Pioneer: Magnus EDGAR – lived on Gabriola Island from 1852 until 1894 when he died.

Pioneer: George EDGAR and his wife Mary Ann ALEXCEE

George EDGAR was born at Port Simpson, BC in 1854. He married Mary Ann ALEXCEE, who was also born at Port Simpson in 1854. George died in Klemtu in 1931 and Mary Ann died in Prince Rupert in 1952.

Pioneer: Mark EDGAR and his wife Lilian JONES

Mark EDGAR was born in Port Simpson in 1878. He married Lilian JONES, daughter of Peter JONES and Matilda Ruth RANEY. Lilian was born in Port Simpson in 1885. Mark died in Prince Rupert in 1959 and Lilian died there in 1963.

Pioneer: Peter JONES and his wife Matilda Ruth RANEY

Peter JONES married Matilda Ruth RANEY in Port Simpson in 1884. Matilda was born in Port Simpson, date unknown, and died there in 1895. Peter died in a boat accident near Port Simpson in 1904.

John WRAY was born January 19, 1859 at Brigg, Lincolnshire, England to George WRAY and Emma BURTON. John was a schoolmaster in Lincolnshire. In 1884 he married Sarah Elizabeth TOMLINSON, the daughter of Charles and Harriet TOMLINSON. She had been born at Scawby, Lincolnshire on January 12,1860. Children of John and Sarah:

In 1893 the family moved fifty miles north to Nelson Island near Pender Harbour, first living at Hidden Bay and the Quarry Bay. Their next child was born:

died: 1990, buried at Gibsons, BC

Still undecided on where to settle, they moved a few miles to Pender Harbour. At that time Irvines Landing in Pender Harbour was a post settlement named after Charles IRVINE, the merchant and postmaster. There were few white people and Sarah spent two years there in the wilderness without seeing another white woman. Their two youngest children were born there:

married: John EDMOND

Walter born 1900

married: Bertha Ellen MANAHAN

died: 1974, buried in Forest View Cemetery, Pender

Harbour, BC

In 1906 John WRAY applied for an original Crown Grant and preempted the 160 acre property near Fearney Point in Agamemnon Channel on Nelson Island. Fish and game were plentiful. They had poultry, and orchard and berries. In later years, John was a lineman for Dominion Telephone. He kept in daily with **Tom BRAZIL**, on Hardy Island, who also had a telephone.

Reading from the bible each night was a ritual that gave them strength. The Wrays lived on Nelson Island until John's death in 1941. Sarah moved to Pender Harbour and passed away in 1951. Both are buried in Forest View Cemetery in Pender Harbour.

Pioneer: James Bain THOMSON

He worked with his father in clearing a site of the first BC paper mill at Alberni and also in his father's General Store at River Bend, Alberni.





Pioneer: W.E. "William Emerson" LAKING and his wife Barbara McFERRAN

W.E. "William Emerson" LAKING was born in 1862. He came to BC in 1887 from Ontario and fished in the Fraser River out of New Westminster. In 1893 he settled in Surrey, living there for eighteen years before moving to Langley. William had returned to Halton County, Ontario in 1897 to marry Barbara Amy McFERRAN.

He had been a lumberman in Surrey and Langley. His Surrey mill, that originally cut lumber and later shingles, was located where the present day Fair Grounds site.

William died in 1953.

Pioneer: J.W. "John Walter" BERRY

J.W. "John Walter" BERRY was born is 1869. He came to BC from Bruce County, Ontario in 1897 with his wife and two small children. They traveled on the Fraser to Fort Langley in a boat that carried passengers, cattle, lumber and hay. At Fort Langley he became a partner in the General Store of Coulter-Berry. A second store was later opening in Murrayville.

For nineteen years he drove the mail cart between Fort Langley and Murrayville and for several years had a freight service hauling farm produce from the Valley into Vancouver. In 1900 he established Belmont Dairy Farm in Langley. It is still operated today by the Berry Family.

John was one of the founders of the Fraser Valley Milk Producers Assn., serving as a director and the second President. He traveled as an auctioneer, was a municipal clerk, chairman of the Langley School Board, and a one time Reeve.

