Justice J. C. Massie performed the May 3 ceremony for A. J. Grubb of Durham and Miss Elizabeth Gray. He was 23 and she 22 years of age.

John Guinn, 16 and Miss M. E. Reed, 18, both of Hazel Valley, pledged their love and faith in a ceremony before Preacher Edmon Osburn on July 22. She was 18, and he boasted of 16 years.

A. A. Gulley, 33 of Fayetteville, and Miss Mattie Anderson, 18, also of the Fayetteville area, were married on Nov. 17, with the Rev. John Mayes reading their ceremony.

A Strickler couple, John Hammontree, 21 and Miss Mildred Clark, also 21, were married by the Rev. James Whitaker, a local minister, on Sept. 2.

John Gullis (which may have been Gillis), age 21, and Miss Mary E. Cooper, both of Cincinnati, she at 19, were married on Jan. 1, by J. S. Cowan, a minister.

William Hammontree, 23 and Miss Elizabeth Malicoat, age 18, both of Billingsley, were married by The Rev. Mathew Sypres on Aug. 5.

An old time Justice of the Peace Bracken Lewis performed the ceremony for Seldon Hanna 25 and Miss A. H. Perry, 22 of the Carters Store area on Feb. 21. Bracken came here in the Early Days.

He was at 70 young in spirit, strong in body, and cheerful in heart. He was seldom sick. Though working hard, he did not abuse his health, and at 80 could drive his binder to cut his wheat crop.

Family prayers were always held in the home. Rare indeed was the occasion when this was omitted. It was not a pretentious home, but was a home that we loved because father was there, which meant love dwelt there. His last illness was about ten days. He underwent an operation from which he did not recover. He "passed over" as the church bells were ringing on Sunday morning, June 3, 1917. Always we shall thank God for such a father.

To complete the story of the Pyeatt-Moore mill at Cane Hill, here is a biographical sketch from Goodspeed's "History of the Northwest Arkansas Counties", page 1005:

The Pyeatts were among the pioneer settlers of Arkansas, and were first represented in this state by James and Kate (Finley) Pyeatt, natives of North Carolina, who, in 1812, removed from Kentucky to about 13 miles above Little Rock. Here they spent the remainder of their days.

J. R. (John Rankin) Pyeatt was born in Kentucky in 1805 and came to Arkansas with his parents and was here reared to manhood. In August 1827 he came to Washington County. He opened a wagon and blacksmith shop shortly after his arrival here and followed that occupation for a number of years. He and his brother purchased some raw land in 1838, which they improved, but in 1861 Mr. Pyeatt engaged in the milling business, in partnership with his son-in-law, William S. Moore.

William S. Moore spent his youthful days on a farm in Tennessee and made his home with his father until 21 years of age. He then learned the wagon-maker's trade, and in the fall of 1858 came to Arkansas, locating in Cane Hill. He worked at his trade until the summer of 1862 when he joined the 34th Arkansas Infantry, Confederate States Army, and served until the close of the war. He participated in the battle of Prairie Grove and was paroled in the summer of 1865.

He then returned home and formed a partnership with Mr. Pyeatt in the milling business and erected the Cane Hill Mills, which was in running order by the spring of 1866. The mill has been remodeled and improved since it was erected and is now one of the finest mills in Washington County. It has a combined roller and buhr process and has a capacity of about 40 barrels per day. They also manufacture some lumber, and in 1869 added a carding machine, which has proved very profitable.

In 1861 Mr. Moore married Miss Kate Pyeatt, daughter of his partner, J. R. Pyeatt, and their union was blessed in the birth of four children: Henry (who is a physician in this county), Charles R., Bettie and Lucy. Mrs. Moore died in 1877 and he afterward married Miss Josephine Moore, daughter of James Moore. She was born in East Tennessee and reared in Texas and Missouri. They are members of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Mr. Moore has a good farm which he manages in connection with his mill, and a fine orchard of 45 acres.

all in pretty good health. We had good health most of the way. Some of us had a little spell of the mountain fever. It is pretty bad while it lasts but we took medicine that soon releaved us.

