For a short period in 1853 and 1854 the Newtown Academy published a newspaper under the banner displayed above. This private school operated from 1837 until its building was sold for a free high school in Newtown in 1902. There were eleven issues in 1853 (monthly except during the August recess) and just two issues, April and June, in 1854. Laminated copies of each issue (and duplicates of some) were recently found in the Cyrenius H. Booth Library's genealogical collection.

The paper is mostly devoted to student-written articles and to promotions of the school based on its academic qualifications. But there are many business advertisements, and, in an apparent attempt to lure local subscribers, there are lists of local marriages and deaths in each issue. Most of these are probably included in town records, but there are certainly details added by this newspaper's reports. Particular poignant is the long obituary of Ellen Clark, written by a schoolmate. Note also, the death on 22 Jun 1853 of Richard Nash, an Irishman, who had been at work only two days in this country. Rather than transcribe these records, we have chosen to reproduce them in facsimile—possibly more difficult to read, but much less susceptible to error.

DEATH OF THE VICE PRESIDENT.

Wm. R. King, Vice President of the U. S., died at his plantation near Cahawba Alabama, on Monday evening April 18. The announcement is not entirely unexpected, as Mr. King had been in feeble health for some months. He returned from Havana, a few days since, in order to die at home; having given up all hope of recovery. He was about 68 years of age and had been in public life for nearly 40 years. With the exception of four years, when he was Minister to France, we believe he has been Senator from Alabama, since the year 1819—the date of her admission into the Union. Mr. K. was a man of high character and was regarded with respect by his associates in the Senate, and by the public generally.

Death has been Among Us.

On the afternoon of Friday, Aug. 12th, as we were in the midst of our usual weekly Public Exercises, a message was sent into school, informing us of the sudden death of Mary B. Nichols. Had one of our number then assembled in the school-room been struck down suddenly by the Fell Destroyer, the shock to the feelings of all present could not have been greater than was that given by the intelligence of the death of our dear young friend.

Only the Sabbath previous we had seen her at Church, her cheek flushed with health, and, for aught we know, her prospects, anticipating and plans for a long life were as flattering as are those of any of us. But "Death comes at an hour we know not of." On Monday she was at her post of duty, as teacher of the south center school. On Tuesday she was not able to leave her room, and on Friday she died.

On the announcement to us of her death, the duties of the school were suspended for the day. On Saturday we paid the last sad tokens of love and respect to the remains of our former school-mate; and, as we stood beside her grave, and saw her buried in the cold ground, we thought that we, too, must die; and while we wept for her who was being buried out of our sight, I doubt not we all resolved to live better and more useful lives, that when we are laid on a bed of death, we may, like her, be prepared.

Mary was a member of this Institution, during the last winter term, and was identified with the interests of this paper as one of its first Editors.

She was a young lady of no ordinary mind, as all who were present at the last Examination of this Institution can bear witness. She possessed the confidence and esteem of her teachers and school-mates, and was much beloved by them, and by all who knew her.



Terrible, indeed, was this intelligence. We were inexorably shocked.

She expressed a desire to see some of her school companions again, and all of us who could, hastened to her side, hoping to hear our names repeated once more, before the power of speech was gone. And we were not disappointed; but so weak and exhausted was she, that to pronounce faintly our names was all she could do.

Could it be that our dear Ellen, whom we had all so loved, she who had, by her sweet and gentle disposition so won our hearts that we felt to part with her was impossible; she who had been our happy companion for six months, ascending the Hill of Science by our sides, and sharing our joys and sorrows;—Oh, could it indeed be, that we were so soon to lay that dear form in the dust? But such was the will of her God. On Tuesday, Nov. 15th, she bade adieu to her friends, and slept the sleep of death. On Thursday, with sad hearts, we prepared to pay the last mournful rites to our friend.

