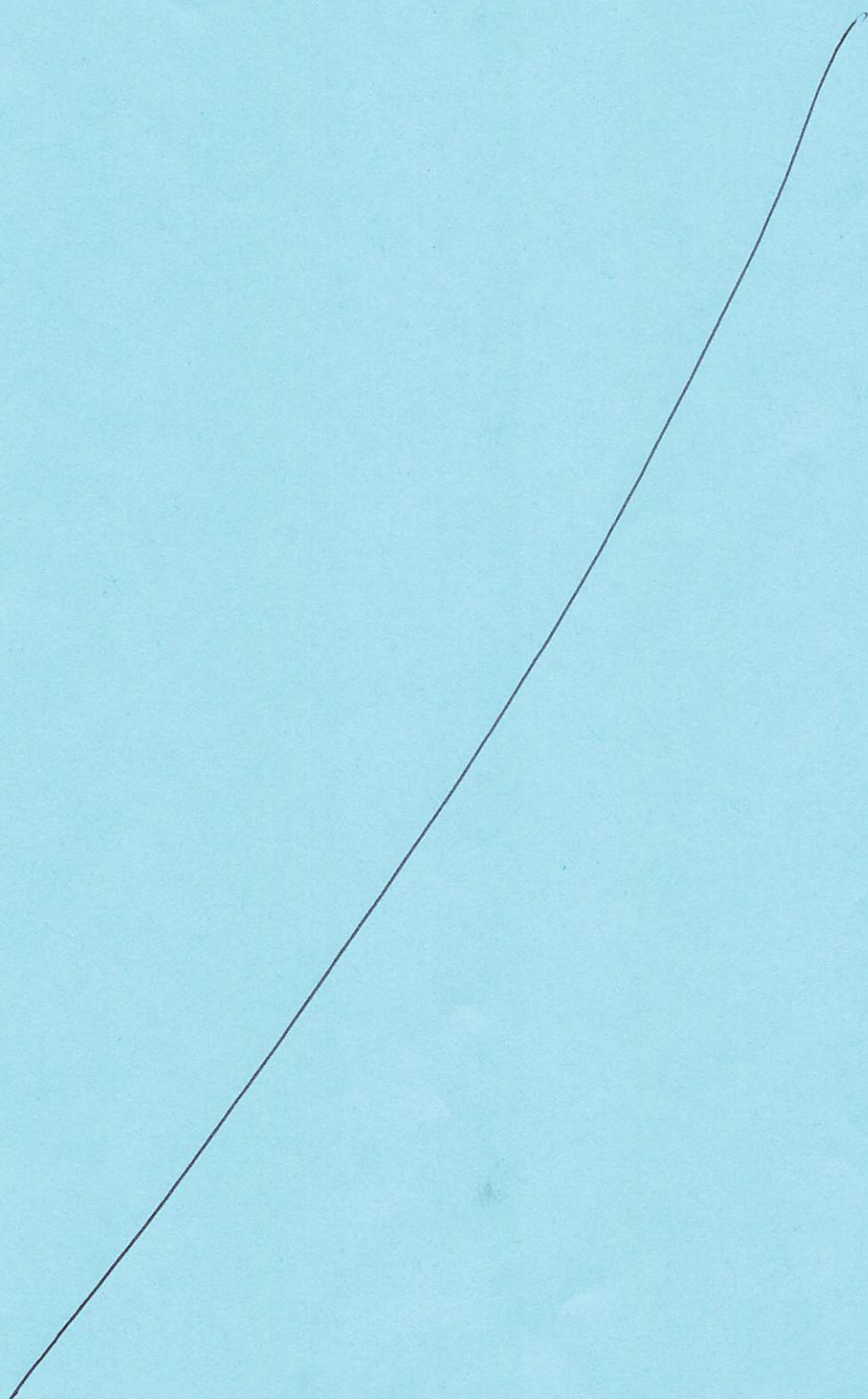

THE MARRIAGES OF PIKE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

(The contents of this book are taken from an original copy of The History of Pike County, Mississippi, c. 1909 by Luke Ward Conerly.) This book was printed by the Brandon Printing Company of Nashville, Tennessee and is now out of print, a copy of portions of the book was made by E. Russ Williams in the 1950's, but this too is out of print. The original copy of this book from which this is extracted is in the Birmingham Public Library, in Birmingham, Alabama. Because the Pike County Courthouse was burned in about 1876, most all of the records were lost; therefore, the importance of this book is tremendous. The census of the year 1830 is not available. Pike County was formed from the County of Marion in the year of 1811.

