New Englanders in the West Indies

The importance of the sea to the New England economy and patterns of international trade jointly created a strong connection between New England and the West Indies. There seem to have been five principal reasons for the sizeable migration of New Englanders to the West Indies (and the lesser migration of West Indians to New England): occupation (usually as mariner or merchant), war or civil unrest (Loyalists escaping the American Revolution; French refugees fleeing the effects of the French Revolution or the uprisings in St. Domingue), education (100% in New England), family (joining a spouse or other relatives), and health (often a fatal reason).

For this series I have listed a reasonable number of New Englanders in the West Indies and West Indians in New England, all before 1850. For families like the Vassalls with connections that continued for several generations, I have shown only the earliest generation. Many entries below are records of marriages or deaths, and for most of them I have made no effort to pursue further genealogical data. Some potential entries were intentionally omitted, and a few classes of entries I have barely touched on (diplomats, soldiers, French refugees, black sailors). Entries from New England sources with indexes of places have usually been included; however, many deaths from Providence, R.I., newspapers have been omitted as many New England men died in the West Indies. I have simplified some of the entries by omitting details such as occupations and specific locations on smaller islands.

Most of the locations in the West Indies are self-explanatory, with one exception. Place names on the island of Hispaniola (now divided between Haiti and the Dominican Republic) have not been identified; they are Port-au-Prince, Aux Cayes, Cap Haiti, Cap François, and Cap St. Nicolas Mole. Haiti was formerly St. Domingue, usually referred to as St. Domingo.

Robert Abbott, of St. Croix, married Boston by 22 June 1819 Jane Ann (Hooper) Blakely, mother of *Udney Maria Blakely* [1].

John Adams, of Boston, died Martinique in or before Dec. 1789 [2].

Richard Allen, of Manchester, New England, made a will dated 22 Nov. 1717, proved Barbados 15 Feb. 1717/18 [3].

Robert S. Allen, son of Elisha Allen, of Middletown, R.I., died Puerto Rico 10 July 1811, in 25th year [4].

Abel Alleyne, baptized Barbados 16 Feb. 1698/99, son of Reynold and Elizabeth Isabella (Gay) Alleyne, married Barbados 16 July 1719 Mary Woodbridge, daughter of *Dudley* and *Jane (Mead) Woodbridge* (qq.v.). He moved to Mass. in 1739, settling in Braintree. He died between 10 Oct. 1744 and

18 Sept. 1747, probably on Barbados. She died between 3 June 1775 and 16 Oct. 1781, probably at Braintree [5].

Christopher Almy, bachelor, born R.I., married St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church 3 Sept. 1747 Catharina Haley, spinster, born Saba [6].

Peleg Almy, born 25 Oct. 1709, son of Job and Bridget (Sanford) Almy, of Tiverton, R.I., died 18 Feb. 1734, in 25th year, buried Barbados [7].

Edward Anderson, born Falmouth, New England, had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 22 Dec. 1780 [8].

Joseph Andrews, of Dighton, Mass., died Barbados 12 Mar. 1803 [9].

John Angell, of Providence and Baltimore, died Port-au-Prince 6 Sept. 1822, in 25th year [10].

Thomas B. Angell, son of Thomas Angell of Providence, died Martinique 5 Dec. 1818, age 24 [11].

John Anthony, of Providence, died Pointe-à-Pitre, Guadeloupe 23 July 1811, in 23rd year [12].

Robert Apthorp, son of Charles and Grizzell (Eastwick) Apthorp, of Boston, died Kingston, Jamaica 16 Mar. 1768, age 23, buried there [13].

Stephen Apthorp, son of Charles and Grizzell (Eastwick) Apthorp, of Boston, died 1769, age 30, buried Kingston, Jamaica [14].

William Rice Apthorp, born Boston 8 May 1772, son of William and Mary (Thompson) Apthorp, and nephew of Robert and Stephen Apthorp. He died St. Thomas prior to February 1800, when probate on his estate was granted to his brother [15].

Thomas Archer, of Barbados, made a will dated 4 June 1717, proved Barbados 20 June 1717, mentioning wife Anne Archer in New England [16].

Jonathan Armstrong, born Farmouth [near Boston], had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 3 Jan. 1781 [17].

George Arnold, son of Job Arnold of Coventry, R.I., died St. Thomas in or before May 1799, in 24th year [18].

William Atherton, of Jamaica, married R.I. 13 Dec. 1784 Sarah (Brenton) Wanton, born 27 Aug. 1751, daughter of Jahleel and Mary (Neargrass) Brenton, of Newport. She died 19 July 1787 [19].

William Audinet, of Guadeloupe, married Mary Catherine _____. He died Newport 27 June 1807, age 68; she died there Oct. 1807, in 80th year (sic) [20].

Samuel Babson, born Cape Ann, Mass., died St. Eustatius 13 May 1793, age 27 [21].

John Warren Bailey, of North Kingstown, R.I., died St. Pierre, Martinique 7 Feb. 1817, age 21 [22].

Robert Balderick, lately of Barbados, but in Boston, New England, made a will recorded on Barbados 9 June 1716 [23].

Benjamin Ball, baptized Barbados 7 Apr. 1716, son of Guy and Catherine (___) Ball, Harvard 1738, perhaps the Benjamin Ball whose will was proved on Barbados in 1766 [24].

George Ball, baptized Barbados 7 Apr. 1716, son of Guy and Catherine (_____) Ball, Harvard 1734, presumably

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returned to Barbados, perhaps the George Ball who died Dominica 1781 [25].

Benjamin Barber, from New London, age 50, buried Port-au-Prince 29 Mar. 1792 [26].

John Barnes, born about 1681, son of William Barnes of Antigua; in New England in 1727 but returned to Antigua by 4 Jan. 1732 when he married **Anne Roach** there [27].

John Baptiste Barrier, a native of Newburyport, Mass., died Port-au-Prince in or before Mar. 1789, age 22 [28].

Hannah Bartlett, daughter of William and Mary (Andrews) Bartlett, of Marblehead, Mass., married (1) Salem, Mass. 30 Oct. 1738 William Heyliger, son of Nicholas Heyliger, of St. Eustatius. She married (2) St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church 29 Sept. 1754 William Heyliger, born St. Eustatius 11 Apr. 1713, son of Pieter and Maria (Waters) Heyliger, merchant in Boston 1750. He died about 1766. As Hannah Heyliger, widow, she left a will on St. Croix dated 9 Jan. 1794, confirmed 26 Feb. 1796 [29].

Cornelius Durant Battelle, born Dedham, Mass. 28 Dec. 1776, son of Ebenezer and Anna (Durant) Battelle, and brother of Thomas Battelle. He joined his uncle *Cornelius Durant* in business on St. Croix, where he married Sarah Gordon [30].

Thomas Battelle, born Dedham, Mass. 17 Aug. 1780, son of Ebenezer and Anna (Durant) Battelle, and brother of Cornelius Durant Battelle. He moved to St. Croix where he married 5 May 1807 Anne Dashwood Lewis, born 1783, daughter of Francis and Elizabeth (Ludlow) Lewis. She died 1856, he died 1867 [31].

William Bennett, of R.I., died 4 June 1750, in 34th year, buried St. Eustatius [32].

Henry Bishop, son of Demas Bishop, of Providence, died St. Croix in or before May 1805, in 22nd year [33].

Lemuel Bishop, son of Lemuel Bishop, of Providence, died St. Domingo 26 Dec. 1806, age 25 [34].

Udney Maria Blakely, born Boston 10 Nov. 1814, d. 2 Mar. 1842, daughter of Captain Johnston Blakely, U.S. Navy, and his wife, *Jane Ann Hooper*, and stepdaughter of *Robert Abbott*, married St. John's Anglican Church, Christiansted, St. Croix 19 May 1841 Baron Joseph von Bretton, M.D., born 28 Nov. 1797, baptized St. Croix Reformed Dutch Church 14 Feb. 1798, son of Lucas Uytendaele, Baron von Bretton, and his wife Maria Charlotte Maas. He was buried St. John's Anglican Church Cemetery 7 Feb. 1882, age 83 [35].

Joseph Borden, born Portsmouth, R.I. 3 July 1643, son of Richard and Joan (Fowle) Borden, married (1) Hope _____. About 1675 they moved to Barbados where he married (2) Ann _____, who was a widow by 10 Dec. 1693 [36].

John Boss, born in Roddelam (sic), Rhode Island, age 23, buried Port-au-Prince 12 Apr. 1792 [37].

James Bourne, born Warren, R.I., resident of New York, died St. Barts 15 Apr. 1821 [38].

Joseph S. Bowen, of Providence, died St. Domingo 23 July 1821 [39].

Lloyd Bowers, of Somerset, Mass., died Aux Cayes 4 June 1796, age 28 [40].

Samuel Bowler, born Newport 13 Dec. 1764, son of Metcalf and Anne (Fairchild) Bowler, married Providence 23 Feb.1786 Abigail Lee. He died St. Eustatius 13 May 1790 [41].

Peter Andrew Bowyer, resident of Cap François, married Margaret _____. She died Providence 5 Jan. 1799; he died there 17 Sept. 1807 [42].

Antipas Boyse, of Boston in New England, made a will dated 21 May 170_, proved Barbados 12 Dec. 1706 [43].

Jacob Bradbury, born Salisbury, Mass. 17 June 1647, son of Thomas and Mary (Perkins) Bradbury, and brother of Wymond Bradbury, died unmarried Barbados 1669 [44].

Wymond Bradbury, born Salisbury, Mass. 1 Apr. 1637, son of Thomas and Mary (Perkins) Bradbury, and brother of Jacob Bradbury, married there 7 May 1661 Sarah Pike, born there 24 Feb. 1641/42, daughter of Robert and Sarah (Sanders) Pike. He died Nevis 7 Apr. 1669; she died Salisbury 6 May 1718 [45].

Williams Bradford, born Boston 26 May 1741, son of James and Hepzibah (Williams) Bradford, Harvard 1760, of New Providence, Bahamas by 1765, died 1801 [46].

