

The 1892 Great Register of Voters Living in the City of Pomona

The 1892 Great Register of Voters for Los Angeles County, California contains more than 27,500 records. Of these, approximately 12,000 are for voters who resided in the City of Los Angeles and the remaining 15,500 represent voters living in "The Country." At that time, "The Country" was defined as any place in the county other than in the City of Los Angeles. (By contrast, note that in 1884 there were approximately 7,000 persons living in "The Country.")

The registers were the result of California's Registry Act of 1866 in which all voters were required to register. Not until the passage of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1920 were females allowed to vote, explaining why only males are listed.

In addition to name, age, place of birth, occupation and place of residence, the registers provide naturalization information in sufficient detail to show the date of naturalization and the court conferring the naturalization. The 1892 Great Register contains a wealth of personal information regarding each person, namely, height (in feet and inches), complexion shade, eye and hair color, and distinguishing marks.

The Southern California Genealogical Society's library presently has microfilms of the bi-annually printed Great Registers for Los Angeles County for the period 1873–1896. If you're performing research in Los Angeles County for that time period, perhaps a visit to our library to peruse the registers would help!

Please note that it is anticipated that the entire extraction of the 1892 Great Register will be included in the upcoming Members-Only section of our website, presently under construction.

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The registers were the result of California's Registry Act of 1866 in which all voters were required to register. Not until the passage of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1920 were females allowed to vote, explaining why only males are listed.

In addition to name, age, place of birth, occupation and place of residence, the registers provide naturalization information in sufficient detail to show the date of naturalization and the court conferring the naturalization. The 1892 Great Register contains a wealth of personal information regarding each person, namely, height (in feet and inches), complexion shade, eye and hair color, and distinguishing marks.



The 1884 Great Register

The 1884 Great Register of Voters for Los Angeles County contains 6,963 records of persons who lived in "The Country." At that time, "The Country" was defined as any place in the county other than in the City of Los Angeles. In 1884, Los Angeles County included present-day L.A. County plus the area that is now known as Orange County.

The Registers were the result of California's Registry Act of 1866, in which all voters were required to register. Why were only males listed? Because only men were allowed to vote in 1884. (Women were finally allowed to vote as a result of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1920.)

We begin our series on the 1884 Great Register with information on the citizens of Pomona, California (463 records), which has been extracted from "The 1884 Great Register."

In addition to name, age, place of birth, occupation and place of residence, the registers provide naturalization information in sufficient detail to show the date of naturalization and the court conferring the naturalization.

Our library presently has microfilms of the biannually printed Great Registers for the period 1873 through 1896. If you are performing research in Los Angeles County for that time period, perhaps a visit to our library to peruse the microfilms would help!

We would like to say a special "Thank you" to **Donald Chaput**, SCGS member and curator emeritus, Los Angeles Natural History Museum, for his assistance in our Great Register project. The Museum's Seaver Center has originals and printed copies of the Great Registers of Los Angeles County. We will continue this project in upcoming issues.

The 1884 Great Register

The 1884 Great Register of Voters for Los Angeles County California contains 6,963 records of persons who lived in "The Country". At that time, "The Country" was defined as any place in the county other than in the City of Los Angeles. In 1884, Los Angeles County included present day L.A. County plus the area that is now known as Orange County.

The registers were the result of California's Registry Act of 1866 in which all voters were required to register. Why were only males listed? Because only men were allowed to vote in 1884. (Women were finally allowed to vote as a result of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1920.)

In the March/April 2000 issue of *The Searcher*, we presented extracted information from the Great Register about citizens of Pomona, California (463 records). Our series continues with information for the citizens of Pasadena, California (404 records).

In addition to name, age, place of birth, occupation and place of residence, the registers provide naturalization information in sufficient detail to show the date of naturalization and the court conferring the naturalization.

Our library presently has microfilms of the biannually printed Great Registers for the period 1873 through 1896. If you are performing research in Los Angeles County for that time period, perhaps a visit to our library to peruse the registers would help!

We would like to say a special "Thank you" to **Donald Chaput**, curator emeritus, Los Angeles Natural History Museum, for his assistance in our Great Register project. The Museum's Seaver Center has originals and printed copies of the Great Registers of Los Angeles County.

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The 1884 Great Register

The 1884 Great Register of Voters for Los Angeles County California contains 6,963 records of persons who lived in "The Country." At that time The Country was defined as any place in the county other than in the city of Los Angeles. In 1884 Los Angeles County included present day L.A. County plus the area that is now known as Orange County.

The Registers were the result of California's Registry Act of 1866 in which all voters were required to register. Why were only males listed? Because only men were allowed to vote in 1884. (Women were finally allowed to vote as a result of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1920.)

The March/April 2000 issue of *The Searcher* presented extracted information from the Great Register on citizens of Pomona (463 records) and the May/June 2000 issue contained information for the citizens of Pasadena (404 records). This extraction contains information for the residents of Santa Ana, (528 records).

In addition to name, age, place of birth, occupation and place of residence, the registers provide naturalization information in sufficient detail to show the date of naturalization and the court conferring the naturalization.

Our library presently has microfilms of the biannually printed Great Registers for the period 1873 through 1896. If you are performing research in Los Angeles County for that time period, perhaps a visit to our library to peruse the Registers would help!

We would like to say a special "Thank you" to Donald Chaput, curator emeritus, Los Angeles Natural History Museum for his assistance in our Great Register project. The Museum's Seaver Center has originals and printed copies of the Great Registers of Los Angeles County.

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

SUTRO LIBRARY ACQUISITIONS

Noted in the September 1, 1979 issue of the Genealogical Gazette, published by Sandra K. Ogle of Napa, California:

"Sutro Library (San Francisco) has added a great many new microfilms to their shelves. They are filmed from original volumes of history in the Cox Library, by AMERICANA UNLIMITED, Tucson, Arizona. Included are many rolls where research materials are very scarce, such as Colorado, Nebraska, etc. A great many for Illinois."

This is most welcome news for those of us who make frequent use of Sutro's collection, both in person and through inter-library loan.

