[WALTER HATCH]

[1: 335-338: OS Docket #9,609 contains the will and inventory.] The will of Walter Hatch, late of Scituate, provided for his wife, Mary and made bequests to his sons, Samuel (eldest), John (executor), Israel (executor), Antipas (to be cared for by John and Israel), and Joseph (youngest): daughters, Jane Sherman, and Bethyah Ford. He also made a bequest to "all my grandchildren that are born before my death." Wit: Thomas Ouldham, Joseph Lapham and Samuel Lapham (each of whom signed by a mark).

The inventory was taken 1 April 1701 by Josiah Holmes, Thomas Macomber and Israel Hatch. Oath was taken by John and Israel Hatch on 2 April 1701.

[JOHN and SARAH WOOD]

[1: 338-339: OS Docket #23,387 contains only the inventory. The Letter of Administration is missing.] On 2 April 1701, Letters of Administration were granted to Nathanael Wood of Plymouth, "only surviving son of John Wood, sometimes of Plimouth, deceased, and Sarah Wood, Relict of John Wood, late also deceased."

The inventory of John Wood, formerly of Plymouth, deceased, and of Mary [*sic*] his relict and widow, also deceased, was undated. Oath was made by Nathaniel Wood on 2 April 1701.

[FRANCIS CROOKER]

[1: 340-341: OS Docket #5,252 contains the will and inventory.] The will of Francis Crooker [*of Marshfield*], dated 11 September 1700 and proved 7 April 1701, mentioned his son, Jonathan; daughter, Sarah Macomber; grandchildren, Daniel Crooker, Ursula Macomber and Mary/Maria Crooker; Ruth Crooker, Mercy Crooker; three granddaughters, Ursilla Macomber, Mary and Sarah (nor surnames); Mary Crooker, widow; grandchild, Francis Crooker; and granddaughter Abigail Crooker. Wit: John Jones, Elenor Jones (his wife).

Mr. Jams Stacy family Regestord

Mehetebell Stacy Daughter to Jams Stacy and **Mehetebell Stacy** Borne March 29th 1753.

Abiel Howard Son to **Nathan Howard Jr.** of Bridgewater was born in Easton of his wife **Susanah** March the 28th 1771.

Memorandum: Mr. Ephraim Little of Marshfield appeared and upon his oath said that he for many years now past having been well acquainted with ye writing and hand of Francis Crooker abovesaid verily believes the abovesaid will to be written with is own hand. (No third witness as required by law).

The inventory, 21 March 1700/01, was taken by Ephraim Little and Anthony Eames. Oath by Jonathan Crooker dated 7 April 1701.

[JOHN DOTY]

[1: 342-343: OS Docket #6,623. See MD, 6: 77]

[CHARLES STOCKBRIDGE]

[1: 344: OS Docket # 19,472 contain the appraisal/division]. The appraisal of the estate of Charles Stockbridge, deceased, which by settlement of his estate were to belong to Samuel and Benjamin Stockbridge, when the youngest son came of age, they rendering to their mother [*now Abigail Turner*] rent during her life time, was dated 1 August 1700. Appraisers: John Bryant, William Perry, Zachariah Damon who made oath to the appraisal/division on 15 March 1700/1.

[ISAAC BUCK]

[1: 345-346: OS Docket #3218]. Division of the dower third set out to Francis [*sic*] Buck, late of Scituate, widow and Relict of Lieut. Isaac Buck, dated 30 August 1701, was made by Stephen Vinal, Nathaniel Tilden, David Jacobs and John Cushing, Jr., with one ninth part to the legal representatives of sons, Thomas Buck, James Buck and Joseph Buck, all deceased; to sons, Jonathan Buck and Benjamin Buck; and to daughters, Ruth, wife of Joseph Gannett, Mehitable, wife of Stephen Chittenden, Deborah, wife of Henry Merritt and Elizabeth, wife of Robert Whitcomb.

[JOHN HOLMES]

[1: 347: OS Docket #10,466 contain the agreement/settlement.] The agreement for settlement of the estate of John Holmes, late of Plymouth, dated 29 September 1700, was made to John Holmes of Plymouth in ye County of Plymouth in New England, eldest son, who was to pay a yearly sum to the widow, Patience Holmes, for life as her dower, and make full payment to each of the said children [*of the deceased*], that is to say: to Nathaniel, Ebenezer, Thomas, Joseph, and Desire, wife of John Churchill, who were of age to sign for themselves and to Richard, Patience, Mehitable, Sarah and George, who were minors. The agreement was signed on 29 September 1701 by the mark of Patience Holmes for her self and her minor children, the mark of George Bonum, Jr. in behalf of Richard, Thomas Holmes, Nathaniel Holmes, Joseph Holmes, the mark of Desire Churchill, John Churchill and John Holmes.