In 1929, John entered the BC Legislature as M.L.A., retiring in 1933. He died in 1943, survived by his wife Lydia, sons: Harry, Thomas and Jack, and daughter Anne.

Pioneer: Joseph Charles BISHOP, wife and son

Joseph Charles BISHOP was born circa 1851 in England to William Branson BISHOP and Elizabeth HAWKES. He married Mary Adelaide SAGE possibly in Brantford, Ontario. Mary was born 1859 in Ontario.

Mary was related to Walter N. SAGE who became the head of the History Department at UBC. Joseph's half sister, Millie, married Tome

WILLIAMS, a meat merchant who owned much of Sea Island.

Mary died Nov 9, 1901 of Bright's disease in Vancouver. Joseph died July 21, 1913 at Mount Baker, Washington State while on a mountaineering expedition. Both are buried in Mountain View Cemetery. Son Walter married Alice Maude GRIFFITHS in 1902. He died on June 20, 1940 in Vancouver.

Walter Branson BISHOP born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1877, the son of Joseph Emerson BISHOP and his wife Mary Adelaide SAGE. He married Alice Maude GRIFFITHS in 1902. Amram REEVES was born February 19, 1928, Swindon, Wilts, Leeds, England. He came to Canada with his parents in 1843. They settled in the County of Norfolk, Ontario. In 1858, he married Frances "Fanny" PRICE in St. Williams, Norfolk County, Ontario. She was born April 10, 1840 in St. Williams, Ontario, the daughter of James PRICE and his wife Emma OAKES. Amrum and Fanny had eleven children:

Amrum and Fanny came to BC in 1874 with seven children and settled on a large section of land in Cheam, BC, which is 6 miles east of Chilliwack. They farmed there very successfully. They lived on a log house as first then had a large new house built.

Amrum won many prizes at the Chilliwack Fair, winning first for a

special Rose and for his Chevalier Barley. He was a well respected liked man. He died at home on November 24, 1902. He is buried in the family plot in the Chilliwack Cemetery. Fanny died October 27, 1921 in Chilliwack and is also buried in the family plot.

Pioneer: Esther Gertrude REEVES and husband Henry "Harry" READ

Esther Gertrude REEVES was born March 2, 1864 in Ontario to Amrum REEVES and his wife Frances PRICE. In 1874, she traveled with the family to Cheam, BC. She married Edward WILBY on December 25, 1880. Edward died six months later when he fell from a scaffold.

In 1884, she married Henry "Harry" Thomas READ. Henry was born December 12, 1854 at Lambeth, England to Henry Thomas READ Sr. and his wife Harriet Eliza BAILEY. He was the youngest of five children. Harry left school at an early age. He became a proficient cook and it is said that Queen Victoria requested his Christmas pudding recipe after he made the puddings for her.

Harry left England with the Ringling Brothers Circus as leader of their band and filling on as a clown. In 1882 he left the circus and settled in New Westminster, BC. He found work at the Tom Trapp Hardware and Auctioneering Co. Esther and Harry had three children:

child: Esther Bernice born Sept, 2, 1904, Cheam, BC married: Walter PAINTER (he died 6 months after marriage) married: Roy Leonard SCOULLAR, Nov. 8, 1916, Seattle, Washington

child: Albert born May 3, 1919, Seattle, Washington died: June 23, 1982, Penticton, BC

(grew up in New Westminster and Chilliwack. In 1906 she traveled to Alaska where she worked in a corset factory and then was a secretary for a fur buyer. She had a keen wit and told wonderful stories of her adventures.)