Samuel Bradstreet, born ca. 1632, son of Simon and Anne (Dudley) Bradstreet, Harvard 1653, physician, married (1) 1662 Mercy Tyng, born Boston 13 Jan. 1642/43, died 6 Sept. 1670, daughter of William and Elizabeth (Coytmore) Tyng. Samuel Bradstreet married (2) Martha _____. He died Jamaica Aug. 1682 [47].

Simon Bradstreet, born Jamaica ca. 1680, son of Samuel and Martha (_____) Bradstreet, Harvard 1700, died perhaps on Barbados [48].

John Bragg, married (int.) Bristol, R.I. 12 June 1736 Mary Gallup. He died St. Eustatius 18 Apr. 1746 [49].

Benjamin Brandon, born Boston 27 Nov. 1724, son of Joseph and Martha (Wise) Brandon, Harvard 1742, married Cambridge, Mass. 4 Jan. 1749/50 Elizabeth Foxcroft, born there 27 Mar. 1729, daughter of Francis and Mehitabel (Coney) Foxcroft. He died St. Croix Oct. 1755 [50].

Isaac Brayton, son of Stephen and Patience (_____) Brayton, of Newport, died 6 Jan. 1742/43, in 30th year, buried Nassau, Bahamas [51].

Jean Joseph Achille Breckvelt de La Rive, late Treasurer of the island of Guadeloupe, died Dedham, Mass. in or before Oct. 1790 [52].

Silas C. Brenton, of Newport, died Cap François 19 Nov. 1788 [53].

Christopher Bridge, born Rye, N.Y. 1712, son of Rev. Christopher and Elizabeth (Foxcroft) Bridge, Harvard 1733, minister of St. Dorothy, Jamaica, died by 1742 [54].

Rev. Thomas Bridge, born England 1657, of Port Royal, Jamaica 1686, married in Jamaica to Elizabeth Turner. He was Governor of the Bahamas 1687-88, in West Jersey 1694, and moved to Boston by 1704. He died 26 Sept. 1715, probably in Boston [55].

Edward Bridgewater, son of Thomas Bridgewater, of St. Kitts and Nevis, Harvard 1718. He returned to Nevis and married Sarah _____[56].

Catherine Brinley, born 5 Sept. 1759, daughter of Francis and Aleph (Malbone) Brinley, of Newport, married 8 July 1778 Dr. John Field. She died Jamaica 5 Dec. 1784 [57].

John Broadbelt, born Nevis 17 Mar. 1736/37, Harvard 1756 [58].

William Brown, of New England, mentioned as a son in the will of Elizabeth Brown, of Barbados, dated 8 Nov. 1724 [59]. William Brown, of Norwich, Conn., died Martinique 25 Oct. 1805 [60]. William S. Brown, of Providence, died St. Iago de Cuba 27 Mar. 1802 [61].

William Browne, born Salem, Mass. 27 Feb. 1736/37, son of Samuel and Catherine (Winthrop) Browne, Harvard 1755, judge and legislator in Mass. He married his first cousin Ruth Wanton, daughter of Joseph and Mary (Winthrop) Wanton. He was a Loyalist and Governor of Bermuda 1781-90. She died London 19 Oct. 1799; he died there 13 Feb. 1802 [62].

Benjamin Brownell, born 1787, son of Thomas and Philadelphia (Cook) Brownell, of Newport, died St. Thomas May 1811 [63].

Rev. William Josephus Bulkeley, born Fairfield, Conn. 18 June 1787, son of Jonathan and Lydia (Bulkeley) Bulkeley, Rector of St. John's Anglican Church, Christiansted, St. Croix. He married there 7 Aug. 1828 Louisa Battelle, daughter of *Thomas* and *Anne Dashwood (Lewis) Battelle*. He died St. Croix 14 Nov. 1830 [64].

George Buly, of Piscataway in New England, now of Barbados, made a will dated 24 Feb. 1718/19, recorded Barbados 6 Mar. 1718/19 [65].

Asa Burdett, son of Samuel Burdett, of Charlestown, Mass., married there 4 Oct. 1791 Hannah Frothingham, born Charlestown 9 or 10 Dec. 1769, daughter of James and Abigail (Bradish) Frothingham. He died St. Eustatius 24 Jan. 1795, age about 33 [66].

Thomas Burk, of New England, mentioned as a son in the will of Thomas Burk, of Barbados, dated 21 Sept. 1695 [67].

Abijah Burritt, born Huntington, Conn., died St. Eustatius 22 Mar. 1795, age about 22 [68].

William Pym Burt, probably born England, son of John Heyliger and Judith (Robinson) Burt, married Elizabeth Louisa Chabert, born St. Croix 18 Apr. 1800, daughter of Joseph Blake and Elizabeth Sophia (Heyliger) Chabert. She died New Haven 16 Dec. 1833 [69].

Benjamin Butler, of Providence, died Port-au-Prince 7 Aug. 1824 [70].

Jeremiah Butler, born Durham, Conn., buried Nassau, Bahamas 7 Sept. 1812 [71].

Erasmus Button, born Conn., had a borgerbrev dated 21 Sept. 1848 on St. Croix or St. Thomas. He probably was identical with Erasmus Button, born about 1810, son of Avery and Hannah (Witter) Button, of Preston, Conn. [72].

Henry Byley, baptized Salisbury, Wiltshire, England 26 Aug. 1638, son of Henry and Rebecca (Swayne) Byley, later of Salisbury, Mass. He was on Barbados 1669-70 and died by 1676 [73].

Oliver Capron, of Providence, died Turks Island 4 Nov. 1809 [74].

Philip Carr, son of Caleb Carr, of Warren, R.I., died Matanzas, Cuba 26 May 1821, in 23rd year [75].

John Catlin, of Barbados, will proved Boston 1686 [76]. Andrew Cazneau, born Boston 20 Dec. 1738, son of Peace and Mary (Scutt) Cazneau, married Boston 2 Sept. 1769 Hannah Hamock, baptized Christ Church, Boston 4 May 1739, died Boston 28 Dec. 1771, daughter of John and Sarah (Hodgson) Hamock. He was a Loyalist and moved to Bermuda where he was Judge of the Vice-Admiralty Court. He returned to Massachusetts in 1790 and was buried Roxbury 2 May 1792 [77].

Uriah Oliver Champlin, born R.I. 30 Jan. 1742, son of Joseph and Rebecca (Cheeseborough) Champlin, died 12 Nov. 1770, buried St. Eustatius [78].

John Chandler, born ca. 1632, son of Edmund Chandler, of Duxbury, Mass., made a will dated 25 June 1653, proved Barbados 11 July 1653 [79].

Lemuel Chandler, of Providence, died Turks Island 17 Sept. 1817, in 39th year [80].

Leon Chappotin, born St. Domingo, resident of Providence, died Cuba 7 May 1823, age 58 [81].

Peter Chardon, married (1) Boston 6 Dec. 1733 Sarah Colman, (2) Boston 2 Sept. 1750 Mary (Alleyne) Alleyne, baptized there 4 June 1720, daughter of *Abel* and *Mary* (*Woodbridge*) *Alleyne*. He died Dominica Oct. 1766 [82].

Col. Charnley, late of Boston, killed Barbados in or before Sept. 1731 [83].

William Charters, of Charlestown, Mass., died Antigua in or before Apr. 1706 [84].

John Christophers, son of Christopher and Mary (_____) Christophers, of New London, Conn., married 28 July 1696 Elizabeth Mulford, born about 1676, daughter of Samuel and Hester (Conkling) Mulford, of East Hampton, L.I. He died Barbados Feb. 1703 [85].

Clarissa Churchill, wife of B.K. Churchill, of Bristol, R.I., died Trinidad 25 Aug. 1821 [86].

Gideon Wanton Clarke, son of Jeremiah Clarke, of Newport, died Jamaica 14 Aug. 1786, age 21 [87].

Daniel Coats, of Providence, died Jamaica 11 June 1808 [88].

H.A. Cole, of North Kingstown, R.I., died Turks Island 11 Sept. 1820, in 31st year [89].

John Congdon, of West Greenwich, R.I., died St. Pierre, Martinique 14 Jan. 1817, age 24 [90].

Benjamin Cook, of Salem, Mass., died Aux Cayes in or before Mar. 1789 [91].

John Cooke, of New England, made a will dated 3 Apr. 1694, proved Barbados 19 Apr. 1694 [92].

Arnold Cormerais, from Martinique, married Portsmouth, N.H. by 18 Nov. 1797 Jane Vaughn Rindge. [93]

John Cormerais del Horme, of Boston, married Guadeloupe in or before Jan. 1790 Mariette Cornette [94]. Gideon Cornell, of Newport, died Jamaica by 13 Sept.

1766 [95].

Henry Crook, probably son of Samuel and Mary (Woodley) Crook, of St. Kitts, Harvard 1741 [96].

James Crooke, lately of Jamaica, died Newport by 15 Apr. 1774 [97].

David Crowley, of Jamaica and Boston, will proved Boston 1690 [98].

Benjamin Curtis, of Providence, died Cap St. Nicolas Mole 25 Oct. 1794 [99].

George Curwen, born Salem, Mass. 4 Dec. 1717, son of Rev. George and Mehitabel (Parkman) Curwen, Harvard 1735, married Salem 18 Mar. 1737/38 Sarah Pickman, daughter of Benjamin and Abigail (Lindall) Pickman. He died St. Eustatius 7 June 1746 [100].

John Cutting, in New England, mentioned as a son in the will of **Ann Cutting**, widow, of Barbados, dated 3 Nov. 1712 [101].

Joseph da Costa, son of Joseph and Catherine (Adams) da Costa, of Mass., married (1) Katherine Tallman. He moved to St. Croix by 1804, and married (2) St. John's Anglican Church, Christiansted, St. Croix 8 June 1805 Sarah Smith [102].

Daniel Dailey, of Providence, died St. Croix 4 Mar. 1795 [103].

Humphrey Davenport, of Barbados 1659-61, then Dorchester, Mass. 1666. He married Rachel Holmes, daughter of Thomas and Margaret (Webb) Holmes. They were later of Hartford, Conn., and New York City [104].

Anthony Davis, born Boston 8 Mar. 1715/16, son of Nicholas and Sarah (Hatch) Davis, Harvard 1735, married Boston 31 July 1738 Elizabeth Adams, daughter of William Adams, of Barbados. He moved to Spanish Town, Jamaica, where he died July 1763 [105].