Darien Vital Records, Book I: Another Barbour Omission

When Darien was separated from Stamford in 1820, the town clerk began recording the births, marriages, and deaths of town families. Births of some of the parents are as early as 1765, and some entries were continued at least to 1851 by clerk Darius K. Scofield and his successors, Ira Scofield and Edward Scofield. Entered in reverse at the end of the same volume are the ear marks for the town's farmers. All of the vital records entries occupy only ten pages, and there are scarcely more than two pages of earmarks. When, in 1847, a new practice began of recording births, marriages, and deaths by school district, there remained nearly 130 unused pages in the vital records book. Not wanting to waste good paper, the clerk used these pages for recording attachments or liens against local properties. Probably because the book was then shelved among the tax records, the vital records entries were overlooked by James Arnold and his agents who, about 1920, began to compile all early Connecticut Vital Records for the now famous Barbour Collection.

Thus, this cache of records for some sixteen Darien families has not been published and is omitted from the Barbour Collection. The book with both vital records and tax records has been microfilmed and is available at the Connecticut State Library and elsewhere as LDS Film #1434227. The original pagination for family records began with page 1, but the overwritten numbers shown here are more prominently legible.

The BRADLEY and HUBBELL FAMILIES
Their HOME and NEIGHBORS in EASTON, CONNECTICUT

The Bradley-Hubbell House, located at 535 Black Rock Turnpike in Easton, was acquired December, 1999 by the Historical Society of Easton from BHC Company, Acquarion, Inc., formerly the Bridgeport Hydraulic Company. It is presently under restoration by the Society. The following quotation is from the Society's publication. "For almost two centuries, the house has overlooked the beautiful Aspetuck River, now the Aspetuck Reservoir, on the historic road the British took in their march on Danbury during the Revolution. The historic vista, in all directions, has been virtually unchanged since Colonial times. The early Federal architecture of the house is a prime example of the golden age of Easton's settlement in the early part of the 19th century." During restoration, the house is open by appointment only.

From 1816 until 1996 only two families had resided in the house. Aljah Bradley (1782-1861) bought the property in 1811 and built the house in 1816. Aljah and his descendants lived in the house for about one hundred years. Aljah was a descendant of Francis Bradley an early settler of Fairfield, Connecticut. Aljah's grandson, John Bradley Wakeman (1853-1934), sold the property to the Bridgeport Hydraulic Company in 1912 [Easton LR 8:459]. The company created the Aspetuck Reservoir from the Aspetuck River running opposite the house. One of the company employees, Franklin Hubbell who managed company land resources, moved into the house in 1917. He lived there until his death, a few months short of his 100th birthday, in 1996. During his tenure the historic integrity of the house was preserved. Franklin Hubbell served as first selectman of Easton. He was a descendant of Richard Hubbell, who was a freeman in Fairfield in 1664. Members of the Bradley and Hubbell families had intermarried three times in the early seventeen hundreds. The families came together once more as occupants of the home on Black Rock Turnpike.

The house had been identified as having been built by Captain David Bradley, however, any documentation to support this was missing. A search of the Easton and Weston land records, Easton having separated from Weston in 1845, was made. The records placed David Bradley at other locations on Black Rock Turnpike. The Bradley-Hubbell House was traced back from the Bridgeport Hydraulic Company to John Bradley Wakeman and then through members of the Bradley family, as heirs of Aljah, to Aljah Bradley himself. Aljah had bought 23 acres and buildings for \$2,100 from Salmon Sherwood 20 March 1811 [Weston LR 10:198]. The bounds of the property included land owned by Heirs of Wakeman Hill, the Aspetuck River, Moses Burr land as the line between the land formerly owned by the heirs of Benoni Dimon and Moses Burr, and land of Jeremiah Osborn. Salmon Sherwood had bought the property with the same description from Moses Burr 3 March 1810 [Weston LR 10:74].

Huntington (Shelton) Marriages, 1820-1827: Omissions from the Barbour Collection

In May of 1820 the Connecticut legislature passed "An act for the due and orderly celebrating of Marriage." This required the person officiating to lodge a certificate of the marriage with the town clerk and the clerk to record the certificate "in a book procured by him for this purpose." Prior to this date most vital records in Connecticut towns were kept by family groups, but separate marriage registers appear in many towns, beginning about 1820. The town clerk of Huntington (now Shelton) did not quite comply with the new law, but rather began his register in a book of land records. And these were somehow overlooked in the Barbour Collection which was intended to be comprehensive for all vital records in the town books to the year 1850. Some 120 marriages, transcribed from the returns of the officiating clergymen and Justices of the Peace, are found on the first ten numbered pages of Land Records, vol.10, following the index.

