The following document began over 20 years ago with the interview of my grandfather, Edward Barnaby Leduc (May 20, 1973) about the members of the Scott Bar Cemetery. My grandfather had a terrific memory and although he left Scott Bar when he was 14, he was able to recall a lot about the people of Scott Bar. I have pieced together his memories and his comments (*they are in Italics type*) written for the Siskiyou Pioneer in 1978 along with my research to accumulate the following work.

Bangs, William H. M. d. 6/7/1941 82 years 4 months 27 days. this grave is located of the far north lower corner. Old-timer who lived in a small cabin half-way between the town of Scott Bar and the Russells where the Post office was located. "I remember this old guy, he had long whiskers."

Barney. Unmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse -1856

Bateman, Eva(n) d.1882 "Bateman is drown son of Mrs. Eva Morgan.

Beall, James Oscar Beall, Georgia W.W.I. 1894-1960. Cannot read a grave to his right.

Beall, Willie Arthur 11/19/1883 to 11/9/1960

Beebe, Jerome Beebe died 1918.

Benfield, Eli died 1901 Aged 69 years. "Lived across the street from the old school house. He weighed over 300 pounds."Unmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse - 1901

Bennet, Will

Borland, Walter died 1907, "Operated Mine across from Leduc."

Brady, Augustus 1850-1928 Owner of Brady Hotel Scott Bar Postmaster 1910-1914 Born in Ireland Went to New York then made a fortune mining at Happy Camp. Bought Eagle Hotel from Crawford. His daughter, Gussie Noonan, said he was 85 years old at the time he died which does not agree with his tombstone dates. "Mr. and Mrs. Brady operated the Eagle Hotel and had five children."

Brady, Goldie d. 1898

Brady, Orpha 1870-1928 wife of Augustus Brady, cook at Eagle Hotel, married in Scott Bar. Died May 19.

Brase, Roger Morgan 1947-1973

Brown, Luella M. 6-24-1907 / 7-14-1974

Brown, Oliver J. 5-27-1910 / 6-2-1985

Bussert, Wendell 4-4-1913 / 2-11-1990

Byner, Louis(e)Unmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse 1868

Cambell, GeorgeUnmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse

Cameron, Blanche M. 3-16-1902 / 6-17-1974

Campbell, Frank

Christ, Adam Unmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse

Cole, King "Ol' King Cole" dynamited himself up in a mine. He was around 50 or 60 years old.

Collins, James B. Born in Ripley, Ohio 12/4/1838 - Died 6/30/1862. a spare stone is with this but it is blank. Looks as if two graves are near these.

Courts, Walter d. 3-17-1882

Cummings, Elmer E. 6-2-1894 / 9-12-1979

C.L. Simply marked D.L., next to a wooden picket fence.

Dietrick, Daniel W. 1878-1955. Daniel Webster Dietrick 2/26/1878 to 4/1/9/1955.

"Daniel Dietrick used to board with my mother and, I.....Dan Dietrick, Clyde Jeter and Oscar Comstock worked for Noonan Bros. when they reopened Quartz Hill about 1907 or 1908."

Two unmarked graves lie near the Dietrick graves.

Dillstrom, Adeline Ro. Dillstrom (Not sure if the t is a l or what?) 1854-1922. Grave marked with a black rock.

Drebert, Harold 1899-1977

Drebert, Roselia 8-18-1906 / 12-25-1974

Edwards, E.A. 9-2-1900 / 9-18-1985

Falkinstein, George August 7/3/1859 - 10/8/1865

Falkinstein, Valentine Lewis 2/16/1830 - 6/26/1885

Fehely, Bernice Vera 7-19-1923 / 7-26-1991

Fisher, Charles Fisher Sr. and one other unable to read. (Probably father of Charles Fischer) Fischer was a blacksmith of Scott Valley and responsible for iron fences at the Scott Bar Cemetery. "This man and his father came from Germany and after the old man died his son became the blacksmith for Scott Bar and vicinity. I can remember old Charlie Fischer pulling out some of my teeth."