The author has a great interest in this book, since his great grandmother was Mary Jane Conerly (she married William Fletcher Sandel.) Mary Jane Conerly's father was Dr. John R. Conerly, his wife was Elizabeth Tynes... Dr. John R. Conerly was a son of Owen Conerly, who was a brother to the older Luke Conerly...

My hope is that this material may help you in your research, as much as it has helped me in mine. I am also a direct descendant of Henry Sandel and Catherine Nobles mentioned in this book.

In the year, 1799 John Warren and his wife Priscilla settled on the Otopasas(pronounced Topisaw), which is located below the junction of East Fork and on the west side of the stream of water. They became the parents of Sally Warren, wife of William McCollough. He had come to Pike County in the year 1814, at the age of 15. His father was Alexander McCollough, and he came from Ireland into Georgia. The wife of Alexander was a Miss Marshall from Scotland. After William McCollough married Sally Warren, they settled on the Topisaw River and became the parents of Winston, Jasper, Olive, Sarah and Melinda.

Jacob Kean married Keziah Gates on February 13, 1816, Pike County.

Daniel Sandell (also spelled Sandal, Sandall, Sandle), was the son of George Henry Sandell and Catherine Nobles, who lived in the Orangeburg District of South Carolina, where he was born in 1792. He married Charity Eleanor Corley, the daughter of Jeremiah Corley, from the Barnwell District ,South Carolina, September 17, 1815. They became the parents of Gabriel, Walter, Rev. John Wesley Sandell (a Methodist Minister), Samuel Murry, Monroe, Mary Ann and Martha.

(Author's note: Mr. A.S. Salley's book on Orangeburg District, South Carolina, records many baptisms and other material on the Henry Sandel and other families, who later migrated to Pike County, Mississippi).

Peter Felder came from Barnwell District, South Carolina in 1811, and settled what is known as the Vaughn place near Magnolia, Miss. Peter was the father of John Felder, who was also born in Barnwell District, South Carolina, and married Elizabeth Sandell October 15, 1812. They were the parents of Mary Catherine, who married Seaborn Alford; and Wyatt Westley, Elizabeth G., Gabriel Nally, Levi Darius, Robert Henry and Simeon Noble.

Authors' note: (Elizabeth Sandell was the daughter of Henry Sandell and Catherine Nobles,) who are the author's great, great, great grandparents. Catherine Sandel is buried in the Felder Cemetery and she died in 1846.

Alexander McCollough emigrated from Ireland to Georgia. His wife was Miss Marshall of Scotland. They were the parents of William McCollough,They were the parents of Winston, Benjamin, Jasper, Olive, Melinda and Sarah.

Matthew and Archie McElwen came from Carolina in the year 1800 and they settled also on Topisaw Creek. James a son of Matthew, married Nancy Barnes, widow of John Barnes, (she was a Bearden before she married J. Barnes and was the mother of Pinkney and W. Clinton Barnes)

John Walker was a native of Virginia, born in the year 1785. He emigrated to Georgia and married Sarah Gates, who was born in 1790. They emigrated to the Mississippi Territory in 1814 and settled on Topisaw Creek. They were the parents of Jeremiah, William, John E., David C., Augustus, Sarah, Elizabeth, Mary, Zebiah, Martha and Elisha Walker. William Walker married Ruth Harvey, daughter of Michael Harvey, who settled on Pearl River in Marion County in the year 1808, where Daniel Harvey was born in 1812.

William Walker settled on Silver Creek in the southern part of the county. He was not related to the Topisaw Walkers. He came from Georgia and married Jane Duncan, a daughter of Cullen Duncan and Fanny Conerley; subsequently wife of Elijah Turnage. The following are the names of their children: Martha Ann, married first her cousin James Duncan, and when he died, she married John Cothorn; Sarah Jane who remained single, Barbara, who married John Estess; Pollie died early; Annie, who married William Rushing; Levisa, who married Charlie Rainey; Margaret, who married Harper Garner, son of Calvin Garner and Ruhmie Ward of Lawrence County, from South Carolina; Cornelius, who married Nannie Boone, daughter of Skinner Boone; Wesley,

Roda Walker married Nancey Gates from Georgia, and settled the Turnipseed place on the east side of Topisaw, five miles north of Holmesville in 1815. They were the parents of Elijah Cothorn, who married Catherine Dunnaway, daughter of Jonothan Dunaway, and they were the parents of John, Joseph, and William Cothorn. The above Turnipseed mentioned, married a Miss Brent, daughter of John Brent. They were the parents of : Laura, who married Ben Briley; Clifton, who married Miss Ada Marshal; Harris, who became a dentist; Berkley, who married Mary Huffman.

