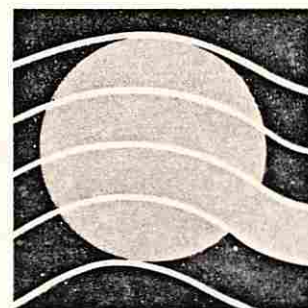

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THE QUAD-CITIES: PAST, PRESENT, & FUTURE

Today's Terms of Reference

Today, local chambers of commerce describe the Quad-Cities as being that region bounded by Interstates 80 and 280 as shown on the map. One quickly concludes from looking at the map that there are more than four cities in that region and that there are many more adjoining communities.

The mighty Mississippi River which flows through the Quad-Cities is an integral part of their past, present, and future. It is an ever growing transportation artery to the heartland of Mid-America.

Because of its abundant water, fish, game, forests, and prairies the area was home to the Indian long before the white man came. Because of its strategic location on the East-West and South-North routes of discovery and settlement, the area became important to white pioneers and those who followed them across the Nation.

As commerce and industry developed, immigrants flowed into the area in a constant stream from the mid-1800's. The resulting ethnicity of the area reflects German, Swedish, Irish, Belgian, and Hispanic cultures. More recently, to this has been added the culture of Southeast Asians. This rich heritage reflects itself in a variety of institutions and events today.

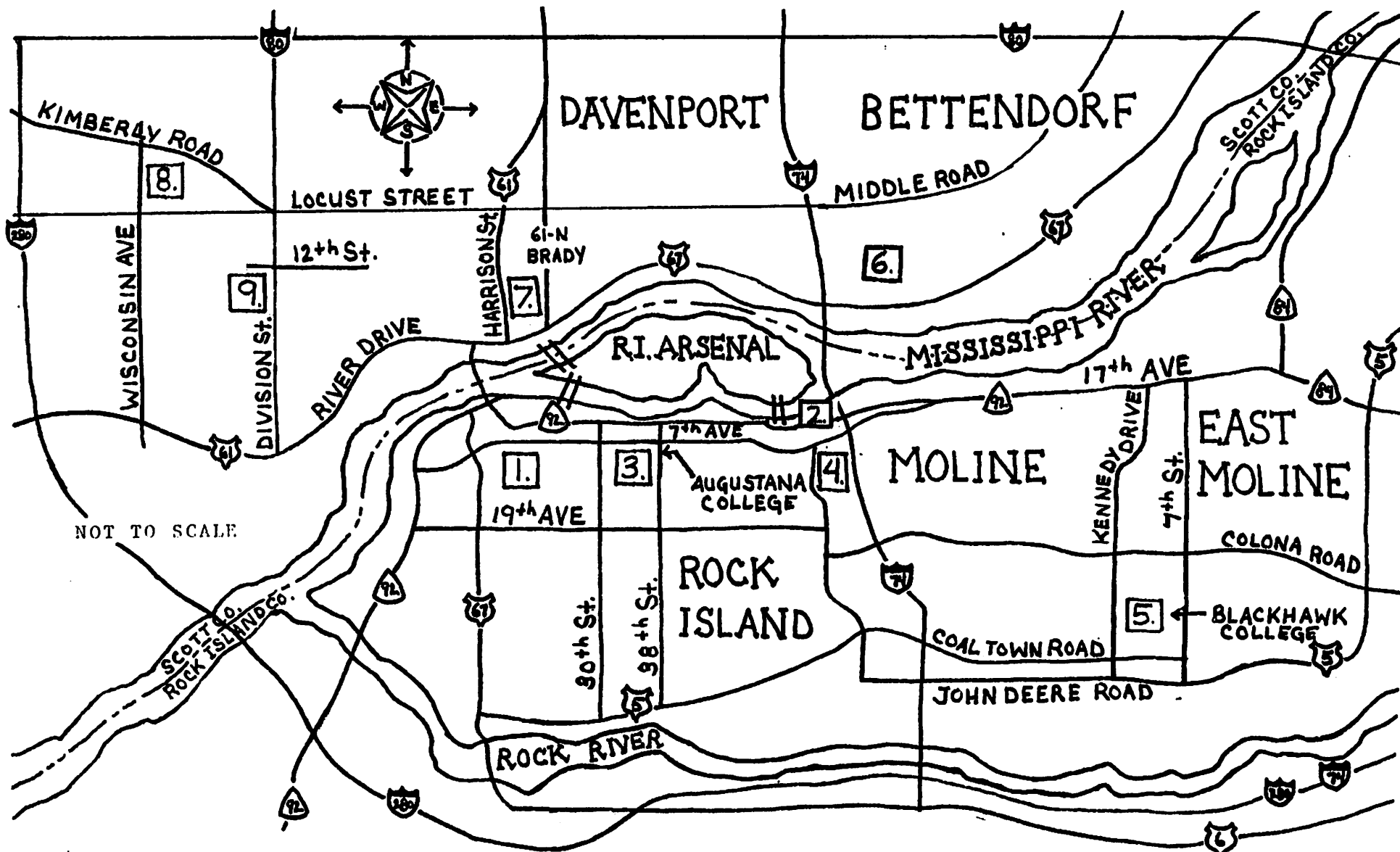
The area has at one time or another has been a major lumber center, washing machine manufacturing center, automobile manufacturing center, major railroad center, and has been, and is today the FARM IMPLEMENT CAPITOL OF THE WORLD.