Friedley, William died 1935 "Friedley was a fire Warden, miner, and a loafer. My first wife Elsie once told me to go back and get the horns of the beheaded deer my friends and I had killed. Only thing was that it had been a doe we had killed by mistake so we beheaded it so no one would realize. Well when we brought the deer back, my wife wanted me to go back and get the horns. Well anyway Friedley was there at the time she asked and he knew damn well it had been a doe though he didn't press charges. Friedley lived atop of the mountains so he could look out for fires."E.B.Leduc, May 20, 1973.

Gilloon, Henry died 20 Nov. 1865

Gilloon, Infant girl died 20 Nov. 1865

Gilloon, John died 20 Nov. 1865 aged nine

Gilloon, William - died 20 Nov. 1865 aged nine

These were the children of P. & J. Gilloon. "The Gilloon Children all died in a fire. John and William were twins."

Grizzly Tom Unmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse

Hickman, John Born 12/21/1829 died 6/21/1899

Hicks, Greenbury A. 1828-1900 Native of Tenn. Scott Bar postmaster 1886-1890 and 18794-1898. Greenbury Hicks ran the Hicks store which was out of business by 1913. Chester Barton once heard "a story of the Hicks boys hunting through

junk in a back room and found an old can or jar containing several thousand dollars of gold nuggets."

Hicks, Joseph Ambrose son of G.A. and T.A. Hicks, died 1-10-1896 aged 20 years.

Hicks, Louis E. Hicks 1874-1942. Justice of the peace that married Henrietta Jensen Leduc to William Jahde. *"Lou Hick was a watch-maker, and Justice of the Peace. He was a very tall man, 6'6" I'd say, at least.....operated the General Store and at the same time was the Justice of the Peace, Postmaster and town jeweller."*

Hicks, Mary Ellen

Hicks, Teresa Agnes (1840-1914) Native of Ireland. On her & Greenbury's stone it says "May they rest in peace."

Hicks, Teresa Agnes b. 4-21-1868 d. 8-19-1868

Hood, Joe D. 12-23-1900 / 2-12-1978

Hossick, George C. (George C. Nossick Co. 1 48 Ill, Inf.) *"Married to Til Milne. He ran a store in Sied."*

Jacobs, Benjamin 1-15-1828/9-23-1895 One of the first white men in Scott Bar. George Magoffey told Hollis Anderson that Ben Jacobs got immense nugget 100 or 1500 just north of Nesbitt barn about 100 feet away. Ben Jacobs was one of the original owners of the Frederica Mine which was named after Frederica Leduc Martin.

Jacobs, Lash (Elisha) *"I had other traps set on the mountain back of Scott Bar near the Lash Jacobs mine....When Ben Jacobs passed away, his interest (in the Frederica Mine) was taken over by his brother Elisha, commonly known as Lash. When Lash died George Milne acquired his interest."*

Jahde, W. M. 1871-1923 Drown on the Klamath River. He was the second husband of Henrietta Leduc.

Jensen, Christian (11-13 1822 / 1-15-1882) Christian was a butcher and farmer who came around the horn from Germany in 1855 & lived in Deadwood.

Jensen, Frederica (10-18-1824 / 8-4-1901)

Jensen, Howard (d. 9-25-1896) Aged 12 yrs 8 months and 11 days. Howard was crippled and had a hunchback. He lived with J.B. Leduc & his family. He was the younger cousin of Henrietta Jensen Leduc.

Kleaver, Charles A. 7/25/1882 - 6/11/1889 *"Drowned in Scott River."* There is a grave between the graves of Cole and Kleaver.

Krause, Adeline May 3/22/1885 - 10/24/1969 *"This old gal died a few years ago. She was the half sister to Joe Weeks."*

Lange, Edward 1903-1908

Lapnes, (Lannes) A.P. d. 1889. 62 years.

LeCreig, Robert 6-5-1810 / 5-5-1880

Leduc, C.M. born & died 1883

Leduc, Henrietta (1859-1941)

Leduc, Joseph B. (1830 1907) One of Scott Bar's first settlers. A miner, sawmill owner, rancher, justice of the peace, a mason, Hydraulic Mine owner, pack train operator and County Supervisor for District 4 from 1892-1896. School Board member Birth record from his church in Rigaud, Canada indicate that he was actually born in 1828 not 1830. In fact he had an older brother with the same name who was born in 1826 but died so Joe was really the second Joe. Canada. *"The Hancock mining company, owned by my father and George Smith, operated a hydraulic operation between the schoolhouse and Scott Bar and up into graveyard hill. My father had 180 cattle but he sold*

them off until he had only 103 when he died. They were rather scrubby cattle. my father had just gotten a couple of good bulls to build up the herd when he passed away. Generally we cut two crops of hay a year and sometimes three if the weather was favorable. My father had a small saw mill run by water power, using the old style straight blade saw.....After my father passed away the property was sold to George Lighthill."

