# ROBERTSON-STONE CEMETERY

Restoration of the old ROBERTSON-STONE Cemetery has recently caught the attention of Northport residents. Many of the old settlers buried there have interesting backgrounds. Descendants of these pioneers can find considerable data regarding their ancestors.

Phillip P. COMERFORD and his wife, Sarah, were received by letter in the old Bethel Baptist Church, 6 April 1839. Phillip COMERFORD took an active part in the affairs of the church until 3 March 1849 when he probably moved to Northport. He was born 30 August 1806, GA, and died 2 October 1875, aged 69. Sarah COMERFORD was born 30 January 1808, SC, and died 7 February 1893, aged 85.

James CHRISTIAN and his wife, Dorothy GARY CHRISTIAN, settled in Northport in 1828. He was a brother of John CHRISTIAN. Both men served in the War of 1812 with the South Carolina Militia from Abbeville District. James CHRISTIAN and Dorothy GARY were married 1 November 1820 in Laurens Co., SC. James CHRISTIAN was born 4 March 1796, SC, and died 13 November 1852, aged 56. Dorothy CHRISTIAN was born 18 October 1797, SC, and died 1 December, 1870, aged 73.

Isaac LEE was a veteran of the Indian Wars, serving under General Jackson at the Battle of Horseshoe Bend. He was the son of William LEE, a veteran of the Revolutionary War. He built several houses in Northport and owned a large plantation in the North River area. Isaac LEE was married to Elizabeth PRUITT, sister of Jacob PRUITT. Isaac LEE was born 1776, NC, and died 26 June 1856.

Nancy McLESTER was the mother of Tuscaloosa merchants, James A. McLESTER and Richard C. McLESTER. Nancy TEMPKINS married James McLESTER in NC. She was born 7 July 1776, NC, and died 16 February 1844.

James FEARS and wife, Judith, owned land in Tuscaloosa County as early as 1821. There are many land transactions recorded in their names. James FEARS was a veteran of the War of 1812, entering service at Savannah, GA. He received Bounty Land for this service. His wife was evidently Judith BINION because William BINION, a Revolutionary War veteran and a neighbor, made a deed of gift to his beloved daughter, Judith FEARS, 5 November 1840. James FEARS was the executor of his estate. James FEARS was born 1790, GA, and died 1863.

The Tuskaloosa Gazette, March 14, 1878, notes that "Rev. John BROWN, an old and highly esteemed citizen of our county, died last Sunday night." Rev John BROWN was born March 11, 1810, and died March 11, 1878. His wife, Rachel, was born ca 1812 and died June 15, 1872. Their daughter, Harriet F., who married Lafayette N. COLE, March 31, 1863, died January 8, 1864, at the age of 20. Their son, Henry HART BROWN, a CSA veteran, was born August 24, 1837, and died January 9, 1903. A daughter, Mary E., died April 25, 1858, age 16, and a son, T. J. BROWN (Thomas), died November 27, 1861, age 27 years. Their

children in the 1850 census, p. 242B, were: Thomas J., James W., Henry H., Sarah J., Mary E., Harriet, and Martha A.

James H., FAIR, born August 2, 1829, died April 9, 1884, age 54, married Mary Alice ELMORE, July 3, 1856, the daughter of Berry ELMORE. Mary Alice FAIR, born September 27, 1836, died January 21, 1888, age 51. Her brother, James T., ELMORE, born April 17, 1839, died April 21, 1890, is also buried there.

There is a family relationship between the RAYMONDS and the HUGHES. Martha RAYMOND married Thomas CLEMENTS, March 3, 1842. The 1850 census, Tuscaloosa County, p. 212B, lists this family: Thomas J. HUGHES 35, Sarah 18, Martha CLEMENTS 53, William HUGHES 14, Robert 11, Van 10, Virginia RAYMOND 15. Added to the HUGHES family in 1860 are John 8, Daniel 1. Martha RAYMOND 61, and Virginia RAYMOND 22, are in their own household, p. 469. Martha RAYMOND died July 30, 1873, age 76. Thomas J. HUGHES died April 11, 1859, age 65. William W.. HUGHES, born August 9, 1829, died December 24, 1871, a CSA veteran. Daniel T. HUGHES, born May 4, 1859, died February 26, 1873.

Louisa HARDIN, born 1825, died February 13, 1881, age 56, was the daughter of Mary POWELL, 1850 census, p. 247. Larkin HARDIN married Louisa POWELL, November 22, 1839. In the 1850 census, the children of Louisa HARDIN 33, born in Tenn., were: Melissa C. 11, Elijah 7, Ellender 4, Larkin 1. Melissa C.. HARDIN, born September 11, 1841, died May 27, 1889, married Phillip F. M. COMERFORD, October 8, 1859, consent of his father, P. P. COMERFORD. Phillip F. M. COMERFORD, a CSA veteran, born July 3, 1842, died February 16, 1904, age 62.

One old settler of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, found buried in the ROBERTSON-STONE Cemetery, is Abner WINN, Sr., born April 26, 1769, died December 26, 1836. A daughter, Melinda, wife of Greenberry MITCHELL, born November 26, 1806, died February 11, 1839, and a son, Rev. Abner WINN, born December 19, 1812, died December 12, 1857, as well as their mother, Lucretia POSEY WINN, born January 14, 1773, died April 19, 1859, are also interred there.

The children of Abner and Lucretia WINN, from the family Bible, are: Mary, Thomas P., John A., Genubeth, Lucretia B., Catherine P., Melinda, James R., Abner, Jr. and Narcissa B.

David S. ANDERSON, born February 17, 1827, died February 7, 1852, was the husband of Amanda COMERFORD. William ANDERSON, born May 10, 1824, died January 24, 1854, was probably his brother. They are found next door to the COMEFORDS in the 1850 census. There is a Sarah ANDERSON, age 50, p. 249, who is probably a relative.

William A. LINDSEY, born December 25, 1819, in Tenn, died February 4, 1884, was a saddler in Northport. His children, in the 1860 census, p. 707, were: James M., William S., Henry L., Sarah A., Richard, Susan, Alabama, and Rebecca. H. L. LINDSEY was born January 1848 and died July 1886, age 38.

ORANGE COUNTY CALIFORNIA GLINEALOGICAL SOCIETY Kenneth FINDLEY, well-known veteran of the War of 1812, died 1828, was considered the original owner of the cemetery site, 1821. His children were: John, Catherine, William, Mary, Murchinson, and Nancy.

William FINDLEY, born October 1808, died July 1836, is probably the William FINDLAY who married Nancy A. COOK, April 9, 1829, the daughter of Robert COOK. She married 2nd Rev. Abner WINN, Jr.

Elizabeth SHIRLEY, born 1789, died October 12, 1865, was the mother of James SHIRLEY, born January 31, 1809, died May 21, 1866. He married Mary Ann CHRISTIAN in 1837. She was born September 15, 1821, died September 30, 1873.

Additional information on these families and other people buried in the cemetery can be found in old Tuscaloosa records or from their descendants.
