OCCESSIVE NOT ONL

Samuel <u>Grant</u> Acton, propietor of Acton's Park, Anne Arundel County, died yesterday morning at his home at Brooklyn. On August 15 Mr. Acton was stricken with paralysis in his left side and had been gradually sinking since. His wife and several of his children were at his bedside when he passed away at 3:15 A.M.

Mr. Acton was a stanch Democrat and was an active worker in the party until several years ago. He served in the House of Delegates for one term and was constable and sheriff of the county for more than 15 years.

Mr. Acton was born in Augusta, Maine, August 1829. He was the son of Nathan and Jane Acton, who came from Ireland in 1828. His childhood was spent in Philadelphia, where his father died in 1859. In 1853, Mr. Acton came to Baltimore and started a small gas plant in opposition to the company then having a monopoly of the industry in the city. In 1857 he opened the park on the other side of Long Bridge that bears his name. For nearly a quarter of a century the resort was the pleasure ground of the most prominent people of the city.

During the Civil War Mr. Acton, with a crew of men, was engaged in the hazardous business of furnishing arms and supplies to the Confederate soldiers in Southern cities. He ran the blockade many time during the early part of the war, but later was less fortunate and before the cessation of hostilities was imprisoned three times. He was released at the close of the war by General Wool.

In 1877 he was elected a member of the House of Delegates and during his term he succeeded in pushing a bill through the House abolishing the toll on Long Bridge.

When he retired from the position of constable of the county his son, the late Harry Acton, was made Chief of Police.

In 1852 Mr. Acton was married to Miss Ann Elizabeth Prentiss, of Massachusetts, who died in 1877. He is survived by four children by his first wife, they are Mrs. Lillian Fitzpatrick, Mrs. May Lowery, Mrs. Charles Gibson and Miss Blanch Acton. He also leaves a widow, Mrs. Alice M. Acton and two children by her, Mrs. C. E. Grieneisen and Mrs. Clarence J. Acton.

The funeral will take place tomorrow. Rev. Thomas Lowe, pastor of Williams Street Independent Methodist Church and Rev. Mr. Mills, pastor of Brooklyn Methodist Episcopal Church, will conduct the services.