Jessie born June 26, 1886, New Westminster

died: 1887 at seven months

Albert Amrum born April 18, 1887, New Westminster, BC

married: Dolly

died June 19, 1917, France (WW II)

Harry was a member of the Masonic Lodge. He played in the first New Westminster Hyack Band in the percussion section and wind instruments. In 1889, he owned the H.T. Read and Co. Hardware and Jewelry Store, situated in the Masonic Block on Columbia Street. He traveled to England for stock and to visit his family. He had just returned and stocked his store when a fire wiped

out his and many other businesses. He rebuilt and again was wiped out by the New Westminster Fire of 1898. It was then that he returned to cooking and traveled by river boat on the Fraser with the survey crews who were surveying the central and northern areas of BC. He was also a cook for the C.P.R. when they were surveying for the Trans-Canada Railway. Harry and Esther divorced in 1904 and in 1905 she married William DAVIS. She died December 26, 1939 and is buried in the Reeves Family Plot in Chilliwack, BC. Harry died in his sleep on December 3, 1949 in Vancouver, BC and is buried along side his daughter Jessie in the IOOF section of the Fraser Cemetery in New Westminster.

Pioneer: SGT. William McCOLL

William McCOLL was born May 24, 1819, in Scotland. As a young man he joined the Corps of the Royal Engineers of England. As a surveyor of the Corps he traveled extensively in England and Ireland making topographical surveys and was soon promoted to Senior Surveyor. He married Ann BAISLEY in England circa 1850/51. They had:

William was chosen to serve in BC with the Royal Engineers, sailing from Southampton on the ship *La Planta* on September 2, 1858, arriving in Victoria October 29, 1958. The family followed on the ship *Thames City* on October 10, 1858 traveling via Cape Horn taking six months. As senior surveyor, he and his men did extensive surveying of the Fort Langley area as well as the Fort. When the Fort was destroyed by fire, his map was used to rebuild it. He laid out the towns of New Westminster, Hope, Yale, Quesnel and Barkerville. He surveyed north of Spuzzum and Chapmans Bar. He recommended a site one mile south of Chapmans Bar for the Alexandra Bridge. He laid out the trail from Hope to Princeton and surveyed the original town of Princeton.

When the Royal Engineers returned to England in 1863, he elected to stay in BC with his wife and six children. With George TURNER, William started a survey company. As there were so many others with the same idea, he moved to Yale and was a toll taker on the Alexandra Bridge. He died in Yale on June 3, 1865 and is buried in the IOOF section of the Fraser Cemetery in New Westminster. Ann moved to New Westminster and took in sewing to support her family. In 1869, Ann married George TURNER. He had also been a Royal Engineer. They had three children. Ann died on February 15, 1913 in New Westminster and is buried near William and beside George.

Pioneer: William McCOLL Jr.

William McCOLL Jr was born in Northampton, England on March 10, 1852, the son of William McCOLL and his wife Ann BAISLEY. He traveled with his mother and sisters from England to BC in 1858 to join his father who was serving with the Columbia Detachment Royal Engineers.

William married Susan E. MACLURE, the daughter of John MACLURE, R.E. she was born in Ireland in 1858 and came of the same ship as the McCOLL family. In the 1891 census tow children are listed with them: Marsha 3 and Kenneth 2. there is also a child, Wallace Stanley buried with William in the Fraser Cemetery. William died June 13, 1907.

Pioneer: Mary Ann McCOLL

Mary Ann McCOLL was born on November 6, 1854 at "Richmond" in Yorkshire, England, the first daughter of William McCOLL R.E. and his wife Ann BAISLEY, She has traveled on the ship *Thames City* arriving in Victoria in 1859 with her mother and siblings.

She married **Hugh BOYD** in 1873 in New Westminster. Hugh was born in 1842 in County Down, Ireland and had arrived in BC April 15, 1862. They sailed down the Fraser to make their home near the mouth of the river. The few families in the area gathered at the Boyd home to decide on a name for their settlement. May Ann was asked to give a name and she suggested "Richmond" after her birthplace. Hugh was the first Reeve of Richmond. He and Mary Ann had eight children. Hugh took his family back to Ireland in 1887. He died on November 22, 1931 and Mary Ann did January 28, 1952, both in Bangor, Ireland.

Pioneer: Helen McCOLL and her husband Edwin Sayre SCOULLAR

Helen McCOLL was born March 7, 1856 in Dumfrieshire, Scotland, the second daughter of William McCOLL and his wife Ann BAISLEY. At the age of fourteen, Helen was the first May Queen of New Westminster. On October 8, 1883, Helen married Edwin Sayre SCOULLAR in the Holy Trinity Church in New

Westminster

Edwin was born November 7, 1856, St. John, New Brunswick, the son of Andrew W. SCOULLAR and his wife **Annie B. SAYRE**. He arrived in Victoria with his brother Andrew in 1878, and a year later they moved to New Westminster where he opened his own General Hardware Store. Helen and Edwin had four children.

