PIONEER OF FIFTY-EIGHT DIES AT COUNTY HOSPITAL

(The Denver Times, Monday, April 27, 1903, page 3)

John A. Stanton, a Colorado pioneer who freighted across the plains from the Missouri river to Denver in 1858, and from that time had called Denver his home, died at the county hospital yesterday morning of pneumonia. He was taken from his lodgings at 1848 Larimer street and admitted to the institution last Wednesday.

Prior to the panic Mr. Stanton was considered one of the moderately wealthy men of the city. He had worked as foreman of the head construction gang of the Kansas Pacific railroad when it was built into Denver and remained with the company until the road was absorbed by the Union Pacific. He invested in Colorado Central securities that vielded a good income and was worth about \$75,000, nearly all of which was lost in efforts to protect his other interests when the panic came. He later engaged in mining at Cripple Creek, but without success in restoring his shattered fortunes. In 1896 his wife died and since that time he has been variously employed in the state. The first of the present month he was employed as foreman on some work being done at City park and contracted a severe cold in a recent snowstorm, which developed pneumonia that proved fatal.

A daughter and granddaughter, Mrs. L. K. Hawthorne and Dorothy Hawthorne, residing at 1721 Glenarm street, survive him.

DEATH OF MRS. J. H. P. VOORHIES FOLLOWS ENCOURAGING REPORTS

In the death of Mrs. J. H. P. Voorhies yesterday in Lexington, Ky., Denver has lost one of its representative women in social and philanthropic circles. News of her serious illness reached the city for the first time the day before and was a shock to her friends. When she left a few weeks ago for French Lick Springs, Ind., with Mr. Voorhies, she had plans for returning soon with friends and taking them over the state and entertaining in their honor at home. Although her death occurred in the morning, a wire received here by Miss Louisa Hughes announced that she was better. That the turn for the worse was very sudden seems certain from the fact that early in the afternoon Mr. Hughes and Dennis Sullivan both received a wire announcing her death. The immediate cause, so far as is known, was from pneumonia. followed later by typhoid. Voorhies had her removed from the springs to his brother's home in Lexington and it was from there that the first news was received of her illness.

Mrs. Voorhies came to Denver thirty years ago with her parents from Indianapolis, where she was born. Her father was Lieutenant Governor Hammond of Indiana and Miss Hammond had seen much of

social life when still very young.

She met Anthony Sweeny, a wealthy business man of Denver, much liked among a large acquaintance, after she came here, and when they were married their home became the center of fashionable society and a very happy and hospitable one. After Mr. Sweenv's death his widow retired from the prominence of her former social life and only entertained quietly for years. When she became the wife of J. H. P. Voorhies, the well-known Denver club and mining man, she still continued to live quietly, having leased her old home in Cleveland place. Two years ago when she returned to it she entertained a good deal among her old friends, but it was still only at rather informal but elegantly appointed dinners. She had special charm as a hostess and was an unusually accomplished housekeeper. Her more formal functions during this latter part of her life were given at the Denver club and were of rare occurrence.

Mr. Voorhies leaves Lexington this morning with the remains of his wife. All details for the funeral will await his arrival

IN DEATH THEY WILL NOT BE DIVIDED

John Novak and His Wife, Who Died Same Day, Will Rest in One Coffin.

At the city morgue rest the bodies of John S. Novak and his wife, Catherina. Tonight their son-in-law, William Brauer, will take the bodies to Crete, Neb., where they will be buried in the same coffin, a request which they made before they left Crete for Denver last June.

More than forty years ago Novak and his wife were married in a little town in the northern part of Austria. They came to America ten years later and settled in Nebraska. They had but one child, a daughter, who several years ago married Brauer, a prosperous merchant of Crete.

Until Tuesday they lived in squalid quarters at 2257 Twenty-seventh street. Novak, whose devotion to his wife was the talk of their neighborhood, became demented and the situation was reported to the Humane society. Officer Ransom was sent to their home and removed the old woman to the county hospital.

Novak resisted the removal of his wife and was taken along with her, although his true condition was not known at the time. He escaped from the hospital and was struck by a University park street car. He died later at the hospital. It is thought that he threw himself in front of a street car, unknown to the motorman. His wife died yesterday.

When Brauer searched the house and trunks belonging to the old couple yesterday he found \$1,000 in bank notes tucked away in an old stocking. This money will be used in taking the bodies to the home of their daughter and carrying out their funeral as suggested by Novak and his wife.

Sister Henrica, Mother Superior of St. Anthony's Hospital, Passes Away,

After an illness of seven months, Sister Henrica, mother superior of St. Anthony's hospital, and one of the most brilliant women in the Catholic sisterhood of the Order of St. Francis, died last night in the hospital of which she had been the head for four years. She was 48 years old.

Sister Henrica was a native of Westphalia, Germany. She had no relatives in this country, but a brother in Germany survives her. She had been preparing to celebrate her twenty-fifth anniversary as a nun on New Year day. Before coming to Denver to assume the management of St. Anthony's hospital, Sister Henrica had been superior at Evanston, Ill., for five years. She built the St. Francis hospital in that city.

During her administration, St. Anthony's hospital was greatly improved.

The funeral services probably will be held Monday. Bishop N.C. Matz will officiate. The interment will be in the nun's plot at Mount Olivet cemetery.

CATTLE BARON OF EARLY DAYS WAS GEO. BENKLEMAN

Pioneer Who Came to Colorado in 1862 Dies at an Advanced Age.

WEALTH MADE ON RANGE.

Once Made Deal to Buy Denver Dry Goods Corner for \$800 a Lot.

Whose Death Removes One of the Few Remaining Old-Time Cattle Barons.

With the death of John George Benkelman at his home, 1759 California street, on Thursday night, one of the four or five remaining cattle barons of the middle West took the long trail across the great divide.

There are left Finis P. Ernest, Alfred Butters, Judd Brush and possibly one or two others of the men who, in their day, ran 20,000 cattle on 100,000 acres and forced the buffalo and the Indian to the will of a civilization which neither understood, exterminating the one and relegating the remnants of the other to the reservations of a paternal government

Mr. Benkelman was of German birth, and came to Colorado in 1862. From 1868 until late in the '80s he controlled the range from the Arickeree river in Colorado to the Republican river in Nebraska, a country more than 100 miles in width. His headquarters were in Nebraska, on the Republican river, and where he first made his camp the town of Benkelman now stands a monument to his enterprise.

