J.B. TIMMS of Kent is at the head of a movement to induce the legislature to pass a bill appropriating funds for the erection of a monument at Kellogg Grove in Kent township to commemorate the spot where the decisive battle of the Black Haw War was fought on June 25, 1832. Col. DEMENT with an army of 200 men met Black Hawk whose forces numbered 500 savage. Thirteen soldiers were shot or hacked to pieces before the redskins retreated in the evening; the big chief satisfied that his victories were over. The log cabin of Mr. TIMM'S father was used as a fort during the engagement.



His service in the Black Hills was long before gold was discovered, and as there were but few white people there at that time it was a section that was wholly in "the wild and woolly west." After leaving the service he returned to Freeport and entered two quarter sections in Florence township, the two land warrents he received from the government for long service, having entitled him to that amount of land without complying with the formalities of the homestead or other entry laws. While looking after his farming in Florence he met, courted and married Laura WASHBURN, a neighbor's daughter, and, unlike Capt. Miles STANDISH, he did his own courting, or he might not have been any more successful than was the famous soldier. Mr. & Mrs. Webb are the parents of four children: ARTHUR, San Fancisco, Cal.; Mrs. ORIN MUNN, this city; Mrs. PARKER, wife of Dr. J.L. PARKER, Charles City, Ia.; and Dr. BERT WEBB, Rome, Italy; who has been permanently located in that far-off city for fifteen years, and who has the honor of being dentist to the king. Rockford Star: Mrs. Ellen Davis, widow of the late John W. DAVIS, residing in Kishwaukee, Winnebago county, is probably the oldest woman in the state of Illinois. Yesterday Mrs. Davis who is well known throughout the county, and who is called Grandma Davis celebrated her 102nd birthday.

Mrs. Davis is one of the pioneers of the county as well as being the oldest inhabitant, and the occasion of her birthday was made an event in the history of the town where she resides. Many of the neighbors and friends from that vicinity and also several from the city called on the more than centenarian and extended congratulations, and wished that she might live to celebrate added birthdays.

Ellen MYERS was born on Prince Edward's Island, Dominion of Canada. Sept. 9, 1802. Her father was a native of Holland and her mother of Switzerland. Before she was three years old she was bereft of the guiding council of her father and mother and left to the care of strangers. Her education was neglected and she was denied many of the comforts of life. At age of eighteen she was united in marriage to John W. DAVIS, a sailor of Welsh descent, with whom she lived happily for fifty-nine years. To them were born eleven children, two of whom, with twenty-four grand children, forty-nine great grandchildrn and three great great grandchildrn, are living, making a group of seventy-nine descendants.

She maintains all her faculties and even her hearing and eyesight have not failed her.



TIMMS: one of the oldest residents of county and who lived in Illinois during the entire eighty-five years of his life, died at his home in Pearl City Sunday. He has been an invalid for more than a year and for many months had been confined to his bed. Unlike many early settlers of the county, Mr " "imms did not come to Illinois from states in the east. He was born June 16, 1831, near Apple River station, in Jo Daviess county at a time when settlers along the fron- , tier were experiencing hardships of the Blackhawk war. His father was a native of South Carolina who moved to the Tennessee country in the early 21's and who a few years later became a river pilot on the Mississippi, Shortly after James B. TIMMS was born, his parents moved to Stephenson

county, where the father purchased a farm on the site of the historic BlackHawk battle ground. Mr. Timms in later days often recalled the early years of his life when as a boy he helped his father clear the ground; how neighbors were unknown and one could travel miles without seeing a cabin; how the family of which he was a member had to endure every hardship and how even when he was a young man and had secured land of his own, he had to furrow it for the first time, erect all the buildings himself and live for many months without a luxury of any kind.

On the 16th of March, 1854, Mr. Timms was united in marriage to Miss Christina GABLE, the ceremony being performed in this city. It was shortly after that that Mr. Timms secured eighty acres of the old Timms homestead

SWOGHEN VOL. 9 NO. 2 PAGE 20 (Cont. from Page 19 - TIMMS west of Freeport. By gradually improving his land he was able to secure more and it was not long before he was the owner of 200 acres of the best land in the county.

For a great many years Mr. Timms was prominent in the affairs of the republican party of this county, but after the forming of the prohibition party he changed his politics slightly and voted the national prohibition ticket. He at one time served his community efficiently as supervisor and was several times elected delegate to county and state conventions.