The 1892 Great Register of Voters Living in the City of Pomona

The 1892 Great Register of Voters for Los Angeles County, California contains more than 27,500 records. Of these, approximately 12,000 are for voters who resided in the City of Los Angeles and the remaining 15,500 represent voters living in "The Country." At that time, "The Country" was defined as any place in the county other than in the City of Los Angeles. (By contrast, note that in 1884 there were approximately 7,000 persons living in "The Country.")

The registers were the result of California's Registry Act of 1866 in which all voters were required to register. Not until the passage of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1920 were females allowed to vote, explaining why only males are listed.

In addition to name, age, place of birth, occupation and place of residence, the registers provide naturalization information in sufficient detail to show the date of naturalization and the court conferring the naturalization. The 1892 Great Register contains a wealth of personal information regarding each person, namely, height (in feet and inches), complexion shade, eye and hair color, and distinguishing marks.

The Southern California Genealogical Society's library presently has microfilms of the bi-annually printed Great Registers for Los Angeles County for the period 1873–1896. If you're performing research in Los Angeles County for that time period, perhaps a visit to our library to peruse the registers would help!

Please note that it is anticipated that the entire extraction of the 1892 Great Register will be included in the upcoming Members-Only section of our website, presently under construction. Lookups can be performed by the SCGS Research team and can be ordered via the SCGS website.



INTRODUCTION.

THE wish to know something of our ancestors, to learn from whom and what manner of men one is descended, is a natural and laudable ambition, although in a new country the pursuit of wealth usually leaves but little time or desire for anything else until that is accomplished. California is so far removed from the places wherein our families have been rooted, so far from all records and home of tradition, that those of us who turn for a moment from the exacting cares and distractions of our work-a-day existence to the interesting study of the family origin do so under unusual difficulties. We have, however, made a beginning in our society, and who can tell what we may accomplish? California draws her population from all sections of the United States, and indeed, from all quarters of the civilized and semi-civilized globe. The records and pedigrees of such a diversified people ought to contain much of interest. And then, while our state has had but fifty years of existence,—a mere moment in the life of a commonwealth,—our American nineteenth century civilization came to displace with its rude vigor, a dreamy civilization which was much older. We refer to that which followed the introduction of the Spanish missions. The conquest of California was a spiritual one, followed by civil and military rule. The first missions were established by the Jesuits in Baja California (Lower California), that of Loreto, by Father Salvatierra in 1697, being the first. In 1767, the Jesuits were expelled by decree of Charles III, and the missions fell into the hands of the Franciscans, who at once took steps to establish themselves in Alta (Upper) California. The coast of California had been visited by Cabrillo, Drake, Viscayno, and others, but no attempt at settlement had been made. An expedition was now organized for the conversion of the Indians of Alta California, and the direction and management

given to Father Junipero Serra. A part of the company sailed from La Paz, January 9, 1769, while the rest proceeded overland, both parties to meet at San Diego bay. The land expedition, headed by Father Junipero Serra, was first to arrive, and the mission of San Diego, the first in Alta California, was established June 16, 1769. This was followed by the missions of Monterey, San Antonio, San Gabriel, San Juan Capistrano, and San Francisco, in the order named. Other missions were established until they numbered twenty-one in all. The fathers were careful in selecting localities for their missions, and they are situated in the very garden spots of California. The missions flourished, colonists arrived, and gradually a trade sprung up between the Atlantic and the Pacific sides of the continent. A few Americans and Englishmen wandered into California from different parts of the world, and many of these pioneers married into the old Spanish families. There is a wealth of material for family history in the records of the missions, and it will be the ambition of the society to incorporate within its own life something of the older civilization which preceded the coming of the Americans.

Dr. Edward S. Clark, the president, has given the society a large quantity of very valuable genealogical matter, being the records of the families of the ten original purchasers of Nantucket, and representing many years of careful and conscientious work. It is the intention of the society to begin the publication of these records in the near future and to continue until all are in print.

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THE HOLMES FAMILY OF RHODE ISLAND AND NEW JERSEY.

By HULDA HOLMES BERGEN BROWN.

REV. OBADIAH HOLMES, OF NEWPORT, RHODE ISLAND, AND HIS DESCENDANTS IN MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY.

1. The Rev. OBADIAH HOLMES, a dissenting clergyman, from Manchester, England, first settled in Salem, Mass., with his wife, Catherine Preston, and son Jonathan, in 1639. He was then thirty-two years of age, highly educated for that period, as his writings indicate, and a man of property; for among other articles of value brought over from England was a "horologe," or tall "grandfather's clock," the first pendulum-clock ever brought to America, which still counts the hours in the rooms of the Long Island Historical Society, in Brooklyn, N. Y. These clocks were very rare previous to 1700, except in the houses of the nobility or moneyed scientists. That he was an original thinker with the courage of his convictions, is shown by the fact that, after preaching for seven years in the Congregationalist denomination, he, with others, left that fold for the Baptist, then holding services in a private house in Lynn, Mass. Here he was tried for "Dishonor to his God," in saying his prayers with his hat on and for baptizing on Sunday, and was sentenced to be lashed (thirty lashes) at the whipping-post. Instead of the post he was whipped from the tail of a cart as it was driven through the town. In his diary he describes his sufferings as most intense, and, although he could have easily paid the fine imposed, he felt he was suffering for conscience' sake and refused to yield to his persecutors. So severe was this punishment that for two weeks after he could only rest, when not in a recumbent position, on his *knees* and *elbows*. Soon after this, in 1646, he joined Roger Williams's colony at Providence, R. I., where he served as a member of the special governor's council for King Philip's War. Later he was pastor of the Baptist church at Newport, R. I., for twenty-five years. In 1655, he was a freeman in Newport, and commissioner from 1656 to 1658. He was also representative to the general court of Rhode Island at both Newport and Portsmouth. But the spirit of adventure was in him and in 1664 we find him residing at Gravesend, Long Island, whither Lady Deborah Moody, Sergeant-at-Law James Hubbard, and others, had fled from Salem, Mass., in 1643, for the same principles of the Baptist faith. In 1665, there were fertile lands to be occupied in East Jersey, and the Rev. Obadiah Holmes and James Hubbard and many Baptists from Long Island and Rhode Island, patented lands in Monmouth county, N. J.; and, to their honor be it said, the Indians were duly paid for them on their own terms. Among these early patentees were William Bowne, of Long Island, whose son Andrew was afterward governor of New Jersey, and Richard Borden, James Ashton, and John Throckmorton, of Rhode Island, whose descendants were later destined to intermarry and form some of the most honored families of

that county. After framing the patent of Monmouth county and establishing members of his family on his newly acquired lands, he returned to Newport to end his days, where he died in 1682, having served his God and his country according to his conscience, in England and four of the American colonies. His will (extant) provides for his widow and children, and contains long messages of love and advice to each individual member of his family.

