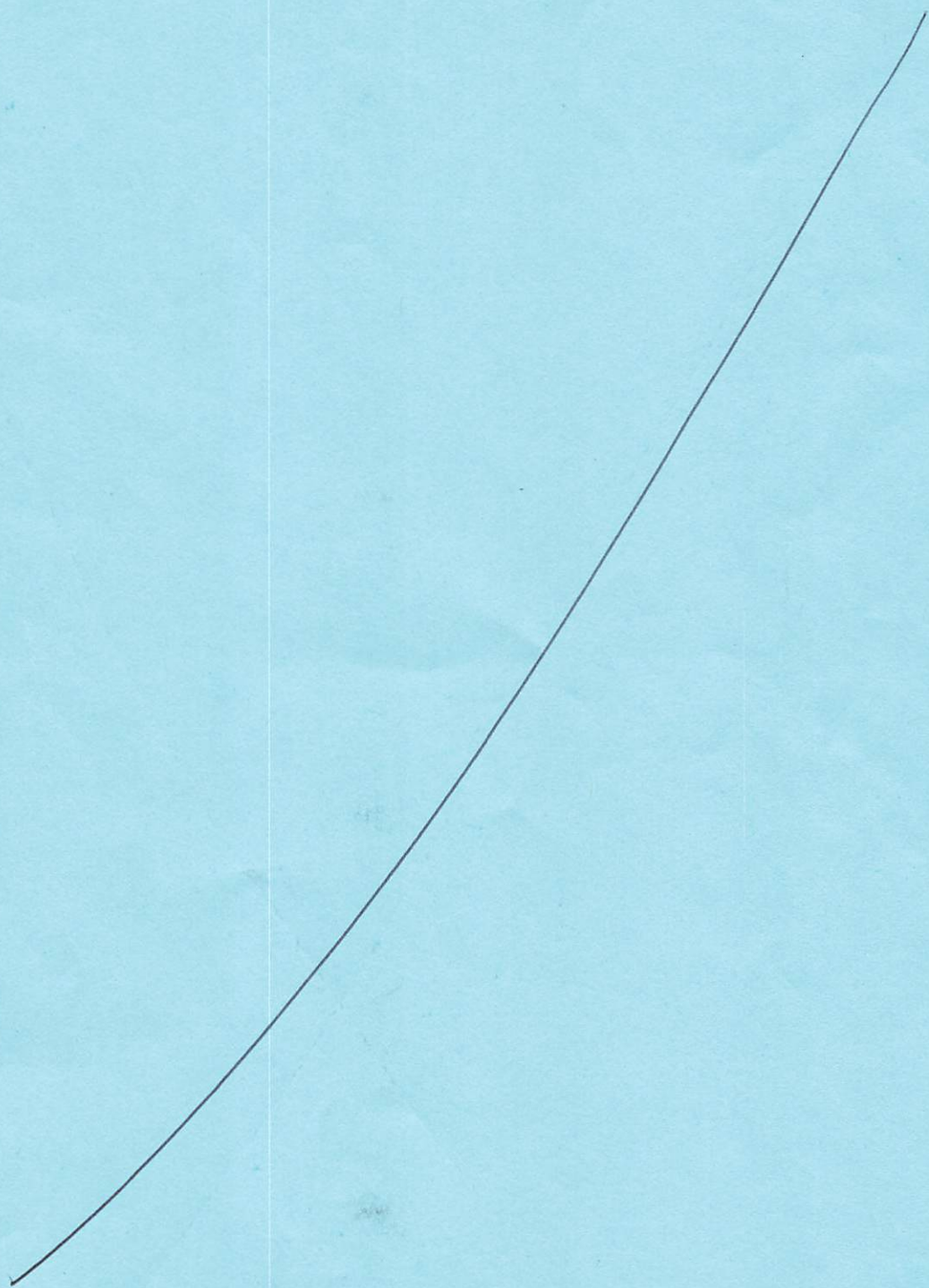

KINLEY, William Thomas: died January 7th at Vancouver B.C., husband of Alice Kinley, and eldest son of the late Thomas and Margaret Kinley, Mount Pleasant, Port St. Mary.

KILLIP, John Thomas (Rev.): died at his home in Paxton, Illinois, on December 26th at the age of 93. Surviving are his wife, Anna Marie; 2 sons, Wilfred of Robert, Illinois and Dr. Merrill H. of Dixon, Illinois; a brother James in Florida; two grandchildren and five great-grandchildren; nieces and nephews. A daughter died in childhood. Rev. Killip was born in Sulby, Isle of Man and came to the States at the age of 22 to settle in Galva. He

graduated from Hedding College, Abingdon, Illinois in 1894 and at the time of his death was the oldest member of the Central Illinois Methodist Conference. He also was the oldest member of the Peoria Manx Association. He served many Illinois churches during his ministry, retiring to Paxton, in 1931.

KEWLEY, Francis James: "Fell 1000 Feet" - a recently appointed labour magistrate of Wallasey, Cheshire was the victim of a terrible accident on Langdale Pike, Cumberland, on Thursday last. Apparently, Mr. Kewley lost his bearings in the mist and had fallen nearly a thousand feet. His neck was broken. From his name we presume the deceased was a Manxman, but we have no direct information on this point.

