Kriley.

 - Contents: 5-page detailed mineral survey; final oaths for surveys; relocation affidavit; surveyor general's certificate of approval of field notes and survey of mining claim; register's final certificate of entry; application to purchase for sum of \$30 and receipt; proof of non-abandonment; statement of fees and charges to the surveyor's general's office of \$135.35; location certificate signed by the original owners of the Cellar Lode mine Willis J.  - Discoveries: Jacob Vincent Kriley is the brother of Mathias M. Kriley and the brother of my great-grandfather William G. Kriley, Jacob was born in Butler County, Pennsylvania had a post office box in Black Hawk, Gilpin, Colorado but resided in Apex, Gilpin, Colorado from 1894-1901. The Cellar Lode gold and silver mine was located in the Pine Mining District in the Sawmill Gulch west of the Apex post office. The mine contained 5.1376 acres and the improvements consisted of three shafts and a shaft house. The discovery shaft was set 65 ft. deep in rock and was timbered and valued \$780, the 22 ft. shaft valued \$225 and the 10 ft. shaft valued \$100. The log shaft house was 15 x 19 ft. and the value was \$100. The mineral survey mentions four other log houses to the East, each 15 x 19 ft., all belonging to Jacob Kriley. The partners in the original mine of 1894 sold to Jacob or other parties and by 1899 Jacob owned the entire mine. Forrest A. Godley sold to her husband Thomas, Willis J. Storke sold to Geo. W. Schneider. Many handwritten signatures of J.V. Kriley are found throughout the file.

- Discoveries: My 2nd great-grandfather, John Dwyer, was the father of Katherine Ellen Dwyer who married William G. Kriley. The Naturalization Certificate shows John Dwyer was in the U.S. at least five years before 1868 and at least one year in New Jersey before 1868. John testified of his residence on the Colorado homestead July 10, 1885, "As far as I can learn about 8 years ago. I purchased it of James McNutty in June 1880 and established my residence June 21, 1880. Frame dwelling house, 1 and 1/2 story, about 24 x 26, and good outhouses the land all under fence valued at \$1,000. Wife and nine children. Have only been temporarily absent to market. Some of us have been there all the time. Between 20 and 25 acres this will be the sixth crop. For agriculture and grazing." Thomas Hayes added, "Good stable and cow houses." On a handwritten tab, A. W. Neyland B. of B. wrote, "5 years residence, 4 and 1/2 residence before entry." Handwritten signatures of John Dwyer are evident throughout the file.
- David Mathieson homestead land entry file, patent number 204, land office Denver City, Colorado Territory, date of entry December 1, 1865, section 31, township 1-N, range 68-W, 5 pages, located in box 2, National Archives, Washington, D.C.
 - Contents: Naturalization form for David Mathieson, Register of Land Office at Denver City, C.T., Arapahoe County swears allegiance to United States (no home country mentioned), February 16, 1865; affidavit of pre-emption claimant; receipt for \$200; land office patent February 15, 1865; testimony of Alexander Garber February 16, 1865.
 - Discoveries: My 2nd great-grandfather, David Mathieson is one of the very early pioneer homesteaders in what is now southwestern Weld County near the Boulder County line. The receipt shows he came from Boulder County and purchased 160 acres for \$1.25 per acre amounting to \$200. Alexander Garber testified, "David Mathieson is a citizen of the United States and the head of a Family. David Mathieson entered upon, and made a settlement in person on said land on the 4th day of September A.D. 1864, since which time he has erected thereon a frame house ______ feet with roof, floor, door, and window, and is a comfortable house to live in. Is now living in said house on said land where he makes his exclusive home." Two handwritten signatures of David Mathieson included in file.



The Rocky Mountain State

by John W. Heisey History books tell us that gold was discovered in many places in the great American West. When we read that we immediately think of California, but that wasn't the only place prospective millionaires went.