CONTEMPORARY WITH ILIFF.

Mr. Benkelman was contemporaneous with Henry Iliff, the king of cattle barons of the West, who died leaving his widow, now the wife of Bishop Henry Warren, a couple of millions of dollars, and of W. R. Wilson, the brother of Andrew Wilson, who was shot and killed a year ago in the lobby of the Graymont hotel.

As the settlement of the West increased the Benkelman range was more and more restricted until in 1893 he quit the business and has since lived a retired life at his residence at Eighteenth and California, dying at the age of 77. This housestill the family residence-is of interest as showing the wonderful growth of Denver, a growth that has not been duplicated by any city in the country. Mr. Benkelman bought the two lots upon which the house stands from William Barth, who began in Denver as a shoemaker and, thanks to his business sagacity and confidence in Denver's future, made many millions. He paid \$800 for the lots in 1870 and considerably less for the two lots adjoining. A few months before his death he was offered and refused \$100,000 for these self-same

THEN OUT ON PRAIRIE.

When he completed the house on these lots, in the fall of 1871, the nearest building to him was the Catholic cathedral, near Fifteenth and Stout streets. Looking from the house in every direction save towards the city hall there was nothing but prairie. The three Benkelman boys remember when the Indians came to the house and begged food.

In the same year Mr. Benkelman closed a deal with Louis Bartels Sr. for the purchase of the half block upon which the Denver Dry Goods store now stands at \$800 a lot. At the last moment the deal fell through because Mr. Bartlels insisted that there should be a clause in the deed

that the property should be used for residences only. Today the corner lot of this half block is worth at least \$80,000, and only thirty-seven years have elapsed since.

Mr. Benkelman enjoyed the respect and admiration of Colorado pioneers. He was known for his integrity and upright business dealings. Among those who yesterday paid tribute to his memory was C. B. Kountze and many other prominent men.

LEAVES THREE SONS.

His wife died several years ago. His direct heirs are three sons, Harry, Charles and George, all of whom reside in Denver. All three boys were born in Colorado. The will is not to be opened for several days, but it is understood the three sons share alike with George, the eldest the executor.

While the estate is not so large as in the cattle days, it is still of good amount. Practically all of the property is in Denver real estate. The funeral will be from the family residence today at 2 o'clock.



A BARTENDER'S SUDDEN DEATH.

(Rocky Mountain News, January 10, 1888, Page 8)

He is Found Dead by a Fellow Employe.

When one of the bartenders employed at the Athletic saloon, on Twenty first street near Champa street, opened up the store to go to work early yesterday morning, he saw Milton H. Bottkin, also a bartender, apparently asleep on the sofa. There was nothing unusual in this in itself, but the time had long passed when Bottkin should be at work, and his fellow bartender proceeded at once to awaken him.

A touch revealed the fact that Bottkin was a corpse, and the terrified man at once notified Coroner Rogers, who took charge of the body.

Bottkin had only partly undressed, and lay in a natural position on the lounge. Near by on the floor lay a half filled bottle of laudanum, which indicated by what means the man had found death.

Bottkin was on duty at the saloon the afternoon previous and seemed in a merry mood, occupying himself by playing several games of pool with friends who had casually dropped in. At 6 o'clock he went off duty, but stayed around the saloon for some time.

Finally he said that he guessed he would not go home, on account of the severity of the weather and would remain in the saloon all night. He also remarked that he had to get up very early in the morning and thought if he went home he would over sleep himself.

When the hour for closing arrived, Bottkin went into the side room and retired for the night. He was never again seen alive. The dead man was not addicted to drinking and had very few vices. He was never known to use drugs in any form, and his friends scout the theory of suicide. It is possible however, that he took the poison with the object of bringing on sleep.

Two years ago Bottkin was divorced from his wife and later he took charge of their child, but the whereabouts of mother and child are not now known. Deceased, who was 29 years of age, has a mother and sister living in Omaha, and they were yesterday notified by the coroner and requested as to what disposition they desired to make of the remains.

Killed in the Mines.

Ouray, Colo., Jan. 8.—A miner by the name of James O'Shaughnessy was killed on the Crown Point mine near Camp Pauquin this morning about 9 o'clock, while picking a charge put in the day before and which exploded while he was over it. A piece of rock half the size of a hen's egg buried itself in the unfortunate man's neck and his right arm was shattered and blown off. He lived but a few moments. The deceased was formerly of Clinton county, New York, where he still has relatives in comfortable circumstances.

Joe Cubbon, an old miner working in the Virginius was crushed to death yesterday morning about 3 o'clock while attempting to cross the cage which had been rung up from the seventh level by the night boss, but disregarded it and met his death a moment later. The body was brought to Ouray yesterday and buried near Portland to-day.

George Engl Passes Away After an Active Life.

Immense Landed Proprietor.
Deceased Owned Over 3,000
Acres of Land in the Vicinity of
Castle Rock, and Accumulated a
Handsome Fortune During a Life
that Was Spent Almost Entirely in
the County Where He Made His
First Location.

One by one, the pioneers of Colorado are passing into the great unknown. Thursday night last, at his ranch near Castle Rock, George Engl, one of the earliest settlers in the state and one of the best known and respected citizens of this section of the country, succumbed to kidney trouble and solved the mystery of death.

The report of the demise of this pioneer deeply affected his numerous friends in both Douglas and Arapahoe counties. The widow, together with about twenty close friends of deceased, accompanied the remains to Denver yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Engl was a German by birth, having been born in Bavaria 67 years ago. His boyhood days were spent in his native land, where he obtained an excellent education. While still a young man, the desire to visit America seized him and soon after becoming of age, he embarked for New York. In the early '50s he lived at New York, Leavenworth, Kan., and other important points.

In 1858 he came to Colorado and soon after his arrival he settled upon a ranch in Lake Gulch, which is now distant about nine miles from Castle Rock. His possessions included about 3,000 acres, which he devoted to cattle raising. His residence upon this piece of property was almost continuous, from the day he first set foot upon it. He did all in his power

for the development of Douglas county, and in recognition of his untiring efforts in this regard his friends twice sent him to the legislature. His last term expired twelve years ago, after which he retired from political life.

Mr. Engl married twice. His first wife died in 1885. By her he had six children. A few years ago he met Miss Louisa Roracher, who afterwards became Mrs. Engl. By careful investments and business success, he became the owner of a small fortune, amounting to nearly \$40,000.