Charles Davis, of Newport, died Port Noah [Pointe-Noire?], Guadeloupe 20 Feb. 1821, age 43 [106].

Robert Davis, of Hartford, Conn., and Bristol, R.I., died Matanzas, Cuba 20 June 1821, age 33 [107].

George Dean, from Salem, age 24, buried Port-au-Prince 12 Feb. 1792 [108].

Stephen de Lancey, born 1748, son of Oliver and Phila (Franks) de Lancey, of New York, married 16 June 1773 Cornelia Barclay, daughter of Rev. Henry and Mary (Rutgers) Barclay. He was a Loyalist, and was Chief Justice of the Bahamas and Governor of Tobago. He died Portsmouth, N.H. 15 Dec. 1798 [109].

de La Rive: see Breckvelt de La Rive del Horme: see Cormerais del Horme

John Daverise Dennis, born Boston, had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 18 Nov. 1780 [110].

Jacob de Rivera, born 1719, married Curaçao by 1747 Hannah Pimentel Sasportas, born Minorca 1720. He was naturalized in New York in 1746, and settled in Newport by 1762. He died Newport 18 Feb. 1789; she died 24 Nov. 1820 [111].

John de Windt, son of Daniel and Catharina (de Windt) de Windt, of St. Thomas, probably was the John de Windt who attended Dartmouth College 1789-92 [112].

Peter Cornelius de Windt, Jr., baptized St. John's Anglican Church, Christiansted, St. Croix 11 Mar. 1806, son of Peter Cornelius and Catharina (Runnels) de Windt, Yale 1828, married New Haven 18 Aug. 1831 Mary Pynchon Caldwell. He died 16 Nov. 1831 [113].

Benjamin G. Dexter, son of Philip Dexter, of Killingly, Conn., died St. Croix 8 Sept. 1817, age 28 [114].

John Dibbs, son of John Dibbs, of New England, buried Barbados 8 May 1694 [115].

Samuel Dixon, of Pawtucket, R.I., died Trinidad 3 Aug. 1793 [116].

James Donaldson, born Boston, age 21, buried Port-au-Prince 28 Nov. 1793 [117].

William Donnison, son of Jonathan Donnison, of Providence, died Port-au-Prince 26 Mar. 1796, in 21st year [118]. Nathaniel Dowse, born Boston, had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 3 Oct. 1780 [119].

Samuel Driggs, born Middletown, Conn., buried Nassau, Bahamas 19 Oct. 1814, age about 51 [120].

William Coit du Bocage, born New London, Conn., son of Joseph Isadore and Elizabeth (Coit) du Bocage, later of St.

Lucia, married there 1818 Marie Ann Gouillard Lavoisier. He died St. Lucia 1819 [121].

Jacques Louis Duhamel, of Martinique, died Jamaica Plain, Mass. 25 Aug. 1792 [122].

John Dunford, of Bermuda, married Colchester, Conn. by 3 June 1814 Mary Skinner [123].

Cornelius Durant, born Boston 7 June 1732, baptized Old South Church there 11 June, son of Edward and Judith (Waldo) Durant, brother of **Thomas Durant**, uncle of the *Battelle* brothers, and stepfather of the *Hunt* brothers (qq.v.). He married (1) about 1766 Mary (Tothill) Hunt, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth (Shore) Tothill, and widow of Richard Hunt. He lived on St. Croix 1766-78 and several times thereafter. His first wife died there in 1775, and he married (2) Boston 20 May 1786 Mary Fenno, who died July-Aug. 1789. He died St. Croix, leaving a will dated 8 Mar. 1812, proved 11 May 1812 [124].

Thomas Durant, born Boston 22 Aug. 1730, son of Edward and Judith (Waldo) Durant, brother of Cornelius Durant and uncle of the *Battelle* brothers. He married (1) Boston 21 Nov. 1751 Ann Hunt, daughter of Richard and Sarah (Williams) Hunt, and aunt of the *Hunt* brothers (qq.v.). She died in 1761, and he moved to St. Croix where he was in partnership with his brother. He married (2) on St. Croix, Sally Hallam, who died prior to Apr. 1792. He was referred to as deceased in his brother's will dated 8 Mar. 1812 [125].

James Dyer, son of Joseph Dyer, of Newport, died Petit Cuave, Hispaniola by 21 Mar. 1797 [126].

Sally Easton, wife of Colin Easton, of St. Croix, died Providence 15 June 1810 [127].

He was of Antigua in 1714-15, possibly earlier and probably later. He died Dec. 1726, probably in Boston [135].

Francis James Dallett, F.A.S.G., points out that Cap François, on the island of Hispaniola, was more accurately Cap Français.

Nathaniel Fellows, of Cuba, married by 17 Oct. 1825 Lucy Lambert, daughter of William Lambert, of Roxbury, Mass. [136].

Joseph King Fenno, baptized First Church, Middletown, Conn. 6 Aug. 1780, son of Ephraim and Mary (King) Fenno, and brother of Mary Fenno who married *Henry Mansfield*. He had a *borgerbrev* on St. Croix dated 26 Apr. 1800, but died and was buried on St. Croix within the next few months [137].

Rev. John Feveryear, born Boston 28 Mar. 1731/32, son of Grafton and Sarah (Pierce) Feveryear, Harvard 1751. He was on Bermuda 1755-66, and married there 27 Apr. 1758 Elizabeth Butterfield. He died in Beaufort, S.C. 26 June 1766 [138].

John Fibenzen, from Boston, age 14, buried Port-au-Prince 11 Mar. 1792 [139].

John Field, born Providence 1708, son of Zachariah and Abigail (_____) Field, married Providence 12 Jan. 1735
Elizabeth Snow, daughter of Joseph and Elizabeth (Field)
Snow. He died St. Eustatius 5 Apr. 1738 [140].

John W. Fisher, of St. Croix, married Providence 16 or 18 Sept. 1811 Mary Whiting [141].

Mr. Flagg, of Boston, buried St. Eustatius Anglican Church 4 July 1773 [142].

Thomas Forguson, late of Rhode Island, made a power of attorney in the Bahamas 9 Oct. 1749 [143].

Thomas Foster, from Ipswich, Mass., age 33, buried Port-au-Prince 1 Dec. 1793 [144].

Alex Frazer, of Guilford, Conn., married Mary Ann ____ of Farmington, Conn. He died St. Croix 16 Apr. 1767 [145].

Rev. Calvin Galpine, son of Calvin Galpine, of Marblehead, Mass., Harvard 1715, later of St. Catherine, Jamaica. He died Jamaica 1749 [146].

John Gardiner, born Boston 1731, son of Dr. Silvester and Anne (Gibbins) Gardiner, Harvard 1755. He became an attorney in England and married 25 Sept. 1763 Margaret Harries, daughter of George Harries. He lived on St. Kitts 1767-83 where he was Attorney General. In 1783 he returned to Mass. She died St. Kitts 22 Apr. 1789; he died at sea Oct. 1793 [147].

Henry Gardner, born Salem, Mass. 17 Oct. 1747, son of Samuel and Esther (Orne) Gardner, Harvard 1765, shipowner, married 19 Oct. 1769 Sarah Turner, daughter of John and Mary (Osborne) Turner, of Salem. He had a *burgherbrief* on St. Eustatius 8 Jan. 1781, but was back in Salem in May 1781 [148].

William Gerrish, son of Dr. William Gerrish, of Charlestown, Mass., was of Montserrat in 1704 [149].

Jotham Gibbons, born Boston 6 Oct. 1633, son of Edward and Margaret (_____) Gibbons, married Susanna _____. He was of Bermuda in 1655, and died by 16 Dec. 1658 [150].

John Gilbert, born New Haven, age 22, buried Port-au-Prince 13 Oct. 1793 [151]. Joseph Gilbert, late of Boston, now of Jamaica, was a defendant in Boston in 1707 [152].

Edmund Giller, from Beverly [Mass.], age 31, buried Portau-Prince 28 Nov. 1793 [153].

Benjamin Gomes, bachelor, born Boston, married Curação Reformed Dutch Church on or after 26 Nov. 1779 Anna Catharina Gravenhorst, spinster, born St. Thomas [154].

Oliver Goodrich, born Conn., had a *borgerbrev* on St. Croix or St. Thomas dated 27 Dec. 1799. There was an Oliver Goodrich of Wethersfield, Conn. who traded with the West Indies in 1784, and it seems likely both references are to Oliver Goodrich, born Wethersfield 19 Sept. 1749, son of Oliver and Temperance (Wright) Goodrich, married Sarah Warner who died Rocky Hill, Conn. 17 July 1810, age 58 [155].

Daniel Gould, born 24 Oct. 1656, son of Daniel and Wait (Coggeshall) Gould, of R.I., married Mary Clarke, born 11 Jan. 1661, daughter of Walter and Content (Greenman) Clarke. He made a will dated 5 Mar. 1693/94, proved Barbados 30 Mar. 1694 [156].

Samuel Gould, late of Boston, now of New Providence [in the Bahamas], made a will dated 10 Sept. 1751, proved 18 Nov. 1751 [157].

Roger Goulding, of R.I., married there 1 Jan. 1673 Penelope Arnold, born 10 Feb. 1653, daughter of Benedict and Damaris (Westcott) Arnold. He made a will dated 22 Dec. 1694, proved Barbados 1 Mar. 1694/95 [158].

Nathaniel Grafton, born 1642, son of Joseph Grafton, of Salem, Mass., married 6 Apr. 1665 Elizabeth Maverick, baptized 30 Sept. 1649, daughter of Moses and Remember (Allerton) Maverick. He died Barbados 11 Feb. 1670/71 [159].

John Green, bachelor, born Boston, married Curaçao Reformed Dutch Church 26 Sept. 1753 Susanna (Croesse) Van Moorn, born Curaçao [160].

David Greene, born Boston 20 June 1749, son of Thomas and Martha (Coit) Greene, Harvard 1768. He was on Antigua by 1776, and married there 13 Nov. 1777 Rebecca Rose, daughter of John and Alice (Bacon) Rose. They returned to Boston in 1784, and she died 1 May 1800. He died Ballston Springs, N.Y. 12 June 1812 [161].

