Louise B. Ryder, 3105 Green Arbor Pl., Jacksonville, FL 32277-2803, seeks art pieces of china decorations made by her ancestor **O. Luetta Bumstead Braumuller**, originally of Springfield. Mrs. Ryder's research has proven that Luetta descended from several Pilgrim families, including Bliss, Chapin, Hitchcock, Leach, Morgan, Stevens, Weld, Wood and Wright, all well known names in the Springfield area. Luetta was the subject of several articles in artistic periodicals of the late nineteenth century. She was born in Monson, MA, 4 December, 1856. She studied art in several European capitals before becoming internationally recognized for her figure painting, china plates and other statuary. She also won acclaim as a writer and publisher, and was a leading, and early, advocate of women's rights. Most of Luetta's works are unsigned, but if any reader knows or believes that Luetta's art exist in their area, please contact Mrs. Ryder.

RETIREMENT (from a child's view)

After a Christmas break, a teacher asked her young pupils how they spent their holidays. One small boy wrote the following:

"We always used to spend Christmas with Grandpa and Grandma. They used to live here in a big brick home, but Grandpa got retarded and they moved to Florida. Now they live in a place with a lot of other retarded people. They all live in little tin boxes. They ride on big three-wheeled tricycles and they all wear name tags because they don't know who they are. They go to a big building called a wrecked hall, but if it was wrecked, they got it fixed, because it's bright now. They play games and do exercises there, but they don't do them very good.

There is a swimming pool there. They go into it and just stand there with their hats on. I guess they don't know how to swim.

As you go into their park, there is a doll house with a little man sitting in it. He watches all day so they can't get out without him seeing them. When they sneak out they go to the beach and pick up shells.

My Grandma used to bake cookies and stuff, but I guess she forgot how. Nobody cooks, they just eat out. They eat the same thing every night, early birds. Some of the people are so retarded that they don't know how to cook at all, so my Grandma and Grandpa bring food into the wrecked hall and they call it "pot luck".

My Grandma says Grandpa worked all his life and earned his retardment. I wish they would move back up here, but I guess the little man in the doll house won't let them out."

(Note- He forgot to add that his Grandpa and Grandma have a hobby, they look up information on their Grandpa and Grandma. They call themselves "geologists".)