Many hopeful miners, and others, went to Colorado as well. The lure of gold, silver and other riches drew them. Although large numbers of Easterners went to Colorado, stayed a while and then left, many others went, stayed and left records. Lacking the success of finding a fortune in precious metals, those who remained turned to the land and open ranges for their livelihood. Did any of your ancestors or relatives do that?

Should Colorado be "home" to your family, you can have a wonderful "vacation" by going there to check records. You'll find a large number.

Colorado had many "transients" in its area for quite a long time before it became a territory of the United States in 1861. The discovery of gold and silver brought in more people, and it was this rise in population which enabled Colorado to become a state in 1876.

To look for Colorado folks in the U.S. census, you can begin with the one of 1860. However, you'll have to look in Kansas, as Colorado was then part of Kansas Territory. The 1870 federal census, then, is the first one to show Colorado as a separate entity.

These Colorado census schedules (originals) are now on file with the Division of State Archives and Public Records in Denver. Microfilm copies should be available in many libraries throughout the state and elsewhere. By the way, the 1900 census is indexed, so checking this ought to be easier. There's also an index in the state archives or at the Colorado Historical Society Library (also in Denver) for the 1860 census of Kansas. At that time, the Colorado region showed a population of about 33,000 men and 1,500 women.

Your Ancestors ...and how to find them

Excellent additional censuses are the "state" schedules taken in 1861, 1866 and 1885. That 1885 census is quite a help. It was made by the state with federal assistance and is just as complete as the federal census of 1880. This one for 1885 included special sections or schedules. These were: Schedule 1 — Population; Schedule 2 — Agriculture; Schedule 3 — Industry; and Schedule 5 (not 4) — Mortality. This listed all who had died in the vear ending May 31, 1885. What more could one ask? It's on microfilm in many libraries. The original is in the National Archives, Washington, D.C.

There are also Mortality Schedules for Colorado concerning the years 1869-70 and 1879-80 (available on microfilm). For some reason the originals are in the library of the National Society of the DAR in Washington, D.C.

Vital records searching in Colorado might be a problem for earlier years but don't give up. More records are around for later on. For example, most records weren't registered until the 20th century. Death records were first kept in 1900 and most birth records began to be recorded in 1910 (some before that date). Marriages also fall into that same 20th century time frame. But it wasn't until 1968 that there was a state Bureau of Vital Statistics.

Indexes for some of these records are on hand, but there are no indexes for marriages between 1940 and 1975, nor any for divorces between 1940 and 1967. Your best solution is to check first in the appropriate county for any of these documents and consult the 1942 edition of the WPA *Guide to Vital Statistics Rec*ords in Colorado, Volume I, Public Archives.

Church records are just as useful and necessary in Colorado as elsewhere, so be sure to use them. If you have Quaker ancestors, some of your Colorado kin may have been members of one of the three "meetings" or congregations in that state. If so, you might want to check for them in the Friends' Memorial Library, Swarthmore College, Swarthmore, Penna. That date should be in William Wade Hinshaw's "Unpublished Quaker Records," which are filed there.

For all church records needs in Colorado, check the WPA *Guide to Vital Statistics Records in Colorado, Volume II, Church Archives* (Washington, D.C., 1942).

Land records are an important source of information for ancestors, especially those of earlier days. Locally, check deeds and other land transactions at the County Recorder's office.

For information on homesteads and other federal land records check with the Federal Archives Records Center in Denver. They also have information on land transactions made when the territory was under Spanish rule. That same type information may also be checked at the State Archives, at the State Library and at the State Historical Society, all in Denver.


Other county records you'll need to look for are wills and intestate records. These can be found in the District Court office in the appropriate county, except for Denver. There the place to look is the Probate Court. The same holds true for guardianships of minors.

At county level also, check with the Clerk for marriage and divorce records. Be sure you're checking in the county where the license was issued for a marriage, or where the divorce was granted.

An unusual situation arose in places like Colorado in early days. "Mining Districts" were set up. In Colorado there were 50 of them by 1866. The usual county-type record keeping was done there wills, deeds, land surveys, etc. Much of this information may be on file in the State Archives, so ask about it.