Mr. Timms was one of the oldest Masons in the county. He became a Master Mason in Freeport and belonged to Pearl Lodge 828, F. & A.M. who had charge of the services at the cemetery. For more than 30 years he was a member of Freeport Chapter R.A.M.

The Black Hawk monument erected, on the site of the battle of Kellog's Grove in Kent Township; and known to nearly every resident of the county, will long stand as a monument to work of Mr. Timms. It was due to his efforts that the monument was built and the place marked where one of the most decisive battles of the Black Hawk war took place.

The monument stands on one of the highest points in Illinois, overlooking the Yellow Creek valley, and can be seen for miles in every direction. It is built of flinty limestone taken from the quarry nearby on a farm then owned by Mr. Timms. The monument built by Wm. ASCHER of Freeport is eight feet square at the base three feet square at the top and is thirtyfour feet high. Credit for the erection of this monument belongs to Mr. Timms, who lived on the site of the famous old battle field. His father was a soldier in the Black Hawk war and James B. Timms was living when the attack made on the fort at Apple River by Black Hawk and his braves in 1832.

Surviving him are one son and five daughters. His wife passed away in 1909. The children who survive him are: Harvey M. TIMMS of Los Angeles, Cal., Mrs. Adelade DBISHER of this place, Mrs. Lucy KINMAN of Kansas, Mrs. Olive KEELER of Chicago, Mrs. John KLECKNER of Kent, and Mrs. Wm. HARRIS of Iowa. A son Albert preceded him recently.

The funeral services were held at the M.E. Church on Wednesday, Rev. TUTTLE officiating. Interment was made in the Yellow Creek Cemetery.

Mrs. Maria SIMPSON CLINGMAN died at half past nine o'clock last evening at the home of her son, William CLINGMAN, at Cedarville. Had she lived until Dec. 12 of this year Mrs. CLINGMAN would have been 107 years old. As it is she was the oldest person in Illinois and one of the oldest in the United States. Although of such great age, it has been only recently that Mrs. Clingman has been really ill. For many years her vitality and good health has been the wonder of her friends. Even after she had passed the hundredyear mark she was able to receive her friends, and with the exception of the last two years she remained active and in possession of all her mental faculties. At the age of 100 she could read and sew.

Mrs. Clingman's life has been a wonderful one. Born at a time when the United States extended west only as far as the Mississippi river she has lived to see her country developed to the Pacific and from Canada to the gulf. She was three years old at the time of the second war with England. She was 37 at the time of the war with Mexico. At the time the Civil War broke out she was 52 and three of her sons enlisted with the armies of the north. In 1898 when war with Spain broke out, three of her grandchildren hastened to join the colors.

All of the worlds greatest inventions have been made since Mrs. Clingman was a girl. The first locomotive was introduced into the United States when she was six years old, the first passenger railroad was built when she was sixteen, matches were unheard of until two years after that, the telegraph was not known until Mrs. Clingman was twenty-three, and it was two years later before the electric motor was invented. The typewriter was first heard of in 1843. Bessemer steel was perfected in 1855, self-binding reapers came to use in 1873, telephones in 1876, phonographs in 1877, the X-Ray in 1895, the practical airship in 1901, the flying machine in 1906, color photograph, radium, motion pictures-all of these things and many more which are today looked upon in many cases as necessities were at the time Mrs. CLINGMAN was born, unheard of and perhaps even undreamed of. In her

life time events have happened which will be read about for hundreds of years. She has witnessed progress such as may never be repeated again in an equal period of time of the world's history.

Mrs. CLINGMAN was born Dec. 12, 1809, in Portsmouth, Scioto county, Ohio and was before her marriage to JOSIAH CLINGMAN on Nov. 25, 1830, in Ohio, Miss MARIA SIMPSON. Five years after their marriage Mr. & Mrs. Clingman, with their two children, came to Illinois. They made the trip by boat, coming down the Ohio and up the Mississippi, Illinois and LaSalle rivers to Putnam county, and a little later to LaSalle county. They arrived in Illinois in 1835, and a year later Josiah Clingman came on horseback to this county to take up a claim a few miles north of Cedarville. The following year Mrs. Clingman and her children joined him. That was in 1837 and since that time Mrs. Clingman has mad her home continuously in this county. The years which have not been spent on the Clingman farm, have been enjoyed with her son in Cedarville. Mrs. Clingman often told of life as she found it when she first came to this county with her husband and their three children-George, Mary and Chester, the last-named having been born in LaSalle county. Cedarville then consisted of a long shack and a mill claim marked by two logs which had been cut and laid across each other near the rapids-a mark of respect all along the "frontier". These logs had been placed by John GODDARD and the claim was bought the same year by Dr. VAN VALZAH.

