
BURBANK HOBBY SHOW...




POSTSCRIPT...

Other desk items are foreign dictionaries, catalogs from Goodspeeds Book Shop and Genealogical Book Company with price lists of family and local histories, name and flag books, a Adjacent to the list of oversize books, and an up-to-date list of periodicals. desk are various encyclopedias, including the seven volumes of Hinshaw's Encyclopedia of American Quaker Canealogy, and the Dictionary of National Biography for Europe.

A new book list is compiled every two months and kept near the display of new books. The arrangement is by subjects under Biography, Collective, Genealogy Handbooks, Family Histories and Local History. Many new books have been coming into the library recently.

Some other books that will be helpful to the genealogist are the Monnette collection (some 2,000 of Mr Mønnette's donated books have been cataloged), the Virginia Colonial Abstracts in 34 volumes, and Virkus' Compendium of American Genealogy in seven volumes.

Two fairly new additions to the genealogy room for the convenience of the researcher are the Dycostat, a self-operating copying machine, and the Microcard reader and card file. The card file has the Boston Transcript genealogy column, some family histories, and the new editions in the Library of Congress.



IN MEMORIAM

Kathryn Carolyn Emerick Geiger Shank Brown

It was early in 1961, when my family moved from Santa Barbara to Santa Maria, that I met Kathy Geiger and her four children at a group Bible study. When her husband, Howard, had a highly premature and debilitating hear attack, she obtained employment at the Auto Club, and as a busy working mother (in 1967 a widow), her path diverged from mine. It was early in 1981 that our paths re-converged when she and her second husband, Ralph Shank, and her daughter, Eileen Easter, joined the Santa Maria Valley Genealogical Society.

She and Ralph were enthusiastic genealogists who made several trips east, in particular to Pennsylvania where they sought out their German ancestors. Ralph was the Society's Treasurer in 1984, but died suddenly that December. His successor, Rudi Schneider, became ill, and died the following March, thus occasioning some concern about the curse of the vice-presidency. We are happy to say the trend failed to continue.

Kathy, by then the wife of Clarence L Brown (1913-1997), was Society treasurer in 1987. The Summer 1988 Quarterly 20:1-2 contained her Ahnentafel; found on page 15, it was brief, having numbers 1-15, 22-23, and 28-29. Since that time she added much, largely by means of the Internet. In 1989 Kathy was the Society's president, and also stepped into the breach left by the departure of librarian Wil Kesner, in which I helped as much as possible. She continued as librarian until Wil's return in 1994, remaining on the list as assistant; Wil's permanent departure left her again in charge. In 1996 she was vice-president as well as librarian, and she continued as librarian until her own "departure."

When I undertook the position of *Quarterly* editor in 1992, Kathy was one of the chief typists, not only of my work, but also of the compilations of vital statistics and other records prepared for the *Quarterly*. She specially bought an alphabetizing program for her computer to use for the Society's projects. In addition to all the records the librarian must keep, she also kept the membership list for me, the membership chairman, from which she printed out the mailing labels for the *Quarterly*.

Even with no functioning library, Kathy and I saw each other often, as my husband and I pick up the mail at the post office and deliver the incoming periodicals to her for recording, cataloguing, and the physical preparation required to install them in their covers. All this is done 'behind the scenes' but is here stated so that Kathy's successor(s) will have an idea of the work involved.

Kathy Brown was an uncomplaining, devoted and generous volunteer for twenty years, willing to fill in when others demur. We shall miss her!

CATHOLIC CEMETERY ON POINT SAL ROAD NEAR GUADALUPE, CALIFORNIA

Listings below are based on findings in South Counties Library, Arroyo Grande, San Luis Obispo, California, as given in Shirley Contreras' recent article published in the October 19th Santa Maria Times. We thought it worthy of wider distribution via PERSI to genealogists, so are printing the data in the Quarterly. This Catholic Cemetery is about a mile from Hwy. 1 along Point Sal Road; not to be confused with the other small cemetery out at Point Sal.

The data had originally been abstracted by Jean Hubbard of Arroyo Grande who copied baptisms, marriages and deaths from their primary source: the original old St. Patrick's Parish Records. The early priests who recorded the names included the Revs. McNally, Lynch, Lack, Aguillera, Ternes, and Buckley. Be aware that the following is 'four times removed' and thus may have gained some variations in the process. Shirley also noted that the records may be incomplete.

Note: The Confirmation records of 'St. Isidor's Church, Guadalupe, 1877, 1879, 1886', and 'St. Patrick's Church, Arroyo Grande, 1894, 1897,1901' were featured in the *SMVGS Quarterly* 28:1 Spring 1996.

While background researching her newspaper article, Shirley Contreras discovered that the Archdiocese of .Los Angeles owns the two acres of land in which a lone headstone still stands. She found that the **Donovan** family owned the land on either side of the cemetery, but it is not yet known who originally donated the land.

The reader will notice the tragically high incidence of childhood deaths of the time.