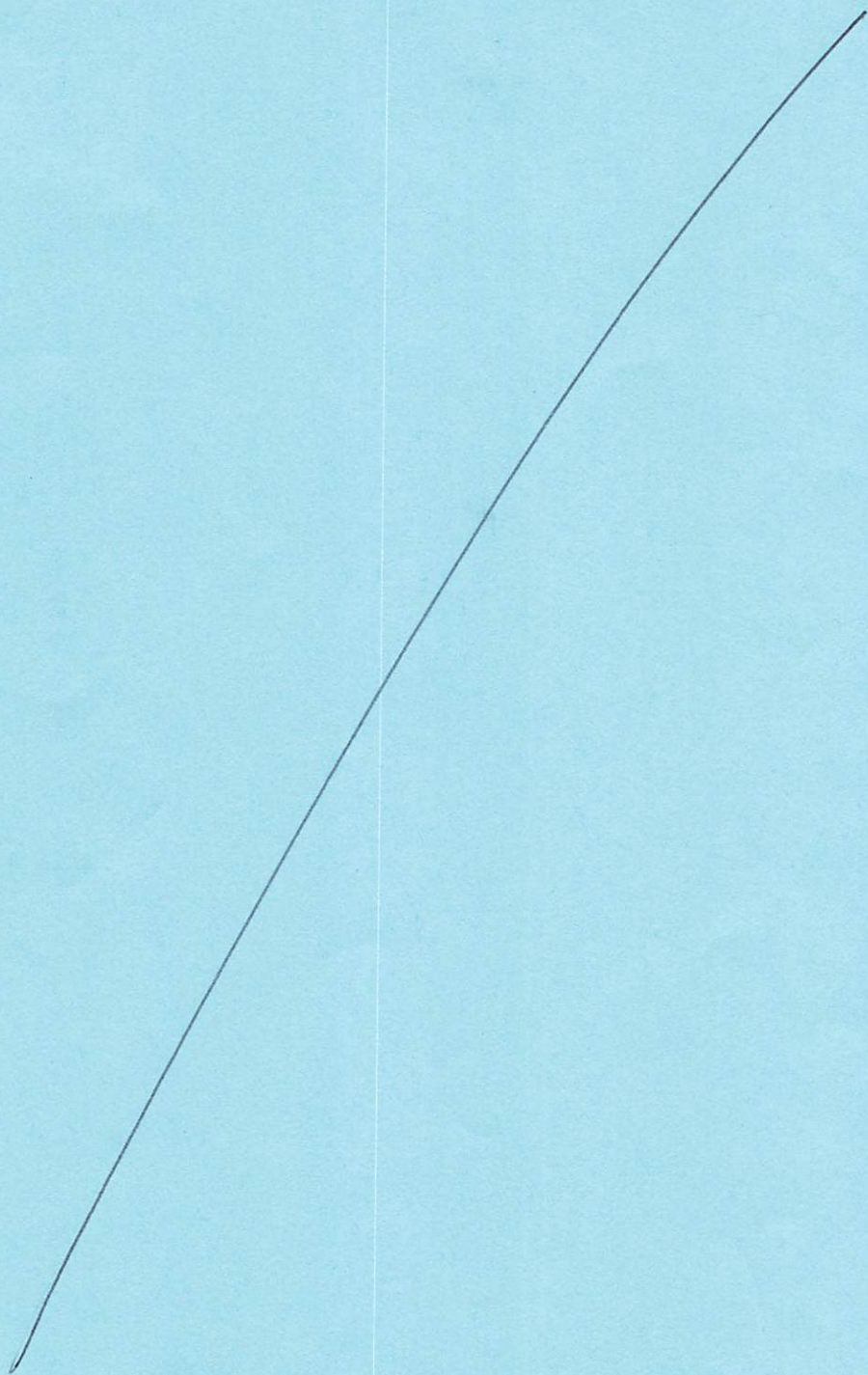

with the successful "SS Great Britain" Project. The Western Australian Maritime Museum also put in a similar proposal, as they wished to restore the 'Edwin Fox' in the Swan River, Western Australia. It would appear however, that the Ship will be staying in New Zealand for the time being.

The idea of the Convict Register was born of a suggestion by the Royal Jubilee and Prince's Trusts that I might like to form a U.K. based society which could promote the aims of, and seek to raise funds for, the Restoration Society in New Zealand. I put the idea to the Restoration Society and, as I was to try to raise money on their behalf, asked them to let me have details on their plans for restoration, how much it would cost, together with how much financial assistance had already been secured. Unfortunately at that time the Society appeared to be undergoing some reformation and whilst they indicated in their reply that a U.K. society would be welcome, they didn't make available any information. I therefore felt that I could not raise public money on their behalf since questions were being asked that I was unable to answer and I therefore decided that entry to the Convict Register would be free of any charge. Regrettably this means that there are no funds to forward to the Restoration Society.

However, with preparations for the Australian Bicentennial Celebrations well under way I don't want to 'miss the boat', hence the publicity for the Convict Register. I do hope that you will be able to give it your support because without British response the Register will fail.

To date we have 84 convict entries with one possible connection (confirmation eagerly awaited as we go to press!). Australian Family History Societies appear to be organising 'Descendants of Convicts' Groups who are eager to find their roots in Britain. The Convict Register could at least go part-way toward helping them in their search; any success depends entirely on a two-way participation.