Like commerce and industry worldwide, the Quad-Cities today is in the midst of the 2nd Industrial Revolution in which the computer and automation is reshaping the marketplace. As they have in the past, Quad-Citians are facing these challenges with determination and confidence in the future.

The Indian Period

The Quad-Cities Area was home to the Indian long before the white man came. Tradition has it that Father Marquette was the first white man to set foot in the area before he and Joliet discovered the Mississippi River on June 17, 1673.

Tradition has it that the Sauk (also known as the Sac) and Mesquakie (also known as the Fox) came to the area in the mid-1600's, being driven west from the Algonquin region in the east. Though they spoke a commonly identifiable language and intermarried, they maintained separate identities and villages. By the early 1800's they controlled the area

the area along the Mississippi River from the mouth of the Wisconsin River south 700 miles almost to the Missouri River.

The Transition Period

The beginning of the end of Indian control of the area dates from the Treaty of 1804 when the Indians ceded their land between the Rock River and the Mississippi River to the United States. This was part of a series of treaties which ceded the prairie region between the Illinois River and the Mississippi River to the U.S. to be used for land grants to U.S. war veterans.

Between 1804 and 1832, the Sauk and Mesquakie resisted leaving the ceded lands and were forcibly removed when they returned by Territorial and Federal troops. During the War of 1812, some of members of these tribes, including Ma-ka-tai-me-she-kia-kiak or Blackhawk who at the age of 19 had succeeded to his father's role when the later was killed in a fierce battle with the Cherokee.

But it was the Sauk Chief Quashquamie who brought the dissatisfaction to a head when he and between 80 and 100 Sauk warriors attacked and killed 25 Menominee Indians camped below Fort Crawford at Prairie Du Chien. Territorial and Federal troops were mobilized and the Blackhawk War ensued. That war lasted from July 31, 1831, the date of the attack at Fort Crawford until September 21, 1832 with the signing of the treaty at Fort Armstrong under the supervision of General Winfield Scott after whom Scott County is named ending the hostilities.

In 1805, Lieutenant Zebulon Pike of the US Army on his discovery expedition west came upon the Rock Island Rapids. In his report, he wrote that there was an excellent site for a fort atop the stone cliffs overlooking the rapids on the western tip of the 1,000 acre island which had rock, limestone deposits and timber for construction. This island, today referred to in the local communities as Arsenal Island was the garden of the Indians in the area. They harvested a wide variety of berries and other plants from its soil.

The Upper Mississippi Valley Forts

Following the War of 1812, at the insistence of American fur trappers, the United States moved to exclude the English from the Mississippi Valley Region and to establish military control of the area. From 1816 to 1819 a string of forts was constructed from the US - Canadian Border down to the Rock Island Rapids; forts below that point already being established.

Fort Mackinac and Fort Dearborn were established in what is now the State of Michigan; Fort Edwards was established at the Des Moines Rapids; Fort Armstrong was established at the Rock Island Rapids; Fort Crawford was established at Prairie Du Chein; and Fort Snelling was established at St. Anthony's Falls.

Fort Armstrong

On May 10, 1816, Brevet Brigadier General Thomas A. Smith, 8th United States Infantry arrived with troops from Fort Independence, Kansas to begin construction of a fort on the site recommended earlier by Lt. Pike. Named for a Secretary of War, General John Armstrong, Fort Armstrong, when completed, was 270' in circumference. The fort sat atop the 25' high rock cliffs overlooking the rapids. On the land side the fort was enclosed by an 8' high rock wall built of stone quarried on the island. Lumber used to construct the quarters and storage buildings came from timber growing on the island.