Many of these marriages were by Thomas Penderson, minister of the Congregational Church (officially Ripton Society) in Huntington, and by Menzies Rayner, rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Those by Penderson can also be found in the Congregational Church records, and these also appear in the statewide index of church records at the State Library. Those by Rayner can be found in the Episcopal Church records, available on microfilm at the State Library but not indexed.

All are subject to potential transcription errors. For example, the dates of the first three marriages by Menzies Rayner, here given as 21, 24, and 24 May 1821, appear more correctly in the church record as 15, 24, and 24 August. The listings are presented in the order they appear in the Land Records, which is more or less chronological, apparently depending on when the returns were received by the town clerk.

An earlier transcription of these records, made either by David Coe or by William Howard Wilcoxson, may be found in the Wilcoxson Estate Papers at the Stratford Historical Society (their catalog #4706-35-A). This work provided the clue to the Barbour omission and facilitated the current transcription. A few errors or misreadings from the earlier transcription have been corrected, and we pray that no further errors have been introduced.

COVELL/BENNETT BIBLE

The Bible appears to be about 9" by 12". It was printed by George V. Jones, Boston, MA. Although no date is given on the frontispice, the Bible can be approximately dated as after 1880, since the New Testament is given in both the King James and the Revised versions. The British Committee of Revision gave their approval on 11 Nov 1880, and the American Committee of Revision on 20 May 1881. Handwritten on the copy of the frontispice is the comment "The Bible of Willis Covell Poomfret, Conn. 1872-1950"

Aaron Sherman (b. Sept. 12, 1764) Family Bible

This Bible is inscribed on the inside front cover as follows: "This book the family bible of Aaron Sherman was given his son Bennett A. Sherman, later inherited by his grandson Roger Sherman ..." The covers are still firmly in place. The title page is inscribed: "Philadelphia, Printed for Matthew Carey, No. 118, Market Street, October 27, 1802". This was a subscription publication; the names of about 4700 subscribers (from Joshua Abbe to William Zuill) were printed before the First Chapter of Genesis).

The overall condition would be judged poor because the paper is dry and tending to crumble, apparently made from a poor quality of groundwood pulp. The pages appear as though they had been subject to excessive moisture at one time. The between-the-testaments "Family Record" pages read as follows:

Descendants of Philo DeForest of Woodbury, Conn.

This monograph relates to the descendants of Philo DeForest (1772-1842) of Woodbury, Conn. found in his family bible. He appears to have been the first owner of this bible in that his name appears first, his name bears the earliest birth date, and he would have been about 30 years old at the time it was printed. The title page of this King James Version says it was "printed for Matthew Carey, 118 Market-Street, Philadelphia, October 27, 1802".

The volume itself is 8-1/2" wide x 10-1/2" tall by 3-1/2" thick. The binding is in only fair condition, although both covers are attached. The interior pages appear to be made of a groundwood stock not uncommon in that day; they are in a brittle and stained condition best described as "fair to poor". It bears no ownership or presentation legend.

The bible the names and usually some dates of about 44 descendants of Philo or their spouses. As mentioned the earliest date given is 1772; the latest refer to two children born 1914 or earlier. These two names have been omitted in the interest of protecting the privacy of possibly living persons, in accordance with the policy of this researcher in regard to materials which may be published in printed or electronic publications.

Fortunately we have several supporting authorities which confirm parts of this material. The excellent pamphlet *Anthony DeForest of Stamford, Connecticut, 1979* published by John L. ("Jack") DeForest of North Stamford was published by him in 1983 and is the result of many years of labor in this country and in Europe. Also noteworthy is *A Walloon Family in America* by Mrs. Robert W. DeForest (1913); copies of these are in the "Stamford Room" which features genealogy in the Stamford "Ferguson" Library. They point out that Isaac, the immigrant ancestor, arrived in New Amsterdam in March 1637, as Jack says and "unusual" time of year for such a crossing.

The Anthony DeForest of John L. DeForest's pamphlet descended from one grandson of the immigrant Isaac: Isaac-Hendrick-Barent-Anthony. Philo descended from another son of Isaac as follows: Isaac-David-Edward-John (who married Abigail Walker "of Woodbury")-Philo.