Job Greene, born Newport, had a *burgherbrief* on St. Eustatius 12 Nov. 1780 [162].

Thomas Greenough, of Newburyport, Mass., died Cap Français in or before Dec. 1790 [163].

Elizabeth Greenway, of R.I., mentioned as a daughter in the will of Moses Greenway, of Barbados, dated 21 Mar. 1702 [164].

Thomas Hadley, of Jamaica, died Newport 23 Feb. 1796, age 38 [165].

Richard Hale, born Coventry, Conn. 20 Feb. 1757, son of Richard and Elizabeth (Strong) Hale, married 16 Mar. 1786 Mary Wright. He died St. Eustatius 12 Feb. 1793 [166].

Harper Hall, born Barbados 7 Oct. 1721, son of Benjamin and Elizabeth (Reed) Hall, Harvard 1742, buried Barbados 22 May 1759 [167].

Hugh Hall, son of Hugh and Lydia (Gibbs) Hall, Harvard 1713, later of Barbados and Boston, married 31 Oct. 1722 Elizabeth Pitts, daughter of John and Elizabeth (Lindall) Pitts, of Boston. He died 15 June 1773, perhaps in Boston [168].

Nathaniel Harrington, born Watertown, Mass. 1 Aug. 1750, son of Nathaniel and Mary (Kimball) Harrington, Harvard 1769, physician, died Jamaica [169].

Herman B. Harris, of Concord, N.H., died Falmouth, Jamaica 17 June 1795, age 52, buried there [170].

John Harris, son of Henry and Tabitha (_____) Harris, of R.I., died 23 May 1753, age 22 years and 4 days, buried Barbados [171].

John Harris, born Salem, Mass., married St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church on or after 2 Mar. 1771 Maria Doeke, born St. Eustatius [172].

Benjamin Hart, of Newport, died Havana 18 June 1779, age 24 [173].

Naphtali Hart, son of Aaron and Rachel (Cohen) Hart, of London, settled in New York by 1742 and in Newport by 1761. He married Sheprah _____, and they moved to St. Eustatius by 1788 [174].

Samuel Hart, of Newport, died Barbados 15 Oct. 1773, age 55 [175].

Ann Haynes, baptized Hingham, Norfolk, England 28 Feb. 1622/23, daughter of John and Mary (Thornton) Haynes, later of Hartford, Conn., married (1) _____ Woodruff, (2) ____ Clay, (3) Barbados 8 Dec. 1678 Nathaniel Eldred. He made a will dated 24 Dec. 1681, proved on Barbados 2 May 1682. She made a will dated 11 Feb. 1695, proved on Barbados 18 June 1696 [176].

Joseph Herrick, born 18 July 1714, son of Henry and Joanna (Woodbury) Herrick, of Beverly, Mass., Harvard 1732, married 12 July 1744 Anna Irving. He died Jamaica 11 Nov. 1747 [177].

Engel Heyliger, born St. Eustatius 20 Mar. 1820, son of Theodore Godet and Maria Arabella (O'Flaherty) Heyliger, attended Yale College 1837-38, died unmarried St. Eustatius Feb. 1872 [178].

Johannes Heyliger, born about 1748, perhaps on St. Martin, son of Abraham and Judith (Benners) Heyliger, married there 1772 Elisabeth Salomons, born about 1755, daughter of Nicholas Salomons. After living on St. Martin, St. Croix, and in London, they moved to New Haven in 1789. She died New Haven 27 Oct. 1802 and was buried in Grove Street Cemetery there. He returned to St. Croix where he died in 1811 [179].

Peter Heyliger, born St. Eustatius 11 Oct. 1750, son of Johannes and Catharina (Lindesay) Heyliger, entered Harvard 1768 but did not graduate, died before 23 May 1785 [180].

Susanna Heyliger, born St. Eustatius 7 Mar. 1776, daughter of Peter and Ann (Sargent?) Heyliger, married St. Barts 26 Mar. 1797 William Bainbridge, later Commodore, U.S. Navy, born Princeton, N.J. 7 May 1774, son of Dr. Absalom and Mary (Taylor) Bainbridge. Between 1813 and 1821 she lived in Charlestown, Mass. where he was Commandant of the Charlestown Navy Yard. He died Philadelphia 27 July 1833; she died there 26 Jan. 1857 [181].

Heyliger: see Bartlett

George Hicks, of R.I., now in Barbados, made a will dated 12 Feb. 1702, proved Barbados 16 Mar. 1702/03 [182].

James Henry Hicks, born Boston 23 May 1803, son of Zachariah and Mary (Coolidge) Hicks, married St. Thomas 3 May 1829 Eliza Magens, born St. Croix 10 July 1808. He died 23 Nov. 1849; she died 27 May 1884 [183].

Zechariah Hicks, baptized Cambridge, Mass. 22 Feb. 1701/02, son of Joseph and Bethia (Green) Hicks, Harvard 1729, married Boston 2 Dec. 1731 Lydia Daggett. He died Antigua before 23 Feb. 1743/44 [184].

Ebenezer Hill, of Prudence Island, R.I., and Providence, married North Kingstown, R.I. 1 Jan. 1729/30 Mary Fones. He died St. Eustatius 31 Oct. 1753, in 47th year [185].

John Hill, born 27 July 1748, son of Alexander and Thankful (Allen) Hill, of Boston, Harvard 1766, physician, moved to St. Croix where he died 1771 [186].

Richard Hill, born New London, Conn., died St. Eustatius on or before 11 Feb. 1793, age about 36 [187].

William Hill, of Cambridge, Mass., died Tobago in or before Sept. 1790 [188].

Joseph Hiordt, born Boston, on St. Croix 1781 [189]. Rev. Joshua Hobart, baptized Southwold, Suffolk 12 July 1629, son of Rev. Peter and Elizabeth (Ibrook) Hobart, later of Hingham, Mass. He was on Barbados 1655-56 and married (1) there 25 Apr. 1656 Margaret Vassall, born about 1633, daughter of William and Anna (King) Vassall. She died in Mass. 9 Sept. 1659, and he married (2) 16 Jan. 1672 Mary Sunderland, daughter of John Sunderland. She died Southold, L.I. 19 Apr. 1698; he died there 28 Feb. 1717 [190].

John Hobby, son of Sir Charles Hobby and Elizabeth Colman (Lady Hobby), of Boston, Harvard 1718, later of Barbados, married 7 Apr. 1723 Amy Atkins, probably daughter of Robert and Honor (_____) Atkins [191].

Thomas and James Holland, supposedly in New England, mentioned as sons in the will of Thomas Holland, of Barbados, dated 7 Oct. 1662 [192].

Caleb Hopkins, born Plymouth, Mass. say 1624, son of Stephen and Elizabeth (Fisher) Hopkins, died Barbados between 1644 and 1651 [193].

Captain Hopkins, of Boston, buried St. Eustatius Anglican Church 21 June 1776 [194].

Peter Howard, probably born Cuba about 1777, perhaps son of Forton Howard, married Boston 16 May 1808 Margaret Gardner, born R.I. about 1789. She died Boston 19 Dec. 1850; he died there 16 Jan. 1854 [195].

Captain Hudson, of Boston, buried St. Eustatius Anglican Church 17 July 1776 [196].

Rev. John Hunt, born 1 Sept. 1742, son of John and Sarah (Wendell) Hunt, Harvard 1762, married Boston 15 Apr. 1770 Mary Todd. He moved to the Bahamas in 1770 and died there 14 Feb. 1778 [197].

John Salmon Hunt, baptized 16 Aug. 1752, son of Richard and Mary (Tothill) Hunt, of Boston, brother of Richard Tothill Hunt, and stepson of *Cornelius Durant* (q.v.), married, probably on St. Croix, Russell Lillie Osborn, born there 22 Nov. 1756, daughter of George Lucas and Jane (Renaudet) Osborn. They made a joint will dated 12 Aug. 1800, proved 27 June 1815. She died as a widow on St. Croix on or before 23 Dec. 1816, age 60 [198].

Richard Tothill Hunt, son of Richard and Mary (Tothill) Hunt, of Boston, brother of John Salmon Hunt, and stepson of Cornelius Durant (q.v.). He was on St. Croix by 1775, and died Boston or St. Croix in Mar. or Apr. 1793 [199].

Hezekiah Huntington, born Windham, Conn. 24 July 1771, son of Jabez and Judith (Elderkin) Huntington, married in the West Indies, Mary Smith. He was on St. Croix by 1803 when a son was baptized, and died after 1816 when his youngest child was baptized there. His widow was living as late as 1860, when she was in the census of Frederiksted, St. Croix [200].

William Hutchinson, born Boston 14 May 1742, son of Eliakim and Elizabeth (Shirley) Hutchinson, Harvard 1762, living in the Bahamas 1767 and on Dominica 1775. He died in England 6 Feb. 1797 [201].

William Ingiasson, from Portland [Maine], age 22, buried Port-au-Prince 28 Oct. 1792 [202].

Hannah Isaacs, daughter of Jacob and Rebecca (Mears) Isaacs, married Newport 13 Aug. 1785 Jacob Phillips. She died Martinique 7 or 8 Mar. 1798 [203].

Isaac Isaacs, son of Jacob and Rebecca (Mears) Isaacs, of Newport, died Havana 3 Mar. 1830 [204].

Thomas Ivory, died Antigua 1723 as a "young man," as recorded Charlestown, Mass. [205].

Mrs. Susannah James, of Jamaica, died 26 Oct. 1746, in 30th year, buried King's Chapel, Boston [206].

William Scott Jenks, son of Scott and Sarah (Updike) Jenks, of Providence, R.I., and Matanzas, Cuba, married Matanzas 2 June 1821 Petronia Ximeno, daughter of Don José M. Ximeno [207].

David Jennings, of Fairfield, Conn., died 14 Apr. 1737, in 22nd year, buried St. Eustatius [208].

John Johnson, born America 1726, brought up in Marblehead, Mass., studied medicine in Boston. About 1760 he moved to St. Martin and in 1761 to St. Croix where he practiced as a physician. His wife [name unknown] died in Aug. 1777; he died 24 Dec. 1804, probably on St. Croix [209].

