EDITOR'S MESSAGE

Spring is arriving in Illinois and it's beautiful time to move some your researching to the outdoors. Plan some trips to some old cemeteries and imagine the lifestyles of these pioneers. Notice the details and individuality on several of the gravestones. Many of the epithets are masterpieces. Take some pictures and include them in your history of your ancestors. They will be treasured by your descendents.

I was fortunate to have spent the past three months in Florida enjoyed a very warm winter. I love golf, so spent a lot of time exercising and enjoying the beauty of their golf courses.

I hope you will enjoy this issue of the Quarterly. I am typing the church records from Immaculate Conception Catholic church in Morris, IL and thought perhaps my efforts would help others with their research. I am only at the beginning and will try to transcribe more in the near future. These records begin in 1851 when missionaries traveled from town to town to service the people. In fact, over three hundred years ago, Father Jacques Marquette, who on October 27, 1674, set out from St. Francis Xavier, left Wisconsin with two voyageurs, to proceed to the Mission LaConception along the Illinois River.

Father Marquette and Louis Joliet, a French-Canadian explorer and fur trader are believed to have been the first white men to enter what in now Illinois. The first masses in Illinois were offered on Holy Thursday, April 11, and Easter Sunday, April 13, 1675, by Father Marquette.

The Morris Herald of 1888 stated "When Father du Pontavice first began holding church services, a large majority of the citizens were common laborers on the canal". He was based in Ottawa and held the first Catholic service in Morris in 1841, before Morris had even been named. He and six other clergymen priests made trips on horseback from Joliet to Ottawa.

In about 1845, Father du Pontavice built a church at the foot of Dresden Hill near the canal. This was the first church erected in Grundy County, and served Catholics from several miles around, including residents of Morris.

Your will notice, there are no Baptisms recorded from January 1854-July, 1859. I have been unable to locate them.

I have also included some articles from old newspapers I hope you will find interesting. You will notice how large the Surname Index is in reflecting the data I have included.



SAMUEL SUFFERN

In its pioneer period Illinois was fortunate in having among its incoming citizens many men of means and business ability and experience, who put themselves at the head of various movements and enterprises, and were largely instrumental in hastening the work of settlement, improvement and development. Grundy County had some such citizens in the 1840's and '50's, and none of them was more prominent or more useful in his sphere than the well remembered gentleman whose name is above.

Samuel Suffern was a native of Ireland and came to this country when he was very young and settled in New York near Syracuse, and for some time was engaged successfully in mercantile business and contracting. In 1849 he went to California, where he engaged in mining and farming for a period of five years, and in the spring of 1855 he came to Illinois and settled in Felix Township, where he remained until his death, which occurred at his home on Section 35, October 19, 1893. He devoted himself largely to farming and stock-raising, and by his industry and careful attention to business soon acquired a large property. He laid out the present town of Suffern in Felix Township and erected many of its residences and business buildings.

Mr. Suffern was married at Morris, Illinois, to Ellen Smead, a daughter of George Smead of that place, and they had five children, four of whom are living, Mary, Mattie, Isabelle, William G., and Annie E. Mary was born in Grundy County and is the wife of John Trotter, a prominent merchant of Felix Township, to whom she has borne five children. Mattie was born in Grundy County and died in Felix Township about 1882. She was the wife of John Trotter, the husband now of her sister Mary, and she left no children. Isabelle and Annie E. live in Chicago, where they have established a home with their mother at its head.

William G. Suffern, only son of Samuel and Ellen (Smead) Suffern, was born in Felix Township, Grundy County, Illinois, on December 8, 1864, and has lived much of his life on the family homestead. He attended the public schools of Felix Township and took a commercial course in a Chicago business college. For some years he was a hardware merchant at LaGrange and Coal City, Illinois. At Coal City he held the office of village clerk. He was married December 25, 1890, to Mary C. Penn, daughter of John and Elizabeth Penn of Coal City, and they have four children: Ellen, born at Coal City September 18, 1892; Ethel, born at Coal City June 2, 1894; Winnifred, born in Felix Township March 22, 1896; and Samuel, born in Felix township January 16, 1898. Mr. Suffern is one of the most enterprising young men of his township and county. Politically he is a Democrat, and he takes an intelligent and patriotic interest in all questions of public importance.