Lighthill, Agnes 10-26-1911 / 9-16-1981

Lighthill, John 11-30-1904 / 4-9-1985 "There were several other children (of Charlie Tompkins). One is married to John Lighthill."

Lillard, Garland B 2/22/1829 - 3/6/1879 Native of Kentucky There is a wooden fence around this grave which is just to the left of the Jensen Leduc plot. There is also a tree which stands at the top of the grave behind the headstone

Loftin, James Max, Calif. U. S Navy Korea 1933-1971.

Magoffey, Kate . Unmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse -1875

Magoffey, Esther L. 1866-1938 daughter of Sigmond Simon. Born 15 Jan 1865 Wife of Thomas Magoffey

Magoffey, John "was killed years ago in a logging accident."

Magoffey, Thomas 1833-1909 Native of Ireland, served as deputy assessor, miner. His brother was John Magoffey.

Magoffey, Thomas A. 1854-1936. "Tom Magoffey was one of the road foremen under whom I worked."

Maguffey, Ames

Maguffey, George born 1861 died March 13, 1945 at age 83 yr. 7 mo. and 1 day. Also two unmarked graves.

Mann, ThomasUnmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse

Maranda, Matilda - died 2/3/1860 aged 28 years. Erected by H.A.Bently

Two more unable to read. "She was kind of chipper. You see who erected her stone. There were three Maranda girls."

Maxinoff, Walter 12-10-1913/ 4-28-1973

McCarthy, Eugene 1867-1871, Father Birth date must be wrong

McCarthy, Hanora 1830-1908 mother

McCarthy, John 1865-1871

McCarthy, Michael 1842-1916 "Mary Humphrey was a McCarthy girl; she had three brothers Michael, Dan and Francis. I cannot remember much about Michael. Seems he was away most of the time; Dan has several mines that he worked, one I recall was near the mouth of Franklin Gulch, another was up Scott River above Magoffey Creek and across the river near Ferry Creek.....Michael and Dan McCarthy and possible their parents are buried in the Scott Bar Cemetery, right near the Magoffey plot."

McCauley, James 1826-1904 Born in Ireland. Father of Kate Miller and Mary Jensen, wife of George Jensen.