Elnathan Jones, born Concord, New England, had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 18 Sept. 1780 [210].

Rev. John Jones, baptized St. Stephen's, Coleman Street, London 22 Dec. 1622, son of Rev. John and Sarah (_____) Jones, later of Fairfield, Conn., Harvard 1643, married Mary _____. He was a preacher on Nevis, and died between 17 Jan. 1665 and 27 Dec. 1673 [211].

John Kalew, of Jamaica, married Newport 23 July 1828 Mary B. Marble, daughter of Benjamin Marble [212].

John Keetch, late of Boston, died intestate, administration on Antigua dated 4 Oct. 1695 [where his wife and children were apparently living] [213].

Alain Kelvet, from "Noulanon" [New London?], New England, age 22, buried Port-au-Prince 22 Sept. 1791 [214].

Amalie Kierskow, born Boston, wife of Matthias Block. She died on St. Croix 15 May 1776 [215].

Knight: see Night

Thonis Krises, bachelor, born New England, married St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church on or after 13 Sept. 1739 Sara (Berry) Bouwrie, born Nevis [216].

Raymond Labatut, of Hispaniola, died Newport 1 Oct. 1803, in 66th year [217].

John G. Ladd, born Newport, resident of Alexandria, Va., died Kingston, Jamaica 4 Jan. 1819, age 48 [218].

John Lavicount, born Antigua about 1738, son of Peter and Sarah (Ronan) Lavicount, married Cambridge, Mass. 16 June 1768 Lucy Vassall, born there 15 Nov. 1747, daughter of John and Lucy (Barran) Vassall. She was buried Antigua 21 Aug. 1797; he was buried there 31 Dec. 1798 [219].

George Lee, of Boston, died Barbados 17 Sept. 1737, age 31 [220].

Daniel Legge, born by 1647, son of John and Elizabeth (_____) Legge, of Lynn and Marblehead, Mass., may have settled on Nevis after 1674 [221].

Daniel Leonard, born Norton, Mass. 29 May 1740, son of Ephraim and Judith (Perkins) Leonard, Harvard 1760, married (1) Boston 2 Apr. 1767 Anna White, born 25 Feb. 1741, daughter of Samuel and Prudence (Williams) White. She died 4 Apr. 1768, and he married (2) Boston 4 Mar. 1770 Sarah Hamock, daughter of John and Sarah (Hodgson) Hamock. He was a Loyalist and lived on Bermuda 1781-1815 where he was Chief Justice. His second wife died at sea July 1806. He died in London 27 June 1829 [222].

John Coakley Lettsom, born Jost van Dyke Island, off Tortola 22 Nov. 1744, son of Edward and Mary (Coakley) Lettsom, Harvard 1762, M.D. University of Leiden 1768, married London 31 July 1770 Ann Miers, daughter of John Miers. He died in London 1 Nov. 1815 [223].

Hannah Lewger, formerly of Antigua, now of Boston, was a defendant in Boston in 1706 [224].

Edward Lillington, of New England, mentioned as a son in the will of George Lillington, of Barbados, dated 13 Apr. 1710 [225].

Francis Little, born Newburyport, Mass. 30 Jan. 1749, son of John and Temperance (Ripp) Little, married Curaçao Reformed Dutch Church on or after 19 May 1781 Johanna Houtvat, baptized there 1 Aug. 1755, daughter of Johannes and Willemina (Webb) Houtvat [226].

Caleb Lombard, from New England, buried Barbados 7 June 1691 [227].

Isaac Lovell, of Charlestown, New England, made a will dated 30 December 1671, proved Barbados 30 December 1671 (sic), mentioning wife Mary Lovell in Barbados [228].

Nicholas Lynde, born Charlestown, Mass. 1 July 1672, son of Joseph Lynde, Harvard 1690, married Stonington, Conn. 9 May 1696 Dorothy Stanton. He died Jamaica in Oct. 1703 [229].

Rowland and James Maillard, brothers from St. Kitts, Harvard 1743 and 1745, respectively [230].

Daniel Malcolm, born Boston, had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 9 Aug. 1780 [231].

Henry Mansfield, born New Haven 1 Feb. 1762, son of Stephen and Hannah (Beach) Mansfield, and brother of Grace Mansfield who married *Peter Totten* (q.v.). He married at the First Church, Middletown, Conn. 3 Aug. 1785 Mary Fenno, baptized there 5 Aug. 1767, daughter of Ephraim and Mary (King) Fenno, and sister of *Joseph King Fenno*. As Henry Manfield, born New Haven, tailor, he had a *borgerbrev* on St. Croix or St. Thomas dated 22 Oct. 1790. He was evidently living as late as 1804, when he and his wife were divorced [232].

Giles Mardenbrough, of St. Kitts, married Marblehead, Mass. 29 Oct. 1727 Elisabeth Martin [233].

Joseph Marryat, of Grenada, married Boston in or before Dec. 1789 Charlotte Geyer, daughter of Frederick William Geyer [234].

Jonathan Martin, born Amesbury, Mass. 15 Mar. 1738/39, son of Jonathan and Deborah (Worthen) Martin, married Kingston, N.H. 7 Dec. 1763 Sarah Morrill, born Salisbury, Mass. 24 Mar. 1745/46, daughter of Jacob and Sarah (Wait) Morrill. He lived on Martinique and died at Point St. Vincent, West Indies (presumably on Martinique) 2 Mar. 1812, age 73. She died July-Aug. 1824, age 79 [235].

Susanna Martyn, received by the St. Thomas Reformed Dutch Church 8 Dec. 1751 by certificate from Boston in [New] England [236].

Nathaniel Maverick, born about 1629, son of Samuel and Amias (Cole) Maverick, of Boston, moved to Barbados by 1656, and died there in early 1674 [237].

William Maxwell, probably son of Thomas Maxwell, of Barbados, died Cambridge, Mass. 30 Nov. 1696 while attending Harvard [238].

Oliver Mead, born New Haven, died St. Eustatius 5 Aug. 1793, age about 30 [239].

John Mears, from New England, perhaps son of John and Mary (___) Mears, buried Barbados 23 Apr. 1691 [240].

Mary Mein, wife of John Mein, of Newport, died Port Antonio, Jamaica 8 Aug. 1821, age about 48 [241].

Elisha Mellowes, baptized Boston, Lincolnshire 8 Mar. 1631/32, son of Oliver and Mary (James) Mellowes, later of Braintree, Mass. He moved to Barbados, and made a will dated 16 Oct. 1694, proved Barbados 22 Jan. 1694/95 [242].

Mary Middlecott, born Boston 1 July 1674, daughter of Richard and Sarah (Winslow) Middlecott, married (1) about 1696 Henry Gibbes, from Barbados. They moved to Barbados about 1702, and he died before 24 Oct. 1705. She married (2) about 1705 Othaniel Haggatt, son of Othaniel Haggatt, of Barbados. She died at sea in June 1718, in 45th year [243].

William Miller, of Turks Island, died Newport 19 Oct. 1795 [244].

George Minot, born Boston 25 Jan. 1730/31, son of Stephen and Mary (Brown) Minot, Harvard 1752, later of Jamaica, died Jan. 1801 [245].

John Marston Minot, born Jamaica Oct. 1747, son of John and Ann (Marston) Minot, Harvard 1767, returned to Jamaica [246].

John Mitchell, son of Sarah Mitchell, schoolmistress, of Newport. He was living in the Bahamas 1734-42 [247].

Laurent Moisson, from Hispaniola, died New Haven 5 Feb. 1772 [248].

William Moore, born 6 Jan. 1745, probably on Barbados, son of Francis and Abigail (_____) Moore, later of Cambridge, Mass., Harvard 1767, died by 1776 [249].

William J. Morris, of Newport, died Hispaniola 12 Apr. 1773 [250].

Rev. Simon Giffin Morrison, born Enfield, Conn. 31 Oct. 1768, son of John and Elizabeth (Giffin) Morrison, later of Saba [251].

Giles Mumford, of New London, Conn., died St. Domingo 20 Oct. 1795, age 35 [252].

Willliam Munro, of Bristol, R.I., married Cuba 1 Dec. 1829 Harriet Fales, also of Bristol [253].

John Narbach, from Lancaster, Mass., age 30, buried Port-au-Prince 26 Aug. 1793 [254].

John Neal, from Boston, died St. Croix either 11 May 1772 or 7 Dec. 1774 [255].

Josiah Nelson, of Providence, died St. Barts 12 Oct. 1802 [256]. John New, born Bristol, England May 1742, son of Samuel New, later of Nevis, Harvard 1762, returned to Nevis [257].

Jonathan New, of Barbados, now in Boston, made a will dated 12 Oct. 1725, proved Boston 24 Nov. 1725 [258].

Joseph Newall, of Newburyport, Mass., died Port-au-Prince in or before Dec. 1790 [259].

Sarah Newberry, wife of Walter Newberry, of R.I., mentioned as a daughter in the will of Oliver Hooton, of Barbados, dated 19 Mar. 1686 [260].

Richard Nick, from Marbalaide [Marblehead], near Boston, age 22, buried Port-au-Prince 12 Nov. 1790 [261]. José Nicolas, born Boston, died Puerto Rico 1803 [262]. Mr. Night, born Boston, buried Nassau, Bahamas 9 Apr. 1816 [263].

Joseph Noel, born Naubre [Newbury?], New England, age 18, buried Port-au-Prince 27 Oct. 1790 [264].

Robert Oliver, born Antigua about 1700, son of Richard and Margaret (_____) Oliver of Antigua, married there 3 Feb. 1721/22 Anne Brown, daughter of James Brown and his wife, *Elizabeth*, who married (2) *Isaac Royall* (qq.v.). About 1738 Robert Oliver moved to Dorchester, Mass. about 1738 [where his mother-in-law was living] and died there 16 Dec. 1762 age 62 [265].

Richard Olney, son of Simeon H. Olney, of Providence, died Jamaica 17 Sept. 1796, in 19th year [266].

Elizabeth Gray Otis, born 22 May or 1 June 1791, daughter of Harrison Gray and Sally (Foster) Otis, of Boston, married there 31 May 1810 George Williams Lyman, born Kennebunk, Maine 4 Dec. 1786, son of Theodore and Lydia (Williams) Lyman. She died St. Croix 20 Dec. 1824 [267].

