The following early settlers either came to Boone County or were born in Boone County in the year of settlement noted in the newspaper article.

Some of the early settlers are not mentioned. Many died before 1870. Some were in Winnebago County or Wisconsin or surrounding areas or back east before these dates.

Many were in the disputed western mile strip of Boone county, which was claimed by Winnebago and Boone County from 1837 to 1843. Boone County finally got full control of this strip in 1843.

There are hundreds of books, films, microfiche, indexes, newspapers, county censuses, old city directories, old plat maps, cemetery inscription books, obituary and death and marriage indexes, old county history books available in the lower level of the Ida Public Library.

There is a typed up list of what's in the genealogy and local history cabinet and a typed up list for what's in the back vault room.