Mr. Clingman had started his cabin when he first west to Cedarville but the roof was still lacking when Mrs. Clingman and the children arrived. During the time it was being put on she stayed with another family in that neighborhood who were the proud owners of a one-room log cabin. The women and children slept in the cabin but the men were forced to sleep in the potato hole which had been dug underneath.

At last the Clingman cabin was finished and the family moved in. All that was lacking was the floor, and for the wood with which to make it Mr. Clingman had to drive his oxen as far south as yellow creek, where at the time black walnut was plentiful.

Housekeeping in those days, Mrs. Clingman used to say, was simple. For five or six years she got along without a stove, and with only a few simple cooking utensils which had been brought from Ohio. Clothing they made themselves, even to their hats and caps. They sheared and picked the wool, spun it into yarn and had it made into cloth at Orangeville. Flour was as rare in those days as it is high-priced today. It could only be obtained by going to Galena or Wolf Creek. The first flour the Clingman family got came from Galena, being taken first to Brewster's Ferry and being brought from there by Mr. Clingman in his ox cart. Other supplies were secured from Savanna.

Of the ten children of Mr. & Mrs. Clingman, three served their county during the civil war. JASON was a member of the 11th Illinois and WILLIAM and THOMAS of Company A, 46th Illinois Infantry. At the battle of Shiloh, Thomas received wounds which later caused his death. Three of Mrs. Clingman's grandchildren served in the army during the Spanish-American war. For nearly a hundred years Mrs. Clingman has been a member of the Methodist church, she having joined the church when 9 years old. For more than 75 years she was a member of the Methodist Episcopal church of Cedarville, and as long as her health permitted it she was a regular (CONTINUED ON PAGE 22

During the civil war he volunteered but was never called out. Mrs. Kloepping is well up in years also, but we are unable to give her exact age. Both are quite vigorous. Mr. & Mrs. Kloepping are the parents of three children, two of whom-Henry W. and Mary are living.

MRS. LOUISA MESSMAN - Mrs. Louisa Messman, who is in her 92nd year, was born in Germany, Sept. 6, 1813. She came to America in 1852 with her husband who died in 1880. They were nine weeks on the way and narrowly escaped being shipwrecked when they were almost at their journey's end. Mrs. Messman is the mother of three children - Simon of Dakota, Henry of Rock Grove and Mrs. Minnie MEIERS of Oakley, Wis. Although not very vigorous, Mrs. Messman is in very fair health. to ask a computer if their long-lost uncessful a three-year project to make a The National Park Service has begun a three-year project to make a computerized directory of the blue and gray - all 3.5 million soldiers who

fought in the War Between the States. When the database is complete, Americans will be able to learn their ancestors' links to the war by searching for their names and regiments on computers' installed at Civil War sites across the nation. Historians estimate that at least half of all Americans have relatives who fought in the Civil War.

"It's going to change a way we look at the war. It's going to personalize the battles, the struggles that went on," said Rich RAMBUR, superintendent at Antietam National Battlefield, one of two places where the computerized directory will be tested this fall. "We've spent decades in the preservation of Civil War land and artifacts. Now, we've preserving the names."

The computers are expected to provide the soldier's name, home state, regiment and rank, and whether he fought for North or South, said John F. PETERSON, who works in the Park Service's computer division in Washington.

"It won't prove that your great-grandfather fought at Gettysburg, for example, but it will tell you what regiment he was in and it will tell you that that regiment fought at Gettysburg." Peterson said.

"If someone's name is Robert, SMITH, it's going to be very hard. For Lees and Smiths, you're going to get lots and lots of screens of names. If you know the person's regiment, middle initial or (home) state, you'll be able to narrow the search."

The computers will provide brief information on the 7,000 civil war regiments and units and information on many of the 10,500 battles and skirmishes, Peterson said. "We're also going to be able to track where Civil War soldiers are buried at our 11 Civil War cemeteries within the park system," he said.