Samuel Suffern was a man of much force of character and of a progressive spirit, which not only made him a very successful pioneer but developed him to meet all emergencies and to be thoroughly master of the situation as time brought changed conditions, more important interests and new and unlooked-for responsibilities. He came to help settle the country, and he did

From the Wilmington Advocate, January 1887: At the M.E. parsonage Dec. 29, 1886, the Rev. S.T. Show performed the marriage ceremony between Mr. Edward Blogg and Miss Martha J. Jackson, both of Florence, Ill.

From the Wilmington Advocate, December 24, 1886:

A Wedding in Wesley -- Miss Esther A. Johnston of Wesley and Mr. Thomas Cairns of Chicago were married at the residence of the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Johnston, on Thursday of last week by the Rev. J.C. Armstrong of Chicago. Quite a number of guests witnessed the ceremony and offered warm congratulations. A fine dinner was then dispatched, after which animated social conversation, music, etc., occupied a few hours, until the approach of train-time, when the new-made couple, in the zenith of joy, departed on the evening train for Chicago, taking with them the best wishes of all.

From the Joliet Daily Republican, April 27, 1907:

Joseph Rose, son of John and Sarah Whitley Rose, was born at Nottinghamshire, England, March 1, 1825. In 1846 he was married to Miss Mary Hallam. Deciding to found his new home in the new world he sailed from Liverpool in the good ship Manhattan, and after a brief stay in New York made his way to Lockport. He arrived there June 19, 1850, by way of the canal and found the country in such a state of depression that he was fortunate to secure work at fifty cents a day and board. In 1858 he moved to Manhattan Township, and in 1864 to the farm which he purchased in Wilton Township. In 1891 he moved to the village of Manhattan.

On April 14 he was taken suddenly with a hemorrhage of the brain and died April 18...

Mr. Rose's death was preceded by four children-- Frank, George, John and Lincoln-- and by the three with whom he was joined in wedlock-- Mary Hallam, Sarah Hazard, and Jane Chadwick.

To mourn his departure he leaves thirteen grandchildren, a great grandchild and his children: William Rose of Joliet, Charles Rose of Los Angeles, Cal., Robert Holmes of Washington, Elizabeth Graves, James Rose, and Mary Mackender of Wilton, and Hattie Kru of Manhattan.

The funeral service was held Sunday in the Manhattan Methodist Episcopal church, Rev. G. Nesmith officiating. The remains were interred in the Manhattan cemetery.

From the Dwight Star & Herald, September 25, 1897:

Gardner News: The funeral of Mrs. John H. Mountjoy was held Wednesday at the Presbyterian church, Rev. Burger officiating. The remains were laid to rest in the Braceville-Gardner cemetery. Margaret Mountjoy was of Welsh birth and parentage, being born in Blackwood, Monmouthshire, England, May 12, 1841. She was married to john Mountjoy at Bedwelty church, Blackwood, July 26, 1858. Twenty years ago she landed in America, twelve years of this time in Gardner. She united with the Presbyterian church in April 1892. Her husband and two daughters, together with 10 grandchildren, are left to mourn.

From the Dwight Star & Herald, June 3, 1893:

Braceville News: Mrs. Hulda Johnson, aged about 60 years, died Friday of last week and was buried in the Cotton cemetery last Sunday afternoon. Services were held in the M.E. church. Mrs. Johnson was one of Braceville's oldest settlers and was greatly respected by all. Her son John and his wife Lizzie M., desire to thank all the friends and neighbors who so kindly assisted them during the two weeks of her sickness and suffering.

Daniel Ogden was born May 4, 1906 in Coal City, a son of Ira and Mary Goodin Ogden. He moved with them to Mazon in his early

youth where he attended schools and was graduated from the high school.

On July 5, 1934 he married Viola McComb of Mazon and since that time they made their home in Morris. For the past three years Mr. Ogden had been employed by Morris Tire and Appliance Co. Prior to that he operated the Uptown Sweet Shop for a period of time.