With the troops came a man who would figure prominently in the development of the area. George Davenport, born in 1793 in Lincolnshire, England, came to the U.S in 1804 and joined the US Army where he served during the War of 1812, rising to the rank of Sergeant. Following that war Davenport served in several Indian campaigns and when his enlistment was completed in 1815 he left to enter the contract commissary service whence he came to Fort Armstrong. He maintains excellent relations with the Indians in the area. In 1825 he became postmaster of the area. In 1826 he formed a partnership with Russell Farnham to expand his trade with the Indians and commercial trade with the growing flow of people into and through the area. Farnham's house, the first on the Illinois side, grew into the first recognized settlement called Farnhamsburg. Davenport was murdered by river pirates who mistakenly thought he had a store of treasure in his home on the north bank of the island facing the Iowa side. The main section of that home is preserved and maintained by a private group who hope to restore it. The home is open during the summer to visitors.

The Destiny of Three Future Presidents

Three future presidents served in military capacities in the Quad-Cities Area. One in the War of 1812 and again in the Blackhawk War; all three during the latter war.

Captain, later Brevet Major, Zachary Taylor came to the area during the War of 1812 and fought as commander of infantry troops in several significant battles in the area. Recalled to active duty from his retirement farm, he returned as a Lieutenant Colonel, later Colonel, to command infantry troops in several battles in the area during the Blackhawk War. Going on from there to the war with Mexico he later became President of the United States.

Two other men marked by destiny served under Taylor in the area during the Blackhawk War. One was Abraham Lincoln,

elected Captain of his Illinois Militia Company and serving as private when the appointment expired. The other was a Regular Army Lieutenant, later Captain, by the name of Jefferson Davis. This was the first and only time both men met. Nearly thirty years later Lincoln was President of the United States; Davis, President of the Confederate States.

The Last Days of Fort Armstrong

Fort Armstrong played a significant role from the time it was established in 1816 to the end of the Blackhawk War in 1832. Four years after the end of the war, on May 5, 1836, the troops stationed at Fort Armstrong were transferred to Fort Snelling. The Indian Agent used Fort Armstrong as his headquarters until 1840 when the fort was reactivated as a military depot. Five years later, the fort was closed in an economy move. Abandoned, the physical facility deteriorated, and as a result of several fires, virtually ceased to exist.

Today Fort Armstrong is commemorated by the replica of a blockhouse built on the site, several authentic cannon, memorial plaques, and use of the name by the Association of the United States Army whose local chapter is named the Fort Armstrong Chapter. Occasionally mementos of Fort Armstrong come to the surface in Davenport flower and shrubbery beds when cannon balls fired during target practice over 100 years ago on the then uninhabited Iowa shore come to the surface after winter freezes force them up. The Army Explosive Disposal Teams which remove the cannon balls find them still lethal.

Rock Island Arsenal

When the South captured the US Arsenal at Harper's Ferry at the beginning of the Civil War, citizens of the Quad-Cities Area pressed the Congress to establish a new arsenal in their area. The lobbying was successful and in 1862, Congress authorized the establishment of Rock Island Arsenal to manufacture and supply ordnance. Shortly after, it had an additional mission. It was also to become a wartime military prison.

In December 1863, the first of what became 20,000 Confederate prisoners arrived. Though dubbed by a few as the Andersonville of the North, a label disputed by historians as unfounded, the prison was swept by an epidemic in which 2,000 prisoners died. They lie buried together in a unique Confederate cemetery separated by woods next to the National Cemetery in Arsenal Island. On Memorial Day the Confederate Flag flies over each individual grave and beside the National Flag on the center poles as friends and relatives visit and soldiers dressed and equipped in authentic uniforms of reconstituted Union and Confederate Units render honors to those buried there.

In the 1950's, as a part of the decentralization of the management of the US Army Ordnance Corps, a new command called the US Army Weapons Command was established at Rock Island Arsenal,

with the mission of managing the Army's conventional and nuclear weapons programs, including command of Rock Island Arsenal, and Watertown Arsenal and Springfield Armory in Massachusetts. Some thirty years later those missions had grown to management of the Department of Defense conventional ammunition program, the Army's armament and chemical programs, and a number of special missions of national importance. The command, now the US Army Armament, Munitions, and Chemical Command also commands some 30 manufacturing plants and arsenals.

The Civil War Camps

During the Civil War, seven military camps were established in the Quad-Cities Area, some of short duration.

Camp McClelland was established at the outset of the Civil War, on the heights overlooking the Village of East Davenport on the west bank of the Mississippi River. The camp was a collecting point for troops and had one of the few military hospitals in the State of Iowa. Forty of the eighty thousand Iowa troops that served in the Civil War passed through Camp McClelland.