Computers are to be installed at all 28 Civil War sites that the National Park Service operates in 21 states and the District. About 11 million people visit those sites each year, Peterson said, and the most frequently asked question is, "Did my great-great-grandfather fight here?" To answer the question park, historians now must research pension and service records, state rosters, census and war records and county histories.

On Feb. 20, 1853 he married Miss OLIVE SWEET, a Canadian lady, and after spending on year at Titusville, Pa., they came to Illinois and located in Ridott township; first on a farm and later they moved to town, where they have since resided. During their residence of fifty years in this county they have seen the broad prairies developed into beautiful farms. Mr. Griffin, owing to his advanced years, is rather feeble, yet he is in the best of spirits. He was drafted during the time of the civil war, and with twenty-three others, was assigned to the 46th Illinois, sent from Peoria county. He was in several engagements, but his army life wasn't very

agreeable for the reason that during his nine months' service he was required to march, as he puts it "all over God's creation." Mr. & Mrs. Griffin have no children of their own but brought up three of their relatives children. Mrs. Griffin, who is a few years younger that her

husband, is very active. MRS, SOPHIA HUNT - Mrs. Hunt, nee SOPHIA VAUGHAN was born in New York, Mar. 9, 1828; and came west in 1856, accompanied by her husband and family. Her husband died Mar. 6, 1903: She was the mother of nine children, and all are living except one. Old age is telling on her as she is in feeble health.

HENRY FETTERHOFF - Owing to the death of his mother when he was but an infant, and to his father's neglect in keeping records, Mr. Fetterhoff isn't positive of a few things about his life, but he knows that he was born in Dauphin county, Penn., and he thinks his age is somewhere between eightyfive and ninety. When he was but a boy he moved to Clinton county, Pa., and in 1850 he came to Illinois with GEORGE KOHL, whose sketch appears

elsewhere. He was married in 1804(?)to a Miss BRICK, and they have one son, HENRY JACOB. He has been a carpenter, miller and farmer successfully, and sees now that his farm of 345 acres is properly tilled. When he came to Illinois he had just \$80. He worked hard and got along in the world, but lost about \$10,000 by balling people. This he has "cut out" however, of late years. In explanation of his having been a "soft mark" in the balling business, he says that remembering that he and his father were as poor as Job's turkey while they lived along the mountains in Pennsylvania, he could not help but pity poor people who came to him for aid in the country, and so he let his sympathies run away with him to the extent of the sum named. He saw the point in time, however, to save himself, and is in such circumstances that he needn't have any fears of going to the poor house. He doesn't have much use for newspapers, as the reports of murders, wars, etc., have a tendency to give him many unpleasant dreams.

JAMES OWEN - Mr. Owen was born in County Donegal, Ireland, Dec. 21, 1819, and came to America in 1847. He married JULIA MC GINN in New Jersey in 1849, who died Apr. 30, 1902. Mr. Owen is the father of eleven children, two of whom passed away some years ago. Those living are: WILLIAM and HUGH, Pecatonica; BARNEY and JAMES at home; Mrs. Wm. BRADLEY and HENRY in the south; DENNIS in North Dakota and JOHN at Davis. He has followed farming for many years, and his health is such that he continues quite active, though his eyesight is failing. He has been quite a reader in his time, and knows all about the history of England and Ireland. Before crossing the waters he read the London Times, the Observer and Punch. Since he is in America he has read the New York World and Philadelphia Ledger largely, and has a fund of information that is wonderful.

EDWARD DOONAN - Mr. Doonan, who is in his 83rd year, was born in Ireland, and came to America about the year 1850. He married ELLEN MC GUIRE, who died six years ago. Mr. Doonan has no children of his own but raised five as follows: Mrs. Wm. HYLAND, Pecatonica; JAMES MC INTYRE, California; JAMES HINES, Durand; CATHERINE MC CARTHY, who died many years ago and ARTHUR DOONAN at home. He followed baking in Ireland and farming in this country. His health is fair, though he suffers somewhat from rheumatism.

CHRISTIAN GUTH - Mr. Guth was born in Bavaria, Germany, Sept. 14, 1824, and came to this country in 1855 with his wife and two children and accompanied also by his two brother, ADAM and DANIEL. His wife died some ten years ago. He has three children: ADAM, JOHN and JACOB. The Guth family is an estimable one, The possess the high traits that are always appreciated. He was a farmer and a good one in ever particular. He owns a fine farm which is under the best of cultivation and supplied with convenient farm buildings, including a commodious residence, which is located on a rise of ground commanding a fine view of the surrounding country for miles. He served his native country six years as a soldier. His health is not good, and he is rather feeble.