Edwin built his second Hardware Store on Cordova and Water Streets in Vancouver in 1885 with his brother in charge. The store was burned out in the Vancouver fire of 1886. He immediately rebuilt the store at the same location. Throughout his years in New Westminster he was involved in enterprises furthering the growth of that city. In 1883 it was the installation of the first telephone line. He was a promoter and director of the New Westminster Woollen Mills. He advanced funds for the building of the Masonic and Oddfellows Block. He was a director of the New Westminster Southern Railroad, and the New Westminster and Vancouver Short Line. He was elected to the city council. Edwin was also a senior partner of A. Turnbull & Co., who built the Provincial Court Houses in Vancouver and New Westminster. They moved to Vancouver in 1898, his growing business now including tin smithing.

Helen died in 1919 in Vancouver and was buried in the Holy Trinity section of the Fraser Cemetery, New Westminster. Edwin died in Vancouver on March 14, 1936 and is buried in Mountain View Cemetery.

Pioneer: Andrew William SCOULLAR

Andrew William SCOULLAR was born in 1854 in St. John, New Brunswick to Andrew William SCOULLAR Sr. and Annie SAYRE. He traveled with his brother Edwin Sayre SCOULLAR to BC across the USA, arriving in Victoria in 1878. The y moved to New Westminster in 1879 where he worked fro his brother in his General Hardware Store. When Edwin branched out into Vancouver, Andrew managed the store there for him. He nearly lost his life a year later during the Vancouver Fire of 1886 when he tried to save the business's papers. Along with others, he built a raft and escaped to Moodyville. He continued to manage the store when it was rebuilt.

In 1891, he became an alderman on the Vancouver City council. He worked of the City of Vancouver as a Plumping Inspector in 1894. From 1898 to 1912 he was a Customs Officer. Andrew married Mary B. ?? and had two daughters; Margaret and Louise. Andrew died in 1913 in Alberni, BC.

Pioneer: George TURNER

George TURNER was born in London, England on Sept 17, 1836 to Helena and George TURNER. He joined the Royal Engineers in 1855 at the age of nineteen. He eventually became a Lance-Corporal. He volunteered to serve in BC, arriving in April of 1859. Most of his work with the R.E. was under the command of Sgt. William McCOLL. He elected to stay in BC upon the disbandment of the Royal Engineers in 1863. He joined with William McCOLL is a land surveying firm. There was not enough work to provide for them all so they dissolved their partnership to seek other work.

In 1869, four years after the death of William McCOLL, George married Ann Baisley McCOLL, William's widow, taking on the responsibility of raising her six children. They started a homestead on the Matsqui Prairie. They later returned to live in New Westminster where they had three children:

Annie Helena born February 10, 1876, New Westminster, BC

married: Joseph R. GRANT

George became a very respected man for his work as a surveyor around the lower mainland of BC. Many of the surveys that he did was what is now downtown Vancouver. He located and surveyed Yale Road from New Westminster to Hope, and in the 1900's around Vancouver and a road allowance in Vancouver Island from Cowichan to the Nanaimo River.

In 1892 George helped organize the Provincial Land Surveyors. He died

Some Early Richmond, B.C. Landowners by Maureen Hyde

The following names were on a map of Richmond, British Columbia which listed some early Crown Grant Acquisitions and where they were located. Since there were only surnames on the map, I determined to find more information on them. Some names were very familiar since these men went on to become mayors, councillors, etc. You will note repeats of some of the names but that is because some of them held more than one tract of land. Moreover, this list is not a complete list of early Richmond homeowners as will be seen by further names noted in the two books listed as sources and other information found in the City of Richmond Archives and the Richmond Library. No doubt some names are missing.