In April 1863, part of Camp McClelland was partitioned and designated Camp Kearney to serve as a prison for Indians captured during the uprising in Southern Minnesota. In 1866, Camp Kearney was closed when the prisoners were transferred to the Dakotas.

Camp Hendershot, a cavalry post, was established in October 1862 near what is today St. Ambrose College in Davenport. The movement of the cavalry horses through civilian areas to the west bank of the Mississippi River to be watered led to difficulties and the camp was closed and re-established as Camp Robert in July 1863 south of what is now Duck Creek Park and west of Oakwood Cemetery. Later Camp Roberts was closed and the camp re-established as Camp Kinsman on a site that became the Iowa Soldiers' Orphans Home in Davenport.

Camp Joe Holt was established in September 1861 at what is now 13th and Locust and Perry and Pershing in Davenport. It had a short existence. Likewise Camp Herron, established in October 1862 existed for a short time.

Of the seven camps, the memory of Camp McClelland is the strongest. Today, though no signs of the camp remain, it is the site of an annual Civil War battle reenactment. Once again, the site comes alive as soldiers, sailors, and civilians garbed in authentic Civil War costumes parade, mingle, and replay memorable events of the past. Thousands of spectators join as tents, flags, equipage, and uniforms of reconstituted Union and Confederate infantry, artillery, and cavalry units march, parade, and relive an actual battle.

The Cities and Towns

Within the past decade much has been written about the cities and towns in the Quad-Cities. For those who are interested there is a list of some, but by no means all, of the books at the end of this section that detail their origins and development.

Antoine LeClair, Pioneer Developer

Of the early movers and shakers in the development of cities in the area, the name of Antoine LeClaire stands out prominently. Born in 1797, son of a French Canadian adventurer and Potawatomi Indian mother, LeClaire served as a Government interpreter, possessing the ability to speak in 14 Indian dialects. He enjoyed the trust of the Indians. He interpreted the autobiography of Blackhawk in 1833. By the 1830's, as a result of treaty provisions he became owner of large sections of land in the area, before settlers had come into the area. At the time of his death, LeClaire's wealth was estimated at \$500,000, created by land ownership. He was particularly instrumental in the establishment of Davenport.

Rock Island

Rock Island would have been Davenport as originally proposed to the Illinois Legislature if it had not been for the strong objections of Colonel James M. Strode who charged that Davenport had made insulting remarks about Strode's war record.

Faced with the dispute, the Illinois Legislature changed the proposed name to Stephenson after Benjamin Stephenson, an early pioneer and chartered the City of Stephenson on February 23, 1836. Five years later, bowing to more pressure, the Illinois Legislature chartered the City of Rock Island incorporating therein the City of Stephenson, Farnhamsburg, and three new additions.

Davenport

The group which established Davenport on land sold by LeClaire, attached Davenport's name to the city the previous plan having failed on the Illinois side.

Inter-City Commerce

Up until 1874, intercity commerce between Rock Island and Davenport was by boat. With the completion of the Government Bridge in 1874 that commerce grew significantly. In the first year of operation over 330,000 people and considerable wagon traffic crossed between the two cities. The Government Bridge is still in use and has been joined by two more bridges adjacent to it, one of two separate one way spans. The boats that plied between the two cities have disappeared, but not until recent times.

Moline

Moline began as a mill site and was originally referred to as Rock Island Mills. Because of the availability of water power a series of mills sprang up producing lumber, flour, and corn meal.

The name came about when a surveyor who laid out plats in the Rock Island Mills area labelled one Hispera (Star of the West) and the other Moline (an adaptation of the French word for mill town). The latter was selected as appropriate to the nature of the ongoing enterprises. The surveyor's plat was acknowledged by the Justice of the Peace and County Commissioners on June 6, 1843 but the papers were lost in a fire and so the legal incorporation of the plat was delayed until the spring of 1848. The city was incorporated on April 10, 1872.

East Moline

East Moline has its roots in a land promotion scheme begun in 1857 when the town of Watertown was platted. Watertown which was to have been a site with a superior harbor on the Mississippi River never succeeded. It was not until the incorporation of East Moline on December 23, 1902 that real progress was made in developing a community in that area.

Silvis

Silvis which lies east of East Moline, was incorporated in 1907. Until recently, the town was synonymous with the Rock Island Railroad which had its shops and railroad yard on the outskirts of the town. The flow of Mexican immigrants to the Silvis area during World War I established the foundation of the Hispanic Heritage in the area.