We had tolerable good luck all the way considering all things. We lost some of our oxen but still had enough to get along with pretty well by leaving two of our waggons, Mr. Rieffs little one and that one I bought from Mr. Martin. Five of our oxen died and one of them little ones I got of James Stevenson got lame and we sold him to a trader for 20 dollars. I think that some of our oxen got poisoned and some died with the m-----. We got through with 17 oxen and our two new wagons. We traded off Martin's old pony saddle and bridle at Salt Lake for a very good yoke of young steers and bought one good steer there for 25 dollars. The old pony stood the trip fine as far as we took him and the little mule that I swapped for of John Lawrance the morning we started stood the trip fine. We have him yet and all of our oxen and waggons. We have our oxen on a ranch and they are fattening up very fast.

Times are pretty much the same. Wages from 50 to 75 dollars a month. They give 50 dollars a month for hands to work on the streets and levee. There is a great deal of this sort of work going on. They are planking several of the principle streets and making a plank road out 10 miles from Sacramento City up the American River. Health of the people is very good here so far as I know.

William Ferguson came up to see us yesterday. He is complaining a little. Tell Sis Ferguson that her cousins -- Gardners and her grandmother Old Mrs. English all came through safe and sound and the old lady got through in better health than when she left Ark.

Provisions of all kinds are high here. Pickled pork 18 cts a lb. Coffee 18 Mutton 30 Beef from 15 to 20 cts a lb. Meals from 50 cts to a dollar. Clothing is cheap, very near as cheap as Ark. Tobacco is tolerable cheap but not as good as Ark tobacco. I believe I have given you about all the news that I think would interest you. Martin and all send their best respects to you all. Give my best respects to your brother John. Tell him I will write to him as soon as I can. Give my best compliments to all the pretty girls -- and my respects to all inquiring friends. And accept my best wishes for yourself. I want you to be sure to write as soon as you get this. So farewell for the present.

A Flashback to 1849

Mrs. Martin, widow of the late Judge John Martin, went to Fayetteville to visit her youngest daughter and several granddaughters who were students at Miss Sawyer's Seminary, so popular with the Cherokee people. While there she contracted pneumonia and after an illness of a week, died on March 14 at the age of 56.

John Robinson of Thornsberry

The newspaper announcement of our Society's recent pilgrimage to Thornsberry brought back memories to Mrs.A.W.Way of Fayetteville. She recalled the occasion, some 30 years ago, when the Ways, Floyds and Gregsons drove to Thornsberry over difficult roads and placed the official D.A.R. marker on the grave of John Robinson, soldier of the American Revolution. The late Mrs.W.S.Gregson was head of the D.A.R. and active in marking the graves of Revolutionary soldiers buried in Washington County.

When the Fayetteville group arrived at the Thornsberry campground, they discovered the D.A.R. marker in a locked shed. They found a man who agreed to show them John Robinson's grave and to help them set up the marker. Mrs.Way recalls that it was late afternoon and that a deep quiet brooded over the old burying ground on Little Osage. After the marker was set up, the Rev. Gregson led in prayer and then delivered what Mrs. Way says was an impressive dedication address -- to an audience of six persons.

When Mrs.Way related this incident to me, I had a momentary flash of John Robinson in his Continental uniform listening to "Pop" Gregson on the old Methodist campground at Thornsberry, Arkansas. The soldier of 1776 must have thought "It's nice to be remembered." --WJL

Where Is Robert Mecklin Buried?

Washington County Marriages of 1854

Editor's Note: An interesting feature of the county's Marriage Records for 1854 is the late recording of six marriages solemnized by the Rev. Robert M. King, first president of Cane Hill College, and the late recording of seven marriages solemnized by the Rev. Robert Graham, first president of Arkansas College. Why these two clergymen-educators waited from one to three years to record the marriages they performed is a puzzling question.

On January 6, 1855, County Clerk P. R. Smith entered the following marriages at which the Rev. Robert M. King had officiated:

- Sept. 30, 1852 - Samuel Doak Lowry (28) and Emily Moberly
- Dec. 29, 1852 - Abram Carter and Ada Harrington
- Dec. 22, 1853 - R. Boyd Latta and Elizabeth Simpson

- Dec. 16, 1854 - Zebulon Edmiston and Jane Gray
- Dec. 18, 1854 - A. V. Rieff and Mary Jane Spencer

The bridegroom in King's first Washington County wedding, Samuel Doak Lowry, was King's assistant on the Cane Hill College faculty. Lowry had come from Indiana in 1850. The Rev. Robert M. King arrived in 1851 and became president when the College was chartered on Dec. 15, 1852.

