At Carroll, IA., recently was taken a photograph of five generations in direct descent. Some of the representatives formerly lived in Black Hawk county. The great-greatgrandmother is Mrs. Catharine WINGERT, whose home is at Raymond. She spent several months recently with her daughter, Mrs. Joseph Ortner, at Carroll. Mrs. Martin Reinhart, of Mt. Carmel, daughter of Mrs. Ortner, represents the third generation, Mrs. Barney Sanders of Milford, Ia., the fourth and little Joseph Sanders represents the fifth.

In speaking of the picture the Carroll Times says:

"Mrs. Wingert, from whom all the others are descended, is 83 years old and in good health for one of her years. She was born in December 1831 near Buffalo, N.Y., where her early years were passed, and where she was married at 18 years, to Markus Wingert, who is no longer living. Four of her children were born in New York, one of them Mrs. Ortner. The first lowa home of the family was in Black Hawk county, where Mrs. Wingert still lives and where Mr. and Mrs. Ortner were married. Later the Ortners came to this county, settling near Mt. Carmel."

BLACKBIRDS FOR POT CAN BE SKINNED WITH NEATNESS, DISPATCH

To prepare blackbirds for the pot it is not necessary to go the trouble of plucking the feathers after immersing them in hot water as is done with chicken or other fowl. There is a much quicker process, as well as a better one. The wings and legs should be cut close to the body with a scissors or a knife and the balance is easy. The bird should be taken in both hands, the skin broken at the back and pulled in each direction, the body popping out neat and clean. The head can be twisted off with a turn of the wrist and the removal of the skin results also in taking away much of the "game" flavor which is objected to by many persons. If the bodies are well cleaned and place in mild salt water over night they will be found to be as toothsome as any game which can be secured, sepecially for potpie, altho they are fine if stuffed with ordinary bread filling with a large oyster added in each.

BROTHERS REUNITED 39 YEARS AFTER DONEGAL PARTING
John Has Been Rairoad Man in Waterloo and David Spokane Firefighter

Thirty-nine years ago John McNELLIS set out from his home in mountainous Donegal in the north tip of Ireland for a steamer and train journey to Waterloo, IA., which letters from "Uncle William"-William McNELLIS, pioneer Black Hawk county farmer, said held great promise for a young man. Among those to whom John said farewell was rosy-checked, 10 year old David McNELLIS, his brother.

Stranger Walks In

This week a husky stranger walked into the John McNELLIS home at 120 Newell St., and with a trace of Donegal brogue greeted the Waterloo man. He had to identify himself as "David" before he was recognized. David came to America 10 years after his brother-but other relatives had advised Spokane, WA., as the city with a future, and that's where David went. For 10 years he a had been a city fireman in Spokane. Before that, he had served as an American soldier in the world war, overseas for 10 months. The two brothers had never had the opportunity to visit each other.

Also reunited for the first time in 39 years were David and an older sister, Mrs. Jane TITUS, in Alexandria, MN., whom he visited en route east. The sister recognized him, tho she hadn't seen him since he was 10, when she already living in America, had visited Ireland, and was accompanied to America by John. The Waterloo brother, now a boilermaker, spent most of his life as an Illinois Central shops employee.

EAGLE TOWNSHIP CEMETERY:

March 1, 1858 on petition of Owen McMANUS and others, Eagle township was organized. The burial ground on Section 7, containing one acre was donated for this purpose in 1874 by Wm. H. THOMPSON and wife. The neighbors generally contributed for fencing, etc., which was done in November 18, 1874. Wm. P. THOMPSON, P. B. ROSS and Peter McNALLY are the trustees. Up to August 1878 only three graves have been filled. (From Black Hawk County History 1878.