At one time deceased was a member of the board of county commissioners of Douglas county, also a stockholder and director of the defunct German National bank. He was a member of the Grand Army, Odd Fellows and a charter member of the Pioneers' association of Colorado.

The remains were brought in at 6 o'clock last evening over the Gulf road and taken to Miller's undertaking parlors, at which place the funeral services, conducted by one or more of the orders of which the deceased was a valued member, will be held to-morrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment will be at Riverside. The widow of the deceased is staying with Mrs. Lois Koch at 1426 Welton.

The pioneers will meet at room 309 Charles block, Sunday, April 12, at 1 o'clock p.m., to attend the funeral.

The members of Germania lodge, No. 14, I.O.O.F., will meet at their hall, 1543 Champa street, Sunday at 1 p.m. for the purpose of attending the funeral. Visiting brothers are invited to attend.

DIED AT ST. LUKE'S.

Mrs. A. J. Robinson of Glenwood Succumbs to an Operation.

Mrs. A. J. Robinson, wife of Dr. A. J. Robinson of Glenwood Springs, this state, died at St. Luke's hospital at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon as

the result of an operation performed by several of the leading surgeons of the city. Mrs. Robinson was a sister of C. C. Parks, late state auditor. Mr. Parks arrived in the city vesterday in response to a telegram announcing the intelligence of his sister's critical condition. The husband of Mrs. Robinson was at her side when the dread summons came and was nearly prostrated last evening by the loss of a faithful wife and a true companion. A son, 22 years of age also mourns the departure of Mrs. Robinson. She was 47 years of age and came to Colorado with her family seventeen years ago, residing for five years at Gunnison before taking up her residence at Aspen. The remains will be taken to Neponset. Ill., for burial, the funeral party leaving to-night. Funeral services will be postponed until the time of the burial at the old home.

SCALDED TO DEATH BY ESCAPING STEAM.

(Rocky Mountain News, December 3, 1899, Page 10.)

Anton Sandstrom Loses His Life in Horrible Manner at Diamond Mine, Leadville.

LEADVILLE, Colo., Dec. 2.— An accident occurred at the Diamond mine this afternoon which resulted in the death of Anton Sandstrom. The man was employed as a fireman at the property, and was repairing a pipe leading from the boiler and used for the purpose of blowing off the extra steam.

He turned the steam on hurriedly, and the pipe, receiving the force of the escaping steam, struck him in the head. He was knocked directly beneath the steam jet, and remained there for several minutes under the intense heat, until, when he was finally removed, he was nearly cooked, living only for a few moments afterward. Sandstrom is unmarried and has a sister residing in Denver.

DEATH OF J.D. HOOPER OF ASPEN.

(Rocky Mountain News, April 26, 1898, Page 3)

Former Mayor and Sheriff of Pitkin County Succumbs to a Surgical Operation.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., April 25.- J. D. Hooper of Aspen died at the St. Francis hospital at 7:30 this morning from the effects of a surgical operation for the removal of a tumor from the stomach. Local physicians, assisted by two doctors from Denver, performed the operation. Little hope was held out to Mr. Hooper's friends before the sick man was placed on the operating table, and the operation was had only as a last resort. The sick man never rallied. The body was taken in charge by the Rogers undertaking establishment, from whose rooms the funeral will be held at 2 p.m. to-morrow.

ASPEN, Colo., April 25 – Ex-Mayor J. D. Hooper, whose death occurred at Colorado Springs this morning from the effects of a surgical operation, was one of Aspen's best known citizens, having come to this city in 1881. He was elected mayor in 1884 and again served in the same capacity during 1895-96. He was sheriff of Pitkin county in 1887-88. The Ute uprising near Meeker occurred during Mr. Hooper's incumbency of the sheriff's office and at the head of a posse of eighty deputies, he went to the aid of the settlers. He was a practical carpenter and contractor, and Pitkin county's handsome court house, built in 1896, is a specimen of his handiwork. In his social life Mr. Hooper made many friends. He was generous and nothing pleased him more than to see his fellow man prosperous and happy. During his prosperous days he always paid most liberal wages to his employes, at one time going to the extent of \$4 per day and six hour shifts. The then ruling wages was \$3.50 and eight

hours. Deceased was 48 years old and a native of Virginia. He was a member of the Knights of Pythias, the Woodmen and the National Aid of the Farmers' Alliance. He leaves a wife and two daughters, the oldest being Mrs. Frank Hughes of this city. T.A. Curry of the K. of P. order here left on the Rio Grande to-night for Colorado Springs to represent that organization at the funeral Interment will be made at Riverside. Denver.

KILLED IN THE PORTLAND MINE

(Rocky Mountain News, December 3, 1899, Page 10.)

Two Men Mangled by Terrible Explosion of Dynamite.

Gus Camp Dies Instantly and Alexander Craig is Probably Fatally Hurt. Wife of Injured Miner Lives in Denver

VICTOR, Colo., Dec. 2 – A terrible explosion of dynamite in the breast of the drift from the 900 foot level at the Portland mine at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon instantly killed Gus Camp and probably fatally injured Alexander Craig.

The two miners were engaged in loading and tamping a round of great machine drilled holes. Edward McNichols, another miner, working some distance from the two men on the same level, heard the blast and was knocked off his feet. He hastened to the vicinity of the explosion and there found Camp and Craig. Camp's head was almost blown to pieces, and Craig was terribly mangled and in an unconscious condition.

It is thought that the premature action of the powder was caused by the generation of sparks from the friction created by the ramming tool which was used by Craig and Camp. It was a terrible force from the shock of which hurled the men back into


the drift, and it is a wonder that they were not entirely dismembered. The bodies of both men were brought to the surface, and Coroner Dunn notified. Dr. McKenzie, the mine physician, did all that was possible to relieve the sufferings of Craig, and at a late hour to-night it was not believed that he would survive more than twenty-four hours. He sustained a bad fracture of the skull. while his other injuries are also very Camp resided at dangerous. Goldfield and was married. DIED WHERE HIS WIFE PASSED AWAY

At one time he was treasurer of Saguache county, but since the death of his wife, Dora Kerngood Wile, two years ago, he has been conducting a saloon and eating house at Cripple Creek. Two weeks ago he came to Denver, but grew worse daily. Realizing that his case was hopeless, he asked that he be allowed to die in the same room occupied by his wife when she gave up her life from the same affliction - blood poisoning. His wishes were respected.



