Driving Directions: North from Ramsey on Route 51 - Turn left Road No. 3200N go 1 mile to 700E - turn left - it is a gravel road and leads to cemetery. (This cemetery is marked in Fayette County Plat Books.)

Copied October 30, 1973 by Glenn and Irene Burrus. At this time, the cemetery was very overgrown - it was later cleared. The cemetery was checked by Mary Fouts 1976 and some additions made at that time.

FACTS ADDED AND CORRECTED

FELLWOCK/OERTWIG/SASSE FAMILIES

In Fayette Facts, Vol., 16 No. 3 we published a sketch of these 3 inter-related families from Brandenberg, Germany. They settled first in Dodge Co., WI area before coming south to Wilberton Township and forming St. Paul Ev. Lutheran Church around the time of the Civil War.

Arlene FELLWOCK DUDLEY, 316 1/2 Buchanan St., Mayville, WI 53050 (Dodge County) has researched these families and has more information to add.

On page 49 we listed children of John Friedrich and Maria SASSE FELLWOCK. The second daughter, Dorothea Maria was born 18 Dec 1824 Nahausen and christened there, 30 December. We knew she married an OERTWIG man, but not whom.


Thanks to Arlene, we now know she married Johann Friedrich OERTWIG, a younger brother to Michael OERTWIG. Johann came with the FELLWOCK family in 1846 on the ship *Barque Russia*.

As anyone who has researched German records knows, the children were christened with at least 3 names - many times the same names but were called by a 'given' name - Arlene has provided us with these given names - underlined.

SEFTON TOWNSHIP

FAYETTE COUNTY, ILLINOIS

Fayette County Death Records begin in 1877 and few were recorded. The Vandalia newspapers were not saved before 1893 except for some very early papers from when Vandalia was the state capital. An index of newspapers from 1893-1901 has been prepared and this source was checked as well as back issues of *Fayette Facts*. At the end of each entry is noted the Row and burial site for each.

- BERRY, Elmer Wayne was born December 5, 1918 in Seminary Township the son of Mr. and Mrs. Dwight BERRY and died October 9, 1920. Burial was in Mt. Carmel Cem. His parents, 3 grandparents and 2 brothers survived him. *Vandalia Union*, October 14, 1920
- BRASEL, Mary Susan, born January 24, 1839, Decatur Co., Indiana the daughter of William SEFTON, also of Indiana. Mother unknown. She died December 1, 1912, age 73 years 10 months and 7 days. She married Valentine BRAZEL and they were parents of 8 children. He was since deceased. A son, J. Fred, 3 sisters and 2 brothers survived her. Informant for the death certificate was Fred BRAZEL of Brownstown and burial was in Mt. Carmel Cemetery. Death Certificate #303 and Vandalia Union, December 12, 1912. (Note the differences in spelling of BRAZEL/BRASEL) (Row 11 6)
- CARSON, John was born November 25, 1866 Lawrence Co., IL the son of James and Eliza CARSON and died December 15, 1914 after being struck by an east-bound train. He married December 14, 1889 Nora WASHBURN. He was engaged in the mercantile business with a brother. Of 10 children, 4 are dead. Those surviving were: Annis BALDOCK (Mrs. James)., Samuel of near Moweaqua, IL, Mary, Reuben, Harry and Illa. The deceased children were Lucy, Leroy, Bertha and Maude. Brothers and sisters D.B. CARSON, Brownstown, Charles of Sefton and sisters, Mrs. Cyrus SIDWELL and Mrs. Isaac JONES also survived. *Vandalia Union*, December 17 and 24, 1914.

- CARSON, Sina E., was born September 1864 in Fayette County, the daughter of William and Lutitia PARKISON PIATT. She died August 15, 1911 and burial was in Mt. Carmel Cemetery. She was married and the Information on Death Certificate #103, Fayette County, IL was Dan CARSON. (Row 5 - 9)
- DAVIS, Willie son of Bradley DAVIS, died February 1, 1915 from a self-inflicted gunshot wound. He was 18 years of age. His mother was confined to her bed with sickness and he had fried some potatoes for her before going outside. His sister, Jeanette DAVIS killed herself by hanging herself 3 years ago and a brother, Vester took poison 2 years ago. His father Bradley had been killed by a train 5 years ago. Survivors were his mother, brothers, Robert, Daniel, Bradley and Wesley. Ramsey News Journal February 5, 1915, Vandalia Union, February 4, 1915 (no stone)
- GOLDSBORO, John Ferdinand was born May 5, 1852 Boone Co., Indiana and died November 1, 1915 Sefton Township. Burial was in Mt. Carmel Cemetery. He married 1) February 14, 1877 Milly Ann SEFTON; she died August 30, 1897. He again married February 4, 1897 Almonda J. SEFTON and they were parents of a son, Harry Frederick who was born November, 1902 and died May 30, 1906. Survivors included children, Thomas, Tiny, James, Roland, Mode, Phoebe and George GOLDSBORO along with a brother, W.H. GOLDSBOROUGH. Vandalia Union November 4 and 11, 1915. (Row 19 - 10)
- GRANDFIELD, Oscar, born September 25, 1889 son of G.W. and Margaret GRANDFIELD died March 4, 1915. He married September 1, 1911 Nellie BAGGETT and she with a son, daughter, his parents, 4 brothers and 3 sisters survived him. Burial was in Mt. Carmel. Vandalia Union, March 11, 1915. (Row 12 - 3)
- HAGAN, Arthur Virgil, infant son of Mr. and Mrs. John HAGAN was buried at Mt. Carmel April 15. Vandalia Union, May 2, 1912. (Row 5 - 13)
- RADCLIFF, Ethel was born in St. Elmo in 1904 and died April 20, 1917 age 12 years 6 months and 1 day of pneumonia. She was the daughter of John W. and Birdie RADCLIFF who survived with 5 brothers and sisters. Vandalia Union, April 26, 1917. (Row 31 - 1)