Bettendorf

Bettendorf was preceded by the town of Gilbert, an onion and flower growing area. In 1902 with the arrival of William P. Bettendorf, a successful inventor and manufacturer of the first power lift, sulky plow, the all metal wheel, and the truck side frame for railroad cars, the area prospered and in a general election the City of Bettendorf came into being on April 28, 1903.

For details on the origins and development of the area the following, by no means all, will be found in most Quad-Cities Public Libraries.

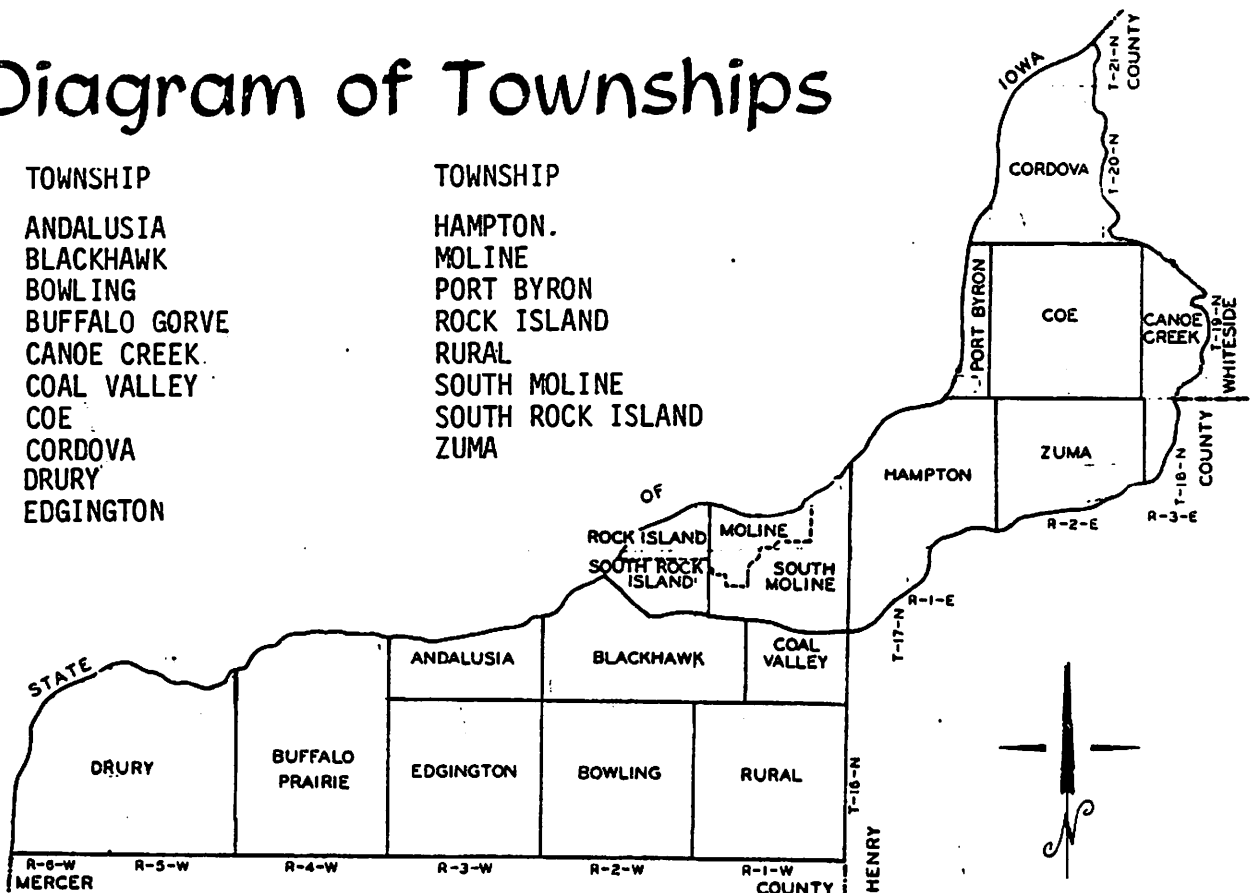

ROCK ISLAND COUNTY, ILLINOIS

The county was created by the Illinois legislature in 1831. Its boundaries in that Act are described as:
 East from middle of the main channel of the Mississippi with the north line of town fifteen north to the fourth principal meridian; thence north to Rock River; thence up the middle of the main channel to its confluence with Marais d'ogee slough; thence with the middle of said slough to the Mississippi; thence down the middle of the main channel of the river to the beginning.