POPULAR TEACHER'S DEATH

Principal of Garfield School Dies From Attack of Typhoid.

After teaching in the schools of district No. 2 for sixteen years, Miss A. N. Miller, principal of the Garfield school, died at her late home, 1037 South Ninth street, at 10:30 o'clock Monday morning. Death was the result of a long sickness with typhoid fever.

Ever since the erection of the Garfield school, about ten years ago, Miss Miller had been principal of that institution.

Two sisters, Miss Emma Miller and Mrs. N. E. Myers, are the only relatives of the deceased living in Denver. Three brothers and one sister live in different parts of the East. The deceased was an active member of the Third Congregational church, and the funeral will take place from the church at 10 o'clock Thursday morning. The school superintendents will be the pallbearers and the interment will be at Fairmount.

BURNED WITH CURLING IRON

(Rocky Mountain News, December 6, 1899, Page 5)

Accident to Miss Ingersoll at Her Father's Home in Catskill.

Miss Mary Edith S. Ingersoll, professor of English literature and history in the Moody school, Northfield, Mass., and a former resident of Denver, was fatally burned last Thursday evening at her mother's home in Catskill, N.Y.

Miss Ingersoll was graduated last year from Denver university at the head of her class, and was at once engaged by Dwight L. Moody, the famous evangelist, to fill the chair in his school that she occupied at the time of her death. Miss Ingersoll was spending her Thanksgiving vacation with her mother when the accident occurred. Her father, Edwin D. Ingersoll, is traveling in Europe.

Miss Ingersoll was crimping her hair with an iron which in some manner set fire to the hair. Miss Ingersoll, becoming frightened and being still weak from an attack of nervous prostration, rushed out of doors and the flames ignited her dress.

Miss Ingersoll's father is president of the Ingersoll Investment company of Denver. The family came to Denver in 1888 and resided in Montclair until less than two years ago, when they returned to Catskill. Miss Ingersoll remaining to finish her course in the university.

Judge Hiram B. Ingersoll, living at 3643 Arlington street, is a cousin of the young woman, who had hundreds of friends in Denver.

COWBOY PREACHER DYING AT RIFLE

(Denver Republican, March 30, 1901, Page 3)

GLENWOOD SPRINGS, Colo., March 29.Rev. T. S. Leland, the Methodist cowboy preacher stationed at Rifle, is at the point of death from apoplexy.

A message from there this afternoon stated that he would be brought to Glenwood tomorrow where he would doubtless have to be operated upon and some of the clots of blood removed from the brain.

BRAKEMAN KILLED ON THE MIDLAND

(Denver Republican, March 31, 1901, page 3)

Crushed by Car Which Was Thrown Into Deep Gully.

At eight o'clock this morning, Fred Hawkins, a brakeman on an east bound Colorado Midland freight train met a violent death, due to the braking of a wheel on one of the rear cars, while the train was crossing a small bridge. The accident occurred near Green Mountain Falls and delayed traffic on the line nearly all day, though a wrecking train was at once sent to the scene.

The train, drawn by engine No. 302, and in charge of Engineer Davis, was an extra freight of 20 box and ore cars, and while crossing a bridge, as mentioned, a wheel broke on the fourth car from the end, resulting in the wrecked car leaving the track, and plunging into the chasm below. Hawkins must have been on the car that was hurled down the gully, as his mangled body was found under the wreckage of that car, by the wrecking crew. He was brought to Colorado City at 2:30 this afternoon.

The deceased had formerly been a conductor on the Santa Fe. He was well known at his home in Colorado City, and leaves a wife and two children.

No arrangements have as yet been made for the funeral, which will be under the auspices of the Masons, the deceased having been a Knight Templar.




Figure 20: "James Tynon, Nov. 1, 1838, Mar. 6, 1918, Pioneer 1859," grave marker, Fairmount Cemetery, photo by Nancy L. Ratay

Dr. Eisenhart Will Enter Upon It Next Tuesday.

The Doctor Was Born in Switzerland and Came to America When 60 Years of Age - Good for Several Years.

If he lives until next Tuesday morning Dr. Johan Eisenhut will have lived in three centuries. He is now in very robust health for a man of more than 100 years, and gives every promise of living out the nineteenth century and seeing the dawn of the twentieth.

He was born April 3, 1800. He thus saw the death of the eighteenth century, has lived an active and eventful life lasting through the nineteenth century and now has but a few more hours to live to see the dawn of the twentieth, his third on earth.

Dr. Eisenhut is a native of Switzerland. He was born in the little town of Herisan, in the canton of Appenzell. He lived in that country until he was 60 years old, when he emigrated to America. He first lived at Omaha, and later moved to Denver, coming here in 1870.

For a number of years Dr. Eisenhut practiced his profession in this city, his office being on Lawrence, then one of the principal thoroughfares. In 1880 he removed to Leavenworth gulch, in the Russell mining district, in Gilpin county, where he still lives. Dr. Eisenhut has been a very active and enduring man, and practiced medicine until two years ago, when age began to tell on him to such an extent that he was forced to retire. He is now feeble, but gives promise to living a number of years.

He was married to Miss Annie Tobian, in his native canton in Switzerland, in 1840. His wife shared all his wanderings, and died only a few weeks ago at the age of 80 years. She lived to see her husband celebrate his 100th birthday, and on that occasion the venerable couple entertained hosts of their friends in their Gilpin county home.

His wife dead and his life work ended, the old physician is now quietly awaiting the end. He hopes, however, to live to see his third century. Then he will be willing to go.

E. L.GALLATIN, A PIONEER OF DENVER, DEAD

(The Denver Post, August 25, 1906, page 2)

Stricken With Paralysis in Home Where He had Lived for Thirty-Five Years.

Another of the pioneer citizens of Denver was called today by the death of E. L. Gallatin, at his home, 1430 Logan avenue, his residence for the last thirty-five years. A stroke of paralysis was the immediate cause of death, but he remained in the full possession of all his faculties until the end.

Mr. Gallatin was the pioneer saddler and harness dealer of Colorado. Born in St. Louis Sept. 5, 1828, he was thrown on the world when 17 years old without father or mother, and became an apprentice at the saddler's trade. In 1860 he crossed the plains to Colorado and settled in Denver. Mr. Gallatin pitched his first camp on the present site of the Union depot.

