, are a tribe of Indians who migrated into the West from Michigan and Great Lakes area, for the purpose of hunting and trapping for the Fur Trade. They came into the West about 1790's. They spoke the Ottawa language (or Ojibway). It was not uncommon for the Indians to take their tribe names to use as their last names. The name Kwarakwanti had changed to Callihoo.

I would like to know if anyone has followed the NIPISSING family. I have bits and pieces of the Nipissing names but there are no connections made as to who belongs to who. In the very early Fur Trade days, there were Nipissings travelling with the CAMPION family, (especially old Joseph Campion m. to Marie Nipissing). In the book, "Czar of the Prairies", by J. G. MacGregor, old John Rowand's wife of the country, Louise Umphreville, had a son, - "Le Nipesanque, Mrs. Rowand's son, and Campion arrived with their hunts" - from George Linton's Lesser Slave Lake journal, winter of 1831. Then we have an Ignace Nipissing, my husband's fourth great-grandfather.

I also would like to inquire about the MILLET family. Would anyone have information pertaining to this name, especially from the Fur Trade days? I am looking for Louise Millet, late 1700's, early 1800's.

I am still busy sending out letters to find more information. I have also started receiving microfilm from the Hudson Bay Co. Archives in Winnipeg for further research. As you can see what turned out to be a hobby, can be a full-time job, but a job I enjoy.

I would like to give credit to the Provincial Archives of Alberta in Edmonton, the Historical Society of Alberta, Calgary, and especially the Jasper-Yellowhead Historical Society, Jasper, Alberta. If it was not for the Jasper Historical Society and their efforts, I would not have had most of this information in the first place.