The failure of the Arkansas College president (Graham) to record promptly the marriages at which he officiated is even more puzzling than the Cane Hill president's delay. Robert Graham had filed his credentials as a clergyman with the County Clerk on May 12, 1849. He read his first marriage ceremony on July 31 of that year. (See FLASHBACK, March 1954, page 12.) He performed five marriages in 1851 (see FLASHBACK, September 1954, page 6.) all of which he recorded promptly. Yet, from September 1852 to December 1854 he officiated at seven marriages, which were not recorded until February 1855.

The Rev. Robert Graham, a graduate of Benthany, Va., College in 1847, came to Fayetteville in the spring of 1848, taught at Mt. Comfort, opened a school in Fayetteville in 1851, built Arkansas College in 1852. He resigned as president in 1858 but returned to Fayetteville in 1860. He left Fayetteville for good on July 27, 1862; spent the war years teaching and preaching in California; then was professor of English in Kentucky University for 31 years. He retired in 1897; died in 1901.

In February 1855, County Clerk P. R. Smith recorded the following marriages at which Robert Graham officiated:

(The name Blennerhassett -- reminiscent of the Aaron Burr conspiracy -- is so unusual in Washington County history that we would welcome any information about this man.)

Personals from Goodspeed's History

Luther N. Hollis was one of the early-day tanners in Fayetteville. He was born in Indiana in 1826, served in the War with Mexico, and as a Confederate Soldier in the Civil War. He died 1877 in Crawford County.

James M. Johnson Jr., who had attended Ozark Institute and Arkansas College, became a Colonel in the Union army. After the war he was elected Lieutenant-Governor of Arkansas and in 1869 Secretary of State. He was a member of the University board of trustees.

Benjamin E. Woodruff, who came with his parents to Washington County in 1835, built the first circular sawmill and the second steam flour mill near Fayetteville.

James L. M. Weir came to Fayetteville in 1866 and in 1870 engaged in the manufacture of tobacco in partnership with George B. Hunt. The enterprise was a failure financially.

Eugene Wager, born in Switzerland in 1821, came to Washington County about 1870 and located at Elm Springs. He purchased and restored the Thornsberry mill and in 1876 purchased the Valley Mills on Osage Creek in Benton County, giving his name to both the postoffice and township.

Archibald McKissick Yell, born in Fayetteville, was the son of Alexander Curry Yell and Martha Coffee Yell, who were born in Tennessee in 1805 and 1806 respectively. A. M. Yell's mother (Martha Coffee Yell) died in Fayetteville on March 25, 1849. A.M. Yell's paternal uncle was Governor Archibald Yell.

Thomas J. Patton came to Prairie Grove from Missouri in 1865, then moved to Fayetteville to put his children in the University. He was a member of the Legislature and introduced the bill that refunded \$16,000 to Washington County, the money having erroneously been collected as interest on bonds issued for building the University.

Some Interesting Walker Mementoes

L. E. Howard, curator of the University Museum, has permitted us to make photostats of some of the documents in the David Walker collection of the Museum. These were presented to the University by the late Miss Sue Walker, granddaughter of Judge David Walker. The documents include:

1. A proclamation dated Washington, D.C., May 10, 1846, and signed in the handwriting of A. Yell, calling on all able-bodied citizens to enlist for the War with Mexico.
2. A photograph (8x10) of the quilt made by Mrs. Rebecca Washington in 1812 and now the property of the Mt. Vernon Association. On the back of the picture, in Miss Sue Walker's handwriting, is a history of the quilt. It states that Rebecca Washington (buried on East Mountain, Fayetteville) was the wife of Whiting Washington whose father Warner Washington was first cousin to Gen. George Washington (their fathers, John and Augustine, being brothers). Miss Sue Walker was a great-granddaughter of Rebecca Washington.
3. Four letters from prominent Confederate women expressing appreciation for their selection as honorary members of the Southern Memorial Association. The letters, dated in 1901, are from Frances Kirby-Smith Wade, daughter of Gen. E. Kirby-Smith; Varina Jefferson Davis, widow of the Confederate President, (letter written in Portland, Maine); Mary Custis Lee, daughter of Gen. Robert E. Lee; and Katie Walker Behan, first President-General of the Confederate Southern Memorial Assn.
4. Manuscript letter written by Albert Pike (218 Third St. N.W., Washington, 14 February, 1883) to Senator J. D. Walker.