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

Carmel Cemetery, Sefton Twp. She married George REYNOLDS and they were parents of 8 children, 1 deceased. Her husband, 4 sons, 3 daughters and brothers B.F. and John RADCLIFF survived her. Vandalia Union October 11, 1917. (Row 10 - 7)
- SEFTON, Charles Henry born December 4, 1851 died September 3, 1919. He was the son of Henry and Phoebe SEFTON and married October, 1873 Mary Ellen BEAL who predeceased him in January, 1919. (See Mary's obituary information below for a list of surviving children). Also surviving were sisters, Vina CARSON and Charlotte KENT. Vandalia Union August 8, 1919. (Row 19 4)
- SEFTON, James Thomas died March 13, 1923 in the home of his son, Ed at St. Elmo, aged 81 years. He served with Co. E 97th IL Volunteers during the Civil War and served 3 years and 6 months. He was in the Mississippi Division under General GRANT. *Vandalia Union* March 22, 1923. (Row 26 8)
- SEFTON, Mary Ellen was born March 1, 1855 the daughter of James and Sarah BEAL and died January 11, 1919, aged 64 years 10 months and 11 days. She married Charles H. SEFTON in October, 1873 and they were parents of 14 children; 3 deceased. Surviving were Cora HOBBS, Minnie RIGDON, Joseph, Lydia, George, Daisy LOCKARD, Harry and Carl SEFTON all living in the home community, Maude RIGDON, Kennett, MO, Essie WORKMAN, Casner, IL and Phoebe WORKMAN of Ramsey. Also surviving were 20 grandchildren and a brother, J.L. BEAL *Vandalia Union* January 23, 1919. (Row 19 5)

- SEFTON, William Darnel, born August 31, 1867 Fayette County son of Mr. and Mrs. John SEFTON, died February 5, 1911. He married June 4, 1891 Nellie FARRIS. He left 2 children with 2 dead. His mother, 4 brothers and 3 sisters survived. He had been ill for 10 years. The death certificate told that he was an engineer and farmer and died of TB. Dr. A.A. WHITEFORT was the attending physician and Ben BROWN the undertaker. *Vandalia Union*, February 23, 1911. (Row 21 7)

- SWITZER, Edna Grace was born March 6, 1912 the daughter of John SWITZER died March 1, 1914. She was afflicted with dropsy and liver trouble. Burial was in Mt. Carmel Cemetery. The parents, 2 brothers and 2 sisters survived. *Vandalia Union*, March 5 and March 12, 1914. (Row 23 10)
- SWITZER, John Turner born February 8, 1918 Sefton Township the son of John and Bessie SWITZER and died November 30, 1920 at the home of his parents. Burial was in Mt. Carmel Cem. His parents 3 brothers and 3 sisters survived him. A sister, Edna died 6 years ago. *Vandalia Union*, December 9, 1920. (Row 23 11)
- TURNER, Elizabeth was born January 11, 1836 in Bowling Green Township the daughter of early settler, Bowling JONES. She married William TURNER and he was killed in the Civil War. She had 4 children, Mary DYCUS died in 1906, George T. died in 1914, John is ill with LaGrippe and Charles has consumption. *Vandalia Union*, January 13, 1916. (Row 8-9)
- TURNER, Francis B., wife of C.B. and his companion for 17 years died in Sefton Township. *Vandalia Union*, March 4, 1897. (Row 8 7)
- WORKMAN, Clara Belle, nee MARKLEY, was born February 2, 1893 Coles Co., IL died February 18, 1914. She married October 6, 1909 Elvy WORKMAN who with a daughter survived as did her father, step-mother, 3 sisters, 3 brothers, 1 step-brother and 3 step-sisters. She and her father had moved to Fayette County in 1902. Vandalia Union, March 5, 1914. (Row 26 10)
- WORKMAN, Etta Adaline nee WILLMS was born March 21, 1845 and died at her home November 13, 1924. She married 1863 John SEFTON and they were parents of 7 children, 5 of whom preceded her in death. Survivors were Mrs. Joe BENNETT of Villa Grove and Mrs. Oscar VIRT of Sefton. Mr. SEFTON died February 15, 1876 and she married a second time, November 29, 1877 Wesley WORKMAN and they were parents of 5 children Mrs. Ed ELLISON, Denver, CO, Floyd, Lake City, IL Grover and Orville of Ramsey and Elvy WORKMAN of Brownstown.
