To mine daughter Maria Anna she can stay here until she marries. I also leave her der first spring calf born after I am gestorbin und she also gets der pewter ware for the supper table. Also she gets half off der chickens dot she vill den give half of to her younger sister. Also she can take der bedding she now uses und can pick a cook pot she vants. Being vat her age is she should hope she gets married if anything else she vants.

To mine daughter Anna Maria who is already married she gets also mit der chickens a cook pot und a sow und boar. She already has a cow so one of mine she does not need. 

Tragic Deaths in Company B

Only Company in 161st Ind. Regiment that Lost None in Service

From the Mt. Vernon, Indiana, Western Star, June 9, 1910; submitted by Connie Conrad

Company B, 161st Indiana Volunteer Infantry, which went out in the Spanish-American war, for which Mt. Vernon held the great record while in the service of being the only company that did not lose a man. Every company in the 161st lost from two to eight men. Company I from Monticello on B company's left, lost six men, while M company from Lawrenceburg, on the right, lost five men.

The strange and remarkable feature of most of the deaths among B boys since the muster out is that they have been violent. The following is the list of the company's dead and how they died.

Smith Hoge -- Suicide by hanging.

Charles H. Miller -- Killed by freight train.

- Morton Stalnaker -- Shot in head while member of 9th Inf., in advance on Pekin, during Boxer uprising in China in 1900.
- Samuel Estes -- Became insane from fever in the Philippine islands, and died in hospital in Illinois.


David R. Marshall -- Died from result of kick in chest by horse.

Fred G. Reavis -- Killed by train in East St. Louis railroad yards.

Frank Redenour -- Killed by coming in contact with electric light wire while working on pole as a lineman.

Clarence E. Ward -- Died result of wound received in the Philippines.

George Bayer -- Died from mysterious causes while in regular army stationed at Tampa, Fla., was found in dying condition badly bruised one night. Died next day. -- Mt. Vernon Sun.


Adam Johnson Raids on Henderson And Newburgh in the Summer of 1862 by Gilbert Schmitt gsch50@aol.com


In 1862, Confederate General John Breckinridge sent Adam Rankin Johnson and Robert Martin to Henderson to deliver a message to David R. Burbank and to recruit soldiers. The message was delivered and Johnson received some money to be used in the Confederate cause but when Johnson met with Martin later it was found that the recruitment had not gone well. On their way to Owensboro to attack the Union provost guard, Frank Owen became a third member of their group. Owen had been captured by the Union but later escaped and told them that the provost guard was no longer in Owensboro. On that same route they captured the Union officer Major Kimbly who was escorting a young lady home to Owensboro. During the time before they released Major Kimbly the three talked about several units of Confederate soldiers in the area so Major Kimbly would have plenty to tell his superiors about the strength of the Rebels around.

On 29 June 1862 Johnson learned that a provost guard was housed in a two-story hotel on Main Street in Henderson. The house was located across the street from Barrett's Tobacco Factory, a place where Johnson worked while living in Henderson. This was familiar territory to Johnson and after dark they tied up their horses in Alves Woods and went through the darkened side streets to the factory, hiding in an excavation shielded from the street lamp that lit the enemy well. The three Confederates having double barrel shot guns decided to fire into the crowd simultaneously. Johnson shot both barrels of his gun while Martin and Owen fired one barrel each at the sentries and then into the crowd of Union Soldiers. The three quickly reloaded their shotguns and ran around to a cemetery behind the hotel. There Martin wounded a guard with a pistol shot and before that guard could close the door the three fired their shotguns through the rear door. That done the three rebels went back to their horses and rode out of the area to the Craighead Hatchett farm and slept the rest of the night.

The federals in the mean time had fired at the attacking enemies from the upper floor windows the rest of the night. There was an old sow that was moving around below and was taking several hits, leaving spots of blood on the ground from place to place. The next morning the Evansville Journal gave an account of the attack, stating the provost guard in Henderson was attacked by 300 guerrillas during the night and after a nine hour battle was driven off with heavy losses. Blood stains proved that many of the rebels were killed or wounded. When the "Henderson Reporter" weekly stated that the attackers were a band of outlaws, Johnson wrote back that everyone in his group was a Confederate soldier and the citizens would not be harmed in his actions. Bob Martin took the letter into town, and while there paid a visit to Johnson's father and gathered intelligence before leaving.

The Federal troops were withdrawn from Henderson on 15 July and sent to Louisville to aid General Boyle in his chasing of John Hunt Morgan. By that time Johnson had recruited other men and on 16 July he led all 27 of his Breckinridge Guards into Henderson where the officials surrendered the town. Later a gunboat

Indiana Has Oldest Fire Chief

From The Poseyville News, Poseyville, Indiana, January 16, 1914 Submitted by Connie Conrad

Indiana has the oldest living fire chief in point of service, in America, according to the state fire marshal. The chief enjoying this distinction is George Fendrich, who has just closed a term of forty-one years as head of the fire department at Vincennes. Since the date of his election in 1872, Fendrich has never missed a fire occurring in this city, although he has been forced to attend many during periods of illness.

