KENTUCKY'S ACTIVE MILITIA—1786.

Compiled by Mrs. Jouett Taylor Cannon.

The following list of Military Certificates, a majority of which were issued on August 10th, 1787, and dates following, was compiled from the little yellow original slips found in file boxes recently transferred from the office of Adjutant General Henry Denhardt to the custody of the Historical Society.

The service performed was principally in the two expeditions of September, 1786, under Gen. George Rogers Clark and Col. Benjamin Logan against the Wabash and Shawnee Indians respectively. Under the "Compact with Virginia" of 1789 it was provided that the new State of Kentucky should assume the obligation of paying for these expeditions, or of any military operations wholly for the protection of the Kentucky frontier, and the books of the Auditor's Office show that beginning with 1801, the Certificates were honored as presented.

The original Certificates were signed by Edmund Lyne, Isaac Shelby and Richard Taylor, Commissioners appointed by the Governor of Virginia for settling the claims for this service. Some later certificates were signed by Baker Ewing and James McDowell.

Besides the expeditions against the Wabash and Shawnees a few of the Certificates are for services "on the Frontiers," one for the "Paint Lick expedition" and one for "the Southern Expedition."

Since the serial numbers on some of the Certificates run considerably above the number of those here listed it is evident that many of the claims were not included in these herewith recorded, and it may be noted that very few of the officers' Certificates are on the list.

It may interest descendants of the men who served in these expeditions against the Indians on the Northwest of the Ohio, to know that this service outside of the State, renders them eligible to membership in the United Society of the Daughters of 1812.