His ability at his trade and honest business methods caused him to prosper, and in 1863 he organized the firm of Gallatin & Coe, which two years later was changed to Gallup & Gallatin. During the early period of his business life he established stores in Nebraska City, Mont., and at Cheyenne, Wyo. The latter business was subsequently sold to a nephew who had learned the trade with him.

In 1873 Mr. Gallatin sold his Denver business to Francis Gallup, and two years later his store in Cheyenne. He then invested in Denver real estate, and by wise reinvestment accumulated very valuable property, which he held at his death.

Mr. Gallatin was a man of many charities, which he carefully hid from the knowledge of his friends, but his kindness and helpfulness are known in the households of many poor whom he assisted in the time of dire need. A few years ago he wrote a book entitled, "What Life Has Taught Me," summing up the wisdom acquired in a long and useful life.

The surviving family consists of the widow and one son, Joseph H. Gallatin, of 778 South Pearl street.

There comes from Greenfield, Mass., the news of the death of the Rev. Peter Voorhees Finch, who died in New York City May 3. To many of the old timers this will be sad news, for the deceased was rector of St. John's church in this city from 1873 to 1879, and preceded Dean Hart. Since his departure from Denver he had been rector of St. James' church in Greenfield.

Dr. Finch was a native of New Jersey and was ordained as a priest in the Episcopal church by Bishop Williams of Connecticut in 1860. He served during the civil war as a chaplain the Sixteenth in Connecticut volunteers, and after being rector in Greenfield for several years he came West. He was an ideal pastor, and found time to take an active interest in matters outside of the church. All that knew him loved him, and his funeral at Greenfield was largely attended by men who had been associated with him in the various fields of activity in which he was prominent.

They Are Alexander Sutherland, Who Sounded the Charge at Balaklava, and Johann Joacob Eisenhut, Great Physician.

With a soothing caressing touch the hand of time is being gently drawn over the brows of two of the oldest, noblest and most celebrated men any country has ever produced. They are Alexander Sutherland of 624 Twenty-fourth street and Dr. John Jacob Eisenhut of Anthony's hospital, and the story of how these two men are slowly, calmly slipping into the sleep that knows no awakening, is an interesting one.

Nearly 84 years ago Alexander Sutherland was born in London. England. His father was Alexander Sutherland, the captain of the Seventy-ninth Highlanders, who was appointed a guard over Napoleon during his exile at St. Helena. From the first the small Alexander had a longing for life upon the field of battle, where the clatter of hoofs and the clanging of swords might be daily heard. From year to year this longing grew upon him, until he arrived at the age of manhood and was admitted into the king's army as a trumpeter. He fought in war after war and battle after battle, but there came a day when the name of Alexander Southerland was passed about from home to home and was spoken with the greatest reverence and love.

Just Before the Great Charge.

It was in the early fall of 1852 that it all happened. One night the troopers had all ridden into their camp at Balaklava, weary and footsore, when the orders came to the captain to select 600 of the lightest men of the division, with fast horses, for the purpose of storming one of the Russian batteries. Alexander Sutherland was the trumpeter of the company at the time, and as he was one of the lightest men, he was appointed to go with the picked men to sound calls. The battery to be stormed was lined on both sides with Russian artillery, and Lord Cardigan, the commander of the brigade, saw that the attack meant death to hundreds of his brave men, but the order had come to attack and attack they The horrors of it all have never been told, for words are meaningless to depict what happened. It is only known that out of that troop of 600 men, there were only 142 left, half mad and powder-stained, crawling back out of that "valley of death." It was Alexander Sutherland who sounded the charge of "forward," amid a shower of cannon balls, cries of men and the onrush of frightened horses, and his name has gone down in history for that memorable deed, and it will always be loved and revered by the generations that will come and go.

Another Grand Old Man.

Now at the age of 84 the angel of death is slowly drawing him onward into the hereafter, and in a short time - no one knows just how soon - he will join the rest of the troopers. Up to two months ago he was in excellent health for one so advanced in

age, but there came a time when for days and nights he hovered between life and death. Careful and tender nursing, however, triumphed, and the aged man is once more able to walk about his little vine-covered cottage, but he has never been the same. As the days and weeks go by, he grows weaker and his eyes dimmer and he knows that his days upon this earth are numbered.

As Alexander Sutherland sits upon his tiny porch, thinking of his happy boyhood days, the kind black-robed sisters at St. Anthony's hospital are counting the heart beats of another grand old man - Dr. Johann Jacob Eisenhut, one of the oldest men in the country. On the third of April he was 104 years of age, and for the first time, life became a burden. A memorable life has been that of the old physician, one of continued study, travel and work, and there is scarcely any one in this country who has not heard the story of the old Swiss physician. He, too, was strong and active, with a keen interest. In everything life had to offer, until a month ago, when the strong hands of death drew him slowly into the little white cot in the hospital. Day after day he lies there, sometimes awake, but oftener asleep, thinking and wishing for the summons to come so that he may join his loved ones in the great beyond.




Figure 21: "Rebecca Tynon, Beloved Wife of Jas. Tynon and Mother of Adeline Tynon, died Jan. 24, 1898", grave marker, Fairmount Cemetery, photo by Nancy L. Ratav



MILITARY FUNERAL FOR OLD BUGLER

(The Denver Post, November 14, 1904, page 2)


"Taps," the "lights out" of the soldier, was sounded this morning over the grave of Alexander Sutherland, the bugler of the "Light Brigade" who gave the signal for the immortal charge at the battle of Balaklava. With military honors the remains of the venerable soldier and musician was laid to rest in Mount Olivet cemetery.

Funeral services were held at the church of the Sacred Heart at 10:30. The procession from the church to the cemetery was an imposing sight. In the lead was a band and behind the hearse followed a riderless horse,

fully equipped with military saddle and bridle.

The body was guarded by a detachment of militia in full uniform. At the cemetery, after the final words had been spoken, there was a volley of musketry and "taps" was sounded as the earth fell upon the casket.

The bugle which Mr. Alexander carried in the Crimean was buried with him. The casket was draped in American flags and was covered with a profusion of flowers. Old friends of the musician who had known him since the early days of Denver acted as pall-bearers.



Horan Mortuary Journal 1891-1892 Index Introduction

This journal is part of the financial records of the Horan Mortuary Records, WH842, in the manuscript collection of the Western History/Genealogy Department of the Denver Public Library. It is the companion volume to the accounting ledger of the same period. It predates the Horan Burial Books and is an itemized account of the services provided by the mortuary.