MRS. D. KRUSE - Among the very old people of the county is Mrs. Kruse, who is past ninety-two and who resides about half a mile east of German Valley. She was born in Germany and came to America about the year 1853. Her husband died a few months ago. She is the mother of two children: CONRAD and JOHN, both of German Valley. This old lady is remarkably vigorous and active for one of her years, her faculties being practically unimpaired.

JOHN EVERTS - Was born in Germany, Aug. 9, 1828, and came to America in 1850, accompanied by C.O. and ANNO COLLMAN and a number of others. In 1853 he married MARY SUNE, who was born in Germany, Aug. 16, 1825. They are the parents of five children, four of whom have passed away, Mrs. BENJAMIN BUSSING of Dundee, Minn., is still living. Mr. Everts followed farming until he was incapacitated for labor by an accident. He then retired and lives in the village of Everts, which was named after him. He and Mrs. Everts are both enjoying fairly good health, though not so active as they once were.

FRIELING FRIELING - Mr. Frieling, who is now in his ninetieth year, was born in Germany, Apr. 19, 1815, and came to America in 1850, locating on a farm in Ridott township about one mile west of German Valley, where he has since resided. He never married, but had as a housekeeper, a sister who died some years ago, since which time Mrs. ELIZABETH HEDDEN assumed these duties. He is in very feeble health and is so badly crippled up with rheumatism that he can be about only a little of the time and that on crutches.

JELLE HEEREN - Is a native of Germany, where he was born June 30, 1822, came to this county in 1849, settled in Ridott township and has lived at the same place ever since. His wife has passed away. There are ten children: WESSEL, GEPPA, FASKA, JOHN, HEYE, EMMA, JETTA, ANGELINE, JOHANNA and ZELLA. He has by industry and perseverance accumulated considerable property. His health is very good and he is still able to perform a full day's labor.

CHARLES ROHKAR - Was born in Hanover, Germany, in 1826, came to this county in 1852, and lived in Freeport up to 1872 when he moved to Ridott, where he has lived ever since. His wife died several years ago. There are four children living: HENRY of Rockford; CHARLES, MRS. CAROLINE MURRAY and Mrs. MARGARET KNOBLE of the county. He held the office of constable for his town many years. His health is fairly good and he is still able to carry on business.

MRS. RACHAEL GITCHELS - A daughter of the late GEO. SIBERT and wife, was born in Canton, Ohio, Sept. 5, 1834, and came to this county soon afterward with her parents. He husband LEWIS D. GITCHELL, was killed in 1873 by a runaway horse. She lived on a farm up to the time of the death of her husband when she moved to the village of Ridott, where she still resides. She has a vivid recollection of the country when it was in its wild state. Her health is good and she is still quite active and as usual very industrious and careful of her affairs.

SAMUEL HART - Was born in Juniata county, Pa., 70 years ago the 20th day of last May. He came to this county in 1857, accompanied by his brother, Wm. HART and has lived here ever since. His wife died Oct. 17, 1902, aged 64. He has two children, GEORGE and Miss PARMELLA, both of Pearl City. Mr. Hart was a prosperous farmer up to a few years ago when he retired. He is one of Stephenson county's staunch citizens and enjoys the confidence of all who know him. He has been commissioner of highways, school trustee and school director. Mr. Hart is a man of vigorous health for one of his age. He says the times were exceedingly hard the first years that he lived in the townty. (Article includes a picture of him.)

MUSSENA P. MITCHELL, whose death occurred Tuesday morning at the home of his grandson, John F. GLASSER, six miles northwest of Freeport, in Lancaster township, removed from earthly activities a man who was perhaps the oldest settler in Stephenson county, Mr. Mitchell having come to this community on Jan. 25, 1841. His residence in this county was an honorable one and the surviving relatives possess the heritage of a life which was filled with good will toward his fellowmen.

Although he was nearly 96 years old. Mr. Mitchell's health had been quite good until six weeks ago, when a steady decline was perceptible. His birthday had been regularly observed by a gathering of relatives at the home of Mr. Glasser, and on the last anniversary, in May, he took a lively interest in the occasion.