[HANNAH GANNETT]

[1: 348-350: OS Docket #8,344 contains the will and inventory.] The will of Hannah Gannet of Scituate, widow, dated 18 October 1700 and proved 31 July 1701, mentioned her late husband, Mathew, deceased and made bequests to: son, Rehoboth; Sarah, wife of Rehoboth; Elizabeth, Rebekah and Mehitabell Gannett, daughters of Rehoboth; son, Mathew; Mathew Gannet, son of Mathew; daughter, Elizabeth Leavitt (executrix); daughter, Deborah Gannett; daughter Abigail Dodson, deceased; grandson, David Adams; daughter in law Deborah Gannett; Mathew and Joseph Gannett, sons of Deborah Gannett; granddaughter, Hannah Gannett; granddaughter, Deborah Gannett. Witness: Joseph Woodworth, Daniel Lincoln and John Cushing, Jr. The will was signed by a mark.

The inventory of the estate, dated 30 July 1701, was taken by Joseph Woodworth and Samuel Clap. Oath of Elizabeth Leavitt was taken 31 July 1701.

[JONATHAN SHAW]

[1: 350-351: OS Docket #17,961 contains Letter of Administration and inventory.] On 25 September 1701, Letters of Administration on the estate of Jonathan Shaw, late of Plymouth, deceased, were granted to Persis Shaw, Relict and widow of Jonathan and to Jonathan Shaw, his son.

The inventory, dated 30 July 1701, was taken by Isaac Cushman, John Waterman and Samuel Sturtevant. Oath signed by the mark of Persis and by Jonathan Shaw on 25 September 1701.

[MARY RAUNCE]

[1: 351-353: OS Docket #16,485 contains the will and inventory.] The will of Mary Raunce of Scituate, dated 12 September 1701 and proved 29 September 1701, mentioned her friend, Josiah Turner; (brother, Joseph Coleman, deceased), sisters, Sarah and Abiah (no surnames given). Wit: Amos Turner, Mary Turner and Thomas Turner.

The inventory, dated 23 September 1701, was taken by Joseph Otis and Thomas Turner. Josiah Turner, executor, made oath on 29 September 1701.

[Lieut. JOHN HAYWARD]

[1: 353-356: OS Docket #9,805 contains the Letter of Administration and inventory. The division is missing.] On 16 October 1701, Letters of Administration on the estate of Lieut. John Haward, late of Bridgewater, were granted to Martha Haward, Relict and widow of John and to his eldest son, John Haward.

The inventory, dated 24 September 1701, was taken by Thomas Snell, Edward Mitchell and Joseph Hayward contained a great deal of real estate. Oath by Martha and John Snell on 16 October 1701.

The division of the estate was dated 15 October 1701, was mutually agreed and consented to by all of the heirs. The widow was given her dower and portions were set off to sons: John (eldest), Jonathan, and Edward; James Haward, the only son of James Haward, deceased (one moiety for James and the other to his two sisters); [sons in law and daughters] Edward Fobes and his wife; Zackeus Packard and his wife, and Henry Kingman and his wife, by Elisha Wadsworth and Thomas Snell. It was signed, on 16 October 1761, by Martha Haward (by mark), John Haward, Jonathan Haward, Ephraim Haward, Edward Fobes, Elizabeth Fobes (by mark), Zaccheus Packard in behalf of himself and Sarah, his wife, Henry Kingman in behalf of himself and Bethyah, his wife, and Edward Mitchell, as guardian to the children of James Haward, deceased.

[JOSIAH BAKER]

[1: 356: OS Docket #797 contains guardianship paper.] On 24 March 1701/2, Josiah Baker of Marshfield, about 16 years of age, chose his brother, Samuel Baker of Marshfield to be his guardian during his minority.

[JOSIAH SMITH]

[1: 357: OS Docket #18,513 contains the Letter of Administration and inventory.] Letters of Administration on the estate of Joseph Smith, late of Scituate, deceased, were granted to Annah Smith, Relict and widow, Jeremiah Hatch, Sr., and James Hatch, on 21 April 1702.

The inventory of the estate of Josiah Smith of Scituate, who dyed 13 February 1701/2, was taken by Jeremiah Hatch, Batcheldor Wing and [name illegible] and sworn to by Jeremiah Hatch and Anna Smith on 30 April 1702.