Lazarus Reeves came from South Carolina and settled on Clear Creek in the year 1811. He was the father of John Reeves, who settled on Clear Creek in 1812, and Alfred Reeves, who settled on Topisaw Creek, and Zachariah Reeves. John Reeves was the father of Jesse, William E., Elijah and Warren, and Leah, wife of William Williams; Lenora, wife of Jasper McCollough; Jane, wife of Pink Cole and Mary, who lost her first husband in the Confederate Army; subsequently wife of David Forest.

Edward and Elizabeth Gatlin settled a place on Clear Creek in 1815. Their son Col. James Gatlin married Rosaba Wells, a daughter of Nathaniel and Elizabeth Wells from South Carolina. James and Rosaba Gatlin were the parents of Julia; Zebulon B. Gatlin, who married Martha Hoover, Elizabeth Gatlin, who married Dr. Germany; Mary Gatlin, who married Mr. Anderson; John B. Gatlin, who married Amanda H. Strickland, Ebenezer Gatlin; Thomas Gatlin, Nathaniel Gatlin; William Gatlin.

Josiah Bartin and his wife, Elizabeth Glass, came from the state of North Carolina and settled on Big Tansopiho(Tangipahoa), where Joseph T. Martin (known as Joe Tuff) was born on April 13, 1812. They were also the parents of William G. Martin, who married Sally Wicker; James B. Martin, who married Mary Pearson; Jack Martin, and Eliza R. Martin, who married John McNabb. Joe Tuff married Lorinda Bacot, daughter of Laban Bacot.

Laban Bacot was born in South Carolina, April 23, 1776, and married Mary Betman in 1797. They emigrated from South Carolina to the Mississippi Territory in 1807. Laban and Mary Bacot were the parents of Samuel, Susana, Elizabeth, Maria, Louisa and Mary Lucinda. His wife, Mary, died in 1812 and he then married Margaret N. Love, April 23, 1822. They became the parents of Lorinda, wife of Joe Tuff Martin, Robert, Levi, William, Adam Bacot and Julia, and Rachael.

Alexander McMorris and his wife Elizabeth Baxter emigrated to South Carolina from Scotland. At the close of the Revolutionary War, they came to Mississippi and settled in Amite County. They had two children namely: Alexander, Jr. and Nancy. Alexander McMorris, Jr. married Esther Herrington, daughter of Joseph Herrington and Anne Brown from South Carolina. Alexander Morris, Jr., and Esther Herrington had two children: Richard H. McMorris, who married Maggie Jones, and Esther Ann McMorris, who married Isaac Charles Dick.

Nancy McMorris married Hardy Thompson. Isaac Charles Dick, who married Esther Ann McMorris, was a son of Jacob Dick, who was born in Switzerland and emigrated to France. His wife was Susanne Jonte' of France. They came to New York, after which they came to Louisville, Kentucky, where Isaac Charles Dick was born.

(Pike County, Mississippi was formed in 1815, from Marion County. The county seat is Magnolia.)

Daniel Quin was a son of Peter Quin, Sr., who came to Pike County in the year of 1812. He married Kitty Deer. They were the parents of Rodney, William, Frank and Emily, who married Jeremiah Coney.

(Peter Quin was a Revolutionary Soldier from South Carolina). Edwin Alford was born in North Carolina in the year 1792; after his birth his parents moved to Georgia, where he remained until the year 1807, when he came to the Mississippi Territory. Narcissa Smith married Judge James B. Quin; Margaret married H.F. Bridges and Sarah married Seamore Catching.

George II of England married Hannah Lightfoot on the 27th of May, 1759. They had a son Buxton Lawn, who married Mary Dawson(or Dorson) a grand daughter of the Lord Mayor of London. Harris Harvey married Liddy Smith, daughter of Jerre Smith. Dan married Melovie Smith. Ruth Harvey, daughter of Micele Harvey, married William Walker, a son of John Walker and Mary Gates.....