McCauley, Rose 1839-1875 wife of James McCauley

McCoy, Walter " David" 1-18-1948 / 9-13-1986

McElroy, Clifton 8-30-1900 / 3-16-1991

McElyea, Caitlin 9-11-1986 / 9-11-1986

- McKinney, Henry S. b. 8/12/1827 d. 4/29/1899. "After McKinney died they were carrying the casket to the burial grounds and the casket fell into the Klamath river as the cart door flew open. They had to dig him out of the river."
- Meyers, Jaunita 10-10-1931/ 10-11-31
- Miller, (MiLey) born 11/27/1921 Died 4/22/1923.
- Milne, Andrew T. (7-3-1873/4-12-1949) "Andrew Milne could really throw a spear when fishing."
- Milne, Anthony (1832-1928) Native of Nova Scotia. "Anthony Milne was a good friend of my fathers. He had Mucca Muck Mine & one on McKinney Creek. I remember the old guy used to come into town for a few drinks or so. And sooner or later his wife would come tagging after him. When she would finally catch him she would head him home yelling at him all the way. The Milne family were living on Mill Creek just above and across the creek from the Ryan place."
- Milne, Charles J. (1871-1929) "A Spanish American War veteran. Charlie Milne had a crippled back in later years."
- Milne, Emma U 1851-1924 wife of Anthony Milne
- Milne, James W. (7-27-1881/12-18-1946) "I have personally made several trips on Horseback with Andrew or Jim Milne and we got plenty (Icknish wild celery), maybe a flour sack well-filled. I am now over 80 years old, and if I am in the Klamath area along about March I usually stop and get myself a few sprigs of it."
- Milne, John H. (1896-1897) "Johnnie drown when he was ten or twelve years old." Perhaps this is the same Johnnie and his birth date should read 1886 instead of 1896.
- Morgan, E. A. 6/2/1847 - 4/27/1912 "There were three midwives in or near Scott Bar. A Mrs. Morgan, mother of Henry and Will, who lived next to us on Mill Creek. Mrs. Morgan, widow of Cal lived there with her sons."
- NOTE. The other two midwives were Henrietta Leduc and Mrs. Collins.
- Morgan, Lillian 10-30-1889 / 6-19-1909 wife of Walter Morgan, dau. of Chris Jensen Jr. Her stone reads beloved wife of Walter Morgan. "There was no school at McKinney Creek and Lillian stayed with my family and the two of us walked to school each day at Scott Bar. The same old school house stands today, but is no longer a school house. It is now a community center and if they have a church service it would be held there. For example, my Mother was buried from there in 1942. Will's Mother (Lillian Jensen Morgan) was buried from the yard in front of our house and next to the Nesbitt close to the old school house. Will's father, Walter Morgan, worked for my parents several times. I think that is where he met Lillian."
- Morgan, Walter 1882-1929 "As I recall, there were four Morgan boys. The oldest one was Eugene, commonly known as Gene, then Walter, who married Lillian, then came Marvin, who later was a Forest Ranger. I cannot remember the other boy's name, but "Ernie" seems to ring a bell."
- Muger, Hazel 1892-193_ (blank)

- Myres, William F. born Cin. Ohio. Born 1830 . Died 12/27/1897, aged 67 years.
Negro Jimmie,
- Nesbitt, George Washington 1870-1948 Son of Mary Paterson (1827-1894) and Thomas Nesbitt (1826-1899) "Charlie Simon and George Nesbitt mined in a drift on the bar across the river and to the west of Scott Bar. I cannot recall the name of that bar. They took out the largest single piece of gold I ever saw. As I recall it was worth about \$ 550 when Gold was worth 16.50 an ounce. That means it weighed a little over two pounds."
- Nesbitt Belle S. mother. 1873-1957. "Bell was daughter of Sigmund Simon. Bell Simon married George Nesbitt who had four sisters. Mary Crawford, wife of Lowell Crawford; Carolyn Zoellin, wife of E. A. Zoellin, a local surveyor; Jessie Tappan, who lived in Alameda and was the mother of Ralph Tappan, one of my school mates; Alice Simon, who was the wife of Arthur Simon, and mother of Eva Simon Parshall, Stella Simon Hart and Walter Simon, all of whom were my schoolmates."
- Nesbitt, Vern A. Nesbitt 1901-1957. Brother "Son of George Nesbitt. He committed suicide....."
- O'Conner, TommyUnmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse
- Payne, Grace M. 1887-1936
- Payne, Maitland O. 1889-1953. "Mait Payne, Charlie Quigley and Tom Quigley were some of the drivers (mail carriers)All was by horse-drawn vehicles After my father died in february 1907, my mother and I lived next to the Nesbitt's and to the east of the Westphal cut. I left Scott Bar the first Monday in August 1911. Maitland Payne was the driver of that stage and my destination was San Francisco."
- Payne, Merle O. 7/2/1914 - 11/7/1933
- Payne, Natasha 3-21-1984 / 3 21-1984
- Peterson, Peter Payson 1825-1889 See page. 1568 in "Well's History of Siskiyou Co." Peterson was born 13 March 1825 in Tondern, Germany in the Duchy of Schleswig. He was the son of Peter P. and Helen Catharina Peterson. He arrived in San Francisco on Feb. 3, 1853 on the clipper ship The Golden Gate. In 1855 he came to Scott Bar where he worked until 1872 before becoming a school teacher. He taught at Seiad, Scott Bar, Franklin School in the Scott Valley, Union District and Cedar Park School.
- Ramus, Catherine Halftamyerhis wife 5/26/1845.
- Ramus, Joseph Ramus 7/25/1832. Then below is listed the date 5/11/1905. Ramus owned a mining claim at Simonville on Scott River. "I know they died in old age and within a few months of each other."
- Reynolds, Edward d. 1899
- Rhoom, William & wifeUnmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse - 1891
- Robinson, Annie She was from the Fort Jones Rancheria "She was the mather of Charles Tompkins, was an Indian and was married to Searles Tompkins who was justice of the peace for several years at Scott Bar. Searles Tompkins might have been partly Negro." To the left of Annie is an unmarked grave and to her right is an open grave covered with wooden boards. I, Will Snyder, was told by a Scott Bar local that a Scott Bar man was responsible for the opening of this grave. It really is a mystery. Wendell

