Westmont, DuPage County, Illinois¹

An Extraction of Residents, with Introductory Commentary by the Contributor, Oriene Morrow Springstroh

Oriene Morrow Springstroh, a DuPage County, Illinois, native, has been researching her family history since the 1960s. In 1981 she founded and served as the first president of the Fox Valley Genealogical Society in Naperville, Illinois, and continues to be actively involved in its programs and projects. Westmont, Illinois is my home town, where I was born and raised. Both sets of my grandparents bought property there in the 1920s and settled down in this new little community. Other towns in DuPage were established primarily by farmers from the eastern states in the 1830s, 1840s, and 1850s. Westmont was settled in the 1920s by immigrants who were more likely to be trades people or skilled and unskilled laborers. The following brief history appears in the Electronic Encyclopedia of Chicago:2

Located "nineteen miles west of the [Chicago] Loop . . . Easy access to transportation is central to Westmont's story. In 1834 two stage routes passed through the area, one along Ogden Avenue and the other down Naperville Road. The Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad began stopping in Westmont (then Bushville) in 1864.

While neighboring towns were settled by the wealthy, Westmont grew through the efforts of working people. In 1872, following the Chicago Fire, William Gregg found the region to have good clay for brickmaking and started the Excelsior Brick Company. He built his factory on the highest point of the railroad so that after bricks were loaded onto a railcar, the load was easily shuttled downhill to the city. In the 1870s Excelsior employed 120 people and produced 70,000 bricks a day. Czech, Polish, and Italian workers came and lived in the settlement that was soon named Greggs. Two schools and a

depot were built. Gregg invented a triplepressure brick machine, which manufactured bricks able to withstand 100,000 pounds of pressure without cracking. The boom period lasted until after 1900, when the brickyard closed down and many workers left.

In 1919 Arthur McIntosh bought land in Westmont and offered working-class Chicagoans an opportunity to own property for five dollars down and small monthly payments. By 1923 the McIntosh subdivision had more than 1,800 people, many either Austrian, Polish, or German immigrants or their children. Newcomers first lived in tents and shacks, and had no paved streets or utilities. Before long, however, they constructed modest cottages.

In 1921 the village was incorporated as Westmont, but during Prohibition acquired the nicknames "Whiskey Hill" and "Wet Mont," as liquor flowed in the community. People in neighboring towns frequented the area where the illegal trade continued.

Population grew to 2,733 in 1930; and as late as 1939, 35 percent were foreignborn. Development escalated in the post-World War II days . . . By the 1960s a large number of laborers and skilled tradesmen had moved into the area to take jobs at Western Electric and International Harvester.

My mother's parents, Andrew and Ellen Gollings Porter, arrived in Westmont in time for the 1924-1925 city directory included here. Andy left his parents' home in Ayr, Scotland, and Ellen, or Nellie, as she was called, was from the West Riding of Yorkshire, England, by way of Workington, Cumberland, England. Each had come alone from Britain to Indianhead, Regina, Saskatchewan, Canada. They met at the hotel they worked in, married in 1911, and by 1918 had three children – Lillian, Andrew, and Jean. In 1924, they all crossed into the United States by railroad through North Dakota and came straight to Westmont by way of Chicago.

Andy did what many new arrivals to town did. He put up a tent for his family, then built a shack to shelter them over the winter until he could build a real home. Fortunately for his family, he was a carpenter by trade, an occupation he continued all his life. Until utilities became available, the Porter family carried water from the pump located at the train depot several town blocks away from their property.

My father's parents were James Morrow from Geneseo in Henry County, Illinois, and Gertrude Miller from Hooppole in the same county. They, however, did not arrive in Westmont in time for this directory. They were still in Chicago, where they had moved so Jim could find work in the early 1920's. A murder in their neighborhood sent them hastily out of the city in search of a good spot for their young family to grow. They found such a place in Westmont. Jim promptly started digging the foundation for their home on the property they purchased on North Grant Street. He had been taught building trade skills

by his father, and called himself a latherer for most of his life.

As earlier noted, booze was everywhere in Westmont in the 1920s. My mother, Jean Porter Morrow, told of her father's sadness whenever he saw liquor containers rolled out of the speakeasies onto Cass Avenue and broken open by the agents dedicated to the task of enforcing prohibition. Andy enjoyed his occasional drop of scotch whiskey, much to the chagrin of his tee-totaling Anglican Church of England wife, Nellie, and lamented the loss of liquor in the streets. As late as the 1950's, Westmont students were still razzed about being from "Whiskey Hill" as we entered nearby Hinsdale or Downers Grove high schools, as Westmont did not have its own high school until some twenty years or so later.

A search of the 1920 federal census for the families named in the following city directory reveals that very few of them were living in DuPage County in that year. The vast majority were in Chicago, still looking for that opportunity that was about to knock on their door and lead them to Westmont, out along the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad. Their new lives there worked well until the depression came along in another decade. Westmont families suffered greatly from the depression, perhaps because they were immigrants, with no long-term local family networks to fall back on. Both sets of my grandparents lost the homes they had built with so much hope. They never made up the loss nor ever owned another home.

The following extraction of the first directory of Westmont, located in DuPage County, Illinois, is presented here with fondness for all those families whose children and grandchildren I was fortunate to call friend or relative.