2. JONATHAN² HOLMES (*Obadiah*¹), born in England in 1637, died in Newport, R. I., in 1713; married Sarah, daughter of Richard Borden, of Rhode Island. Richard Borden was a Monmouth patentee. He was born in 1601, and died in 1671. He was assistant to the governor of Rhode Island, 1653-54; general treasurer, 1653 to 1655; deputy, 1667 to 1670; and surveyor and commissioner of boundaries in 1638. His daughter Sarah was born in 1640. Jonathan Holmes was a member of the New Jersey assembly in 1668; from 1670 to 1672, and in 1680, justice of the peace, and on September 20, 1673, commissioned captain of the Monmouth county troop of horse. Soon after his father's death he went back to Newport, leaving his sons in charge of his Monmouth estates. He became prominent in Rhode Island as deputy from 1689 to 1701; was speaker and member of the governor's council, and treasurer of the colony in 1704.

James Ashton was a Monmouth patentee, 1665; deputy to general court of Rhode Island, 1652 to 1665; and commissioner of boundaries in New Jersey. Obadiah Holmes was a man of wealth and position and was commissioned a captain in the militia.

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Sarah (Clayton) Mott. Gershom Mott was high sheriff of Monmouth county, New Jersey, in 1697-98, and representative from 1707 to 1713. He was a grandson of William Bowne, patentee of Gravesend, L. I., later of Monmouth, and member of assembly from Monmouth. Samuel Holmes was a man of retiring habits, but is mentioned as having been appointed trustee and executor of several estates and was active in the Baptist church. His son Asher was born February 16, 1740.

5. ASHER⁵ HOLMES (*Samuel⁴, Obadiah³, Jonathan², Obadiah¹*), born February 16, 1740; died in 1808; married, in 1771, Sarah, daughter of John and Hope (Taylor) Watson. Hope Taylor was a granddaughter of Edward Taylor and Richard Hartshorne, both prominent in the early history of Monmouth county, New Jersey. Asher Holmes was surveyor, high sheriff, member of committee of safety, in June, 1774; of committee of observation and inspection, December, 1774; helped to organize the First New Jersey regiment; major in 1776; colonel in 1778. His daughter Hulda was born in 1779.
6. HULDA⁶ HOLMES (*Ashers⁵, Samuel⁴, Obadiah³, Jonathan², Obadiah¹*), born in 1779; died in 1851; married, in 1801, Elias Hubbard, of Brooklyn, N. Y., and had

SOME OF THE HUGHES FAMILY.

1. JOHN HUGH came from Merionethshire, Wales, to Gwynedd, Pennsylvania, in 1698. The majority of the Welsh settlers coming over were of the Church of England, but John Hugh and John Humphrey, with his nephew, Rowland Ellis, a man of note, were Quakers. Through the preaching of these men the little band became Friends. Among the original purchasers of Gwynedd township were the names, "John Hugh and John Humphrey, Friends and Preachers." Gwynedd was celebrated for the site of one of the oldest Friends' meetings in the country. The township was taken up in 1698. It is now in Montgomery county. The Quakers had meetings for the society, as early as 1681, at the house of Frances Fairlamb, about the place where Kensington now stands.

2. ELLIS² HUGHES (*John¹*), born in Merionethshire, Wales, 1687; married, 4 mo. 5, 1713, Jane Foulke. At Exeter monthly meeting of Friends, Berks county, Pa., 1 mo. 31, 1763, a memorial of the life of Ellis Hughes, a minister, was read. This account reads: "He was born in Merionethshire, in the principality of

Wales, and brought over into this province by his parents when about twelve years of age." About the 34th year he appeared in the ministry. He died at his own house at Exeter, 1 mo. 11, 1764, aged 76 years, and was buried in Friends' ground at Exeter. Jane, the wife of Ellis Hughes, was the daughter of Edward Foulke, who wrote the historical collections of Gwynedd in Welsh, and a direct descendant of Ririd Floidd, Lord of Penllyn, being the granddaughter of Fíoulke ap Thomas, who married Lady Lowry. At Exeter monthly meeting, 9 mo. 23, 1767, a testimony was read concerning Jane Hughes, who died 8 mo. 1, 1766, at the home of her son-in-law, Samuel Lee, in Oley township, Berks county, Pa., and was buried at Exeter. "She was born in Merionethshire in the North of Wales, 11 mo. 10, 1684, and came into Pennsylvania with her father Edward Foulke and family about the fourteenth year of her age, and some time after joined the Friends. About the 30th year of her age she entered into marriage with our worthy Friend Ellis Hughes, and some time after moved from Gwynedd, where they then lived, to Exeter, where she was appointed an elder, in which station she continued steady to the end, for about thirty years."

3. WILLIAM³ HUGHES (*Ellis², John¹*), born 1716; married at Exeter monthly meeting, 4 mo. 1, 1738, Amy Willets, daughter of Thomas Willets, of Long Island. The Willets family came over about 1650. 4 mo. 26, 1755, William Hughes was disowned from meeting. I think some time after this he and his family removed and lived for some years at Westbury, Long Island. At the monthly meeting, 10 mo. 30, 1760, Ellis Hughes, of Exeter meeting, son of William Hughes, requested a certificate of removal to Westbury monthly meeting, Long Island. It was signed at Exeter, 11 mo. 27, 1760.