When Fendrich took charge of the Vincennes fire department, there were no fire horses, and the trucks were hauled to fires by the local bus company. As soon as the new chief took office he changed this condition, and began the organization of a department which is now thoroughly efficient.

It was due principally to Chief Fendrich's efforts that Vincennes adopted the motor fire truck, and became probably the first Indiana city to use apparatus of this nature for fire fighting purposes.

At the beginning of the new year, Chief Fendrich retired from active service in Vincennes. He is seventy three years of age, and has lived in Indiana since 1863. \sim

1970s, which still come back to haunt him on television today! These include *Blackbeard's Ghost* with Peter Ustinov, Elsa Lanchester, and Suzanne Pleshette, *Herbie Rides Again* with Helen Hayes, *The Shaggy D. A.* with Dean Jones and Tim Conway, *The Cat from Outer Space* with Sandy Duncan, and several others. He also appeared in many other films, including MGM's *Girl Happy* with Elvis Presley and 20th Century Fox's *Tora! Tora! Tora!*, the Academy Award-winning film about Pearl Harbor.

On television, Hank Jones had recurring roles on *My Three Sons* with Fred MacMurray and William Frawley, and on *The Patty Duke Show*. He was on many of the comedy programs of the 1960s and 1970s, including *Love Boat*, *The Jeffersons*, *Mork & Mindy*, *The Henry Fonda Show*, *Love - American Style*, *Petticoat Junction*, and many others. One of his most interesting roles was playing former Beatle Ringo Starr's twin brother (after five hours of make-up every day) in a TV version of Mark Twain's *The Prince and the Pauper*.

Over the years, Hank has been featured in countless TV commercials, several of which (for McDonald's, Hai Karate After Shave, Honda, and Dial Soap) won awards and were shown on NBC's *World's Greatest Commercials* show. A long-time songwriter and member of ASCAP, Hank's song *Midnight Swinger*, recorded by Mel Torme, was honored with a preliminary Grammy nomination in 1970. In 1986, Hank made three appearances as "champion" on the popular quiz show *Jeopardy!* on television. Besides all the fun and \$\$\$ involved, it gave him a chance to talk about genealogy on national television and brought forth thousands of letters from around the country from those interested in the Palatines! Hank retired from "on-camera acting" in 1981 to devote more time to his first love of genealogical research. He has a daughter Amanda, now in her early 20s, and lives with his wife Bonnie in the Scripps Ranch area of San Diego.





The new crop of photo printers that are on the selves in time for Christmas includes a number of models that are capable of the six-color printing that is a part of this technology. The printers vary in price from around \$160 to over \$600 on the units I have seen sitting on retailers' shelves. If you want to spend more for larger formats, then the prices go a lot higher. What they don't tell you up front is the cost of the ink cartridges. It takes four to complete the complement needed: Cyan-light cyan, magenta-light magenta, yellow, and black. Total for all four cartridges is \$230. I think I'll wait a while.

Davis Lodge at Dayville, Indiana

In Anderson Township of Warrick County, Indiana, is a crossroads farming community called Dayville. On 20 December 1899, a petition was sent to the federal government to have a post office established there using the name "Nation's City." After the petition was signed and before it was submitted, David Watson changed the name to Dayville. That name stuck even though some citizens tried to get it changed to Nation's City again. The post office at Dayville was active from 10 January 1900 until 30 November 1901.

A Masonic Lodge was also active at Dayville at that time. It met in the Davis School and was called the Davis Lodge. In her files as Warrick County Historian for the Indiana Historical Society, Kay Lant, has the membership rolls for this lodge for 1889 and 1890. The membership roll for 1889 includes the age, occupation, and place of birth of each member. All were born in Indiana unless otherwise noted. All of the members were farmers. The minutes of the meetings include discussions of wheat, corn, and other crops. Only the names of those who were added in 1889 appear on the 1890 roster here.



A Cemetery Tale, Part 1

From The Evansville Courier and Journal, Saturday, 30 May 1931:

Evansville Man Owns Deed For "Grave Yard" in 1841

An old, yellowed document sent to John. J. Marlett, 715 Southeast Riverside drive, by his brother, Mortimer Starr Marlett of Knoxville, Tenn., recalls early history of Evansville.

The paper is the original record of sale for \$7.50 of lot No. 89 of "the grave yard," from Nathan Rawley, a trustee to the late John J. Marlett and is dated August 16, 1841.

The only Evansville cemetery of that day was where Mulberry and Fifth streets now intersect. Marlett's brother, Edward; sister, Charlotte, and grandmother Jerusha Potter Marlett, lie somewhere beneath the pavement over which the city's traffic clamors its way daily.

When the time came after several years that it was decreed that abandoned cemeteries pass into the hands of the city, relatives were not permitted to remove bodies of their loved ones because of the uncertain markings in the burying ground.

Mortimer Marlett discovered the old document as he was looking through some family records at his home and forwarded them to his brother in Evansville. The Marlett family originally came to America from England in 1635 and first settled in Newton, Mass., what is now Cambridge.