Diagram of Townships



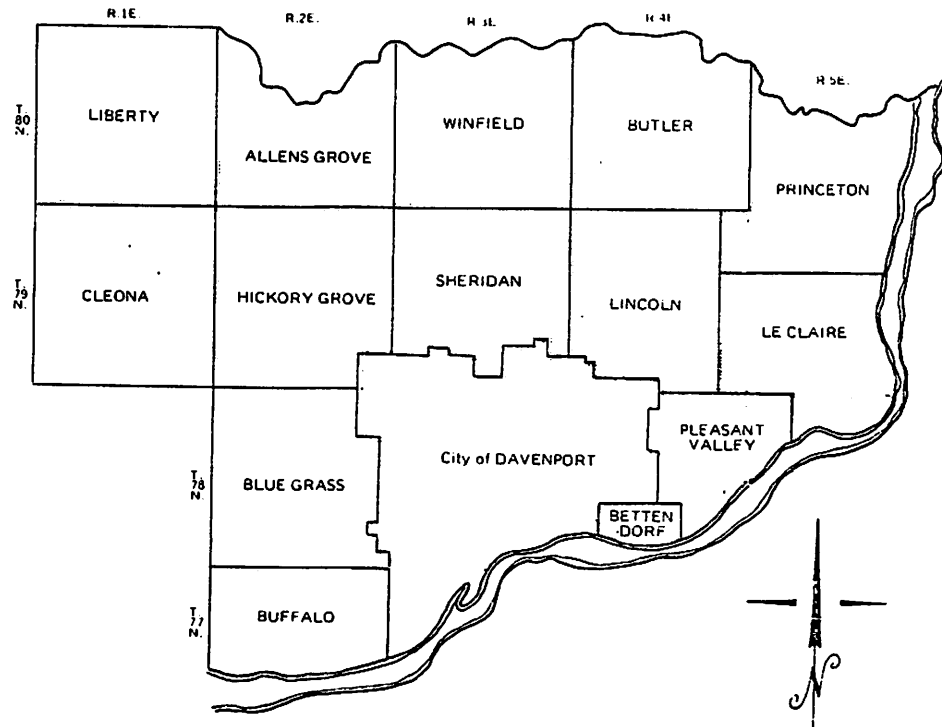
SCOTT COUNTY, IOWA

Scott County, named for General Winfield Scott, was created by an Act of the Wisconsin Territorial Legislature in the winter of 1837-1838, the boundaries of which were as follows:

"Beginning at a point in the middle of the main channel of the Mississippi River, where the line dividing townships 1 and 2, east of the fifth principal meridian intersects the same; thence north with said range-line to the line dividing townships 78 and 79 north; thence west with said line to the fifth principal meridian; thence north with said meridian to the line dividing townships 80 and 81 north; thence east with said line to a point where the said line intersects or crosses the Wapasipinica River; thence down the main channel of said river to its mouth; thence due east to the middle of the main channel to the place of beginning; shall be, and the same is hereby constituted, a separate county, to be called Scott."

ROCK ISLAND COUNTY RECORDS

Administrative Jurisdictions

County records are under three administrative jurisdictions:

- The County Recorder's Office is located on the second floor, Rock Island Court House, 200 15th Street, Rock Island, IL 61201 (309) 786-4451.

The Recorder's office has custody of the following records:

- a. Real estate records that include the legal description and grantee/grantor in transactions beginning 30 December 1835.
- b. Records of mortgages beginning 1838.
- c. Servicemen's discharge records beginning 17 June 1865.

All records are indexed by name.

There is no charge for searches by private individuals, but there is a reproduction charge of \$1.00 per page.

There is a \$3.00 per name search charge by the Recorder's staff, except for real estate searches that include state and federal lein searches which cost \$5.00. The fee includes reproduction of the search in question. Checks should be drawn payable to the Rock Island County Recorder.

- The Circuit Clerk's Office has a Probate Division located on the 1st floor of the Rock Island County Court House (see above) which has will books dating back to 1860. They are indexed by the name of the deceased and by date of death.
 - a. At this time, there is no charge for searches by private individuals. There is a \$2.00 fee per name for searches by the Probate Division staff. However, fee charges are under evaluation and are subject to change.
 - b. There is a reproduction charge per page as follows:
 - 1st page\$1.00
 - 2 - 99 pages.....\$.50/pg.
 - 100 & over.....\$.25/pg.
 - c. Checks should be drawn payable to the office.

- The County Clerk's Office is located on the first floor of the Rock Island County Office Building (also known as the old Modern Woodman Building), 1504 3rd Avenue, Rock Island, IL 61201 (309) 786-4451.