4. ELLIS⁴ HUGHES (*William³, Ellis², John¹*), born 1 mo. 12, 1739; died October 6, 1785; married, in 1764, Hannah, daughter of Francis Yarnall (who was tax collector of Exeter) and great granddaughter of Francis Yarnall, who was a member of the provincial assembly in 1711, and died in 1721. Francis Yarnall married, in 1686, Hannah Baker. Ellis Hughes was sometimes called General Hughes. He was a surveyor, and public surveyors of that day were generally styled surveyors-general. He was a large

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landowner, owning about 25,000 acres of land. He surveyed and owned all the land where the Lehigh coal mines now are. With his father, William Hughes, he laid out Catawissa, originally a Quaker settlement, on a beautiful shady knoll. A little apart from the din and dust of the village stood the venerable Quaker meeting-house. The following account of Ellis Hughes was written by his son Jeremiah in the family Bible. I give it *verbatim*. The spelling of some of the proper names has since been changed:

“ Among those who accompanied the early emigrants to the province of Pennsylvania, and subsequently settled upon the upper branches of Schuylkill, in and near the town of Reading, were two brothers of the name of Hugh, afterwards Hughes, from Wales, one if not both of whom were eminent preachers of the Gospel in the society of Friends, and two other brothers of the name of Yarnall, from each of whom have sprung a numerous progeny, now dispersed over various parts of the United States. Other Hughes, but no other Yarnalls, have been known to have emigrated to America.

“ As the aborigines retired the immediate descendants of those four individuals located themselves upon the then frontier, in many cases the Indians being their nearest neighbors; whenever hostilities occurred they shared severely in the disaster incident to Indian warfare. Their houses were burned and their property devastated, and yet often amongst the first to extend the brotherly hand in aiding them to retrieve their comforts, were those same natives of the forest, who, as soon as peace returned, invited them back to the settlements from which they had been driven.

“ Prior to the American Revolution, we find the family of the Yarnall's located beyond the 'Broad mountain,' at the intersection of the creek which flows between the Mohoney and the Mahontonga mountains with the road leading through the then Wilderness which separated Shamoking Fort, at the junction of the two branches of the Susquehanna (now Sunbury) from settlements near Reading.

“ Very few if any families were within twenty miles of them. Still further up the 'New Purchase,' as it was then designated in virtue of recent treaties with the Indians, upon a most beautiful spot which he had himself as pioneer and surveyor selected, where the Cataweesa Creek empties itself into the Susquehanna, and about half way between Shamokin Fort and the Wyoming Settlement, Ellis Hughes, grandson of one of the aforementioned brothers, with his wife, a grand-daughter of one of the Yarnalls, with his young family had settled themselves. Cataweesa village, or Hughesburgh, now occupies this site upon the banks of the Susquehanna. They had already collected many comforts around them, erected commodious dwellings, planted orchards, constructed a sawmill, gristmill, tannery, smithery, etc., and were in the act of going forth in the morning to reap an abundant harvest—as the miserable remnant of them, that had been made widows and orphans the day before by the memorable massacre at Wyoming, flying for their lives—rushed almost famished to partake of the first mouthful they had tasted after the disaster—the bread so hastily prepared by

Ellis & Hannah Hughes, time only allowed to secure the children upon the backs of the horses hastily driven up for the purpose, while the strangers snatched their scanty meal, when all joined in the rapid flight on which alone depended their lives.

"The whole frontier was abandoned to the savage enemy. Hundreds of families destitute of everything were precipitated upon the settlements below, and terror spread far and wide. The improvements at Cataweesa, were mostly reduced to ashes.

"When peace was restored, or the enemy driven far beyond the recent scenes of their prowess, the family of the Yarnalls returned to their former settlements and continued to occupy them and enlarge their borders by new ramifications of the families for many years, and their descendants are probably numerous in the neighborhood at this day.

"Ellis and Hannah Hughes meantime, with a family of ten children, removed to Chester county, Pa. He associated with a capitalist of the city of Philadelphia, who was to have two thirds for advancing the purchase money and perfecting the title, and Ellis the other third for making the actual survey and locating warrants, of a number of tracts of land, embracing about twenty-five thousand acres, situated above his former residence and embracing much of the now valuable coal regions of that section.

"Before completing the enterprise, Ellis, whilst from home employed therein, was taken ill at Cataweesa and died on the 6th of Oct', 1785, in the 45th year of his age. His remains lay in the Friends' burying ground at his favorite place. His family never derived an acre of the land to which he was entitled, and in securing which he lost his life. His partner had hold of the writings. Few periods in American history exceed for general distress and difficulties those which immediately succeeded the Revolution and preceded the adjustment of the Federal Government. It was a commotion of the mountain wave, when the storm wind suddenly subsides and leaves the bark without headway or steerage. It was a Revolution divested of its inspiring impulses—before it had yet had to settle down to the harmonies and occupation of peaceful life.

"Public credit signally bankrupt and private confidence greatly shaken—he was indeed sanguine who could surmount for the time the many fearful forebodings that seemed inevitable to the condition of the illy confederated States—now left free to dispute with each other—it was at the moment of the heighth—the general difficulties superinduced by these circumstances and amidst the embarrassments which the disasters of the war had entailed upon the family itself not only by the loss of every atom of property but also environed by the obligations which the acquisition of that property had induced, that Hannah Hughes became a widow, with a family of ten young children and her own constitution exceedingly feeble, but she had an unwavering faith in the superintending providence of Him who promised to be a father to the fatherless and a sure help in every time of need. To a meek and truly feminine delicacy of mind, she united with the most endearing disposition an uncommon share of both fortitude and perseverance,

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a quick and steady presence of mind and a sound understanding, which improving by a large share of very eventful experience had matured into a profound judgment eminently qualifying her for the duties of a parent—which now in a double measure devolved upon her.

“After toiling for several years, with the difficulties of making a living upon rented land, she finally concluded to move to a town, and in—or about the year 1790—arrived at Baltimore with her family, where she had scarcely an acquaintance—and which place she had never seen.

“The enterprise was blest of Him upon whom she had confided, and after a life of usefulness her remains were deposited in the burying ground of the Friends’ Society, of which she lived and died, the day after her decease, which occurred suddenly the 1st of April, 1816, in the sixty-ninth year of her age. The sermon preached by that eminent member of the Gospel of Peace, Mary Mifflin, upon the occasion of returning from the grave just enclosed—to the meeting then convened—was among the most consoling and eloquent discourses ever listened to—by him who leaves this testimony upon record, with the hope that the lesson which he has learned of so impressive a character may not be lost to others—Trust in the Lord Oh! my soul.”