Newspaper Published in Fayetteville Courthouse in 1862

Through the courtesy of Mrs. Malcolm McLean, member of the WCHS who worked as an archivist at the University of Texas during the summer, we have been able to examine photostats of some rare Civil War material pertaining to Washington County. This material is from the John Henry Brown collection in the University of Texas Library. It includes four issues of THE WAR BULLETIN, printed by Brown in the courthouse at Fayetteville in 1862, and Brown's diary written in 1861-62.

Brown, who held the rank of Major in the Confederate army, was a personal friend of Gen. Ben McCulloch. The diary gives a detailed account of the disposition of the General's possessions after his death at Pea Ridge and of the removal of his body to Austin, Texas. The diary also gives many sidelights on life in Fayetteville during the early months of the War. For example, Brown was accustomed to spend the week-ends with his friends, The Cunninghams at Mt. Comfort, or with the Zeb Pettigrews "2 miles south of town". We hope to publish some of the Brown material in future issues of FLASHBACK.

Old Brick Houses Discussed at Roundtable

The October session of the WCHS Round Table was held Oct. 4 in the Mountain Inn. Miss Grace Albright gave a paper on "Old Brick Houses of Washington County". This was followed by a lively discussion, in which information about several other old brick houses was brought to light. Miss Albright's paper will be published in an early issue of FLASHBACK.

Interesting Facts from Early Tax Lists

An examination of the Washington County tax lists for the first two years of statehood (1836-1837) reveals the fact that tanyards were assessed in 1836 and sawmills were added to the assessment list in 1837. Five owners of tanyards assessed their tanyards in 1836 -- John Buckhanon, Noah W. Bowen, James Campbell, Samuel Mayes and James Mitchell. The assessed value ranged from \$50 to Mitchell's \$175. The following year (1837) the following paid taxes on their tanyards:

Only six owners of sawmills paid taxes on their mills in 1837. They were: Barnett Brixey, George Freyschlag, Joshua Onstott, Warren Philpot, David Walker and Samuel Wilson. Philpot assessed two sawmills, located in S-5 T-16 R-28. There were other sawmills in the county but they do not appear on the tax list.

These first tax lists of Washington County show that only two "Distilleries" paid taxes in 1837. Wm. and A. Allen assessed their distillery at \$300, while John Casey valued his distillery at \$60 for tax purposes. No residents of Washington County paid taxes on "Billiard Tables" or "Nine-Pin Games" in 1836-37.

The Washington County tax list for 1836 reveals that the Bean brothers of Cane Hill were the county's largest slave holders. Richard Bean assessed 15 slaves and Mark Bean 14 slaves. Leonard and Willis Wallace jointly paid tax on 13 slaves. M.J., Joseph, and Wm. Ake paid taxes on 9 slaves. Rev. Andrew Buchanan assessed 8 slaves. John Tilly assessed his 8 slaves at \$3,000. Ludovic Brodie paid taxes on 10 slaves in 1836. Judge Seborn G. Sneed assessed 3 slaves in 1836 but four years later (1840) he paid taxes on 9 slaves assessed at \$5,900. James C. Bell, administrator of the estate of John Wilson, deceased; reported four slaves in 1836 as the property of the Wilson estate.

State and county property taxes were in effect in 1836 but few citizens assessed their real estate. In 1837 the county's largest landowners, according to their taxes, were David Walker who paid taxes on 880 acres, and Samuel Wilson, who owned 720 acres. John and Samuel Alexander, father and son, paid taxes on 520 acres.

The Sheriff of Washington County in 1836-37 was Lucius C. Pleasants; the Clerk was B. H. Smithson. Among the county's largest tax payers (state and county) in 1836 were Richard Bean \$16.38; Mark Bean, \$13.81; Andrew Buchanan, \$11.81. In 1837 John Alexander paid a total tax of \$30 on 320 acres of land and "\$12,000 invested in merchandise."

This is the end of Marriage Record Book "B". It is doubtful if any marriage records were kept from Sept. 15, 1861, to March 1864. Washington County was on the route of both armies, North and South, during 1862 and 1863. If any county records were kept during this period, they are not in the vault of the County Clerk's office.

County government began to function normally in March 1864. In that month George W. M. Reed, Fayetteville citizen and ex-Federal officer, began recording marriages in Marriage Record Book "C". Many of the marriages of 1864 were those of Federal soldiers and Washington County girls. An interesting article could be written about the romances of Northern soldiers and Southern girls. Many descendants of these marriages are living in the county today.