- Bussert was married to the daughter of Charles Tompkins, Mary Tompkins Bussert. Bussert tells the story that in the harsh winter of 1852 when all but three miners left the area. Searles Tompkins split from the other two to spend the winter at the Indian Rancheria, which his partners believed would end in his death. This is probably how he became associated with the Indians and eventually married Annie Robinson.
- Roper, Louise A (M. ?) born 1828; d. 12-23-1869 A native of Hamburg, Germany. The stone reads " In memory of Louise M. the beloved and lamented wife of M.A. Roper who departed this life 12-23-1865/9 aged 41 years 8 months and 6 days. A native of Hamburg, Germany a stock of corn lilly ripe."
- Ross, Ambrose d. 9-26-1867 aged 40 years native of Ipswich, Mass.
- Russell, Alice M. 1850-1944 Scott Bar/Scott Valley postmaster 1919-1944. She lived in back part of house with her husband and three children Malcolm, Harry and Ellen. Virgil Nesbit remembers her. " Mrs. Russell enjoyed her gardening and her yard was always a mass of beautiful blooms; whenever she could get out of her home, she would be either in her vegetable or flower garden."
- Russel Zenas E. 1864-1930 "Zenas Russel married Alice Thomas.....When we (Ray and Lester Shorb) were opposite the Russell home we decided to cast in and try our luck.we hooked 66 fish...took home 22 fish."
- Ryan, J.J.L. 9-12-1867 / 2-12-1940 Joe? " I rode with Joe Ryan"
- Ryan, J.T. 8-6-1869 / 1-24-1940 Tom?
- Ryan, Mary 5-1-1827 / 6-26-1921 Wife of Tom Ryan " I believe Mr. Magoffey's father died years before and Mrs. Magoffey married Tom Ryan. They had two sons, Jeff and Joe, neither of whom ever married. They were 20 or 30 years older than I."
- Ryan, Thomas 8-24-1822 / 12-24-1877 " Mr. and Mrs. Ryan, as well as Jeff and Joe, are buried in the Scott Bar Cemetery just a few feet from the Jensen and Leduc plot."
- Ryan, TomUnmarked grave moved from above schoolhouse 1877 Member of Scott Bar Division no. 198
- Sasser, Ella Mae 10-2-1919 / 1-31-1981
- Sasser, Joseph 9-8-1913 / 7-12-1984
- Schuler, Asa d. 1906 " I remember Asa Schuler. He was a fat, chubby little kid. He had two brothers, one was Aaron and I think the other was Martin. He died of Diabetes. You know that didn't have any cure for that in those days you know."
- Simon, Louis S. died 10 Feb. 1909 Co. H. 8 Cal. Inf. of Spanish American War. "When Scy Lowden and Louis Simon were crossing the Scott River behind the Brady Hotel early in the spring of 1909, the boat capsized and Louis Simon got tangled in the ropes and was drowned. Scy was fortunate to escape. I do not remember if Charlie Simon and George Nesbitt were waiting to come across or had just gone across."
- Simon, Sigmund b 5/15/1823 d. 12/1/1881. Sigmund Simon was a native of Hamburg, Germany. Married Louisa Maria Nentzel in the Scott Valley on 26 Nov. 1862. Louisa was born in New York in 1836 and she died 19 Aug 1917. Simon was the Scott Bar Postmaster from 1864 to 1881.
- Skillen, Janet 10-11-1936 / 2-10- can't read
- Skillen, Ted 3-25-1900 / 12-20-1978
- Small, George M. 1857-1929 His remains located in the Milne Plot. " Either cousin or Uncle to Milne family, through Mrs. Milne.