5. JEREMIAH HUGHES (*Ellis, William, Ellis, John*), born 6 mo. 7, 1783; died in Washington, D. C., 11 mo. 27, 1848; married, 7 mo. 9, 1807, Priscilla Jacobs. Five of his children died in infancy, and in 1900 there are only two living descendants of his eleven children. In the list below, I give only those who lived. Jeremiah Hughes was one of the most prominent men of his time in Maryland. As he records in his touching tribute to his mother, he was taken at an early age from Pennsylvania to Baltimore. He had large land interests, owned flour mills, was member of the legislature, state printer, and presidential elector. He edited and printed the *Maryland Gazette*, which was one of the oldest papers in the country, being the second newspaper published in the colony. He was also editor of the *Maryland Republican*, and in 1839 he bought of Mrs. Sallie Ann Niles the *Register*, which he continued to publish until it ceased to exist in 1848. The *Niles Weekly Register*, the most valuable newspaper of its day, as all searchers for historical facts find it to be, was established in Baltimore, in 1811, by Hezekiah Niles, an editor of the *Baltimore Evening Post*, and was a complete and accurate record of events from 1811 to 1848. Its motto was: "The Past—the Present—the Future." A complete file of the *Register* would, to-day, bring hundreds of dollars. Mr. Hughes retired from active life only when he felt the infirmities of age creeping on. He passed away on November 27, 1848, after a life of usefulness and honor. He was buried in Oak Hill cemetery, in Washington, D. C., where all but two of his children lie.

PEARL FAMILY.

In 1666, there lived in Beverly Park, Yorkshire, England, the widow Alice Pearl, who, on November 11th of that year, bound her son John for two years to John Gurwood, miller, to fill out the years of service for which he had been apprenticed to Anthony Elvidge, miller, deceased. By 1670 the widow Alice Pearl was dead, and her son John, who had completed his term of service, was engaged in running a mill in Cottingham, England. The following year he leased this mill to Henry Ball and soon after came to America. He followed his calling of miller, first in Marblehead and then in Bradford, Mass.

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1. JOHN PEARL was born in Skidby, Beverly Park, Yorkshire, England, about 1650, and died in Bradford, Mass., about 1720. He married, about 1682, Elizabeth, daughter of Richard and Alice (Northend) Holmes, of Rowley. She was born in Rowley, Mass., September 15, 1662, and died in Boxford, Mass., March 26, 1744. Her father, Richard Holmes, was an early settler of Rowley. He was born about 1604, and died in Bradford, about the beginning of 1696. CAPTAIN TIMOTHY³ PEARL (*Timothy², John¹*) was born in Windham, Conn., October 24, 1723; died in Willington, Conn., October 19, 1789; married in Windham, November 7, 1746, Dinah, daughter of Captain Joshua and Ketrurah (Holt) Holt. She was born in Windham, March 17, 1725/6, and died in Willington, September 25, 1806. Her father and mother were cousins. Her father was son of Nicholas Holt, the second, and her mother the daughter of Henry Holt, both sons of Nicholas Holt, the first, of Andover, Mass. The wife of Henry Holt was Sarah, daughter of William Ballard, who came with Nicholas Holt in the ship *James*, in 1635. The wife of Nicholas Holt, the second, was Mary, daughter of Robert and Mary (Marshall) Russell, of Andover. Mary Marshall was the daughter of Thomas and Joanna Marshall. Towards the end of 1748, Captain Pearl removed from Windham to Willington, where he bought 100 acres of land from Philip Abbot. In May, 1756, he was appointed lieutenant of the Eighth company, Fifth regiment, Connecticut troops, and in October, 1763, he was commissioned captain of the same. Between 1764 and 1771, he served for five years in the general court as deputy for Willington. He was buried in the old graveyard in Willington, and Dinah, his wife, sleeps by his side.

 THOMAS POPE, OF PLYMOUTH, AND HIS DESCENDANTS.

I. THOMAS POPE, born in 1608; died in Dartmouth, in October, 1683; married, first, in Plymouth, January 28, 1637, Anna, daughter of Gabriel and Catharine Fallowell, of Plymouth. Married, second, in Plymouth, May 19, 1646, Sarah, daughter of John and Sarah (Carey) Jenney, of Plymouth. Thomas Pope was of Plymouth in 1631, one of a jury in 1668, had land granted him in 1636, volunteered to fight the Pequins in 1637, chosen constable in June 4, 1645; was in a jury August, 1645. Of Yarmouth in 1646. Surveyor of highways June 6, 1651. Fined June 7, 1670, for villifying the ministry. Was one of the Grand Enquist, June 5, 1672. Granted leave, since he and others cannot secure Saconnett Neck according to the

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grant, to look out some other place undisposed of for their accommo-
dation. John Barnes and Thomas Pope had some disputes, first,
February 17, 1664; second, May, 1665, about boundary of lands, etc.
Thomas's name mentioned in a deed of land between Richard Clough
and William Dennis. August 29, 1640, sold house, etc., to Geo.
Bonance. Thomas Pope rated, 25 March, 1633. On June 7, 1637,
offers to go under Mr. Prince against Peguin Indians. Isaac and Seth
Pope took out letters of administration on the estate of Thomas Pope
November 2, 1683. In Thomas Pope's will, dated 12 mo. 5, 1683.
(February 25, 1683; previous to September, 1752, the 1st month
began March 25th, making the 12th month begin February 21st) he
gives to his son Seth 10 per cent in addition to what he had already
given him. To his grandson, Thomas, 20 acres upland and 2 acres
meadow on the west side of Acushnett River; but his father (Seth) in
consideration thereof, was to pay Thomas's grandson, Jacob Mitchell,
£3 when he was 21 years old. To his daughter Deborah, and his other
daughter, £5 each; and his meadows at South Meadows, Plymouth,
to all his children equally. To Isaac, his homestead and the rest and
residue of his property; but if he should die before 21 without issue,
then it was to go to Seth's sons. He appoints John Cook, his son
Seth Pope, and Thomas Taber overseers, and orders Isaac not to make
any bargains before he is 21 years old without the consent of his over-
seers. Included in this gift are his Indians, Lydia and Geolo.