FLASHBACK has now published the county marriage records from 1845 to 1861. We would like to remind our readers that the earlier marriage records (before 1845) were lost. It might be possible to compile a list from old family records but it would be incomplete at best.

Pulaski Review Lists Early Arkansas Marriages

The Pulaski County Historical Society's Review, in its last issue, published a list of Arkansas marriages, compiled from the files of the Arkansas Gazette. This is a valuable list, because the early official records in many counties are missing. This is true in Pulaski County and also in Washington County. War-Time Marriages in Washington County, 1862-1865

FLASHBACK has previously published the marriages recorded in Marriage Record Books "A" and "B" of Washington County. The last marriage before the war was recorded in September 1861. Record Book "C" begins in March 1864, when George W. M. Reed, ex-soldier, took over as County Clerk and Recorder.

As is known, the ante-bellum records of Washington County are in existence today because interested citizens hid the books in a cave near Fayetteville, thus saving them from possible destruction.

Since no county records were kept during 1862 and 1863, no complete list of marriages is possible. There is no doubt that many marriages took place in our county during the war years. The records show 162 marriages in 1860 and 92 marriages during the first nine months of 1861. Obviously, the young people wouldn't let a war interfere with love and marriage.

But the only way to ascertain the war-time marriages is from family Bibles and other family records. And from the recording of earlier marriages made after county government resumed its functions in 1864. Typical is the marriage of William S. Hixon and Mary Harriet Mayfield on Jan. 14, 1862, by the Rev. Andrew J. Vaughan. Three years later, on Feb. 25, 1865, the Rev. Vaughan "made oath" and the marriage was recorded as follows:

"Jan. 14, 1862 - Wm.S.Hixon and Mary Harriet Mayfield, by Rev. Andrew J. Vaughan. Sworn to and subscribed before me..and I certify that no record of marriages that occurred in Washington County, Arkansas, in the year 1862 can be found and that consequently no record of the marriage of the aforesaid parties can be found in my office. I further certify that A.J.Vaughan aforesaid is and has been for years a respectable minister of the Baptist Church and further that I have no interest in this claim.
G.W.M.Reed, Clerk, Circuit Court"

An ante-bellum marriage that was four years late in getting into the Record Book was that of Orin Austin Phillips and Phebe Miller, both of Washington County. The Rev.A.B.Murphy married this couple on Feb. 10, 1861, but the marriage was not recorded until July 13, 1865.

The Rev.A.B.Murphy was Washington County's "marrying parson" during the war years. The record shows that he married 41 couples between 1861 and 1865. He was a minister of the Christian Church. The Rev. John Mayes (Baptist) had no marriages during the early years of the war but recorded 10 in 1864 and 14 in 1865, a total of 24. Third in war-time marriages was the Rev. Riley Jones (Missionary Baptist) who recorded 2 marriages in 1863, 7 in 1864 and 6 in 1865, a total of 15.

Not much is known about the Rev. A. B. Murphy. He came to Fayetteville from Illinois and performed his first marriage ceremony on Feb. 8, 1861. His credentials, as recorded in Marriage Record Book "C", read as follows:

"Warren County, Ills., Aug. 1, 1853. We the Elders of a regularly organized Christian Church, meeting on Talbott's Creek in said county and state, do hereby certify that A. B. Murphy was duly authorized to solemnize the marriage rite and to administer the ordinances of the Church. -- L. S. Wallace. Joseph Murphy."

County Clerk Reed in 1865 recorded 15 marriages that took place in 1862 and 14 that were solemnized in 1863. It is probable that many of the Washington County men who got married in those years were soldiers, although in only 8 cases is this definitely shown in the record. The age of the bridegrooms -- mostly in the early 20's -- would seem to indicate that they were in military service.

Reuben North, Chaplain of the 1st Arkansas Cavalry Volunteers USA, was stationed in Fayetteville during the Federal occupation. He was a minister of the Primitive Methodist Church and read the marriage vows for six couples and had these marriages recorded as follows:

Mar. 29, 1862 -- Francis M. Temple (35), son of Roderick and Mary Temple of Washington County, and Manervy Lewis (24), daughter of Henry and Jane Ann Lewis of Crawford County, Ark. Witness: Fidelo P. Lane.

Mar. 3, 1863 -- William Meiers, son of Gabriel and Sarah Meiers of Carroll County, Ark., to Elizabeth Winkels, daughter of John and Mary Winkels. Witnesses: Capt. Albert Pearson and Capt. Frank Strong, 1st Arkansas Cavalry Volunteers.

