The 22d annual reunion of the Eighth Illinois Volunteers was held at the Sherman House, Sept. 18, the few living members of that brave band of men, whose deeds in war have been woven into the history of this Nation, gathering together from pleasant homes in various parts of the country, as soldiers no longer, but civilians, and welcoming one another with genuine cordiality. Old memories were awakened, some pleasant and others sad, but there was not a man present at the grand reception and banquet who was not proud of the fact that he had served his country as a member of the Eighth Illinois Cavalry.

General Daniel DUSTIN, the Chairman, called the business meeting to order at 11:30 o'clock. The following gentlemen were elected officers for the ensuing year: President, J.M. SOUTHWORTH, Woodstock, Ill.; First Vice President, W.C. HAZELTON, Jefferson, Ill.; Second Vice President, Robert SILL, Chicago; Third Vice President, Henry F. LEE, Winnebago, Ill.; Secretary and Treasurer, Dr. Abner HARD. It was with faces tenderly solemn that the veterans then listened to the call of the death roll since the last meeting. The names of those who were thinned out from the ranks were as follows:

HAKES Belvidere, Ill., Oct. 22, 1882, Mrs. L.N. LINKHAM Bristol, Ill died last fall, Mrs. John EHLE August 1883 at Elgin, Ill., William HERRICK Company K died last winter at Somonauk, Ill.