OBITUARY - JOHN MILKS of Lockport. Died on Saturday, August 1, 1874, in the 84th year of his age.

Deceased was a native of the vicinity of Albany, New York, where he was born March 31, 1791. He emigrated to the vicinity of Rome in the same state, where, having married Miss Diantha Maxfield of Georgia, Vermont, he resided until he enlisted as a soldier in the War of 1812. His division was that commanded by Gen. Dearborn. He emigrated with his family to this state in the spring of 1838. Coming here, he entered the service of Mr. [John] Heck, taking the oversight of his flouring mills at this place [Lockport]. In this business he continued several years. He afterwards engaged in farming and in merchandise, and continued in trade until about 12 years ago, when he retired from business. Mr. Mills was twice married, his second partner in life surviving and caring for him most tenderly to the end. He had one son and two daughters. He entered the Congregational church here at its organization-the first formed in Lockport. Until within a few years, he enjoyed uniformly good health. About two years since he was stricken with paralysis, and Saturday night last, from the effects of dropsy, he expired. He was widely respected and beloved, and his "end was peace." His funeral at the Congregational church was attended by a large portion of the community.

Death of Mrs. Freer

Died: - Mrs. Mary Freer of advanced old age, at the residence of her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. D.C. Baldwin, Lockport, Ill., in her 87th year, at nearly eight o'clock p.m. November 1st, 1879. The dear departed was the widow of Elias Freer, who died in Lockport at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Francis Hanford on February 4th, 1868. His father, John Freer, was born in Ulster County, New York, July 16th, 1758, and his mother in Clavenack, Columbia County, New York; her maiden name was Margaret Bennett.

Mrs. Mary Freer was born in Benson, Rutland County, Vermont, February, 1793. She was the mother of ten children, five boys and five girls: Lemuel C. Paine Freer, a lawyer, born September 18, 1813. Joseph Warren Freer, a doctor, born August 10, 1816. Margaret Freer (Mrs. R.J. Boylan), born June 18, 1819. James B. Freer, born August 1, 1822, died January, 1851. Villetta Cornell Freer (Mrs. Dr. Oatman), born September 17, 1824. Cornelia Ann Freer (Mrs. D.C. Baldwin), born July 2, 1828. Nathan Calvin Freer, born September 26, 1830, died November 20, 1848. Thaddeus Romeyn Freer, born June 16, 1834, died in the cause of his country with the 105th Regiment, Illinois State Volunteers, January 31, 1863. Louise Freer (Mrs. Francis Hanford), born November 6, 1836. Caroline Freer, born August 12, 1839, died December 13, 1839.

For the past ten years Mrs. Freer was a confirmed invalid; the last year however showing a marked improvement in mental ability and bodily quietude. Her mind was very clear and she read and conversed freely. She was a lifelong and devoted member of the Baptist church. The funeral services were held at the residence of D.C. Baldwin, Rev. Goff of this place [Lockport[officiating. A large number of friends and relatives from abroad were present.

From the Will County Advertiser, November 5, 1879. Editor's note: This obit is a model for what every genealogist hopes to find. It is a nearly perfect example, except for one thing: what was Mrs. Freer's maiden name and who were her parents? It's almost as if the obit is not about her. However, any of us would be thrilled to find such an item about one of our people.

Mrs. Laymon's Death

An Old Resident of Braceville Township - Mother of Mrs. D. R. Anderson Passes Away -- In yesterday's Herald was mentioned the death of Mrs. Thomas Laymon in her home in Braceville Township. Mr. and Mrs. D. R. Anderson had been called by telegram to the home of the Laymons on account of the serious illness of the deceased, and although typhoid fever and pleurisy had combined in an attack upon her vitality, it was hardly expected she would be taken away so soon. Her sickness lasted but a week. The spirit took its eternal flight at 9 o'clock Tuesday morning. The funeral will be from the house Thursday forenoon, at 11 o'clock, Rev. J. H. Ryan of the Coal City Methodist church officiating. Interment will be made in the Braceville & Gardner cemetery.