Oct. 8, 1863 -- Francis M. Mannon (28), son of Moses and Mary Mannon of Washington County and Margaret L. Taylor (20), daughter of Hiram and Margaret Taylor of Washington County, Ark.

Jan. 17, 1864 -- Henry Mason (23), son of Winson and Abby Mason of Marshfield, Mo., and Louisa Winkels (18), daughter of John and Mary Winkels of Johnson County, Ky.

May 10, 1864 -- Walker W. Brashears (26), son of M. M. and Sarah Brashears of Pope County, Ark., and Nancy Brewer (17), daughter of Howell and Mary Brewer of Washington County. Witness: H. F. Wade. This marriage was recorded in Record Book "C" on Aug. 10, 1865. Thirty years later (Nov. 8, 1895) the marriage was again recorded, for the sole purpose of correcting the bridegroom's name from Walker to Walter Brashears.

Feb. 19, 1865 -- J. B. Stark (22), son of George W. and Parthena E. Stark of Washington County and Mary E. Culbertson (18), daughter of Delila Culbertson of Washington County.

There are only two marriages recorded in Washington County Record Book "C" that name the military unit to which the bridegroom belonged. They are:

Nov. 19, 1863 -- Elias Branick (21), Sergeant in Co. A, 1st Arkansas Cavalry Volunteers, USA, and America Adeline Elizabeth Smith (18) of Fayetteville. The officiating minister was the Rev. Young D. Waddle of the Methodist Protestant Church who had been preaching in Fayetteville before the war.

Feb. 16, 1862 -- Thomas Marrs of the 3rd Louisiana Regiment CSA and Mrs. Levina E. Smith of Benton County, Ark. This marriage of a Confederate soldier of the 3rd Louisiana, which fought at Pea Ridge in March 1862, was solemnized by the Rev. M.D. Steele.

The Rev. M.D. Steele was a well-known Methodist minister of Elm Springs and a staunch Confederate sympathizer. He was the officiating minister at five war-time marriages. Besides the Marrs-Smith wedding, he read the vows to the following:

- May 1, 1862 - John Harp and Mary E. Finley
- Aug. 25, 1863 - Lewis Reed and Mrs. Sarah Akin
- Nov. 24 - 1863 - William Riley Ritter and Malinda Butler
- Mar. 26, 1865 - James Ritter and Mrs. Sarah Reed

The Rev. Steele kept a record of the marriages he performed, and after the war ended, he went to the courthouse in Fayetteville and recorded all five marriages -- on Aug. 2, 1865.

Another well-known Washington County Methodist minister, the Rev. Jordan Banks, is believed to have served with an independent Confederate cavalry outfit, yet found opportunity to officiate at seven war-time marriages, all of which he duly recorded at the courthouse after hostilities had ceased -- on Nov. 24, 1865. These are the war-time marriages at which the Rev. Jordan Banks officiated:

Another minister who evidently remained in Washington County during the war, but about whom little is known, was the Rev. W. A. Langston of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. After the war he reported the following war-time marriages to the County Clerk:

- June 8, 1862 - John J. Payne (46) and Margaret J. Hicks (32)
- June 24, 1862 - John C. Ish (21) of Holt Co., Mo., and Martha J. Phillips (20) of Washington Co., Ark.
- Dec. 6, 1863 - Wm. F. Fletcher (26) and Martha Ann Cole (24)
- Dec. 15, 1863 - Frederic McGee (22) and Tabitha A. Wood (23)

The Cumberland Presbyterian pastors, nearly all of whom were Southern in sympathy, suffered most from the decline in the number of marriages during the war. But when conditions in northwest Arkansas were returning to normal, early in 1865, they again took over a large share of the marrying in Washington County. The Rev. John Buchanan, one of the more popular of the Cumberland Presbyterian preachers, had no call for

his marriage services during the war, but officiated at eight weddings in 1865 beginning with the Dearing-Sawyers marriage on Feb. 12. Another CP minister, the Rev. Luther M. Bell, officiated at six marriages in 1865, beginning with the Fincher-Colclasure wedding on Jan. 12.

The Rev. F. R. Earle, Cumberland Presbyterian minister and president of Cane Hill College, was a Major in the Confederate army. He returned to Cane Hill shortly after the surrender, and on June 13, 1865, was married to Amanda Buchanan, the marriage ceremony being read by the Rev. John Buchanan. Less than a week after his own marriage, the Rev. Earle officiated at the Pyeatte-Yates wedding June 18 and the Crawford-Yeager wedding on June 22, 1865.