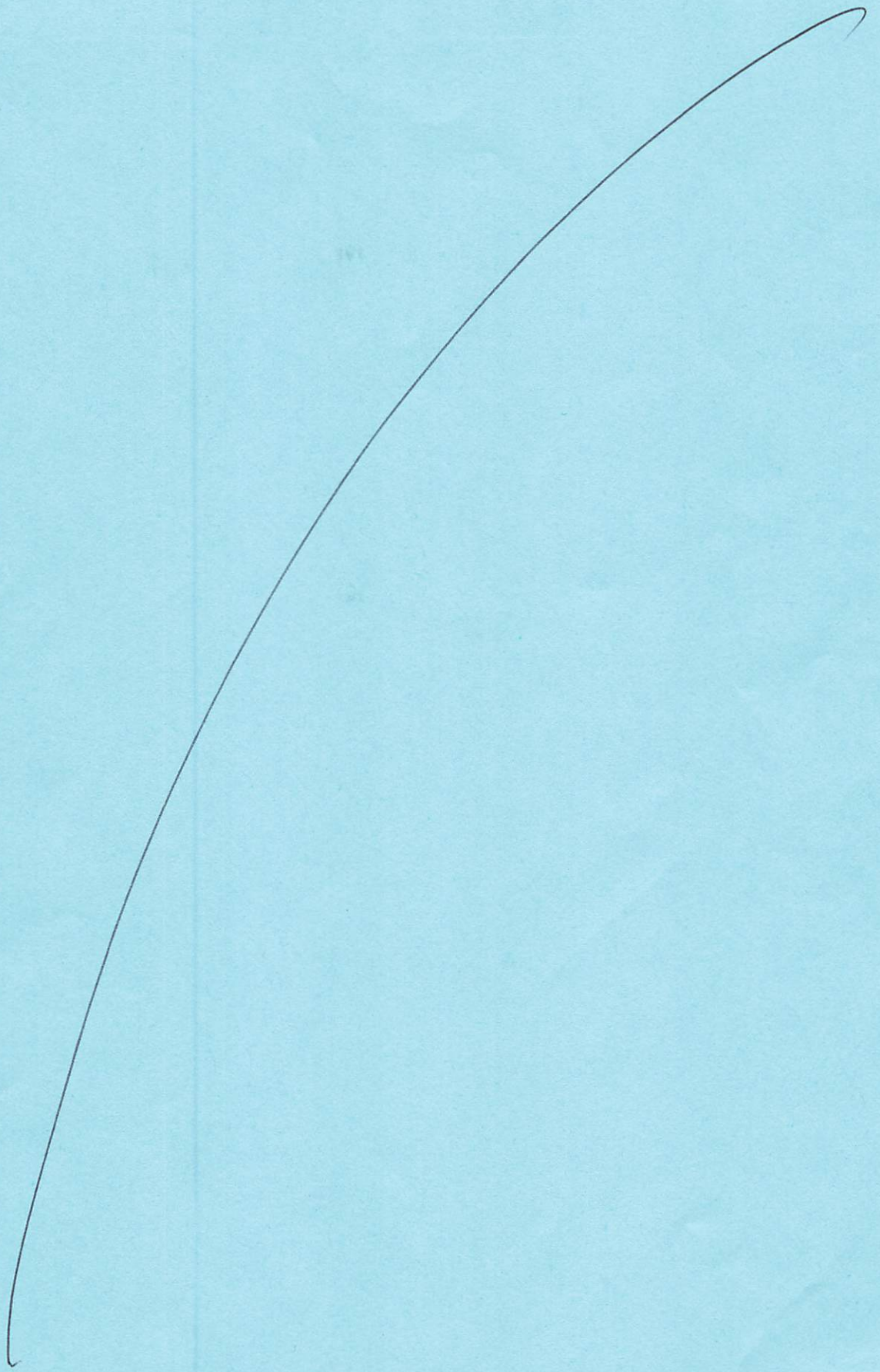

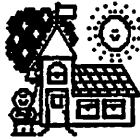

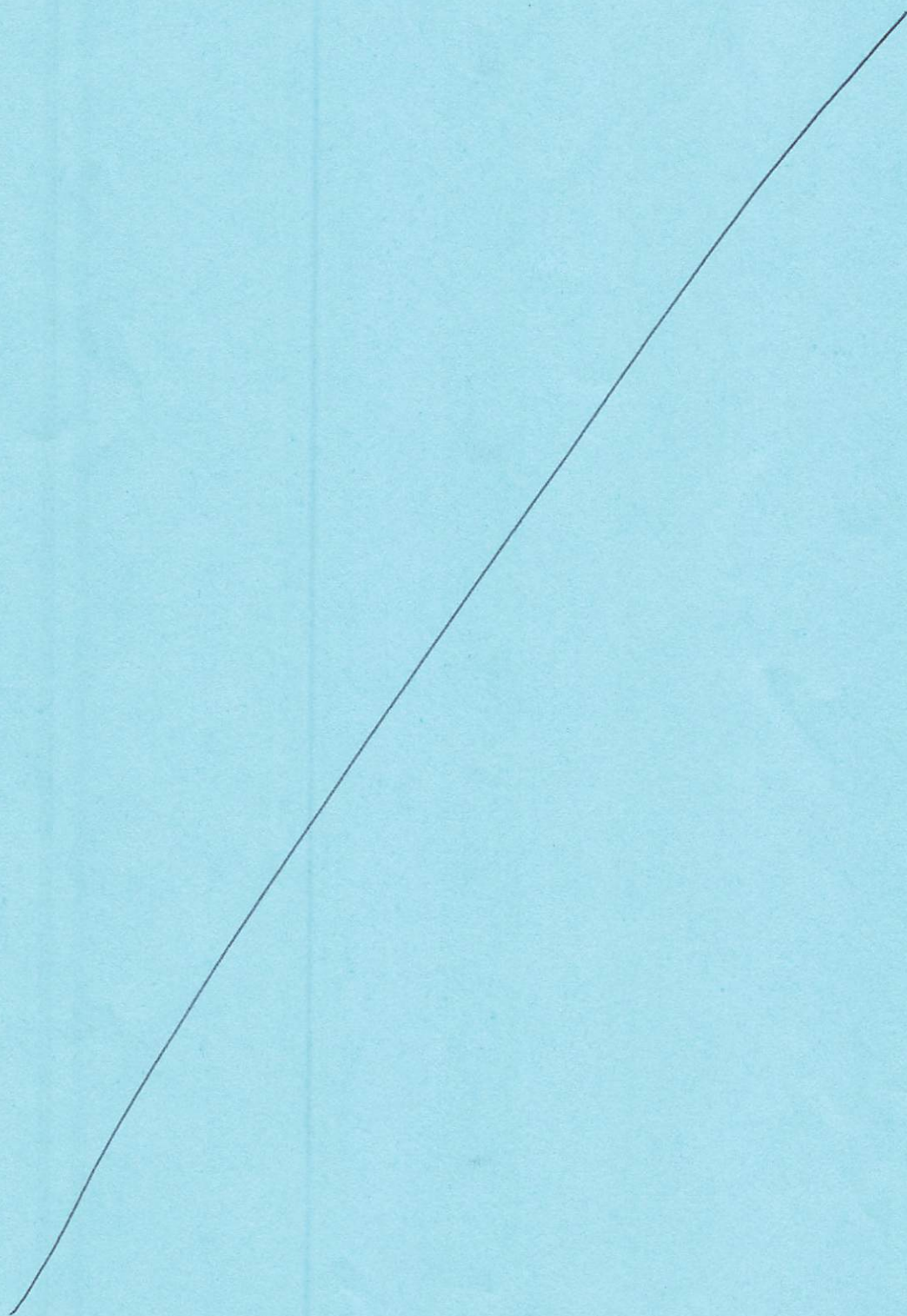

Entrants may submit more than one work; material must have been published in the preceding twenty-four months. Awards will be made at the Annual General Meeting of the Alberta Society of Archivists.

