Dr. Thomas S. PAGE, who came to Sonoma County in 1847, named his grant of land in the Sonoma-Petaluma area "Rancho Cotati." It was in this area that an exciting event took place on 14 August 14 1921.

Auto racing promoters sold stock and built what they called the Cotati saucer. It was named Northbay Speedway. No other northern California racetrack existed, and memories of the speed event staged at the San Francisco Exhibition in 1915 lingered in the minds of racing fans. The try-outs drew a crowd of over 10,000. Eddie HEARNE's Duesenberg-Disteel was clocked at an astounding 110 mph. Excitement reigned! There were drivers by the names of Frank ELLIOT, Roscoe SARLES, Alton SOULES, Tom ALLEY, Tommy MILTON, Johnny THIELE, Eddie HEARNE, Joe THOMAS, Jim COSBY, Mike MOOSIE and Eddie MILLER.

In the picture above, the two drivers at the Cotati racetrack are ready for a race. The picture is in this author's collection. The man in the background is Charles V. TALMADGE, who took part in road races well before this track was built. He thrilled his family as he sped by them, in the lead, at Fulton Road (now River Road). When word came that Ben NOONAN won the race they couldn't believe it. They found out later that Uncle Charlie TALMADGE blew a tire before the end of the race.

Speeding daredevils mesmerized North Bay residents. The August 14th event drew a big crowd. Eddie RICKENBACKER was named the Honorary Referee; Cliff DURANT, Pacemaker; Paul DERKUM, Starter; E. H. PENDLETON, Timer; D. H. LAFERTY, Referee; E. F. CHEFFINS, Representative Control Board A. A. A. Clerk of the Course was Less MANNING.

A purse of \$16,500 was to be divided among the drivers according to points.

OCCOS PREPENCE ON

The Crane Brothers

When Robert, Richard, James and William CRANE left Missouri in 1849 to seek a fortune in the gold fields of California, their dream was to return home with enough gold to buy and equip the largest farm Missouri would ever see. The men were the older sons of Tarleton Lee CRANE and his wife Mary Elizabeth BEAGLE of Philadelphia, Missouri. Both husband and wife, whose family consisted of seventeen children, fourteen of them males, were natives of Virginia.

After six months the four CRANE brothers arrived in Cold Springs, El Dorado County, California. There they worked in the gold fields for two-and-one-half years and managed to save enough money to open and operate a dry goods store in Hangtown (now Placerville). William and James made the decision to return to Missouri, but Robert and Richard decided to search for land in northern California. The four men loaded their horses on a barge and traveled down the Sacramento River to San Francisco Bay. From there William and James returned to Missouri by way of Panama.

Richard and Robert pursued a path along the neck of the bay to a point below Petaluma. From there they rode over the hills to Sonoma County. This was July 1852, and the sight of a fertile valley surrounded by hills convinced them that this was the perfect spot for a ranch. The men assumed they were on government land and commenced farming. A few years passed before they discovered "their land" was part of the of the Cotate Land Grant belonging to Thomas S. PAGE. Richard then negotiated with PAGE to buy the land he wanted for himself and Robert and for neighbors, Jeff and Miranda COOK. The 160 acres on the lower slope of Sonoma Mountain went for nine dollars an acre!

By 1850 younger brother Joel CRANE had joined his brithers in California. He met and married Jane **DAVIDSON**, sister of his brother Robert's wife, Susan DAVIDSON CRANE in 1853.

On 1 September 1853 Richard CRANE married Nancy PATTON, whose parents, Charles and


Mary Ann PATTON, had come to California in 1849; they lived in the pueblo of Sonoma. For a time both Joel and Jane and Robert and Susan lived with Richard and Nancy in a small house on the north side of the creek near a small bridge.

Eventually, the Richard CRANEs built a stately stone house of eight rooms to hold their growing family. Richard and Nancy's family included Mary Susan, born on 22 October 1856; Oliver Lawrence arrived 30 October 1859; Richard Lincoln's birth date was 8 April 1864; the twins, Arthur Perry and William Percy, arrived on 23 October 1866; and the baby, Eva Grace (FORD) made her appearance much later, on 5 November 1879.

Their property was contiguous to the homestead owned by Robert CRANE. Robert's residence was a spacious two-story house, painted white with upper and lower verandahs. A white picket fence protected the front yard of the home which was a quarter mile from Petaluma Hill Road. On his property Robert bred race horses and raced trotters. From 1856 to 1858 Robert served as town constable and later as Sonoma County supervisor.

Robert and Susan DAVIDSON CRANE had a dozen children: Mary Jane (LOWRY), born 19 August 1854; George Silas, on 16 February 1856; Charles Burton, 30 September 1857; Martha Kay (WARD), 1 May 1859; James Alexander, born 5 November 1860; Hettie Forest, 8 May 1862; Thomas Jackson 26 May 1864; Robert Lee on 21 April 1866; Rowland Archie, 24 May 1868; Estelle Hope, 16 Dec 1871; Harlan Smith, 26 July 1873; and Wade Hampton, born 18 March 1875

Joel and Jane DAVIDSON CRANE may have lived for a time in Rincon Valley before moving elsewhere. They had at least five children: Ellis, William, Belle, Martha and Ollie. James CRANE, who had come in to California in 1849 with his brothers and had returned to Missouri, never came back to California. His son, Prince CRANE, however, joined the family in Vallejo township. Prince married Nellie SAVORY; their children

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Index to the Registration Affadavits Of the Election Precincts of Sonoma County, California 1908

Historically, Llano de Santa Rosa was a rancho granted to Joaquin CARRILLO in 1844. Later, Llano became a stop on a spur of the Northwestern Pacific R. R. that ran from Santa Rosa to Sebastopol. In the far western part of Santa Rosa Township, modern day Llano Road runs north-south between Highway 12 and the Gravenstein Highway (Route 116).

This index was created under the authority of County Clerk Fred L. WRIGHT. The booklet was produced by Republican Print of Santa Rosa. The reader should not trust completely in ages given, since those ages were sometimes picked up, unchanged, from the previous year's index. These records have been transcribed from a microfilm available in the Genealogy and Local History Department at the Sonoma County Public Library. Note: The names listed here are not included in the index of this issue of The Sonoma Searcher.