Mr. Mitchell was a man who possessed an intellect which was as keen as that of any person who debated the issues of the day with him. His remarkable faculty for remembering events and dates made his opinion carry more than the usual weight, and he was universally respected by the entire countryside. Nearly all the years of his long life had been spent on the farm, where he lived near to nature, and the marked punctuality with which he retired and arose was often ascribed as the reason for his longevity.

Mr. Mitchell came to this community when it was an unsettled wilderness, when the breaking of the virgin soil was a task which required the strongest muscles, when public highways were practically unknown, and the people who lived remote from the towns and villages found their way to their destination through trails, many of which had been broken by the redman. His life covered a span of many important epochs, in the nation's history, and his fund of reminiscences was a never ending recital of the days when the people looked forward to the coming of railroad trains, and when the commercial use of electricity and the hundreds of other inventions were regarded as inventors' dreams.

Mr. Mitchell was the sole survivor of a family of four sons and three daughters, and all of these lived to a ripe old age. They were Mrs. MARGARET SEDAM, who lived to be 90 years old; Mrs. EMILY BROWN, 80 years; WILLIAM MITCHELL, known as SQUIRE MITCHELL, 85 years; JACOB MITCHELL and Mrs. A.M. NEEDLER, 70 years and ROBERT MITCHELL, 63 years.

Mr. Mitchell was born on May 6, 1812, at Aaronsburg, Center county, Penn. His Marriage to Miss MARIA RUTH occurred Aug. 27, 1833, at Bigmocharow, Northumberland county, Penn. The couple left there on April 19, 1839, and arrived at Halfday, Lake county, Ill. on the 17th of the following month. They came by team and wagon as far as Pittsburg from there by boat to Peoria, Ill., thence by wagon to Halfday.

Mr. & Mrs. Mitchell arrived in Stephenson county over sixty-five years ago on January 25, 1841, the trip to Buena Vista, where they located first being made with teams and sleds. After living there one year they moved to Lancaster township and settled on the farm known as the old KORTEMEYER farm, living there from 1842 to 1848. In 1848 they moved to the farm now owned by Mr. WACHLIN, two miles east and four miles north of Freeport. Mr. & Mrs. Mitchell lived there until 1875, the death of Mrs. Mitchell occurring on March 25 of that year. They were the parents of four children, as follows: Lavina (Mrs. Tobias CLUMP); Hannah, who died at the age of 21 years; ELMIRA, (Mrs. F.J. CLUMP); of Superior, Ia., Mrs. GLASSER died at the age of 57 years and Mrs. TOBIAS CLUMP at the age of 63 years.

Mr. Mitchell made his home with his son-in-law and daughter, Mr. & Mrs. F.J. CLUMP, until the spring of 1884, when they moved west. He then made his home with his son-in-law, WILLIAM GLASSER, until six years ago, when the latter moved to Dakota, Ill. Since that time he has made his home with his grandson John F. Glasser, on the old GLASSER homestead, six miles northeast of Freeport.







Eggs 3 Cents a Dozen, Butter 6 Cents a Pond; Money Values Unstable.

MOSES LEVERTON, retired farmer residing between Warren and Winslow, tells interesting tales of the early days in Stephenson County and an excerpt from his narrative is given in the following letter. MR. LEVERTON has long been a prominent citizen in this part of the country and is particularly noted for his advocacy of good roads. In giving his "recollections of seventy years in Stephenosn county." Mr. LEVERTON writes:

"We landed near Oneco on March 18, 1853, father, mother and seven children. From the eastern shore of Maryland we had come by boat and stage and by railroad as far as the railroad went, which was Rockford. Ill. For the rest of the journey father hired a man with a team and wagon for \$4 to bring us to Oneco. During the first day we drove as far as Rock Grove, where we stayed all night with the family of JOHN BOLENDER. They were very good to us, and although I have often heard my parents speak of them, I do not know whether they kept a tavern or just kept us out of kindness. They refused pay and mother often spoke about how kind MRS. BOLENDER was to the children. After seeing that we all had enough to eat, she put us to bed. The BOLENDERS seem to have been noted for their kindness in an early day.

"Since we had lost all our goods at Rockford, we did not even have a change of clothes. After we had been here about two weeks, we caught the measles and with little to wear and not much to eat, except corn pone and bacon, we were feeling miserable. A wash tub turned bottom side up served for a table and buckets, likewise over turned made chairs for father and mother, while we children hopped around like crickets and caught a bite where ever we could.