A fortunate third supporting authority, the name of whose author is unknown, is four handwritten inked interpretive sheets found loose within the pages of the Philo DeForest bible. They are about 16" by 16", quite clearly written all in the same hand and bearing the latest date of 1914. The author, whether male or female is not clear, obviously spent much time and eyestrain interpreting and translating the often small and cramped handwriting on the "between-the-gospels" pages of the DeForest bible itself. These sheets appear to be a complete transposition and it would appear (with a singular, possible exception) are accurate.

These records are from the genealogical collection of Newtown's Cyrenius H. Booth Library. Spellings are maintained in these transcriptions, and word arrangement simulates that of the original record.

Jesse and Daniel PECK Families

This sheet was found tucked in the pages of an old book donated for the annual book sale at the Booth Library. It is not a Bible record, but it is an authentic family record penned by Daniel PECK of Danbury sometime before his death in New York City in 1829. The orthography, the type of paper, and the traces of sealing wax are all consistent with an early 19th century date.

The birth dates differ no more than a day or two from those published in Ira B. Peck's *Genealogical History of the Descendants of Joseph Peck*, Boston, 1868. No sources are cited in the published work, and only Daniel PECK's marriage and the birth of his first child are recorded in Danbury Vital Records. But this document may be considered a primary source as Daniel here gives the birthdates of his parents, wife, and children from first-hand knowledge (though his age calculations are not quite right). He also gives the full names of two daughters who have only middle initials in Ira B. Peck's work.

Excerpts from a Talk by Richard S. Bowman
 Condensed by Irene Brouwer

"At the February [1972] meeting held at the Square House in Rye, New York, headquarters of the Rye Historical Society, Mr. Richard S. Bowman, a member of the Friends Record Committee of the New York Yearly Meeting of the Friends Religious Society, talked about records of Quaker Ancestors. He traced the history of the first Quakers in Westchester who arrived from Flushing and other Long Island towns. A prominent visitor around 1672 to Rye was George Fox, founder of the Quaker movement...."

"Prior to the meeting, Mr. Bowman had called upon fellow members of the [Friends] Records Committee of New York and others to gather information regarding Records of Quaker ancestors in Westchester, N.Y. and Fairfield, Conn. counties....The Records Committee was established in 1904 as a joint body of the two New York Yearly Meetings..., the Orthodox and the Hicksites,...[in response to a concern] about the collecting and preserving of manuscript records. Since that time the Committee has been charged with collecting and [the] preservation of records of the Yearly Meetings, its committees and related functions and all subordinate meetings, which are or have been parts of New York Yearly Meeting."

Mr. Bowman reported that in 1971 there were "approximately 2,500 volumes of manuscript record books. The subordinate meetings are scattered geographically throughout Northern New Jersey, all of New York, Western Connecticut, Vermont and Southern Quebec. The records consist of minutes of business meetings, records of births, deaths, marriages and transfers, minutes of Ministers and Elders Meetings. Membership is always in the Monthly Meeting."

"When meetings were established in [southwestern] Connecticut, they were under the care of Monthly Meetings in Westchester and Dutchess Counties, N.Y. Therefore, the early membership records of those Connecticut Friends will be in records of Purchase, Chappaqua, Nine Partners, etc....Records of the Connecticut Monthly Meetings are lacking. Efforts are [being] made to locate these meetings' records through individuals and historical societies, but as far as Connecticut is concerned, [the Committee has] had little luck."

The Records Committee "also maintains collections of meeting house pictures; portraits of members; a rich collection of manumission papers signed by members of Meetings;...papers dealing with New

**Marriages and Deaths from P. T. Barnum's
Herald of Freedom, 1832 - 1833**

From October 1831 to November 1834, the young P. T. Barnum published a newspaper, *The Herald of Freedom*, in Bethel, Connecticut. Of 160 issues published, copies of only about twenty have been found for the Connecticut newspaper project. These were microfilmed on a single reel in 2000 which may be found at the State Library and elsewhere. There was little local news in the paper, but almost every issue had notices of a few marriages and deaths which are transcribed here.