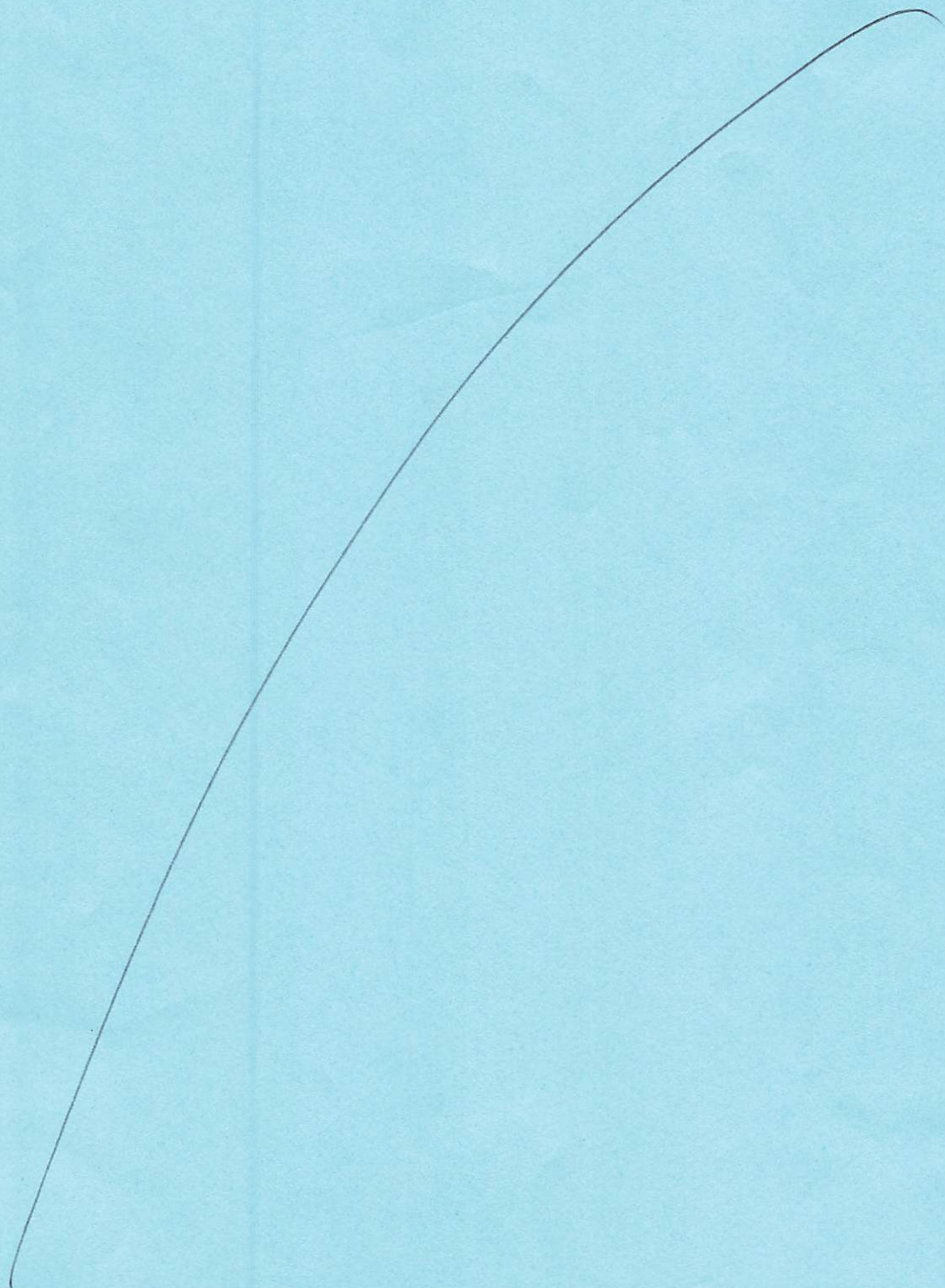

# GHOSTLY ADDRESSES - p 18

by Section Editor Carin Thomas



As we continue our exploration of ghostly addresses in the areas drained by the Battle River, we look north from BATTLE BEND (18-40-10-W4) toward the present day HARDISTY (6-43-9-W4). A few miles beyond, a tributary flows in from the west. Iron Creek has collected water from several yet smaller streams, the nearest coming through BELISHILL (32-41-11-W4). Another feeder stream comes from farther north, past PRAGUE (28-46-13-W4) and WAVY LAKE (SE22-46-13-W4) areas. Farther northeast, Vernon Lake and Grattan Creek flow in from

Kinsella, Irma, and HAWKINS (N-9-45-8-W4), which was on the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway in 1914. CLARK MANOR (SW-1-46-8-W4) is not far to the north. Downstream in township 46, range 5, Buffalo Coulee enters, and again from the west, from near COTTERVIEW (SE-18-49-8-W4 in 1914, but farther north by 1917), ZOLDEVARRA, (SW2-48-9-W4), SALTAUX (NE10-48-8-W4). and ORBINDALE (16-47-8-W4). BATTLEVIEW (SW10-47-6-W4) is along the main stream we are following.

Just where the Battle River has a major change in direction, to the south and east again, Grizzly Bear Coulee joins it from the north, with tributaries from CONNOLLY (SE10-49-6-W4), TOLLAND (NE16-48-5-W4), and WILDMERE (2-48-6-W4). Tributaries flow into the Battle from HINDVILLE (NW1-49-5-W4) area and VANESTA (SE6-48-4-W4). Several miles farther along the river, we find the sites of HOPE VALLEY (NW18-46-4-W4) off on the west, and SIDCUP (30-46-3-W4) nearby on the east.

Several miles farther along, the river is added to by a tiny stream from OXVILLE (10-46-2-W4). Then in the township 45, range 1, Ribstone creek enters from the areas to the south and southwest. The waters come from such sites as CASEYVILLE (4-37-9-W4), TALBOT (6-38-9-W4), LAKESEND (9-38-8-W4), KESSLER (3-39-8-W4), CRAIGMILLER (34-38-7-W4), PECKHAM (N12-39-7-W4), Czar, BUFFALOVIEW (NW10-42-6-W4, near the Dixon Lake in 1914, but SW6-42-5-W4 in 1917), through Ribstone Lake past RIBSTONE (30-43-2-W4), and near LEAHOLME (16-44-1-W4). PROSPECT VALLEY (NW6-45-1-W4) is not far away.

## BOUQUET TO IRMA

In 1981 Ted Johns, THEN president of the Red Deer branch of the A.G.S. suggested we organize the birth, marriage, death and in memoriam records from our daily paper. In future years this would be of immense benefit to people searching for their family ties.

At this point Irma Cameron, an active member of the branch (and the local stamp club, as well as librarian for her church library) volunteered to take on the challenge and suggested a five year project. She started with Jan 1, 1982 records and is now at the midway point with half the 1984 records done. This is how she handled the project.

Irma collects every copy of the Red Deer Advocate printed in the year, "rain or shine, holidays or not". She uses 365 business envelopes to file the announcements, which she clips from the days paper. She keeps a list of announcements so clippings are not repeated (announcements are sometimes repeated several times in following issues of the paper). She allows a "lag time" of 2-3 months before she makes the "printer's copy". Irma glues the clippings onto papers in order numerically and then alphabetically. She then compiles an index.

At this point the 1982 and 1983 books are both completed and a copy of each has been donated by the Red Deer branch to the following:

- Red Deer Museum and Archives
- Red Deer LDS Branch Genealogical Library
- Red Deer Centennial Public Library
- Red Deer Branch of A.G.S. Library
- Alberta Genealogical Society Library

We have had good comments and feedback in regards to this work and would recommend it as a good project for any or all of the branches of the A.G.S. And now, on behalf of the Red Deer branch members, I would like to give a big THANK YOU to IRMA for her hard work and dedication to this very worthwhile project.