There's much more to check in Colorado, but you don't always need to go there to do your research. Try the nearest branch library of the Genealogical Society of Utah, usually located in a Mormon Church or nearby. Much of what you seek may be available there on microfilm, or obtainable through their library loan system.

As you might have guessed by now, there's more to Colorado than was covered in a previous column. Not all records on the state will be found in libraries and resource centers in Colorado. For instance, in the National Archives, Washington, D.C., are found assessment lists of the Internal Revenue. (Shades of April 15.)

These lists cover the period 1862 to 1866 and concern special taxes levied by the federal government on certain businesses and individuals. The lists give the names, locations and certain other data. Altheagh such information is not really genealogical, it might provide the clue needed to pinpoint the residence of an ancestor.

By the way, the Federal Archives Records Center-Denver Branch has original monthly tax assessment lists for Colorado covering the years 1873 to 1917. Again, while not really containing much genealogical data, the lists might establish the presence of an ancestor in a specific place. However, don't resort to those records unless you're having trouble locating an ancestor known to have been in Colorado.

The Federal Archives Records Branch also has naturalizations from 1876 to 1949 for Colorado, and can provide much other valuable genealogical information from the National Archives in Washington. You'll find the archives in Building 48, Denver Federal Center, Denver, CO 80225.

Many veterans of the Civil War lived in Colorado. In fact, quite a number of men from the area, before it was a state or even a separate territory, served in the war. There is an index to the Compiled Service Records of Union Army Volunteers, 1861-1865, on three rolls of microfilm (call number M-534). It should be available in some Colorado libraries (probably the State Historical Society Library, the State Archives and the Denver Federal Archives Branch). One copy is known to be in the library of Fort Lewis College in Durango.

Unfortunately, there is not a microfilm of the service records themselves, but that data can be obtained from the National Archives in Washington.

Sad to report is the fact that the special schedule of the veterans of the Union Army, which was part of the 1890 federal census, doesn't exist any more. It was lost when the census was destroyed.

Your Ancestors ...and how to find them

You might want to look through Sherman L. Pompey's *Civil War Veteran Burials from California, Nevada, Oregon and Washington Regiments Buried in Colorado* (Independence, CA: Historical & Genealogical Publishing Company, 1965). Another book by this same author is *Confederate Soldiers Buried in Colorado* (Independence, CA: Historical & Genealogical Publishing Company, 1965).

Since obituaries are so helpful, see Wallace H. Rex, *Colorado Newspaper Bibliography*, 1859-1933 (Denver: Bibliographical Center for Research, Rocky Mountain Region, 1939), and Donald E. Oehlert's *Guide to Colorado Newspapers*, 1859-1963 (Denver: Rocky Mountain Bibliographie Center, 1964).

There are many places throughout Colorado where you can do research. Foremost to visit is the Colorado Division of State Archives and Public Records, 1313 Sherman St., Denver. Another excellent place is the State Historical Society of Colorado, 1300 Broadway, Denver. You might find some useful genealogical information in issues of their publication, The Colorado Magazine, printed since 1923.

For good advice and suggestions on other resource possibilities in this state, write the Colorado Council of Genealogical Societies. The latest address I have for this organization is c/o Donald S. Vogels, Jr., President, 1824 Robb Street, Lakewood, CO 80215.

Don't forget to write or visit the Coloado Genealogical Society. Their mailing address is P.O. Box 9671, Denver, CO 80209. There are numerous genealogical societies scattered throughout the state — my count comes to almost a dozen so you should have no problem in finding some place with helpful data for you. They're located in Arvada, Boulder, Colorado Springs, Fort Collins, Georgetown, Grand Junction, Greeley, Lakewood, Littleton and Pueblo, as well as the one in Denver mentioned above.

The Genealogical Society of Utah, directly and through branch libraries, makes available enormous amounts of genealogical data they hold. In Colorado, this society has more than a dozen branches or "Stake" libraries. Look for them in Arvada, Boulder, Colorado Springs, Cortez, Denver, Durango, Fort Collins, Glenwood Springs, Grand Junction, LaJara, Littleton, Montrose, Northglenn and Pueblo. If you have difficulty in finding an address, contact the nearest Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormon).