The deceased settled in Braceville some time before the war. Her maiden name was Esther Colwell and she was first married to James Morrison, who died when they had trod life's pathway together but a comparatively short time. Two children resulted from this union, now known as Mrs. John Maxwell and Mrs. Andrew McKeen. The former's husband is dead and she has been residing of late at the home of her mother. Mrs. McKeen and family reside in Coal

City.

On April 10th, 1861, Esther Morrison was married to Thomas Laymon. As he was a soldier in the Union army during the war, she was called upon to endure the axiety and privation which so many wives and mothers experienced during that trying period. But one child was born to Mr. and Mrs. Laymon, a daughter, Elva J., who is now the wife of D. R. Anderson, county superintendent of schools. Few were better known than Mrs. Laymon, her residence in Brace-ville Township covering a period of forty years or more. She was highly respected for her womanly nature and upright life. Passing away at the age of 60, she had not quite filled out the scriptural allotment of years. The community mourns with the bereaved and extends its heartfelt sympathy to them in their sorrow.

Type in a keyword or two and you'll get a complete EB entry on the subject. But alongside it will be recent magazine articles, books, and related Web sites from EB's database of over 125,000 reviews. If you don't know exactly what you're looking for, start exploring subsections. There are also detailed news sections, including weather and sports. And to top it off, they have thrown in a searchable version of the Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary. The whole thing is free, but if you really like the paper version you can get it for only \$1,250. Take a look.

City Directories - Gold Mines of Information

We all know that city directories exist, and some of us have used them to locate our ancestors. But beyond mere location aids, they can be veritable gold minds of information. In addition to a householder's name one can find his wife's name, his occupation and/or his employer, and his house number and street. In the case of a widow, her name will often be listed as the householder as "Jones, Mary (wid of John)", thus giving a clue to the death date of the husband. Tracking a family through successive years of city directories can chart their movements about a city, can track career moves, follow the development of a business, and can give clues to when someone died.

In our geographical area most of the city directories were and still are published by R. L. Polk & Co., of St. Paul, MN and later of Kansas City, MO. The books are divided into three sections: the first is a "yellow pages"-type listing of busiesses, schools, cemeteries, etc. The next section is an alphabetical listing of householders and businesses. The businesses will have listed the officers of the company. The third section lists all the houses and buildings, with numbers, street by street, and notes where each cross street intersectes. This last section is invaluable in locating a particular house, as street numbers change over the years, and using cross street intersections can help to zero in on a location.

This third section can be most interesting, as reading the entries for a whole neighborhood can tell who the neighbors were, how close to schools a family lived, or what businesses were in their neighborhood.

These directories have always carried advertising, both as regular "space" ads and as mentions across the top of each page. The ads are also of interest to researchers, both as clues to ancestors' employment and also as "signs of the times."

A related kind of directory is the Farmers Directory, which gives the same sort of information about those who lived outside of towns or cities. They give similar personal information but in addition give specifics of their agricultural pursuits. In early days many farms had names, often derived from the original homesteader's name or from the particular production of the farm (i.e., livestock, dairy, grains). Some editions also gave the brand and year of the farmer's automobile!

Directories should be considered a routine source for every family search. Check all three sections and you may find some good clues. And you may find yourself reading on just for fun.

Most fitting tributes were paid the memory of Andrew Ambrewster yesterday. The Norwegian Lutheran church was packed with sympathizing friends and relatives. Rev. Aarrestad and Rev. Swartz each spoke touchingly, the former in the Norwegian tongue and Mr. Swartz in English. The church choir sang hymns in Norwegian and English. The floral offerings were magnificent. They consisted of: a pillow from the Morris Fish and Game Club, to which the deceased belonged, which was characterized by a broken fish pole of remarkable design; a crescent, a cross, a wreath, a letter "A" or the set pieces, and several bouquets. Interment was in Evergreen Cemetery and the following served as pallbearers: John Christenson, Ole Paulson, Chris. Olson, Lars Foxford, Andrew Arneson, and Johan Olson.