Ansel H. Prewett, son of Elisha Prewett and Ann Huckabee, married Julia Raborn, and they were parents of the following children: Sarah Ann, who married first Wesley Powell and then Howell Dickey, and husband: William Harrison Prewett, who married Polly Ann Vaughn; James Smiley Prewett, who married Elizabeth Vaughn; Martha Ann, who married Newton Nash; Elisha Tay, who married Sally Harris; Naomi Eviline, who married David Vaughn; and Mary Ann, who married Cornelius T. Zachary.

Ansel H. Prewett's second wife was a Miss Lucinda Barron, and they adopted a daughter, Ann Elizabeth, who married Erasmus Nash.

Capt. McNair of New Orleans married Miss Columbia Sarah Sydnor.

Capt. Joseph H. Miller married Miss Rachel Coney of Magnolia, Miss. John Quincy Travis married Sarah K. Coney, daughter of Jeremiah Coney and Emily Quin.

Capt. William Monroe Quin married Miss McKay, daughter of Robert M. and Eliza Harrell. Robert McKay came from Ireland. Capt. Quin and his wife had two daughters, Alice, who married Capt. Thomas A. Garner and Nanny.

Capt. Kit Hoover, son of Judge Christian Hoover and Mary Newland married Mary Virginia Barnes, daughter of Harris Barnes and Julia Lott. They had two children, Harrie and Mamie.

Fred W. Collins, son of Chauncey Collins of Connecticut and Amelia Woodruff married Mary Elizabeth Smith, daughter of William Smith and Ann Magee.

Hugh Murray Quin, son of Peter Quin, Jr., and Martha Catherine married Delilah Bearden. They had the following children: Dr. Lucius Quin, who married Courtney Magee; Wallace W. Quin, who married Neelie V.; Emma Eoline, who married Luke W. Conerley; Lula, who married Charles H. George, George married Alla Irvin. After being left a widower, Judge Quin married Nannie Sumrall, and they had two children, Henry and Ina.

William Hoover married Martha Thompson, daughter of Alexander and Dorothy Pryor Womack. Ida M. Farmer, daughter of Zachary T. Farmer and Mary J. Byars, married L. W. Conerley, May 4, 1909.

Henry Smith Bonney, son of Nancy Floyd and Perez Bonney, married Evelyn French Adonis, daughter of J. Q. Adonis and Pella Experience of Massachusetts. Henry Francis married Lucy Whitmore Adonis, and she married Joseph Page. Henry Smith Bonney and Evelyn French Adonis were the parents of the following: Nelson P. Bonney, who married Alexis Flournieque; Mrs. E. E. Levison, Washington, D. C., Mrs. W.T. Head, Flora A. Bonney; D. C. Bonney; R. M. Bonney.

Author's Note: Henry Sandel and Catherine Nobles mentioned on the first pages of this book were the parents of Daniel, Darius, Henry, Elizabeth (who married John Felder) and Rev. Peter Warren Sandel, who married Winifred Tabor, first and Louisa Winbourne, secondly. Rev. Sandel was a Methodist Circuit Rider in the Mississippi area, and was one of the organizers of the Muddy Springs Methodist Church, near McComb, (across the highway (Interstate I 55)) from Magnolia. He migrated to Texas, near Huntsville and he is buried in the East Sandy Cemetery, Walker County, Texas; he was born September 8, 1806 and he died April 18, 1866. He is the great, great grandfather of Rev. Elias Wesley Sandel, one of the writers of this book.

Thomas J. Connally married Sally McNabb. Michael Harvey, who came from Georgia married Mary Clowers. .. Owen and Mary were married January 14, 1808; they became the parents of Cullen, William W., John R., Eliza, Owen, Jr., Emily, Luke, Rebecca, Catherine, Mary Jane, Melissa and Susan.

(Author's note:) The above mentioned Owen Conerly and Mary are my great,great,great grandparents. Dr. John R. Conerly, their son, listed above, was my great,great grandfather. He married Elizabeth Tynes. Their daughter, Mary Jane, was my great grandmother; she married William Fletcher Sandel, the son of Rev. Peter Warren Sandel, a Methodist minister, who is buried in East Sandy Cemetery, Walker County, Texas. I have his New Testament, and am the 7th generation to own it. It always goes to the oldest son.