Nathaniel Walter Otis, born Boston 9 Jan. 1773, son of Joseph and Maria (Walter) Otis, married (1) Nancy Bourne. He settled in Matanzas, Cuba, and married (2) Ellen Rutson [268].

Rebecca Overbeck, spinster, born R.I., married Curaçao Reformed Dutch Church 23 Apr. 1747 Cornelis Leenderssen, born Amsterdam [269].

Henry John Overing, of Newport, died Bermuda 3 May 1783 [270].

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New Englanders in the West Indies

The first two parts of this series appeared in NEXUS 14 (1997): 111-15, 152-56, with an introduction on page 111 explaining the scope of the article.

Rev. John Oxenbridge, son of Daniel and Katherine (Harby) Oxenbridge, of Daventry, Northamptonshire, Oxford University 1628. He was on Bermuda 1635-41 and then returned to England. He married (1) Jane Butler who died 22 Apr. 1655, (2) 1656 Frances Woodward who died in July 1659, (3) 26 Feb. 1660/61 (lic.) Mary Hackshaw. He settled in Surinam in 1662, then Barbados (by about 1668) where he married Susanna (_____) Parris, widow of John Parris. In 1670 he settled in Boston where he died 28 Dec. 1674 [271].

Abraham Palmer, of Charlestown, Mass. 1629-52, married Grace _____. He died Barbados by 29 Aug. 1653 [272].

Benjamin Palmer, born Charlestown, Mass. 30 May 1642, son of Walter and Rebecca (Short) Palmer, married Antigua by 8 May 1681 an unknown wife [273].

Rev. James Parker, married Mary Maverick, baptized South Huish, Devonshire 6 Jan. 1609/10, daughter of Rev. John and Mary (Gye) Maverick. He was in Mass. and N.H. from 1631 to 1646 when he moved to Barbados. He died between 21 Aug. 1648 and 26 Aug. 1652, presumably on Barbados [274].

Mary Parker, born say 1631, daughter of Nicholas and Ann (_____) Parker, later of Boston, married by 1655 William Davis, later of Barbados [275].

John Parris, uncle of Rev. Samuel Parris, married Susanna _____, arrived in Mass. 1642. He moved to Barbados by 1650 and died there between 15 May and 20 Aug. 1660 [276].

Rev. Samuel Parris, son of Thomas Parris, of London and Barbados, and nephew of John Parris, probably attended Harvard College 1672-74. He was a merchant in Boston, and then in 1689 he accepted a position as minister in Salem Village, Mass., where he was subsequently caught up in the witchcraft trials. He married (1) Elizabeth ______, died Salem Village 14 July 1696. He married (2) Dorothy Noyes, daughter of Peter and Elizabeth (Darvell) Noyes. She died Sudbury, Mass. 16 Sept. 1719, and he died there 27 Feb. 1719/20 [277].

Richard Parsons, of Piscataqua in New England, mentioned as a son in the will of Richard Parsons, of Barbados, dated 8 July 1696 [278].

Samuel Patteshall, bachelor, born Boston, probably son of Richard and Martha (Woody) Patteshall, married Curaçao Reformed Dutch Church 15 Oct. 1715 Elisabeth Easely, born Bermuda [279].

Tobias Payne, born Boston 25 June 1697, son of William and Mary (Taylor) Payne, married Marshfield, Mass. 14 Oct. 1728 Sarah Winslow, born there 3 Dec. 1704, daughter of Kenelm and Abigail (Waterman) Winslow. He lived on Barbados before he was married, and died in the Virgin Islands in 1730 or 1733 [280].

Henry Pearne and Richard Pearne, sons of Henry Pearne, of Antigua, Harvard College 1727 and 1728, respectively [281].

Captain Pease, of Boston, buried St. Eustatius Anglican Church 2 July 1777 [282].

Edward Pegge, of Boston, made a will dated 9 Mar. 1700/1, proved Barbados 10 Apr. 1701 [283].

Samuel Perkins, born Boston, had a *burgherbrief* on St. Eustatius 23 Nov. 1780 [284].

Francis Perry, of Salem and Lynn, Mass., married (1) _____ (2) by 1638 Jane (Cash) Verin. By 1655 he was on Barbados where he died in Nov. 1659. She died the next month [285].

George Perry, of Newport, died Cumberland Harbor, Cuba 1 Aug. 1823, age 27 [286].

John Phillips, born Boston 29 Nov. 1726, son of John and Mary (Buttolph) Phillips, Harvard College 1745. He married 19 Sept. 1750 **Elizabeth Green**. He was on St. Thomas by 1766 [287].

Mr. Phillips, of Boston, buried St. Eustatius Anglican Church 17 Sept. 1773 [288].

William Pickman, born Salem, Mass. 1 Oct. 1710, son of Benjamin and Abigail (Lindall) Pickman, died 10 Apr. 1735, age 24 years and 6 months, buried Barbados [289].

Ebenezer Pierce, born Boston, had a *burgherbrief* on St. Eustatius 21 Nov. 1780 [290].

Richard Pierce, from New England, buried Barbados 7 July 1691 [291].

Christina Pieters, born New England, in the 1691 land list of St. Thomas with a daughter Gertruye, age 16, born Amsterdam [292].

John Porter, born 27 Feb. 1752, son of Rev. John and Mary (Huntington) Porter, of Bridgewater, Mass., Yale College 1770, Harvard College A.M. 1777, patriot, merchant at Curaçao, died Port-au-Prince Dec. 1790 [293].

Samuel Quincy, born Braintree, Mass. 13 Apr. 1734, son of Josiah and Hannah (Sturgis) Quincy, Harvard College 1754, married (1) 16 June 1761 Hannah Hill, daughter of Thomas and Hannah (Cushing) Hill. He was a Loyalist and moved to Antigua in 1780. His wife died there 2 Nov. 1782. He was on St. Kitts 1783-1784, on Tortola 1784-85, and on St. Croix 1785. He married (2) 1787 M.A. (_____) Chadwell. He died at sea 9 Aug. 1789 [294].

Edward Rainsford, baptized Boston 1 Oct. 1654, son of Edward and Elizabeth (_____) Rainsford, brother of Jonathan Rainsford, and uncle of John Rainsford. He married by 1686 Huldah Davis. As Edward Rainsford, now of Barbados, he made a will dated 8 May 1688, proved there 13 July 1688 [295].

John Rainsford, born Boston 5 Mar. 1661, son of John and Susanna (Vergoose) Rainsford, and nephew of Edward and Jonathan Rainsford. He died 3 Feb. 1710, age 49 years and 11 months, buried Barbados [296].

Jonathan Rainsford, born Boston in Oct. 1636, son of Edward and Elizabeth (______) Rainsford, brother of Edward Rainsford, and uncle of John Rainsford. He married Boston 29 Nov. 1656 Mary Sunderland. He made a will dated 11 Mar. 1670, proved Barbados 23 Mar. 1670 [297].

Charles Redford, married Salem, Mass. 19 June 1684 Elizabeth (Roberts) Turner. He was buried on Barbados 11 Aug. 1691 [298].

Abraham Redwood, baptized Bristol, England 2 July 1665, son of William and Anne (_____) Redwood, moved to Antigua in 1687 where he married (1) Mehitable Langford, daughter of Jonas Langford. He moved to Salem, Mass. in 1712 and married (2) Newport 14 Aug. 1716 Patience (Howland) Phillips, born Duxbury, Mass. 30 2nd month 1687, daughter of Joseph and

David Reynolds, of Fairfield, Conn. by 1687, living on Barbados 29 Nov. 1692 when he made a will, proved there 1 Dec. 1692 [300].

Christopher Rhodes, of St. Thomas, married Newport 18 July 1827 Mary Wickham [301].

David Robertson, of Boston, mentioned as a son in the will of Margery Lowe, widow, of Barbados, dated 15 July 1718 [302].

Francis Robinson, of Saco, Maine 1631. He was on Barbados in 1650 and on Nevis in 1666. He returned to New England the next year, and died after 27 July 1675, perhaps in Boston [303].

John Robinson, of Antigua, will proved Boston 1686 [304]. William Robinson, of Bermuda, died Boston 3 Sept. 1662 [305].

John Rodman, baptized Barbados 21 Mar. 1655/56, son of John and Ann (___) Rodman, and brother of Thomas Rodman, married (1) Barbados 15 May 1676 Christina Gibson, (2) Mary Scamon, born about 1663, daughter of John Scamon. About 1682 he moved to Newport where he practiced as a physician. He later moved to Flushing, L.I., where he died 10 July 1731, age 78. His widow died there 24 Feb. 1748, age 85 [306].

Thomas Rodman, born 26 Dec. 1640, son of John and Ann (___) Rodman, and brother of John Rodman, married (1) Barbados 9 Mar. 1671 Sarah Pead. About 1675 he moved to Newport where he practiced as a physician. He married (2) 7 June 1682 Patience (Easton) Malins, born 20 Nov. 1655, died 21 Nov. 1690, daughter of Peter and Ann (Coggeshall) Easton. He married (3) 26 Nov. 1691 Hannah Clarke, born 28 Oct. 1667, daughter of Walter and Hannah (Scott) Clarke. He died 11 Jan. 1728; his widow died 22 Oct. 1732 [307].

Warner Rogiers, probably son of Johannes and Elizabeth (Suhm) Rogiers, of St. Croix, graduated from Dartmouth College in 1793 [308].

Harriet Paine Rose, born Antigua 5 Feb. 1804, died North Conway, N.H. 4 Aug. 1885, daughter of Joseph and Harriet (Paine) Rose, married 29 July 1826 John Clarke Lee, born Boston 9 April 1804, died Salem, Mass. 19 Nov. 1877, son of Nathaniel Cabot and Mary Ann (Cabot) Lee [309].

Nicholas Rowland, of Boston, otherwise of St. Kitts, was a defendant in Boston in 1706 [310].