The Justices of the Peace, who performed many Washington County marriages before the war, had very little business after hostilities began. There were only four JP marriages in 1862, none recorded for 1863, three in 1864, and twenty in 1865. The only JP's who recorded marriages for 1862 were C. G. Gilbreath, J. B. Rainwater and Pinckney Cantrell. JPs Samuel Mayes and Abram C. Males got in the marriage business in 1864. Other JPs began marrying folks early in 1865, among them James L. Carlile (8 marriages), John R. Reed and E. S. Cox (3 marriages each in 1865), Owen Ramey and W. C. Graham. The total number of war-time marriages by Justices of the Peace from 1862 to 1865 was 27.

The complete list of marriages recorded in Washington County Record Book "C" up to 1866 is given below. It should be remembered that other war-time marriages may have been recorded by the officiating minister in later years. We do not have the facilities to make a complete search. We take pride, however, in presenting the following list - the first publication of war-time marriages in Washington County:

An interesting historical curiosity in the County Clerk's vault in the courthouse is a "Marriage Record Book for Colored Persons." The colored marriages were recorded in this book from 1868 to 1876. The first Negro marriage recorded in Washington County was that of William Kelly (41) and Cintha A. Kelly (21) on Jan. 2, 1868. On Jan. 9, 1868, Mark M. Crawford (23) married Lotty George (16). On Feb. 6, 1868, W.H. Crawford (33) married Nancy E. North (21). All three of these colored marriages were performed by Rev. W. L. Molloy, Presbyterian minister. The Crawford names would indicate that Mark M. Crawford and W.H. Crawford had been slaves of the Crawford family. The last entry in the colored marriage record book is dated Jan. 28, 1876.

In the Historical Journals

The March 1957 issue of the Pulaski County Historical Review was devoted to the seizure of the U. S. Arsenal at Little Rock in February 1861, as told in contemporary newspaper accounts and in the official records.

The current issue (No. 14) of the Arkansas Valley Historical Papers (Russellville) carries an interesting series of short sketches of "Old Homes in Dardanelle" written by Louise Dunbar Parks. Seven old homes are described and their history given.

CHARLES STEWART INTERVIEW

PS: What's your view about what's going on there today compared with the accomplishments you and your colleagues made? Where do you see Arkansas politics today?

CS: Well, since I got out I just tried to divorce myself from it all. But I think we are again putting too much power in the Speaker. We virtually took power away from the Speaker. He was selected to preside over the House fairly and impartially with still some appointive powers. But under the seniority system, he had no control over who would be chairmen or vice chairmen. We have returned to where the Speaker will decide who will be the chairmen and vice chairmen of committees. The candidates running for Speaker use these appointments for votes—"I'll give you this appointment and you give me your vote for Speaker." It's back where you're getting more and more little sub-committees. They're going to go right back to having problems, I think, with quorums.

PS: But you wouldn't consider going back and straightening all that out?

CS: Nope. I've had all of it I want.

PS: Well, I've covered everything I wanted to cover, but I don't want to stop the interview if there's anything you'd like to add.

CS: Later I'll probably think of something, but right now—

PS: You've had an extremely satisfying, rich, and varied life. I'll end our interview with a thank you for your hospitality and your openness.

Oak Cemetery Inventory

By Izola Preston Morgan and Gordon Morgan*

On January 5, 1875, several citizens of Washington County gave land for Oak Cemetery, including Stephen K. and Amanda Stone, Lafayette Gregg, E.D. Harn, William Story, and Judge David Walker.

Some of the people interred in Oak Cemetery were born into slavery, among them Sam Young (1828-1933) from Paris, Texas, and grandfather of Sherman Morgan and Inez McPherson. He was a member of St. James United Methodist Church. Joe Manuel, born in West Virginia in 1858, died in 1938. He was a slave of the Calberts, coming to Arkansas after the Civil War and was a member of the Masonic Lodge at St. James.

Others buried in Oak Cemetery include James Hoover (1896-1954) who has a wing at Fayetteville City Hospital, Rev. A.L. Buchanan (1883-1962) was pastor of St. James United Methodist. Otis J. Parker (1889-1976) and Ruth H. Rich (1905-1987), notable citizens of the community, are also entombed there. However, some of the headstones are broken or missing. George Ballard, poet and author of *Ozark Ballads* (1928) is likely buried in Oak Cemetery, but a stone is not present.