Father soon made a cross-legged table and some cots for us to sleep on. **Orangeville Then "Bowertown**"

Orangeville was not on the map and in its place was Bowertown, a settlement with a few houses, a grist and saw mill, one or two stores and a blacksmith shop. Freeport did not have a railroad and was only a small village. There was not much inducement for the people to try to do much, as the products were not worth much. Wheat brought 35 cents a bushel, oats 6 cents, and corn 10 or 12 cents. Butter was worth 6 or 7 cents a pound and dressed hogs one and one fourth cents a pound. In 1857 father dressed seventeen hogs that weight 300 pounds, or better, apiece and found that he could only get 1 1/4 cents per pound for them. He build a rail fence around them to let them hang three weeks during which time the price went to 1 1/2 cents and he hauled them to Monroe and sold them.

Eggs 3 Cents a Dozen

Eggs were 3 cents per dozen, and more than once I helped mother carry them to Oneco and take out in trade for the eggs blue denim, at 9 cents a yard, to make our pants. One yard made a pair of trousers, always full length, as we had no knee breeches in those days. Since they were made as big at the bottom as at the top, my big toe would often catch in them and send me sprawling full length. I had many hard falls in that way.

Dr. Wright practiced medicine at Van Brocklin from the time he came to this county until he passed away in 1888. He served also as county judge from '63 to '69. Mrs. Wright was the mother of three children, all of whom are dead. Aside from being crippled up with rheumatism she is quite active for one of her years.

He is an authority on financial and fiscal subjects. He was married on My 25, 1861, to JANE LAWYER daughter of the late MICHAEL LAWYER. She died in 1892. He has one son, EDWARD LAWVER BURCHARD, of Washington, D.C., who has charge of the congressional library. Mr. Burchard is social in disposition democratic in habits and manner and a true American. Despite the weight of seventy-nine years, he is still vigorous and diligently pursues his profession.

HORATIO JONES - Horatio Jones of Lena was born at Georgia, Virginia, in 1822, and Mrs. Jones, whose maiden name was BETSEY JEWELL, was born at Westford, Virginia, in 1815, the latter, who is several years older than her husband, being now in her 89th year. PETER POWELL, probably the oldest man in Freeport, died last evening at the home of Mr. & Mrs. T.D. HEWITT, on Pleasant street. Mr. Powell had been in feeble health for some years, and last Thursday evening he suffered a stroke of paralysis while at the dinner table, and passed from earth last evening at 8 o'clock.

Mr. Powell was born in 1801, on Bedloe's Island in New York harbor. His mother, MARY BEDLOE, was the wife the Mr. Bedloe in honor of whom the island was named. Mr. Powell was reared in New York City, and for many years he followed the occupation of contractor and builder in that city. In 1855 he came west and settled in Freeport, which city has ever since been his home. His wife died many years ago, and he outlived his seven children. For some time he has made his home with Mr. & Mrs. HEWITT. His nearest relatives are his grandchildren, Mr. J.E. ADAMSON, MRS. T.D. HEWITT and MRS. S.B. Mr. Powell was a man of great intelligence and was well informed in regard to the history of this country. He led a correct life and for years has been prepared to cross the dark river.

The funeral will be held from Mr. Hewitt's residence tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock, and Rev. MARCUS LANE will officiate. W.H.J. STRATTON will have charge of the funeral arrangements.

MRS. NANCY BOWERS, at the residence of Mrs. MARY C. THOMPSON, No. 134 Clay street, at six o'clock Wednesday morning, Mrs. NANCY BOWERS departed this life, after a brief illness. Monday the deceased appeared well, and did some sewing, but Tuesday noon she complained of being ill. She suffered a great deal of pain, but was conscious up to the last moment, and was satisfied to leave this world of care and sorrow.

Mrs. Bowers was a native of Northumberland Co., Pa., and would have been 86 years of age had she lived until the 7th of next June. She was united in marriage at her native place to JOHN H. BOWERS, who died 19 years ago. Thirty-eight years ago the family came west, and here Mrs. Bowers remained until her death. She was a lady of remarkable vitality for one of her years and was never know to complain. In early life she identified herself with the Evangelical Association, and was one of the first members of the Salem church. Here, where she was best known, her loss will be keenly felt by the sons and daughters, as well as by all others who enjoyed her friendship.