Eliza and Emily Conerly married two Ball brothers. Their father Sampson Ball was a nephew of Mary Washington, mother of George Washington. Mrs. Washington was a Ball, before she married Washington's father, Lawrence Washington. (See Mississippi Revolutionary Ancestors Book)

John Ellis of Virginia married Sarah Johnson, also of Virginia. They moved to Georgia and then to Pike County, Miss. They had two sons, Stephen Ellis and Ezekeal Parke Ellis. Stephen Ellis married Mary McGee, and they had the following children: Stephen; Mellissa, who married Rev. David M. Wiggins; Mary, who married Rev. Benjamin Impson; Gabriella, who married Hugh Bateman; and Ellen, who married Robert Babington. Sara Ellis married Judge James M. Burris. Ezekiel Ellis married the youngest daughter of Col. Thomas Cargill Warner. He was the father of E. John Ellis, Stephen D. Ellis, and Thomas Cargill Warner Ellis.

Daniel Burkhalter married Mary Palmore. They were the parents of Henry, William, John and James Burkhalter, and Eliza, who married Joseph Luter; Cynthia, who married Mike Jones; Mary, who married William Kaigler; Sarah Ann, who married Frank Leland; Louisa, who married Willis Magee, and secondly Elbert Magee. John Boon married Helen M. Sartin.

Joseph Thornhill married Elizabeth Fitzpatrick of South Carolina. They had the following children: Liddy, who married Claiborne Rushing; Polly, who married Jack Reddy; Evan J., Lucelle, John Hiram, Joseph, Patrick and William.

Drury Stovall of Georgia married Lucy Wright, also from Georgia, in 1803. They had Charles Green, John Lewis, Thomas Peter, William J., and Felix Crawford Stovall.

Children of Rev. Peter Warren Sandel (above-2nd paragraph) son of Henry Sandel and Catherine Nobles of Pike County, Miss) were the

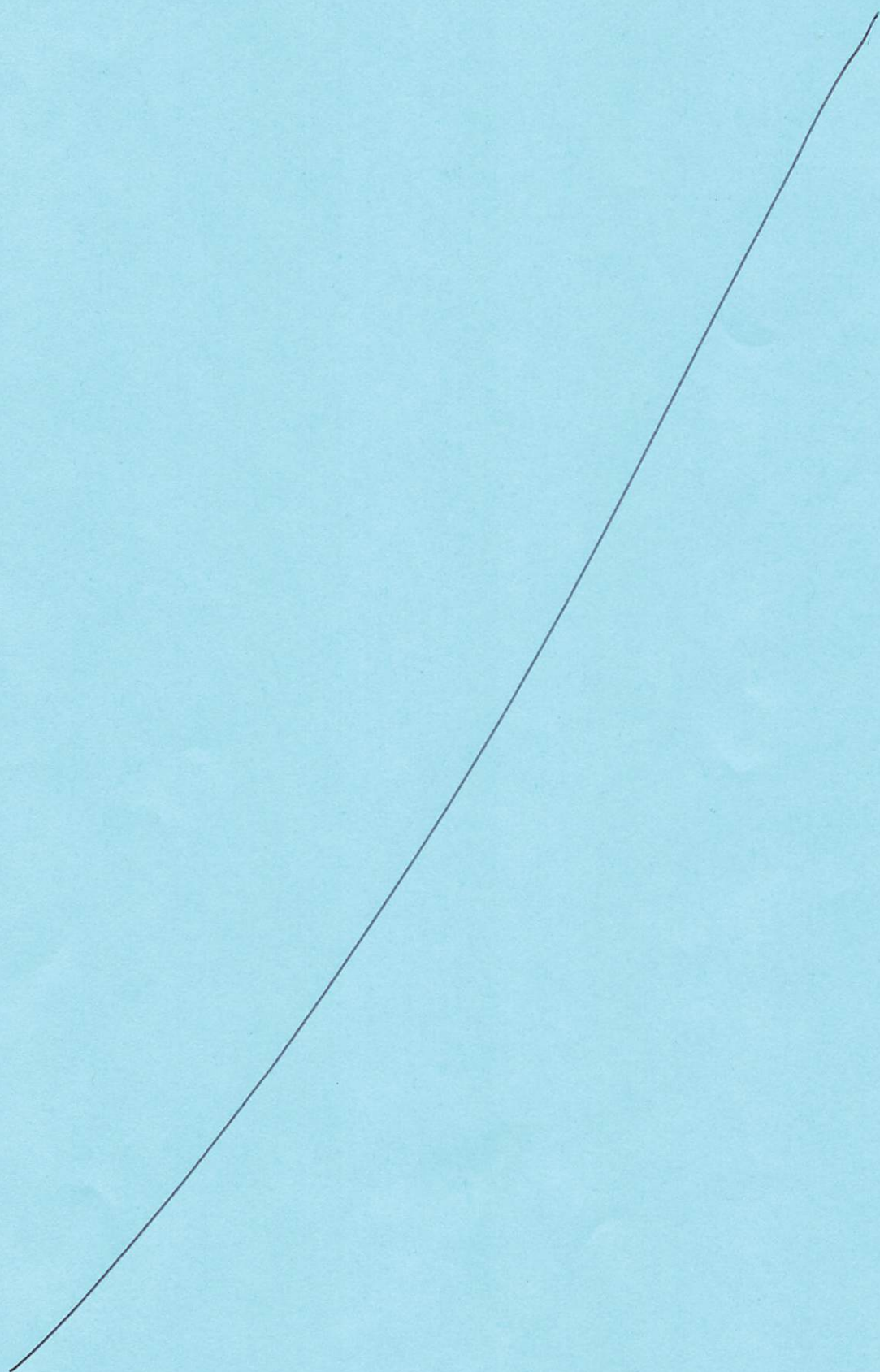
parents of William Fletcher Sandel, who married Mary Jane Conerly, daughter of John R. Conerly(authors' great(2) grandparents).