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"Whereas, Philip, the late Sachem of Pankanakett, and other
sachems, his accomplices, haveing bin in confederation and plighted
covenant with his ma^{ties} collonie of New Plymouth, have lately broken
covenant with the English, and they and these people have likewise
broken out in open rebellion against our sou^a, lord Kinge Charles, his
crowne and dignities, expressed by raising a crewell and onlawfull war,
murdering his leich people, destroying and burning their houses and
estates, expressing great hostillite, outrage and crewelty against his
said ma^{ties} subjects, whereby many of them were personally slaine,
and some bereaved of their deare children and relations, among which
said rebells an Indian named Popanooie is found to be one, whoe
hath had a hand, and is found to be very active in the great crewelty
and outrage acted upon severale of the inhabitants of the town of
Dartmouth, in the said, his ma^{ties} collonie of New Plymouth, in
p^ticular, it being manifest that he was very active towards and about
the destruction of severale of the children of Thomas Pope, late of
Dartmouth, aforesaid, and severale others of the said town: in consid-
eration whereof, after due examination had of the premises, this Court
doth hereby condemne and centence him, the said Popanooie, and
his wife and children to ppetuall servitude they likewise being
found coeptenon with him in the said rebellion, and particularly that
hee, the said Popanooie, is to be sold and sent out of the country."
(From Plymouth Records, July 13, 1677.)

2. SETH² POPE (*Thomas*¹), born January 13, 1648, in Plymouth; died in Dartmouth, March 17, 1727. The records give no information concerning his early history. Tradition, in part confirmed by the records, says that in 1670 he appeared as a peddler in Sandwich, whereupon the constable, in pursuance of a regulation then in force, ordered him to depart, lest in the future he might become a charge upon the town. He accordingly withdrew, taking occasion, however, to remark, that he would yet come back and buy the town. Procuring a boat at Monument, he followed the coast round to Acushnett, where he settled within the present limits of Fairhaven, and by his industry, energy, and skillful business management, ultimately became one of the most wealthy and influential citizens of the old colony. In 1678/9, March 8, an allowance was ordered by the court to be made him for expenses and time returning guns to the Indians after Philip's War; 1685, June 2, was chosen selectman of Dartmouth; 1686, March 4, took the oath of fidelity; June 2, again chosen selectman; June 4, commissioned lieutenant. He was chosen representative from Dartmouth to the general court at Plymouth in 1689 and 1690; magistrate for Bristol county, July 7, 1691, and justice of the peace in Dartmouth, May 27, 1692. He is named as one of the fifty-six proprietors of Dartmouth in the confirmatory deed of Governor Bradford in 1694. June 12, 1695, he appeared in Boston in behalf of his townsmen to urge an abatement of taxes. He appears to have been for many years largely interested in the coastwise trade, and had a wharf and warehouse at Acushnett. In 1698 he was part owner of the sloop *Hopewell*, and in 1709 of the sloop *Joanna and Thankful*. In 1700, by way of the fulfillment of his promise made thirty years before to the Sandwich constable, he purchased a large amount of realty in that village, including the gristmill, fullingmill and weaving-shop, which was valued at the time of his death at £3,460. His

estates in Dartmouth were extensive and valuable, comprising several farms and dwellinghouses, a saw and gristmill, a well-stocked store and warehouse, and other property, amounting in all to more than £15,000—a large sum for those days. He married, first (date and place unknown), Deborah, born 1655, died Feb. 19, 1711; and, second (date and place unknown), Rebecca, born 1662, died July 22, 1741.

PEET FAMILY.

I. JOHN PEAT was born in Derbyshire, Duffield Parish, England, and came to America in the ship *Hopewell* in 1635. Nothing further is known of him until he settled in Stratford, Conn., in 1638, being then about thirty-eight years of age. The name for nearly one hundred years was Peat, although now spelled Peet, and was borne by many prominent in civil, military, and church affairs. Five were commissioned officers in the colonial forces of Connecticut, and several represented their towns in the general assembly. One was a commissioned officer and eleven were non-commissioned officers and privates in the Revolutionary War. John Peat was sexton of the First Congregational church of Stratford, and Orcutt's *History of Connecticut* relates how Goodman Peat for ten or fifteen years rang the first bell that called worshipers together in the State of Connecticut. John Peat died in

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Stratford, January 28, 1677/8. He married Sarah, daughter of Richard Osborn. Her father, Richard Osborn, came in the *Hopewell* in 1634, and in 1635 was one of a company who drew for a home lot in Hingham, Mass. He was a soldier in the Pequot war in 1637, and a "Free Planter" in New Haven in 1639. In 1650 he removed to Fairfield, Conn., where he received a grant of land for his services in the Pequot war.

Francis Nichols, born in England, 1595; died in Stratford, Conn., 1650. Sergt. Francis Nichols settled in Stratford about 1639, and was the first military officer in the plantation, a position of much honor, indicating a previous experience in England. In the *New York Mercury*, October 27, 1760, appears the following: "Died — at Stratford, Conn., Deacon Thomas Peet, in the 62nd year of his age. He was 'Post Rider' for the last thirty years, and gave general satisfaction."

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HOLLYWOOD Before HOLLYWOOD Became HOLLYWOOD
1882--1886

Numerous articles have been written about Hollywood after it became a movie production center but little has been written of its earlier history. Edwin O. Palmer in his 1937 History of Hollywood (pg. 65, vol. I) merely mentions that what later was to become Hollywood was sold to Mr. Hurst. Who was this Mr. Hurst? He was Ezra Morrow Hurst born 1838 in Pickaway County, Ohio. In 1852 he migrated to Missouri when his father took the family there. He was a sergeant on the Union side in the Civil War. In 1867 he married Lydia Ann Sickler in Atchison County, Missouri. He served as County Treasurer and County Judge. In November 1880 he was elected Atchison County Representative to the Missouri State Legislature. When he was stricken with sciatic rheumatism he resigned this office. Forced to use crutches he decided to go west for his health.