From The Wilmington Advocate, April 20, 1917:

Former Old Wilmington Resident Brought Here for Burial - Mrs. Mary Campbell Ritchie, widow of Alexander M. Ritchie, was born in Richmond, Canada, 80 years ago. She came to Illinois when about one year old and spent the greater part of her life in Wilmington. She was a daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth Campbell, who were among the earliest settlers in Wilmington-- about the time several other Scotch families moved here, including the Stewarts, McIntyres, McIntoshes, Bells, Whittens, and others. These families were charter members of the Presbyterian church.

Mrs. Ritchie united with the church here when a girl. Her father and mother were buried here. It was here that all of her children were born. The latter part of her life was spent in the home of her daughter, Mrs. McKee, of Kansas City, Mo. The remains were brought to Wilmington for burial on Saturday, April 14, and services were held in the Presbyterian church, conducted by the pastor, the Rev. Edgar Beckwith. Interment in Oakwood.

From The Joliet Republican, August 15, 1874:

On Saturday last the funeral services were solemnized by the Rev. J.M. Caldwell at the M.E. church in this city [Joliet] of one of the first and oldest settlers of this city. Mrs. Esther Comstock, widow of Dr. A.M.G. Comstock, came to this city with her husband in the fall of 1836 and had since been a permanent resident of the city and county up to the day of her death, which took place on Tuesday of last week. Mrs. Comstock was born in Columbia County, New York, in the year 1790, and was consequently nearly 84 years of age. She was married to her late husband in Thompkins County, N.Y., and they emigrated from that county to this State. She was the mother of nine children, three of whom, Mrs. G.B. Davis of Channahon, Mr. Adam Comstock and Miss Mary Comstock of this city survive her. She leaves a very large circle of friends to mourn with her bereaved children their sad loss. "Anoble life well spent" would be her most fitting epitaph.

From The Morris Herald, Friday, June 20, 1879:

Death of Joshua Collins

At about 11 o'clock a.m. on last Saturday our city was cast into the deepest anxiety by the arrival of a messenger from Mr. Collins' late residence, four miles north of Morris, post haste for Dr. Ridgway, with the startling intelligence that Mr. Collins had been struck by lightning and was seriously if not fatally injured; but ere the Doctor got fairly started and while our business men and the personal friends of the deceased were, with bated breath, awaiting further news and hoping that his accident might not be serious, another messenger arrived with the sad news that he was Mr. Collins had been in the field cultivating corn when he discovered a dark cloud which threatened rain. He hurried home, and led his team into a small wooden stable. He had put them in the stalls next to the east door ... when a thunderbolt struck the east end of the stable at the ridge pole and passed down the side, part entering the stable and killing Mr. Collins and the horse by whose side he was standing. He was found within five or ten minutes of the accident, his head lying near the door, his hat having fallen outside, and his body under the legs of the dead horse. His death was doubtless instantaneous.

Mr. Collins was born september 19, 1820, in Albany County, N.Y., and came to Illinois with his father's family, settling in Grundy County September 20, 1834, and has resided here continually from that time to the day of his death. In 1845 he married Harriet Cryder, only daughter of the late Judge Henry Cryder, who survives him. He leaves three daughters, all married, and two sons, Cryder and Joshua, who are unmarried. He leaves four brothers, Hon. Philip Collins, now residing in Florida; Theran, now residing in Oarsons, Kansas; George, now residing in California; and Jeremiah, his twin. He was a man of great physical strength and of firm resolve, yet kind and courteous. He had accumulated a large fortune, leaving some 6,000 acres of improved and very valuable lands in this county, together with a large number of horses, ponies, sheep, hogs and cattle, among them about one thousand head of fat steers.

His funeral took place from his late residence on Monday morning and was by far the largest one ever had in this county, there being 125 carriages in the procession. The services were conducted by the Rev. J.A. Montgomery of the Congregational church of this city, Judge W.T. Hopkins having charge. Messrs. Samuel Hoge, C.H. Goold, Wm. Stevens, L.W. Claypool, Henry McEwen and Jno. W. Ridings acted as pallbearers, whilst nearly all the early settlers of Grundy County were present. He was buried in the family cemetery in the timber near the Aux Sable Creek. As the funeral cortege approached and surrounded the new-made grave, and the body was being lowered into it, Mrs. Collins fainted away. The entire family seemed inconsolable and few eyes were dry.