The Denver Public Library Genealogy Division, 1357 Broadway, Denver, has ots of useful genealogical data, so don't miss it. Ask them for assistance in locating information they don't have on file.

When looking for publications that have genealogical data; ask about issues of *The Colorado Genealogist*. It began publication in 1939, and, hopefully, is still being issued. I'm not sure. You might write to 7244 S. Platte Canyon Drive, Littleton, CO 80123 for possible information.

County histories and local "centennial" publications often have good genealogical clues in them, so check for those books in libraries. Don't accept their information at face value, but use it as a guide or clue for further proving. You should also get good "human interest" 'ata on ancestors and their lives from lo-

In 1861 the first Colorado Territorial legislature passed an act providing for the establishment and support of a territorial university, the University of Colorado at Boulder. The following list of graduates has been extracted from the *University of Colorado Bulletin*, Vol. XXI, No. 10, General Series No. 175, "Directory, Officers and Graduates, 1877–1921." Boulder, Colorado, August 1921. The book is housed in the Archives of Norlin Library at the University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado; David Hass, Director.

The list is arranged by year of graduation with the name of the graduate, degree received, honorary degree, known occupation, as well as place of residence at the time of publication. An asterisk (*) preceding a name indicates that the person was deceased at the time the directory was compiled. This extraction contains only the names of those graduating from the Boulder, Colorado campus.



Editor's Note: Although we have completed the obituary index for people born in Colorado between 1876 and 1900, this does not complete the index for all the pioneer obituaries in the obituary clipping file held in the Denver Public Library. Pat Allen's full index also includes those who migrated to our state prior to 1900. We will begin the listing of those obituaries here.

The index is organized by surname. The other information includes the first name, the date of the obituary in the newspaper, the name of the newspaper, and the page if it was recorded with the article. The year of arrival category at the end will also give the maiden name of a woman if it appeared in the article. Sometimes the year was not known and the only notation in the article might have been "Pioneer Businessman" to indicate pioneer status. The newspaper abbreviations used in this database are:

the Society that: "Senator Tabor's grave in Calvary Cemetery was in a neglected condition." The Society members decided that this type of work was "not exactly in our line," and suggested that the "Cor. Sec." notify the Pioneer Society to see if they could do something about it.

The first papers to be filed with the Society were accounts of the ancestry of Mrs. Skinker, Mrs. Hough, Dr. Cramb and Mrs. Card.

At the regular meeting in Nov. 1925, the Treasurer announced that yearly dues would be \$ 1.00, payable on the 1st of January. A committee was appointed 19 Nov. 1925 to design an insignia to be used for membership cards, pins and other uses.

Programs suggested for the year 1926 were: "Resources of the State Library," "Methods of Research," "Fascination of Genealogy," "History and Genealogy," "Eugenics and Genealogy," and "European Research." A program to which the whole Society was invited, was to hear Dr. Garth of the University of Denver lecture on "Racial Psychology." (These people were really ahead of their time.)

After reading the Treasurer's report in Sep 1925, there were no further reports of a treasury balance for some time. In April 1926, the Board suggested that the Society do something about getting new members. Post cards were to be placed in the city and state libraries, notices were to be placed in both newspapers and everyone was asked to bring two friends to the meetings. In Sep 1926, Mr. Card presented to the Society a gavel. He suggested that Mr. Thompson make a block for it. At this time the minutes show a treasury balance of \$3.75.

The final date for closing Charter Membership was reviewed and reset for September 1927. A committee was also appointed to make plans for a social (picnic) meeting in July or August as there were no meetings in these months. Each member was appointed as a committee-of-one to interview and collect genealogies of old people. No mention was made as to where they were going to round up the "old people." Items to be purchased by the Society were: "cross section paper and post binders." Digging farther down into this box of archival material, applications for membership were discovered. Apparently you had to make a formal application and the Executive Board then voted upon that application.