The volume is fragile and the binding is falling apart. The first 20 pages have been cut out of the book. The mortuary's inventory of supplies is scattered throughout the volume and was not indexed. Pages 360-431 are blank. Page 432 has a recipe for making silver polish and one for silver plating. The volume is microfilmed at the end of the Horan Burial Books.

The entries are chronological with several dates on a page. Each entry usually contains more than one name along with an itemized list of services provided and the cost. The multiple names make it difficult at times to determine the name of the deceased. The researcher will need to contact the cemetery or consult the burial permit listings of the newspapers to confirm the deceased. In some entries the deceased is obvious.

Each entry for service is marked with a "D" for debt, usually after the first name. Entries for payment are marked with a "C" for credit. Some entries have the name of an organization, union, or insurance company shown as responsible party. A few entries are labeled colored or Jewish. A few contain the cause of death. A large number of infant deaths and stillborns will be found. Most entries indicate a cemetery. Some are for removal of individuals from one cemetery to another. Cemetery names are often letters or abbreviations: O or Oli =Mount Olivet; C or Cal = Mount Calvary; F or Fair = Fairmount; R or Riv = Riverside. Some entries contain local addresses. Some have out of town places included.

Financial status of the family is often indicated by the purchase of a casket or coffin. Coffins were pine boxes often called toe crunchers with no frills. Those funerals were simpler than the ones using caskets. Caskets were made of hardwoods or metals and were much more expensive. The most expensive caskets in the record were \$450 and \$500. Only one of each appeared.

Mortuaries of this period were also livery stables. Many carriage rentals are found in the records. The mortuary made their carriages and horses available to the citizens for rent when they were not in use for funerals. Carriage rentals are included in the journal.

This index is an every name index. The record is handwritten and contains some very creative spelling. A few extra names added to portions of some records were simply unreadable and not indexed. Every effort was made to retain the spelling as it appears in the journal. The researcher is reminded to consider alternate spellings. Infants are listed when a surname is identified. *Lassasso Infant* is indexed as that. Mr. Fox for burial of infant is listed only as Mr. Fox. Company names, law firms, insurance companies, etc. were not indexed. A few entries are a surname or given name only. Entries in [] are surnames that were added by the indexer as the records indicated.

This volume is useful for researchers who had families in the area during this time. It may help bridge the gap created by the loss of the 1890 census. It may provide valuable insight into the family during this time.

Editor's Note: The following is the index compiled by Ms. Rehn. It is formatted in 3 columns. Each entry is in the order Surname, Given Name, Page Number in the Journal. If you find a name entry you are interested in, you can contact the Denver Public Library, Western History and Genealogy Dept. to inquire about viewing the microfilm or getting a copy of the page(s).





CHRONOLOGY OF DENVER SCHOOL DISTRICT #1

| 1859-1862 | Only private schools existed during this time period. Classes were held in log cabins. |

| 1861 | The first session of the Colorado Territorial Legislature passed an act to organize a public school system in Colorado. Owen J. Goldrick was elected Superintendent of Schools for Arapahoe County in the first general territorial and county elections. (Goldrick is credited as being Denver's first school teacher in 1859.) However, Goldrick could do little because the Legislature did not plan for a tax base to create a school fund. |
| 1862 | In the meantime, while waiting for school funds to be appropriated, the city of Denver was divided into two school districts. Cherry Creek was the dividing line. The first school board elections were held in October. |
| | In December, District One opened its first school in a small rented frame building on Sixteenth street. It was referred to as "Mr. Bayaud's Room." While there were 188 persons of school age in the district, only fifty or sixty pupils attended. |
| 1864 | In the spring of 1864, the school was closed due to lack of funds. Education came to a standstill because of a lack of interest, as well as insufficient funds. |
| 1868 | In 1868, Amos Steck made a gift of two lots on the north side of Arapahoe Street, between Seventeenth and Eighteenth Streets. |
| 1870 | By this time Denver was assured that railroads would come through Colorado, and the Territorial Legislature passed an act to provide for "Common Schools". The Board bought two lots adjoining the Steck lots. |
| 1872 | The Arapahoe School was begun in 1872 and completed in 1873. While it was under construction, the city already realized the need for another school. So, simultaneously, |

Six classes graduated from the Arapahoe School. The first class of graduates in 1877 chose carmine and white as the school colors because carmine was the only color of ink available at the time. Later these became red and white and remain the school colors.

they began building Stout Street School on the northeast corner of Stout and Twenty-

Eighth Streets. It was completed by 1874. Both schools were shortlived. The Arapahoe School was soon surrounded by the business district, an inappropriate setting for a school. The neighborhood caused the property to be valuable. It was sold at a substantial price to build a new school. The design for the Stout Street School was faulty and too costly to correct. By 1881, the city condemned the building.

1874

The Territorial Legislature passed a special act, known as the "Charter Act", which is the substance of Colorado school law today. District One became an independent political entity designated as the Board of Education of School District One. The northern boundary was beyond Riverside Cemetery; the eastern boundary was Colorado Boulevard (east of the City Park); and its southern, southwestern and western boundaries were Cherry Creek and the Platte River.

1881

"A Government Square" was set aside by the legislature in the 1860s. In 1881, the enactment of a law gave the "A Government Square" to the city to be used for school purposes, only. It was on this site at Nineteenth and Stout Streets, that a high school building was built. Today this is the site of the Federal Court Building. It has been referred to as East Denver High School, as Old East High School and as Denver High School. The west wing was finished and ready for occupancy in 1881. It operated until 1925. Denver High School housed the Denver Public Library.

The building was intended to accommodate 700 children comfortably. By the time it was abandoned, it housed twice that number and could boast of 7,000 graduates. The last class to graduate from "Old East" was the class of 1925.

Early principals were James Hutchens Baker (1875-1892), William Henry Smiley (1892-1912), Harry M. Barret (1912-1920) and Roscoe Conkling Hill (1920-1944).

1899

In 1899 the enumeration of children in the county, were 38,369 of school age. There were 829 teachers in the county; 113 of these were in the rural schools. The average monthly salary paid to male teachers in graded schools was \$103.79 and to female teachers, \$68.24. In the rural schools, the average pay to male teachers was \$44.42 and \$35.82 to females.