The Clerk's Office has the following records:

- Birth records beginning 1877
- Marriage records beginning 1833
- Death records beginning 1878, access limited to 1878-1916.

Records are indexed by year by name and in the case of marriages by both spouses names. Searches are not permitted by private individuals. There is no fee for the search by the Clerk's staff but there is a reproduction charge of \$5.00 per copy.

The County Clerk has custody of the following records indexed by date and name:

- b. Marriage records since 1838.
- c. Death records since 1880.

Individuals may not make a personal search; the County Clerk's staff will make a search within a 10 year period for no fee, however there is a \$4.00 fee for a period over 10 years. The following fee schedule applies to copies of records:

The Probate Division of the County Clerk's Office has custody of wills which are indexed by surname and begin about 1890. There is no search fee. There is a reproduction charge of 25 cents per page.

- The County Recorder's Office is located on the same floor and building as the County Clerk's Office.
 Phone: (319) 326-8621.

The County Recorder has custody of the following records:

- Real estate records since 1838, indexed by Grantor (seller) and Grantee (buyer).
- Mortgage records since 1838, indexed by Grantor and Grantee.

Note: These records were combined from 1838 to 1930 when separated into two categories.

- Servicemen's Discharges since World War I are indexed by date and name.

The County Recorder's staff will not make extensive searches; these must be made by the individual. The staff will make a no-fee search for one or more on a limited basis. There is a reproduction fee schedule as follows:

CORONER'S RECORDS

Rock Island County

The Rock Island County Coroner's Office, located in the south wing on the ground floor of the County Office Building at 1504 3rd Avenue, Rock Island (309) 786-4451 maintains ledger records going back to 1890. Those ledgers from 1980 to 1974 are stored in the attic but can be sourced by the staff. Records for 1975 and later are maintained in the office. There is no fee for searches and abstracting by the staff but persons seeking information should make inquiries by surname, month and year. (As previously described, there are death certificate records in the County Clerk's Office also).

Scott County

The Scott County Coroner's Office maintains only medical records. Death certificate records are maintained by the County Clerk's Office.

FUNERAL RECORDS

A General Description of Funeral Records

The following, written by Dorothy W. (Mrs. Riley W.) Trimble, provides a perspective of funeral records that will aid in using them as source records.

"The funeral records of the Trimble Funeral Homes, Ltd. extend from March 1874 to the present day, one hundred and nine years. Our records are private. Only authorized members of our staff are permitted access to them.

"We are willing to research our records for persons seeking information concerning their own families. Since we do not charge for this service, we cannot accommodate professional genealogists. We ask for written requests as to the names, dates, places, etc desired, with an enclosed self-addressed, stamped envelope.

"Early funeral records are very brief compared with records of today, stating the name of the deceased, sex, dates of the death and funeral, the place of burial, and the name of the person responsible for the funeral. Occasionally, the cause of death, the age of the deceased, and the name of the attending physician are recorded. Records were kept of the size of the casket (coffin in those days) furnished. They were hand made in those early times.

"Today, the law requires the funeral director to obtain, in detail, the following vital statistics in order to properly file a certificate of death: name of deceased, sex, age, date of death, race, origin or nationality, date and state of birth, exact place of death, residence of the deceased, marital status, name of surviving spouse (maiden name, if wife survives), Social Security Number, occupation, kind of business or industry, armed services record, father's name, mother's maiden name, name of the informant and relationship to the deceased and informant's mailing address. In addition to that information, the cause of death must be certified by the attending physician or the coroner.

"The method and place of disposition of the body must be recorded, as well as the name and license number of the funeral director and the name of the firm handling the arrangements."

The foregoing may vary in the case of individual funeral homes as to the time records have been kept. In some cases some funeral homes have records of prior funeral homes as a result of mergers or discontinuance of business. The following is a current list of funeral homes in the areas listed:

SWENSON SWEDISH IMMIGRATION RESEARCH CENTER

Origin and Role

The Swenson Swedish Immigration Center was founded in 1981 by Birger and Lyal Swenson with the aim of becoming a national archives and center that would provide resources and research opportunities regarding the total impact of Swedes on American life and culture. This includes providing assistance to historians, social scientists, genealogists, and others engaged in research into Swedish-American sources and subjects. It also includes cooperation with the Emigrant Institute (Vaxsjo) and the Emigrant Register (Karlstad) in Sweden and with other Scandinavian-American archives and libraries.

Center Archival Material

The Center is an archival depository for the records, personal papers, and other documentary materials of Swedish-American organizations, institutions, and individuals. Augustana College's collections of Swedish-American books and manuscripts, accumulated over 125 years, have been transferred to the Center. Its newspaper collection - the largest collection of Swedish-American newspapers in the world - is available on microfilm. Completion of the task of microfilming Swedish-American church and society records and periodicals is a major goal of the Center.