It is rather interesting that the naming of Richmond was claimed by two Richmond residents. Hugh McRoberts claimed it was named after their former home in New South Wales, a little town near Parramatta. Mrs. Boyd claimed the municipality was named in honour of her birthplace and for using her home as town hall.

COME CELEBRATE A CENTENNIAL

The City of Lethbridge had its beginnins in 1869 when a whiskey trading outpost named Fort Whoop-Up was constructed 6.5 km south of present day Lethbridge, at the confluence of the St. Mary and Old Man rivers. In 1870, Nicholas Sheran arrived in this area, and in 1874 began a ferry operation near the Fort. During his spare time Sheran grubbed coal and later moved to a site down river called "Coal Banks" where a five-foot coal seam was exposed. In 1882, the first large scale coal mining operation in Alberta commenced at "Coal Banks" under the direction of the North Western Coal and Navigation Co., formed in England by Sir Alexander Tilloch Galt, the Canadian High Commissioner in London.

The first Galt mine — a drift mine, was opened by Mines Superintendent, William Stafford, on 13 Oct 1882. By 11 Dec 1882 coal was being taken from the mine and within a few months 22,000 tons had been sold to Fort Macleod. William Lethbridge was named as the Company's first president.

On 25 Aug 1885 the newly-organized Alberta Railway and Coal Company completed its narrow gauge railway from Lethbridge to Dunmore, on the CPR main line. With Transportation assured, the company began to recruit miners from the eastern United States. By the end of October, Lethbridge had over 60 building including six stores, five hotels with saloons, four billiard rooms, two barber shops, and a livery stable. On 15 Oct 1885 "Coal Banks" was renamed in honor of William Lethbridge.

Since the late 1800's agriculture has become the mainstay of the local economy. Charles A. Magrath became the first mayor and was instrumental in the development of irrigation in Southern Alberta. Lethbridge today holds the distinction of being the "Irrigation Capital of Canada". The city has the honor of being home to a Research Station, the largest regional agricultural research facility in Canada. It also has the University of Lethbridge, the Lethbridge Community College, the Bowman Arts Centre, the Public Library and the Japanese Gardens.

Some of the major events to held this year in conjunction with the centennial include a Centennial History Conference at the University (28 Feb to 2 Mar). The University will produce and present a video of the conference to the City. The fourth week in July (21 -28) has been chosen for the Lethbridge Centennial Homecoming week. There will be street dances, outdoor concerts and picnics for all ages. Included in this week will also be the Homecoming Strawberry Tea (22 Jul) sponsored by the Lethbridge Senior Citizens.

Centennial Week (22-28 Sep) will be a major event with the official reopenings of both the Galt Museum and Fort Whoop-Up. Centennial Day (24 Sep) has been chosen as the Civic Holiday.

The City of Lethbridge extends a warm welcome to everyone to come and help celebrate its 100th birthday. Please come and share in the excitement.

CEMETERY RECORDING

If you're looking outside your window I'm sure that cemetery recording is the last thing you will be thinking of. Actually it is a year-round process. In the good weather, we record the headstones and then in the winter, preferably in front of a fire we compile the information from burial registers or area history books.

I have recorded about 100 cemeteries and still find it very interesting. My husband accused me of spending more time with the dead than the living and I pleaded guilty to the charge. As soon as the snow disappears I will once again be travelling the many backroads of Alberta.

We have made reasonable progress in recording cemeteries in the past five years. To date we have published about 75. (See list at back of issue. Ed.) As well as those we have over 100 recorded cemeteries on hand waiting to be published. The AGS has applied for an Alberta Culture grant to help finance the publishing of cemeteries.

Our main concern as members of AGS is not with the publishing but the recording. There are still many inactive and deserted cemeteries for us to discover on a Sunday drive in the country. Always be prepared with your pen, paper and insect repellent.

I would like to make an appeal to our members-at-large. The members of our seven branches cannot begin to cover the vast distances in this province. We especially need recorders in the northern, eastern and extreme western parts of Alberta. Before recording check with me to see if the cemetery has already been recorded. Please do not hesitate to write to me for information.

I have a card file of all names listed in the cemeteries published by AGS. I would be glad to assist any members with inquiries. SASE please.