Isaac Royall, born 1672, son of William and Mary (_____)
Royall of Dorchester, Mass., married (1) Boston 1 July 1697
Elizabeth Eliot, born there 14 Feb. 1679, daughter of Asaph
and Elizabeth (Davenport) Eliot. He moved to Antigua where
he married (2) 1707 Elizabeth (______) Brown, mother-in-law of
Robert Oliver (q.v.). Isaac Royall moved back to Mass. by 1737
and he died Medford, Mass. 7 June 1739. His widow died there
21 Apr. 1747 [311].

George Ruggles, of Jamaica, married Boston (int.) 24 Dec. 1742 Susannah Vassall, born 20 Nov. 1725/26, daughter of Leonard and Ruth (Gale) Vassall, and aunt of *Elizabeth* (Vassall) Russell [312].

Benjamin Russell, born Nantucket, Mass., had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 8 Jan. 1781 [313].

Charles Russell, born Charlestown, Mass. 27 Dec. 1738, son of James and Katherine (Graves) Russell, Harvard College 1757, married 15 Feb. 1768 Elizabeth Vassall, baptized Cambridge, Mass. 17 Dec. 1742, daughter of Henry and Penelope

(Royall) Vassall, and niece of *Susannah* (*Vassall*) *Ruggles*. He died Antigua 27 May 1780. She died Plymouth, Mass. 23 Feb. 1802 [314].

Ann Maria Therese St. Agnon, of Port of Spain, Trinidad, married Providence by 24 Nov. 1821 Richard S. Stearns, of Salem, Mass. [315].

Benjamin Sandford, M.D., born Ridgefield, Conn. 15 Mar. 1798, died St. Ann, Jamaica 20 Apr. 1832, buried there [316].

Benjamin Sanford, born 4 June 1700, son of Samuel and Susanna (Spatchurst) Sanford, of Portsmouth, R.I., and brother of Joshua Sanford, died St. Eustatius 21 Nov. 1730 [317].

Elisha Sanford, born Portsmouth, R.I. 28 Dec. 1650, son of John and Bridget (Hutchinson) Sanford, and brother of William Sanford, on Barbados 1666-72, died by 1691 [318].

Joshua Sanford, born 18 Apr. 1702, son of Samuel and Susanna (Spatchurst) Sanford, of Portsmouth, R.I., and brother of Benjamin Sanford, died Martinique 13 Nov. 1721 [319].

William Sanford, born Portsmouth, R.I. 4 Mar. 1643/44, son of John and Bridget (Hutchinson) Sanford, and brother of Elisha Sanford, on Barbados 1666-72 [320].

William Sargent, born Malden, Mass. 29 Dec. 1712, son of William and Mary (Lewis) Sargent, married (1) Boston 3 Mar. 1735/36 Mercy Webber, probably the one born there 24 Mar. 1718, daughter of William and Mary (Summer) Webber. He married (2) St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church 14 Apr. 1759 Susanna (Gignilliat) Heyliger, born St. Kitts about 1720, daughter of Peter and Susanna (de la Coussaye) Gignilliat [321].

Isaac Sears, of Providence, son of Isaac and Sarah (Drake) Sears, of Boston and New York City, died Martinique 16 Dec. 1794 [322].

Christopher Seaton, of Tobago, married Boston by 11 June 1800 Penelope Wentworth Butler, of Hingham [3234].

John J. Sheldon, of Providence, died St. Barts 19 July 1800, age 27 [324].

Peter Pezie Shepherd, of Boston, mentioned as a son in the will of **Martha Simmons**, widow, of New Providence, Bahamas, dated 13 Jan. 1747 [325].

Thomas Simpson, of Jamaica, married Providence 11 June 1811 Sidney C. Stacey, of Boston [326].

Samuel Skinner, born Boston, had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 27 Nov. 1780 [327].

Dun Smith, born Cape Cod, died St. Eustatius 3 Aug. 1793, age about 24 [328].

Josiah Smith, born Charleston, S.C. 25 Dec. 1704, son of Dr. George and Dorothy (Archar) Smith, Harvard College 1725. He was on Bermuda in 1726 and married by 1731 Elizabeth Darrell. He subsequently moved back to S.C. He died 19 Oct. 1781 [329].

Samuel Smith, bachelor, born Boston, betrothed St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church 28 Nov. 1750 to Bridget Riddey, spinster, born Kerry in Ireland [the marriage did not take place] [330].

Jane Sparrow, wife of John Sparrow, of New England, mentioned as a daughter in the will of Henry Hunt, of Barbados, dated 20 Jan. 1682/83 [331].

Elizabeth Spatchurst, daughter of Henry Spatchurst, of Bermuda, married Portsmouth, R.I. 8 Aug. 1654 John Sanford, baptized Boston 26 June 1633, son of John and Elizabeth (Webb) Sanford. She died 6 Dec. 1661; he died East Greenwich, R.I. 25 Jan. 1686/87 [332].

Susanna Spatchurst, daughter of William Spatchurst, of Bermuda, married Portsmouth, R.I. 13 Apr. 1686 Samuel Sanford, baptized Boston 21 June 1635, son of John and Elizabeth (Webb) Sanford. He died 18 Mar. 1712/13, presumably in Portsmouth; she died 13 Nov. 1723 [333].

Samuel Stabord, from Portland [Maine], age 19, buried Port-au-Prince 9 Dec. 1792 [334].

George Stirk, probably baptized Bermuda 8 June 1627, son of Rev. George and Elizabeth (Painter) Stirk, Harvard College 1646, chemist and physician, died London before 14 Sept. 1665 [335].

Richard Stoddard, born Jamaica 14 Feb. 1734/35, Harvard 1753, returned to Jamaica [336].

Joshua Stone, baptized Charlestown, Mass. 24 Oct. 1742, son of Thomas and Jemima (Nichols) Stone, married St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church 3 Dec. 1769 Mercy (Sargent) Jenkins, baptized New Brick Church, Boston 30 Aug. 1741, daughter of William and Mercy (Webber) Sargent [337].

John Stoughton, baptized Dorchester, Mass. 10 Mar. 1638/1639, son of Israel and Elizabeth (Knight) Stoughton, died Barbados by 16 May 1665 [338].

William Stow, son of Stephen and Freelove (Baldwin) Stow, of Milford, Conn., married Elizabeth Baldwin, daughter of Amos and Sybil (Baldwin) Baldwin. He died St. Croix 22 Jan. 1792. She died 10 Mar. 1836 [339].

Maria Suhm, born St. Thomas 20 Jan. 1758, daughter of Christian and Maria (Malleville) Suhm, married 29 Nov. 1786 John Wheelock, born 28 Jan. 1754, son of Eleazer and Mary (Brinsmead) Wheelock. John Wheelock was President of Dartmouth College 1779-1815. He died 4 Apr. 1817; she died Brunswick, Maine 16 Feb. 1824 [340].

Nancy Sweet, wife of Elexar Sweet, formerly of Jamaica, died Providence 15 Sept. 1828, age 28 [341].

Hiler Taft, from Mendon, "Machamset" [Massachusetts?], buried Port-au-Prince 23 Dec. 1792 [3423].

Peter Tallman, born Hamburg about 1623, son of Heinrich and Anna (_____) Taelmon. He moved to Barbados in 1647, and married there (1) 2 Jan. 1649 Ann Hill, daughter of Philip and Ann (_____) Hill. He came to R.I. soon thereafter, and was later Attorney General of R.I. He also lived in New Amsterdam intermittently. He was divorced in 1665, and married (2) after 21 July 1665 Joan Briggs. He married (3) Esther _____. He died 1 Apr. 1708 [343].

John Tapin, from Newbury Port, age 24, buried Port-au-Prince 12 Jan. 1792 [344].

David Tarr, born Boston, had a *borgerbrev* on St. Croix or St. Thomas dated 19 Dec. 1837 [345].

John Taylor, born Boston 21 or 22 Nov. 1674, son of John and Rebecca (Tainter) Taylor, married Boston 1 or 5 Nov. 1702 Ann Winslow, born there 7 Aug. 1678, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth (Hutchinson) Winslow. About 1705 they moved to Jamaica, where he died before 29 Jan. 1719/20. She returned to Mass. with her children, and died Milton, Mass. 24 May 1773 [346].

Stephen Tetecomb, from Newbury Port, age 21, buried Port-au-Prince 12 Sept. 1790 [347].

Elisha Thayer, born Braintree, Mass. 4 Dec. 1748, son of Ebenezer and Susanna (Niles) Thayer, Harvard College 1767, died Barbados 1 Feb. 1774 [348].

Harriet Thayer, daughter of William Thayer, of Providence, and sister of James Thayer, married 14 July 1811 Patrick Brown, of Nassau, Bahamas [349].

James Thayer, son of William Thayer, of Providence, and brother of Harriet (Thayer) Brown, died Nassau, Bahamas 21 Aug. 1817, in 21st year [350].

Peter Wanton Thurston, of Newport, died Barbados 13 June 1807, in 20th year [351].

Daniel Tobias Tilden, born Boston, had a *borgerbrev* on St. Croix or St. Thomas dated 17 June 1848 [352].

Moses Titcomb, born Portland, Maine, resident of St. Croix, died Ballston Springs, N.Y. 2 Sept. 1804 [353].

John Titman, of New England, buried Barbados 5 July 1696 [354].

John Tompson, of Exeter, N.H., died St. Lucia in or before Nov. 1789 [355].

Peter Totten, born N.Y. 25 Feb. 1757, son of Joseph and Susannah (Tavau) Totten, married (1) New Haven 15 Oct. 1785 Grace Mansfield, born there 28 July 1770, daughter of Stephen and Hannah (Beach) Mansfield, and sister of *Henry Mansfield* (q.v.). She died there 12 July 1792, and Peter Totten moved to St. Croix prior to 27 Jan. 1794. He married (2) probably on St. Croix, Elizabeth (James) Sinclair, born Halifax, Nova Scotia. He died St. Croix 16 Jan. 1813; his widow died there 2 Dec. 1820 [356].

Rabbi Isaac Touro, born Holland 1738, came to America 1760, married June 1773 **Rebecca Hays**, daughter of Judah and Rebecca (Michael) Hays, of Newport. He died Kingston, Jamaica 8 Dec. 1783 [357].

Emma Tucker, of Dighton, Mass., died near Matanzas, Cuba in or before Nov. 1820 [358].