Phineas Taylor Barnum was born in 1810 in Bethel, a parish of Danbury which was not incorporated as a separate town until 1855. His father, Philo Barnum, died in 1826 and Phineas began to provide support to his mother and younger siblings. At age 19 he married the 21-year-old tailoress, Charity Hallett, in New York. He returned to Bethel in 1828 and became a partner in the village "Yellow Store" where he also acted as a lottery agent. In 1831 several of his letters arguing the cause of the Universalist Church were rejected by the editor of the *Danbury Recorder*, and Barnum determined to publish his own newspaper. When lotteries were banned by the Connecticut legislature in 1834, Barnum lost one of his most profitable portion enterprises, and he ended publication of the paper and moved with his small family to New York City.

Under the masthead of *The Herald of Freedom* appears the motto, "Here comes the herald, cloth'd with truth — a staff to age, a guide to youth!" And it was "published every Thursday morning, a few rods south of the Meeting-house in Bethel." Besides some fiction and some national news, the paper was devoted to apologetics for the Universalist cause and to the Democratic national slate of Andrew Jackson and Martin Van Buren. For the second year of publication Barnum took on an associate editor, L. F. W. Andrews, and the masthead of the paper was changed to *The Herald of Freedom and Gospel Witness*. The partnership lasted only a year, and the third year's publication reverted to *The Herald of Freedom*, albeit with a masthead more decorative than at first.

In 1832, for a libelous charge in the paper against local Deacon Seth Seelye, Barnum was convicted and sentenced to \$100 fine or sixty days in jail. In a letter from jail to Gideon Welles dated October 7, 1832, he asserts that he "chose to go to prison thinking that such a step would be the means of opening many eyes as it no doubt will." From his newly refurbished Danbury jail cell he continued to publish and significantly to expand the circulation of his newspaper. Barnum celebrated his release on December 5 with a orations, odes, toasts, and a banquet dinner in the very courtroom where he was convicted. He reports, surely with characteristic exaggeration, that 1500 people were in attendance, and that the conclusion was marked with a parade from Danbury to Bethel in which he and the band were conveyed in a coach and six preceded by a standard bearer and forty horsemen and followed by sixty carriages of private citizens.

Randomly spaced among three columns of advertisements in an early issue are these examples of Barnum's enterprising *spirit*:

BIBLES, BIBLES, BIBLES!! A QUANTITY of Bibles very Cheap. Just received and For sale by . . . P. T. BARNUM

BRANDY. Of the best quality, for \$1 12 1-2 per gallon for sale by . . . P. T. BARNUM



include the combined forces of the 2nd Maine Battalion and the 63rd Foot, which were brought over the Charlestown Peninsula along with the flank companies of the 64th Foot, which were ordered from Castle William. As the plan developed, Howe was to advance across Charlestown Neck, as the batteries at Boston Neck would enfilade the Roxbury lines with incendiary shells. As this occurred, a British force would land on the Dorchester Peninsula, supported by gondolas and light warships. On 24 June, Howe and his troops began the implementation of the plan, but Gage called off the operation. Speculation abounds as to whether it was because too many people talked and the plans were known by the Americans or whether it was because Gage did not want to risk his command and encounter another Bunker Hill. [52]

During the siege of Boston, Colonel David Brewer's Regiment constructed barracks on the Warren homestead estate, which they occupied. This was the birthplace of General Joseph Warren (killed in the Battle of Bunker Hill). The cottage farm house was built on the seven acre plot by the General's grandfather, which extended from Warren Place to Moreland Street. It is undetermined as to the position occupied by Brewer's regiment during the siege, but on 22 Aug. 1775 Colonel David Brewer was ordered to march his regiment back to Warren's grounds. [53]

Captain Malcom Henry's company returned to Westfield, MA on 7 Oct. 1775, serving at the defense of Boston during the Battle of Bunker Hill and during the Siege of Boston. [54]

During the latter part of 1775, the British were still boxed up in Boston. The American Revolution had become the rallying point for citizens with enough conviction to stand and defend their liberties. The soldier of 1775 brought with him a feeling of patriotism and, although the troops around Boston were ever changing, many believed that to defend their country required the risk of death to fight for their principles, including Connecticut members of Captain Malcom Henry's company of the 9th Continental Regiment (20th Massachusetts).

May the Government not forget his widow and children.