The cemetery is located on South Dunn Street, south of the National Cemetery.

*Gordon Morgan is University Professor in the Sociology and Criminal Justice Department at the University of Arkansas and Izola Preston Morgan is a longtime research assistant at the University.

The First Families of Washington County

FLASHBACK presents herewith what is probably the first census ever taken in Washington County -- the "Sheriff's Census" of 1829. The original is in the Arkansas History Commission archives in LittleRock.

The Sheriff was "Colonel" Lewis Evans, early store-keeper who gave his name to the town of Evansville and who later was a member of the first board of trustees of Cane Hill College. Enumerating the families who lived in Washington County in 1829 must have been quite a job. The county was 50 miles square and included all of what is now Benton County and parts of the present Madison and Carroll Counties. There were no roads. The Sheriff at his store on the Indian line probably listed the family heads whom he knew and then added whatever names he could learn from travelers who visited his store.

He was careless in spelling names, did not number the names in order, and gave no information except the name of the head of the family. He probably overlooked some backwoods settlers. The pioneers were on the move in 1829, for the Cherokee country had just been opened to white settlement and the boundary line between the Indian country and the new county of Washington had just been established.

The "Sheriff's Census" of 1829 lists the names of 233 heads of families. A 3-months search of the records (books, genealogies, public and family records) give information about 109 of them. It hardly seems possible that there were 124 other families living in Washington County in 1829 who left no records of any kind. The pioneers, of course were too busy clearing a patch in the wilderness and setting up a home, to take time to record the names and happenings of those first days. Also, many of them could not write.

Some families are well documented, especially Alexander, Billingsley Blair, Bloyed, Buchanan, Carnahan, Cox, Conner, Garvin, Hagood Holmesley, Ish, McCamy, McGarrahan, Marrs, Morrow, Newton, Pyeatt, Reed, Shannon, Simpson, Skelton, Trent, Vaughan, Weddington, Wood, Woody and Yoes. Most of these first-comers were in the Evansville-Cane Hill section; the others were on West Fork, Middle Fork and Richland rivers.

We realize that the information we have on Our County's first 233 families is incomplete. We are anxious to learn more about these names of 125 years ago and will welcome any contributions to the record. Our historical society would be guilty of gross neglect if we did not make every effort to preserve the names of the men and women who made the beginnings that started Our County on its way to greatness.

OLD CANE HILL

Our Society has come into possession of an unusually interesting set of records of old Cane Hill. Included in the collection are such items as a list of Cane Hill citizens who served in the Confederate army, a list of officers othe 16th Arkansas Infantry, genealogical records of several pioneer families, sketches of some of the better-known Negro slaves, reminiscences of some of the first settlers, a catalog and program of old Cane Hill College, a map of the "Spanish Fort" in 1859, and many others. Because of the large amount of valuable historical material, we will publish it in our Bulletin Series. It is tentatively scheduled for publication July 1 under the title "The Pyeatts and the Carnahans of Old Cane Hill."

Some of our members may not be aware that our Society publishes, in addition to its periodical FLASHBACK, a series of Bulletins - chiefly diaries, collections of letters, and reprints of old books. 3. The War-Time Letters of Capt. T.C.DuPree, CSA. The story of the last years of the War Between the States, from south Arkansas to the battle of Atlanta, told in letters from Captain DuPree to his wife in Hempstead County. Springdale's main street bears the name of Captain DuPree's daughter Emma. 32 pages. 75 cents.

4. The Journals of James A. Walden, Vol.I. The day-by-day diary of an 18-year-old Confederate soldier who enlisted from Carroll County in 1861, was captured at Port Hudson in 1863, and imprisoned on Johnson's Island, Ohio, until 1865. He later lived in Springdale, Fayetteville and Cane Hill. 84 pages. \$1.

5. The Journals of James A. Walden, Vol.II. The diary of a Methodist minister in the Arkansas Ozarks after the War. 1868-1891. A frank account of the hardships and triumphs of a pioneer preacher. Many entries from Greathouse and Thornsberry Camp Grounds, White River and Boonsboro Circuits, Gearing's Chapel and Springdale. Frequent references to such names as Banks, Eidson, Trent, Holcomb, Maguire, Welch, Greathouse, Dutton, Arnett, and many others. 84 pages. \$1.