Orphans Home Served Its Time From The Boonville Enquirer, Boonville, Indiana, Feburary 21, 1957 Submitted by Connie Conrad

ANOTHER LANDMARK BECOMES OBSOLETE — Never an old building torn down but what one is reminded of the early efforts that someone put forth to better the community in which it is located. The house that has been known as the Orphans Home, 625 West Locust street, is now being dismantled. The property is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Curran Reed. It was first entered from the U. S. Government by Wm. Berry on Oct. 4, 1817. Later came into the possession of heirs of Mrs. Kello J. Johnson who sold it to Warrick county June 27, 1887. The acreage started at the center of the old Boonville-Newburgh plank road property on which was Boonville Flouring Mills.

A number of orphans were being housed by individuals at various times and word was getting around that they were not receiving proper care. The first appropriation made for them was in 1883 to the amount of \$1,550.45. Later, Dec. 22, 1886, a report was made for 2034 days at \$.25 per day for their care amounting to \$508.50. (How far would a quarter go today for our youngsters.)

Feb. 4, 1896, a meeting was held at Weyerbacher's hall, which was then in the upstairs of the building on the northwest corner of the Public Square, and was for the purpose of organizing a Warrick County Orphans Home Association. A Resolution read "Resolved that the directors of the Warrick County Orphans Home Association shall consist of ten ladies and five gentlemen, as follows: directors, James E. Sanders, George Houghland, A. J. Rutledge, Albert McCool, George Wilder; Mrs. C. W. Armstrong, Mrs. John Shafer, Mrs. William Allen, Mrs. John Perigo, Mrs. George Trimble, Mrs. John Stout, Mrs. Charles Hopkins, Mrs. Charles Metz and Miss Anna Garwood and Miss Louise Fiebig. The minutes were signed by James Sanders and Miss Louise Fiebig, secretary.

On Feb. 5, 1896, the Board elected the following officers: president, James Sanders; vice-president, Mrs. C. W. Armstrong; secretary, Miss Louise Fiebig; assistant secretary, Mrs. George Trimble. The first matron appointed by the Association was Miss Emma Wilder March 23, 1896. April 1, 1896, Miss Hester Hartley, matron, turned the home over to the Warrick County Orphans Home Association. When the Welfare Department was organized the Orphans Home was discontinued.

The County Commissioners deeded the property to Mr. and Mrs. Reed Sept. 4, 1945. It is not as yet fully decided as to just what Mr. and Mrs. Reed will put on the vacant lot. \sim

New Indiana Orphanages Database

The Indiana State Archives recently announced the creation of a new database that will aid researchers in finding information on orphanages, day nurseries, and boarding and maternity homes. It is searchable by the name of the institution or by its location and includes homes to which African American or Native American children were sent.

According to the announcement, "The entry for each institution lists the years for which data is available. The data consists of inspection reports and correspondence, although not every file has both. The earliest inspection reports were sent by a facility's superintendent to the Board of State Charities. They listed how many children were whole orphans (both parents deceased), how many were half orphans (one parent deceased) and how many had both parents living. They also listed how many children had been adopted or indentured, returned to parent(s) or relatives, or transferred to another institution."

An Old Citizen Gone

From The Journal, Evansville, Indiana, December 4, 1876 Submitted by Patricia Sides

The announcement of the death of Mr. Catlin Preston will not be entirely unexpected, as the general community has for more than a year been aware that he was slowly but surely drawing nigh the end. He died Saturday morning at 11 o'clock, in the bosom of his family, at the age of 61 years, and will be regretted by all who knew him. Catlin Preston was born in Camden, N. Y., on the 24th of January, 1816, where he grew to manhood, and in 1837 married Miss Juliet Cook. In 1838 he determined to remove to the West, and first went to Flemingsburg Ky., where, however, he remained but a year or two, as the place did not suit his wishes. In 1840 he removed to Palestine, Ills., where he concluded to settle, and there with his brother formed the business firm of Preston Bros. Eleven years after this the firm began business in this city, and took first rank in the mercantile world here. He still continued, however, to reside in Illinois, where in 1852 he suffered a great bereavement in the death of his wife. In 1866 he removed to Evansville, when his business interests began to attain great magnitude.

During his residence here and to the day of his death Mr. Preston continued actively in business, and rapidly assumed important posts in the city of his adoption. He was a Director of the Evansville National Bank for a number of years, and was the first President of the Citizens' Insurance Company. He was at last compelled to resign both positions on account of ill-health.

About two years ago Mr. Preston was attacked with paralysis. Although its immediate ravages were prevented, he has continued since then to gradually decline, and his death was not unlooked for by his family and friends. He was unconscious for twenty-four hours preceding his death, and passed away without pain.

The death of Mr. Preston takes away from the community one of its best citizens -- a man of high honor and strict integrity, whose character was an example to all who knew him. He was eminently a man to succeed, and was not alone loved in his own family circle, but by a large circle of acquaintances and friends. He leaves surviving him four children: Fred. A. Preston, John D. Preston, H. M. Preston, and Mrs. D. B. Kumler. The funeral services will take place from the family residence this afternoon at 2 o'clock. ~