Detailed topographical maps showing farms and homesteads in Sweden are available at the Center for research. The microfilmed records of Swedish-American churches of all major denominations that Swedish immigrants belonged to are also on deposit at the Center.

Through exhibits, translations, conferences of scholars and historians, shared cataloging and indexing, lectures, and occasional publications and related subjects, the Center seeks to cooperate with all persons sharing its aims and interest.

Genealogical searches

The Center does not have sufficient material to provide comprehensive genealogical research services. But, the Center can assist you in your search for the place of birth, or place of emigration, in Sweden. The Center's microfilms of Swedish-American church records and newspapers can be helpful in tracing the immigrants' origin in Sweden. If the immigrant belonged to a Swedish-American church in the United States or Canada, the place of birth is usually listed in the membership records. Obituaries in Swedish-American newspapers sometimes list the place of birth in Sweden. (Date of death is needed for the newspaper search.)

Most Swedish immigrants belonged to the State Lutheran Church in Sweden. In this country they joined mainly either the Augustana Lutheran Church (now the Lutheran Church of American), the Swedish Mission Friends (now Evangelical Covenant Church), the Swedish Baptist or Methodist churches of the Free Church. The Center has microfilms of church records from these denominations, but not for all congregations.

You are welcome to visit the Center if you prefer to search the records yourself. The staff will assist you without charge, except for copying charges. If you have to travel far, it is best that you make an appointment beforehand. The Center telephone number is (309) 794-7204. Mrs. Lilly Setterdahl, an experienced researcher, will be happy to assist you whether you decide to write or come in person.

The Center's address is: Augustana College, Box 175, Attention: Swenson Swedish Immigration Research Center, Rock Island, IL 61201. It is located on the Third Floor, Denkman Memorial Library on the Augustana College Campus.

Before you contact the Center, it would be to your advantage to collect as much data and information as possible from older relatives, old letters and other documents from Sweden and, if possible, obtain copies of naturalization records, marriage licenses, deeds,

deeds, death certificates, census records and city directories. These documents will provide you with your ancestors' addresses which can help you determine which church they might have belonged to. A pastor's name on an official church document is also helpful.

If you write, please be patient. The Center has had a tremendous increase in the number of requests for assistance. Because of the increased workload, our Advisory Committee has decided to charge \$10.00 for the initial response to a genealogical inquiry plus \$10.00 per hour or fraction of an hour for additional research beyond the first hour. The Center regrets the necessity for this charge, but it is needed to maintain the Center's microfilm collection and to provide adequate staffing for the demands for service. Checks should be made out to the Swenson Center.

Donation of Material

The Center seeks archival material. Donors of archival material are recognized as Friends of the Swenson Center. Donations of the following items are encouraged:

- Personal papers of Swedish immigrants and their families: letters, diaries, certificates, photographs, family histories and genealogies.
- Organizational papers from Swedish-American fraternal and labor associations, societies and clubs.
- Minutes, correspondence and other records from business firms started by Swedish immigrants.
- All types of printed and unpublished material relative to Swedish immigration and Swedes in America.

When you have assembled your records, the Center would appreciate a copy of your family tree and history. Please remember to list the immigrants' place of birth, year of emigration, date and place of marriage, name and data of spouse, place of settlement, names and number of children, and date and place of death of the immigrants. Your family record will be a part of the Center's permanent collection, and the Swedish immigrants in your family will be registered.

THE LORING MAP LIBRARY
AUGUSTANA COLLEGE

The Loring Map Library, located in the New Science Hall at Augustana College in Rock Island, IL is a U.S. Geological Survey map repository and has a collection of topographical maps (on a scale of 1" = a quarter of a mile) for most of the United States and some European countries. The scale permits the identification of cities, towns, cemeteries, etc.

The library also has a collection of maps on a scale of 1" = 4 miles. While this detail is not as fine as the topographical maps, it is adequate for tracing boundary lines. Some maps in the collection go back 70 to 80 years.

To assure availability of a staff member to assist in examining maps, contact Dr. Norman Moline, Chairman of the Geology Department before visiting the library, (309) 794-7303.

RICHARDSON-SLOANE GENEALOGICAL LIBRARY

This is a private library located at 501 Putnam Building between 2nd and 3rd Street on Main) in Davenport, IA. The library is open, usually, Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., however it is recommended that this be verified before visiting by calling (319) 383-0007.