1900

According to the enumeration of April 1900, there were 19,833 children in the city of Denver of compulsory school age (8-14 years). There were 16,709 pupils enrolled in the public schools, 1,707 pupils enrolled in private schools and 2,325 pupils enrolled in the several high schools. Among those in attendance at Arapahoe county public schools in 1900 14 were deaf mutes and 7 were blind students.

Did you have an ancestor who was a teenager in Denver in the late 1800s? Would you like to own a photograph of that teenage ancestor? If he or she was a graduate of Denver High School from 1877 to 1897, you may be able to procure a photographic copy of their portrait. If you did not have an ancestor in Denver, but have one somewhere else, this list can provide incentive to do a search in the libraries and archives where they lived.

Do not limit your search to Denver High School as it was preceded by Arapahoe School and Stout School. Six classes, beginning with the class of 1877, graduated from the Arapahoe School. (See Chronology on p. 3.) Denver High School at Nineteenth and Stout was ready for occupancy in 1881; this building also housed the Denver Public Library. The high school continued until 1925 when the student body numbered about 1,400 in a building intended to house 700. Denver High School graduated some 7,000 students; the last class to graduate was 1925. Denver High School was replaced by East High School, which still stands today at Colfax and Detroit Avenues.

Photo albums preceded yearbooks. Denver Public Library owns Denver High School photo albums for the years 1877 to 1897 and yearbooks from 1911 to 1925. The 1877-1897 photo albums contain portraits of more than 1,000 graduates. NOTE: If any reader has albums/yearbooks for the years 1898 to 1910 the Denver Public Library would be delighted to receive them in order to complete their collection.

The Denver Public Library's Western History/Genealogy photograph collection has ten (10) volumes of the Denver High School photo albums dating from 1877 to 1897. The years are broken down thus:

Each volume is a brown leather album with the class year and the word "ALBUM" embossed in gold on the spine. The front has gold embossed letters, "Denver High School, District Number One, Denver, Colorado." The pages are heavy stock with picture frames. Volume I has four photos per page front and back. In the list that follows these four photo positions are cited as: (1) upper left, (2) upper right, (3) lower left and (4) lower right. Volumes II through X have two photos per page front and back. The photo positions of these nine volumes are cited as: (1) left and (2) right. All photos are black and white. These albums are not catalogued and the photos are not digitized at this time and there is no plan to do so.

The portraits reflect the clothing fashions and hair styles of the times. The ladies wore little or no jewelry; a few wore flowers or a hat. Several of the men wore their Denver High School Cadet uniform. (See "Denver High School Cadets" on p. 35). In rare instances, there is more than one person in the photo.

The students are identified by name only in the albums. The names are handwritten in lead pencil below the photo on the framing stock. How many years passed before the pictures were identified? There is no way of knowing when, or who wrote the names. There is, also, no way to know what kinds of errors may exist in these records. Did the writer know each person or simply guess the identity? Are the names spelled correctly? Therefore, all names in this list are taken from commencement programs because these programs used the full name of the student.

The list is arranged in the same order as the albums. The column headings are: year (YR), volume number (VOL), page number (PG), position on page (POS#), gender (G), name (NAME) as it appears in the commencement program and comments (AUTHOR'S NOTES). The author's observations are within square brackets []. Other notes without brackets are from historical sources (see Bibliography). Pictures were not removed from the album because of possible damage to the picture frames. Therefore any handwritten notes and/or names of photography studios could not be included in this list. Notes in this list help to clarify contents. [Empty] means there was no photo and no name; [Photo missing] means there was a name, but no photo. When there is no photo, no gender is given since, for example, the name Jesse could be male or female. [Unidentified] means there is a photo, but no name written. However, the names in the commencement programs would give good clues as to who the photo might be.

The albums may be viewed by going to the Western History/Genealogy Reference Desk and asking for the album(s) you wish to see. Copies of photographs may be ordered from the Denver Public Library. 

About the Denver High School Cadets

everal young men appear in the Denver High School photo albums wearing a uniform. The hats bear the letters DHSC; these refer to the Denver High School Cadets. The Western History Department has a copy of the DHSC Bylaws. The following is a transcript of the Preamble, Article pertaining to membership and the 1885 officers/membership.

Description: 3" x 5" booklet. Paper; spine whipstitched with burgundy thread for reinforcement. Handwritten on the booklet cover "BENNETT" and "Please Return." Handwritten inside from cover: Finance: Woodward, Sumner and Theo Smith; Court Martial: C. Kassler, Tinshley and Crocker; Capt. Bradley Aller. (Finance and Court Martial are committees.)

Preamble: We, the undersigned, appreciating the advantages to be derived from military drill, do hereby organize ourselves into a military company, to be known as the "Denver High School Cadets."

And we do hereby solemnly bind ourselves to faithfully perform the duties imposed upon us, and to obey all lawful commands of our superior officer.

Therefore be it resolved:

That in order to secure that harmony of effort and unity of purpose essential to the welfare of the Company, provide for its proper management and define the respective duties of its members, we do ordain and establish the following bylaws: And we do hereby solemnly bind ourselves to faithfully perform the duties imposed upon us, and to obey all lawful commands. Therefore be it resolved:

ARTICLE I - Membership

SECTION 1. None but able bodied men members, in good standing, teachers, or graduates of the Denver High School, of at least five feet three inches in height, shall be admitted as members of this Company.

SECTION 2. The admission shall be by ballot, and if three adverse ballots be cast against the admission of any candidate, he shall be rejected. Candidates shall be balloted for separately. Any member of the Company in good standing, may propose the names of candidates for admission, at any regular meeting.

SECTION 4. The company may elect honorary members, in the same manner prescribed for active members.



THE GRANT AVENUE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH A SHORT HISTORY

The Grant Avenue Methodist Episcopal Church at 216 South Grant Street, Denver, Colorado, had its beginnings as a mission church on November 7, 1890. By November 29, its first structure was completed: a 40 by 55 foot tent constructed of lumber and canvas at the corner of South Sherman and Maple Streets. It had glass windows, two barrel-shaped stoves, hanging kerosene lamps, a pulpit, organ, chairs, and hymnals.

