## AGED RESIDENT IS TAKEN BY DEATH

Prominent Farmer Here For Many Years

MINOR C. MORRIS CALLED HOME

Was 87 Years Old – Had Been in 26 States – Crossed Continent Five Times

Minor C. MORRIS was born in DePeyster, St. Lawrence county, N.Y., June 19 1832. He was raised on a farm and left home at the age of 14 to seek his fortune. For the past eighty-seven years he had followed farming as an occupation. When a young man he spent several years in Vermont, where he worked for \$13 per month

He went to California in 1853, going by water from New York to San Francisco. He was nine days crossing the isthmus. Twelve miles of the distance was made on mules' backs. It took thirty-nine days to make the journey and he made this round trip two different times. Mr. MORRIS was a great traveler all through his life, having crossed the continent five time and being in twenty-six different states, having spent several months in Louisiana.

He was married to Josephine WITHERELL, an early schoolmate, Feb. 22, 1859. To this union were born six children—Thomas D. who passed away in childhood; Louise MORRIS of Crystal Lake; B.V. MORRIS of Park Ridge; Frank H. of Crystal Lake; Mrs. B.F. EVANS of Rockford, and Mrs. E.F. WORKS of Aurora, who was buried one year ago.

Mr. MORRIS, with his family, lived in New York state until the spring of 1885 when they moved to California. After remaining there for a few months they came back to Illinois and bought what is now known as the "Morris Park" farm. Living there for thirty-four years, he sold the place last November and moved to Crystal Lake.

Mr. MORRIS spent a very industrious life and until within the past year accomplished a great deal of work as a progressive farmer. He was taken ill two weeks ago and from that time had been gradually failing until he passed away quietly on Jan. 3 at 8:30 a.m. He was conscious until the last and was ready and anxious to go and join his wife and youngest daughter, who had passed on before.

Besides the children mentioned, Mr. MORRIS leave one sister, Mrs. Julia HURLBUT of Gouverneur, St. Lawrence county, N.Y. and seven grandchildren. Many friends also unite in expressions of sympathy.

Funeral services were private and were held at the home at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon, Rev. F.P. FORD officiating. Interment was in Union cemetery. Mr. and Mrs. B.V. MORRIS and family of Park Ridge, Mr. and Mrs. B.F. EVANS and daughter of Rockford and E.F. WORKS of Aurora were here to attend the services.
