Introduction

The Colorado Soldiers' and Sailors' Home was established by an Act of the Seventh General Assembly, approved 15 March 1889. The Home opened on 1 October 1891, despite not having received appropriations from the State for the care and maintenance of the inmates.

After the opening of the Home, annual and biennial reports were filed, often published with two years in one volume. Researchers who have access to the online FirstSearch(R) WorldCat database can locate copies throughout the United States. In Colorado, the following institutions have copies:

Colorado Soldiers' and Sailors' Home

The early annual reports contain "descriptive lists," or rosters, of inmates, plus lists of payments made to various individuals and companies for work, and donations made by individuals and organizations.

According to the first report, "Inmates are not admitted to the Home except on physician's certificate that they are unable to perform manual labor and are destitute." (p. 3) Some inmates stayed a short time and left (sometimes returning later), and others died in the Home. Below are the names of inmates, staff, workers, and donors mentioned in the first report.