Membership increased steadily and a new red brick Parsonage Church was dedicated at South Grant Street and Cedar Avenue on February 14, 1892. Considerable effort went into fund raising to pay for the land and the building. Hard times began with the Panic of 1893 at which time many members left town. By 1896, the debt on the lots was \$3000 and annual interest was \$240. The pastors and members creatively worked to clear the debt, but at the same time membership increased and new facilities became necessary. A fact sheet published by the congregation in 1991 shows the growth:

- 1890--Mission Church meets in a tent at South Sherman and Maple Streets
- 1891--Incorporated as Grant Ave. Methodist Episcopal Church and moved to South Grant and Cedar Avenue
- · 1899--New church building. Old one was inadequate
- 1903--Church building enlarged
- 1908--Present sanctuary erected
- 1920-New community building finished
- 1935—Hofman's painting "Christ in the Temple" placed in sanctuary
- 1945—All church mortgages cleared
- · 1957-59—Building Improvement fund used to renovate church
- 1963—Congregation votes to acquire land that will permit future growth of church
- 1966—Diamond Anniversary
- 1991—Golden Jubilee¹

The 1908 Gothic Revival Grant Avenue Methodist Episcopal Church, with its 1920 community center addition, was designed by the prominent Denver architect Harry J. Manning. According to the church history, A Century of Illumination, the 1908 church building uses Turkey Creek sandstone, "which could last indefinitely," around the large windows and cornices. The cornerstone was laid February 9. A metal box was cemented into a receptacle under the stone, containing "many records, a silk United States flag, a Methodist Discipline, and lists of living members, Sunday School teachers, trustees, etc." Bishop Henry White Warren made some remarks, saying, "This stone means that members of this church are coworkers with God."

The 58 by 67-foot building had a red painted roof and a 56-foot tower with a spire covered with red clay tile.

Inside, the new auditorium had a bowled floor and two aisles sloped gently toward the center in the front. The chancel was oak with a brass rail and an olive green plush curtain. The walls were painted a soft olive. The pulpit was the same table and two simple chairs used in the tent, the Parsonage Church, and the Chapel Church that preceded the new structure.²

The building was added to the Colorado State Register for Historic Places in 2001. Grant Avenue was the first Methodist Congregation in the newly formed incorporated community of South Denver. The United Methodist Conference recognized the need for Methodist churches to be constructed outside the city limits of Denver. The building functioned not only as a center for worship but also as a major community center for activities from sports to socials, particularly in the youth area. Currently, the building is home to

many community groups, such as the Colorado Honor Band, the Washington Park Players, Mile High Freedom Band, and the Colorado Wind Ensemble, mentoring program, child care and education, peace walks, health services for senior citizens and sponsoring refugee families.³





My great, great grandfather was George Dolphin, an emmigrant from Grinton, York, England which is known as the Swaledale! on or about May 2, 1866 in Denver, Colorado Territory and I doubt that his body was returned to Wisconsin. He was a miner and probably went out West to seek his fortune. Six (6) months prior to his death he executed a Quit Claim Deed to his wife to the property in Iowa County, Wisconsin. Speculating, this was a deed in contemplation of death. He may have been injured in a mining accident. I remember something my Great Aunt Mabel told me when I was about 10 years old about a park and someone being buried in it. It stuck out in my memory because in my child's mind I couldn't understand why a person was buried in a park and not a cemetery. I have written to Colorado Historical Society but from past experience with such organizations I don't expect much, however, one could get luck!!!!



Down Cemeteres ... **Early Denver Had** lts Own 'Boot Hill'

Not to be outdone by Dodge and Abilene, Denver, too, had its Boot Hill where those who died violent deaths

were laid to rest.

Known variously as City Cemetery, Bone Yard, Prospect Hill and Mt. Prospect, the first burial ground was established at the "eastern end" of 11th ave., where Cheesman Park is now.

Tradition is the first person buried there in 1858 was a German pioneer murdered with an

Gambler Killed

Jack O'Neill, Denver gambler, was killed by John Rooker in March 1859 and was buried in the same cemetery. It soon be-came known as "O'Neill's Ranche" to early Denveriles.

Mt. Prospect was not a cemetery in the modern conception of the word. Bodies were buried with little ceremony and without benefit of grass, trees, shrubs or any landscaping.

The Rocky Mountain News of May 16, 1866 listed burials in the cemetery since its found-

In 1867, J. J. Walley filed claim to the land, which the city had failed to do, and started charging fees for every person buried. An act of Congress in 1872 was necessary to transfer the land to Denver.

The cemetery was declared a menace to health in 1890 when the residential area reached the burial grounds. E. P. McGovern was given a contract to transfer bodies to the new Riverside Cemetery at \$1.90 each.

Dreams of Riches

McGovern, however had dreams of getting rich in the deal. Denver newspapers in 1893 revealed he was splitting up remains and filling two or three caskets with each body.

The disgusted Park Commission gave interested persons 90 days to get the bodies out in August 1893 or let them rest forever. Several thousand pioneer Denverites remain buried under Cheesman Park as .a result.

The Mt. Calvary section remained until bodies were removed to Mt. Olivet in 1950. Besides religious burial sections, the cemetery also had plots for Masons, Grand Army, Odd Fel-

lows, Chinese and paupers. In 1867, the Masonic and Odd Fellow Societies established the Masonic Cemetery at the "north end" of 15th st. Those buried there were removed to Riverside after it was established in 1876.

50 Acres Added

The cemetery soon added 50 acres when the park became popular. The grassy, landscaped cemetery-was irrigated with water from an underground sprinkling system.

Riverside was developed on Dr. J. H. Morrison's farm, and he became the fifth person to be buried at Riverside on July 22, 1876. Many bodies from City Cemetery were moved to the new grounds.

Fairmount Cemetery was organized Feb. 20, 1890, with 560 acres of land at E. Alameda ave. and Quebec st. Sadie Shafer was the first person buried there on Nov. 19, 1890, but by 1900 more than 9000 persons had been laid to rest there.

Riverside and Fairmount were toined under the same management in January 1900. The early cemetery still is maintained at E. 52d ave. and Race st.

Replaced Mt. Calvary

The "new Catholic cemetery" replaced Mt. Calvary on May 23, 1891 when Denver church leaders organized Mt. Olivet. The first burial was July 1892, on 200 acres at 12801 W. 44th ave.

The last burial in Mt. Calvary was in 1908.

Crown Hill Cemetery Assn. was organized in 1908 with 290 acres of ground at W. 29th ave. and Wadsworth blvd. A street car line served the area, which soon expanded with the purchase of 200 acres.

Golden Hill Cemetery at 12000 W. Colfax ave. had its