John Harvey Tucker, born Bermuda 17 Mar. 1777, son of James and Anne (____) Tucker, Yale College 1796, married London 7 Aug. 1803 Mary Browne, daughter of William and Ruth (Wanton) Browne (qq.v.). He died Bermuda 20 July 1868 [359].

Isaac Tuckerman, bachelor, born Boston, married Curaçao Reformed Dutch Church 4 Sept. 1725 Nannie (Williams) Just [360].

John Tully, of Boston, made a will on Antigua dated 7 Nov. 1702 [361].

Seth Tupper, born Sandwich, Mass. 6 May 1735, son of Samuel and Hannah (Fish) Tupper, married Priscilla Samson, baptized Middleboro, Mass. 19 March 1738/39, daughter of Peleg and Mary (Ring) Samson. He died St. Lucia in 1775, age 40. She died Kingston, Mass. 26 Mar. 1818, age 78 [362].

John Turner, of Boston 1644-49, later of Barbados where he married Mary (Skeete) Alleyne. He died Oct.-Nov. 1673 [363].

Thomas Turner, born Antigua about 1713, son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Oliver) Turner, Harvard College 1733, married Antigua 24 Jan. 1734 Elizabeth Reynolds. In 1775 Thomas Turner was described as a spendthrift living in New London, Conn. His wife was buried on Antigua 10 Sept. 1785 [364].

Joseph Tyler, late of Salem in New England, now of Barbados, made a will dated 1 Dec. 1698, proved Barbados 21 Dec. 1698 [365].

Hendrick Van Rhyne, of St. Martin, died Bristol, R.I. 8 Mar. 1828 [366].

Anthony Van Schallwyk, of Guadeloupe, married Boston in June 1801 Mary Wilder, of Concord, Mass. [367].

John Vassall, born in England about 1625, son of William and Anna (King) Vassall, and brother of *Judith* (Vassall) White. He moved from Mass. to Jamaica after 1661 and married Anna Lewis. He died on Jamaica in 1688; she was buried there 23 Feb. 1719/20. Their son Samuel Vassall was Harvard College

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1695, and their son *Leonard Vassall* moved to Boston (where most of his descendants stayed) [368].

William Vassall, baptized Stepney, Middlesex, England 27 Aug. 1592, son of John and Anna (Russell) Vassall, married (lic.) 9 June 1613 Anna King, born about 1593, daughter of George King. He and his family arrived in Mass. in 1635. He settled in 1648 on Barbados and died there between 31 July and 7 Aug. 1655 [369].

Benjamin Vaughan, born Jamaica 19 Apr. 1751, son of Samuel and Sarah (Hallowell) Vaughan, Harvard College 1769, patriot, died Hallowell, Maine 7 Dec. 1835 [370].

Enrique Verges, born Conn., living on Puerto Rico in 1827, later a consular agent there [371].

Nathaniel Verin, of Salem, Mass. and Barbados, married Mary _____. He left a will on Barbados dated 29 Mar. 1655 [372].

William Ward Vernon, son of Samuel and Amy (Ward) Vernon, of Newport, died 10 Apr. 1772, in 23rd year, buried St. James, Jamaica [373].

Richard Vines, of Saco, Maine 1630, married Joan _____. In 1646 he moved to Barbados where he died in 1651. She died between 17 Aug. 1669 and 13 Aug. 1675 [374].

Eben Wade, of Havana, married Providence 19 Sept. 1831 Sarah S. Clifford, daughter of Benjamin Clifford [375].

John Walker, born Boston, had a burgherbrief on St. Eustatius 23 Nov. 1780 [376].

John Wallington, of Barbados, formerly of Boston, was a plaintiff in Boston in 1704 [377].

Thomas Walters, of Boston, now at Antigua, will dated 8 July 1693 [378].

Edward Wanton, born 11 Apr. 1702, son of William and Ruth (Bryant) Wanton, of Newport, died 21 Feb. 1720/21, in 19th year, buried Barbados [379].

Caleb Waterman, born Warwick, R.I. 20 June 1739, son of Resolved and Sarah (Carr) Waterman, died Cap Français 22 July 1762 [380].

Nathan Waterman, born Providence 7 Aug. 1703, son of Richard and Abigail (Angell) Waterman, married Providence 28 May 1732 Phebe Smith. He died St. Eustatius 21 Dec. 1735 [381].

John Weeden, of Newport, died Havana 15 Apr. 1799, age 26 [382].

Maria Wever, spinster, born Boston, married St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church on or after 9 Sept. 1731 Jeremiah Kendal, bachelor, born London [383].

John Whippo, of Conn., died Nassau, Bahamas 30 June 1799, in 17th year [384].

Rev. Nathaniel White, probably son of the Rev. Nathaniel White, of Bermuda and the Bahamas, Harvard College 1646 [385].

Resolved White, son of William and Susanna (_____)
White, married Scituate, Mass. 5 Nov. 1640 Judith Vassall,
daughter of William and Anna (King) Vassall, and sister of
John Vassell. They were on Barbados in 1657 [386].

William White, of Boston, had a marriage contract with Martha Cox, widow, on Bermuda dated 4 June 1663 [387].

William White, of Boston and Barbados, made a will dated 10 Sept. 1666, proved Barbados 29 July 1668 [388].

Isaiah Whitmore, born Bath, Maine 21 Feb. 1792, son of John and Hulda (Crooker) Whitmore, married Elizabeth Ann Culver. They lived for a while on St. Croix where two of their

children were born. She died 4 Dec. 1860; he died 1 July 1865 [389].

Hugh Wilcott, from New England, buried Barbados 17 June 1691 [390].

Captain Wilkinson, of Salem, Mass., buried St. Eustatius Anglican Church 28 Dec. 1776 [391].

Parnell Wilkinson, widow of William Wilkinson. She was of Bermuda 1659-65, and later moved to Guilford, Conn. [392].

John Willard, born Groton, Mass. 8 Sept. 1673, son of Rev. Samuel and Abigail (Sherman) Willard, and brother of Samuel and William Willard, Harvard College 1690. By 1700 he was in Port Royal, Jamaica where he married Frances Sherburne. He died in 1723 or 1724 [393].

Rev. Samuel Willard, born Kingston, Jamaica in Sept. 1705, son of John and Frances (Sherburne) Willard, Harvard College 1723 [394].

Samuel Willard, born Groton, Mass. 25 Jan. 1667/68, son of Rev. Samuel and Abigail (Sherman) Willard, and brother of John and William Willard, died 31 Aug. 1701, age 33, buried St. Andrew, Jamaica [395].

William Willard, born Boston Feb. 1685/86, son of Rev. Samuel and Eunice (Tyng) Willard, and brother of John and Samuel Willard, died Jamaica 1716 or 1717 [396].

Frank Williams, bachelor, born R.I., married St. Eustatius Reformed Dutch Church 19 Mar. 1743 Anna Chapman, spinster, born Antigua [397].

Isaac Williams, born Portsmouth, North America, died St. Eustatius on or before 15 Mar. 1793 [398].

Nathaniel Williams, born Boston 25 Aug. 1675, son of Nathaniel and Mary (Oliver) Williams, Harvard College 1693, schoolmaster, missionary, physician. He was on Barbados in 1698 and married there **Anne Bradstreet**, daughter of *Samuel* and *Martha* (_____) *Bradstreet* (qq.v.). He returned to Boston in 1700 and died 10 Jan. 1737/38 [399].

Richard Williams, of New England, buried Barbados 7 July 1691 [400].

Oliver Wilson, born Windsor, Conn. 10 Jan. 1788, son of Calvin and Submit (Denslow) Wilson, married Bristol, R.I. 1 June 1814 Sarah Smith Sabin, born there 6 Mar. 1799, daughter of John and Lucretia (Wardwell) Sabin. About 1814 he moved to the Province of Matanzas, Cuba, and died there 28 Feb. 1839. She died in Seville 8 Jan. 1847 [401].

Rev. Edward Winslow, born Boston 8 Nov. 1722, son of Joshua and Elizabeth (Savage) Winslow, Harvard College 1741, married Barbados 16 July 1745 Jane Isabella Alleyne, born there 22 Oct. 1726, daughter of *Abel* and *Mary (Woodbridge) Alleyne* (qq.v.). He preached in Stratford, Conn. and Braintree, Mass. He died in New York City 31 Oct. 1780 [402].

Isaac Winslow, born Plymouth, Mass. 1644, son of James and Mary (Chilton) Winslow, married Charlestown, Mass. 14 Aug. 1666 Mary Nowell, born there 16 3rd month 1643, daughter of Increase and Parnell (Gray) Nowell. He died Port Royal, Jamaica between 26 and 29 Aug. 1670 [403].

Joshua Winslow, in the 1841 census of St. Croix as born Boston, age 54, Protestant, baptized 1787, widower, merchant [404].

Samuel Winthrop, baptized Groton, Suffolk, England 26 Aug. 1627, son of John and Margaret (Tyndal) Winthrop, married Rotterdam 8 July 1648 Elizabeth Hodgkel. He lived on St. Kitts and later on Antigua where he was Deputy-

Governor 1667-69. He died Antigua in 1674; she died in late 1675 or early 1676 [405].

William Withington, son of William and Priscilla (Gould) Withington, of Newport. He moved to London, then to Barbados where he made a will dated 21 Nov. 1682, recorded there 7 Apr. 1688 [406].

Dudley Woodbridge, born Windsor, Conn. 7 Sept. 1677, son of Rev. Benjamin and Mary (Ward) Woodbridge, Harvard College 1696, moved to Barbados by 1702, Judge of the High Court of Admiralty of Barbados 1707. He married Jane (Mead) (Fowler) (Denham) Willey. He died London 13 Feb. 1719/20 [407].

Jonathan Woodbury, of Kingston, Jamaica in 1700, son of Jonathan and Abigail (Phillips) Woodbury, of Boston [408].

John Halliday Yeamans, son of Joseph and Elizabeth (Halliday) Yeamans of Antigua, described "as late of Rhode Island, deceased" in his mother's undated will, proved 31 Aug. 1750 [409].

John Younge, of Barbados, made a will in Boston dated 2 Nov. 1649, proved Barbados 18 Mar. 1651 [410].