In the spring of 1882 with his wife and children, Ora 13, Forrest 10, Orba 6½ and James 2½, the family boarded the train in Atchison, Kansas and detrained in Las Vegas, New Mexico Territory. For six weeks the family lived here in two tents--one for sleeping and the other for cooking and eating. It snowed once while the family was in the tents. Las Vegas had only a grocery store with post office and a hotel with a bath house. Ezra's left leg was badly swollen. He took daily hot spring baths with blue mud packs and rub downs. Soon the crutches gave way to a cane.

When Ezra decided to continue on west he forgot his cane when the family took the train. Arriving in Los Angeles a small house was rented. Looking for a farm to buy May 11, 1882 he purchased 120 acres from David Cole, his wife, Lucy and daughter Emma. The corner of what was to become Hollywood Blvd. and Vine St. was at the midpoint of the east boundary of the farm.

THE FARM

The farm was considered a part of Colegrove which lay just to the south. The home was a wooden frame house facing east. There were two small frame buildings, one which must have served as the first school building. There were four rows of eucalyptus trees along the lane leading to the house. There was a guava patch south of the house. Milk cows, horses and chickens were kept for the needs of the family. Barley was raised. There was no irrigation. There were no citrus though in 1898 when Ona returned to the area orange trees had been planted. For mercantile and groceries the family had to go into Los Angeles. Snakes were quite numerous. Three children, Arthur, Ona and Lulu were born on this farm. Betty Sly Hurst, mother of Ezra, at the age of about 80, came by train from Missouri to visit the family.

There were not many neighbors. The Gowers lived 1½ miles to the southeast while the Rogers lived four miles to the southwest. The Poiser family lived ¼ mile west until some Chinese took over their place. To the east were all Mexicans, some being Sepulveda, Lamarie, Andratha, Polank and Norris. The Hursts were friends of the Beveridges. Mr. Beveridge was a state governor.

A SAD OCCASION

Three children had died before the Hurst family left Missouri. The eldest child, Ora, died June 30th very shortly after the family moved onto the farm. The day after her death a playmate, Tommy Poiser, was run over and killed by a wagon. Tommy's father did not have the means to buy a lot and bury his son properly. Ezra donated a site near his north property line where Ora and Tommy were buried side by side.

In 1886 when Ezra decided to sell and, being uncertain of the future of the farm, he had Mr. Vonderlowe, sexton of Rosedale Cemetery, reinter Ora and Tommy in his cemetery. This is on Washington Blvd. between Vermont and Western Avenues. A V-shaped monument with the inscription "Ora and Tommy" was erected.

SCHOOL

Ezra provided the building for the school year of 1882-83. He made the wooden benches that were used. He went into Los Angeles and hired Miss Fleshman, a Jewish lady, to teach school. She drove each day from Los Angeles to the school. There were about 30 pupils. The Hurst children and Ruth Harris were the only whites, the rest

being Mexican. Some of the latter children were from the Sepulveda, Lamarie, And-ratha, Norris and Palonka families. The teacher used English, resorting to Spanish only when necessary to help the Mexicans to understand. The wooden benches had no backs. Books were placed on the bench beside each pupil.

The Los Angeles Board of Supervisors approved a petition for a new school district to be known as the Pass School District May 1, 1882. The Pass school was erected on a road later to be known as Sunset Blvd. Regular school desks were installed. The fall of 1883 school started here. Miss Fleshman continued as the teacher.

SALE OF THE FARM

July 18, 1883 Ezra sold 21.265 acres on the northeast side of the road to Alonzo F. Sickler, a brother of his wife. April 26, 1884 Ezra sold 10 acres in the southeast corner to J. W. Keith. March 15, 1886 he sold the remaining 88.735 acres to Elisha Luke of Lenawee County, Michigan. All of this land laid in the northeast quarter of Section 10, Township 1 South, Range 14 West of the San Bernardino Meridian. The land was in a U. S. Patent dated October 20, 1875 to John Bower who then sold it to Alvora Cottle. January 11, 1881 the Alvora Cottle Estate sold to David Cole.

Ezra M. Hurst paid \$4,200 for the 120 acres then sold it as three parcels for \$11,227. In July 1886 John C. Koford of Los Angeles paid \$11,500 for the properties of Elisha Luke and J. W. Keith then he sold them for \$13,000 to H. H. Wilcox. Dec. 31, 1886 David Bueser of Los Angeles County paid \$4,000 for the Sickler property.

Mr. Wilcox walked on stumps as his legs had been severed. It was his wife who gave the name of "HOLLYWOOD." Mr. Wilcox offered the Sacketts a site if they would put a store and post office at the corner of what is now Hollywood and Cahuenga Blvds.

The Hurst family returned to Missouri on the train. Orba distinctly remembers passing through Needles, Calif. Miss Belle Dunn returned to Missouri with the family. She later married a brother of Mrs. Hurst. September 1886 Ezra bought the Judge Needles homestead on the Missouri River bottom in Atchison County, Missouri. The daughters Elizabeth and Nida were born after the return to Missouri. The last surviving child, Nida Hurst Crayton, lived in Torrance, Calif. where she died October 1981 aged 90. A granddaughter, Nyda Coahran Hansen, now lives in Reedsport, Oregon.



As the writer of this historical sketch, I lived in the Los Angeles area from 1938 to 1951. I became acquainted with the daughters of my great-uncle, Ezra Hurst --Orba, Ona, Lulu, Elizabeth and Nida. I made notes of their recollections of the years on the Hollywood farm. This sketch is based chiefly on the reminiscences of Orba and recordings in the Los Angeles County Hall of Records. Last February I read the news release that Hollywood was celebrating its 100th anniversary and I resolved to compose this bit of history. Incidentally Ezra and his family returned to Southern California in 1900 and bought 30 acres in Burbank where Warner Bros. Studios now stand. After living there for five years they returned to the midwest.

A niece of Ezra related this story: "Ezra was invited to ride on the first motorized street car in Los Angeles. A Chinese who was aboard walked to the front of the car and then to the back. He exclaimed: 'No pullem, no pushem, but go like hellum.'"

The description of the boundaries of the Pass (later renamed Colegrove) School District names Rancho San Fernando, Rancho La Brea, Rancho Los Feliz and Rancho Providencia.


An early undated map shows "Udells House" near the north property line of the Hurst farm. The house is on the west side of the road through Cahuenga Pass.

GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

There's no resting in peace for Paula Hinkel, nor, she worries, for a cemetery she loves.

She is among the history buffs and amateur genealogists who revere cemeteries. They like the tranquillity, the connection to the past, the beauty, the thrill of hunting for pioneer families and the gratification of finding lost graves.

Savannah Memorial Park in Rosemead is one of the oldest surviving Protestant graveyards in Southern California. To enter is to touch an earlier era. The iron entry gate and narrow, twisting road were built to accommodate buggies. Pioneers rest here, including a signer of the state Constitution.

But, more than 150 years after the cemetery was created, financial problems threaten its survival. With just 4 acres and most of its 3,000 plots filled, little money comes in for upkeep.

Its plight motivated Hinkel, among others.

"I'm a grave photographer by hobby," she said in a recent interview. "When I heard Savannah was being threatened two years ago because of a financial crisis, I started photographing headstones, then researched their names. The more I learned, the more I became attached to this cemetery and the pioneers buried there."

Hinkel, 52, was born in Iowa and lives in Toluca Lake. She is a member of the El Monte Historical Society and Friends of Savannah Cemetery and is vice president of the Southern California Genealogical Society.

She and Sue Silver, state coordinator of a volunteer group called California Saving Graves, have compiled a comprehensive website about the cemetery, with photos and biographies of the people buried there.

That website helped link nearly 100 people whose ancestors are buried there — and who hold the key to its sur-

History experts say the graveyard is even older than its often-broken headstones would attest: It is believed to have been an Indian burial ground.

Pioneers began to use it before the Civil War. About 40 families pushed west on the Santa Fe Trail during the Gold Rush, settling in the lush valley fed by the Rio Hondo. There, they founded the town of Lexington — a spongy bog later called El Monte.

Within the town, on slightly higher ground, rose the community of Savannah, now known as Rosemead. Unmarked graves already were on the elevated land, which became the local

Boot Hill. Non-Catholic pioneers buried loved ones there beginning in the 1840s because they couldn't be buried at San Gabriel Mission.


No one can find the deed to the property; the earliest graves are unmarked, and some headstones are gone. But M.A. Rogers, a boy of 9, is the first entry in an original burial book that is in the collection of the El Monte Historical Society Museum. The date of his burial was July 22, 1853. No records were kept before then.

"In the early days, when the headstones were made of wood, some boys were hired to clean up the cemetery,"

Donna Crippen, curator of the museum, said in a recent interview. "They decided it would be easier to burn the weeds and grass off the graves. Many of the markers burned too, and some were never replaced."

Among those who rest there are Asa Ellis, a signer of the state Constitution and a California state legislator in the 1860s and 1870s, and Jay Clifton Brearley, a descendant of David Brearley, who signed the U.S. Constitution.

Other local pioneers there include the Cleminsons, Gidleys, Durfees, Maxsons and Shirpsers, for whom elementary schools are named; the Freers, Cogswells, Tylers and Guesses, for whom streets are named; and members of El

Monte's first pioneer family, headed by Ira W. Thompson, the town's first postmaster, who also built the first hotel and bar.

Violence was no stranger. Three King brothers, all lawmen, reigned in the 1850s and '60s during the rowdy "Monte Boys" days. They belonged to the Knights of the Golden Circle, a secret order of Southern sympathizers who owned property in and around town and were known for their vigilante justice.

In 1865, at a wedding in Los Angeles, wealthy rancher and alleged murderer Robert Carlisle slashed the hand of Undersheriff Andrew King over a land dispute.

The next day, King's brothers, Sam and Frank, ambushed Carlisle in the street. They shot him four times, but he managed to return fire. Carlisle and Frank King died; Sam King was wounded but recovered. All three King brothers are buried there; Carlisle (also spelled Carlyle) is not.

The Wiggins family was part of the "hanging justice" crowd, Crippen said. Over their family plot, they planted a camphor tree that now shades most of the graveyard.

Dotting the grounds, Hinkel said, are markers for John Holt, a Mormon polygamist and veteran of the War of 1812; William C. Bullard, a soldier in Gen. Robert E. Lee's army; and Albert Waldron, a Yankee soldier who took part in Gen. William Tecumseh Sherman's fa-

mous March to the Sea during the Civil War.

Then there's Billie Dodson.

At the turn of the 20th century, William "Billie" Dodson was a milliner and dress designer who catered to a faithful clientele: women who insisted on the right accessories for fashionable events. He was also a female impersonator who squeezed into a corset for stage performances.

"I'm just feminine in my nature — that's all," Dodson told *The Times* in 1907. "I always did walk and talk like a girl. And I never did like to do boys' things."

He died at 42, in 1914, and was buried at Savannah, according to the burial directory. His grave is unmarked.

Another unusual "resident" is Liora Young, 84, who died in 1905 in her Boyle Heights home. When officials found her body, they also discovered the skeleton of her daughter, Liora Thompson, 27 — who had died more than 25 years earlier. According to relatives quoted in a *Times* story, Young couldn't bear to part with her daughter's remains. The women are buried side by side.

The El Monte Cemetery Assn. incorporated in 1920. Eight years later, when the city widened Valley Boulevard, construction crews unearthed dozens of sets of human remains outside the cemetery fence. Most of the skeletons were reburied in the graveyard, but some had deteriorated so much that workers left

them and simply paved over them.

"Legend has it that families who couldn't afford to bury young children would often slip over the cemetery fence and dig a small, unmarked grave," Crippen said.

Fast forward to today and the escalating price of upkeep.

"Water costs are up" and the El Monte Cemetery Board's reserve is dwindling, said Bob Bruesch, a board member. "The account is now under \$50,000, and it costs about \$30,000 a year to maintain. Limited space is available, with fewer than 50 plots left."

But there's hope: More than 100 descendants and friends gathered July 15 for the cemetery association's annual meeting. They accepted the resignation of five board members and elected eight members.

No one wants to see what occurred in Ventura happen here, Hinkel said. In 1965, *The Times* has reported, more than 600 tombstones were tossed into a canyon, and the graves were covered with grass. It's now Cemetery Memorial Park.

Newly elected cemetery board President Eric Chase, among others, wants Savannah designated a state historic landmark and listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