[TRYPHOSA WEST]

[1: 358: OS Docket #22,323 contains the Letter of Administration. The inventory is missing.] On 21 April 1703 [sic], Letters of Administration on the estate of Tryphosa West, late of Duxborough were granted to Samuel West.

The inventory, was dated 4 April 1702 and oath was made by Samuel West on 21 April 1702.

The Identity of Mercy French, wife of Joseph⁶ Turner

The ancestry of Joseph⁶ Turner (*Japheth*,⁵⁻³ "young" John,² *Humphrey*¹) has been well documented in the literature. He was a descendant of *Mayflower* passengers Stephen Hopkins through his daughter Damaris; Edward Doty through two of his children John and Mary; and Francis Cooke through his son Jacob.^[66] Joseph's birth was recorded at Middleboro on 23 July 1738^[67] and he died after 26 August 1766 when he was mentioned in the will of his grandmother, Hannah (Hatch) (Turner) (Tinkham) Tupper.^[68] Joseph married Mercy French in Middleboro on 5 October 1757.^[69] Their son and only child, Joshua⁷ Turner, was born there on 13 December 1757.^[70]

The ancestry of Mercy French was not so easily solved. Finally, after unsuccessfully tracing various French families in New England, an account of her ancestry, birth and marriage was found in a monograph by Henry B. Wright.^[71] To begin the process of verifying Mr. Wright's statements, a search of the Berkley Town Records was made. A Mercy, the daughter of John and Mercy French, was born in Berkley on 13 September 1737. The births of her siblings, Hopestill and John, were recorded with her, and the births of younger siblings, Asa, Azubah, Lydia and Rhode, and the death of Rhode, were recorded elsewhere in the volume.^[72]

None of this, of course, proves that this Mercy French was the one who married Joseph Turner. However, the clues to her identity turned out to be the Revolutionary War record for Joshua⁷ Turner. The French genealogy said that in 1764, Mercy (French) Turner requested her brother, Asa French, to take her son, Joshua, then aged about six, to bring up in his household until Joshua should come of age.^[73] This presupposes Joseph Turner's death or disappearance by that date. Henry Parks Wright's *Soldiers of Oakham* cites an

CEMETERY RECORDS

Marshfield Boy Scout Christian Kimball received his Eagle Scout commendation in 1997. For his required community project, Christian decided to copy all the gravestones in Marshfield. Linda Ashley was his advisor for this project.

With the help of Christian's family and other Scouts, an attempt was made to locate all existing stones. To make the project manageable, copying was limited to those deaths prior to 1950, though a few later entries were listed to include all names to be found on one stone or so that the entire cemetery was copied. Since there were so few after 1950 in this particular cemetery, **all legible stones have been included here.**

All the records were put into a computer database, using Lotus Approach software, and also transferred to Microsoft Excel. So that the database would be fully searchable, all dates and ages were put into a consistent format.

For purposes of this publication, additional information to be found on the stones has been included, using the following key: B at = place of birth, D at = place where death occurred, D of = cause of death, F = father, M = mother, P = parents, S = spouse. "By" indicates who the individual was buried beside, if that seems to help identify them. When several names appear on one stone, an indication is made of that also.

All identifying information found on the stone has been included.

Stones in the larger Marshfield cemeteries had previously been copied by Edward H. Whorf in 1906, including all stones up to 1850. He did not, however, copy the smaller, family cemeteries. This is unfortunate, since apparently several, if not many, of those have since been lost. Several of those still to be found were published in the March 2000 Vol. 66 No. 1 issue of the *Mayflower Quarterly*. During the work by Christian Kimball and Linda Ashley, this Whorf's was used as a reference for those stones now found to be illegible. If a stone was listed in Whorf's list but was not found by Kimball, a note was made.

CENTRE MARSHFIELD CEMETERY

Copied by Christian Kimball and Linda Ashley July 7, 1996.

There was once an Episcopal church located near the corner of Grove and Ferry streets, in the section of town called Marshfield Centre. This is not the area now referred to as "the Center," around Webster Square, the Post Office, and Town Hall (that area was previously known as South Marshfield), but was the area near the Centre Marshfield train station and the Centre Marshfield Post Office, now both gone.

This small, but well-kept cemetery is located at that corner. The earliest stones, from the 1750s, represent mainly the White, Lewis, Keen, and Hall fam-



ilies. The latest death date found in this cemetery was 1970, with several in the 1950's. All stones to July 7, 1996, have been included here.