John O. Sandel, who married Roxanna Harrison, Eliza Ann Sandel who married James Thomas Vick, David Wiggins Sandel-wife unknown; had one daughter Mary Wiggins Sandel; he died before 1866 and served in the Civil War from Texas, Peter Tabor Sandel(also a Civil War Soldier) who married Priscilla A. Samuel--these children were children of Winifred Tabor(daughter of Rev. Isaac Tabor and Susan Bullock Tabor- a missionary and circuit riding minister to Texas when it was still a republic, also chaplain to General Sam Houston. Children born by the 2nd wife of Rev. He was the father of my grandfather, John Monroe Sandel, who married Laura Jane Lea, daughter of Needham Brown Lea , who was also born in Pike County, Miss. (his father was born in France according to the Sabine census.) One of John Monroe Sandel's sons was Jesse Oliver Sandel, Sr., who married Alice Peterson. They were the parents of Elias Wesley Sandel, Sr., who married Mary Eleanor Williams(authors of this book), Martha Jane, who married Hugh Flagg; Jesse Oliver Jr, who married Rosabelle Chism; Laura Alice, who married Theophile N. Scott, Ethel Virginia, who married Harland D. Haun, and Daisy Lea,who married Tom Snelling. Johnson Monroe married Elsa Raye Mannasco.

All of William Fletcher's Sandel's descendants are in Louisiana. Elias Wesley Sandel,Sr., is a Methodist Minister having served for some 35 years; he is listed in Cokesbury Book of Methodism, in Who's Who in American Methodism . He and his wife have three children: Elias Wesley Sandel, Jr., Troy Edward Sandel, and Cynthia Eleanor Sandel.

Addenda: John O. Sandel, son of Rev. Peter Warren Sandel, was killed in the Battle of Pleasant Hill during the Civil War; he is buried in the Confederate Memorial Cemetery there at Pleasant Hill. (Sabine Parish)

Clarke's 1860 Vicksburg Directory

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H. C. Clarke's 1860 Directory of Vicksburg provides some interesting glimpses of the daily life of a city poised on the brink of chaos. Within the next five years, all of the people, professions, businesses, and institutions listed in the Directory would be intimately involved in the conflict known as the Civil War.

It is a matter of historical record that the voters of Vicksburg and Warren County were overwhelmingly opposed to the disunion and secession in 1860. When the democratic process had run its course, however, Mississippi was out of the Union.

In Vicksburg emotion and personal loyalties quickly overcame political theory and the city enthusiastically enlisted for the duration. In some more fortunate areas, the hardships and suffering ended in 1865, but Vicksburg was a particular target of the Radical Republicans and reconstruction forces. As a practical matter, Vicksburg's war continued until the late 1870's.

That Vicksburg was able to survive at all was due in large part to some of the people whose names appear on the list of residents in Clarke's Directory. Against almost incredible odds, they endured, they persevered, and eventually they succeeded in rebuilding a bankrupt and devastated community.

What Is A Document?

Abstracted from Dorothee Hughes Carouso, L.H.D., F.G.S.P., C.G., "What Is A Document," *The Pennsylvania Genealogical Magazine* 31 (November 1980).

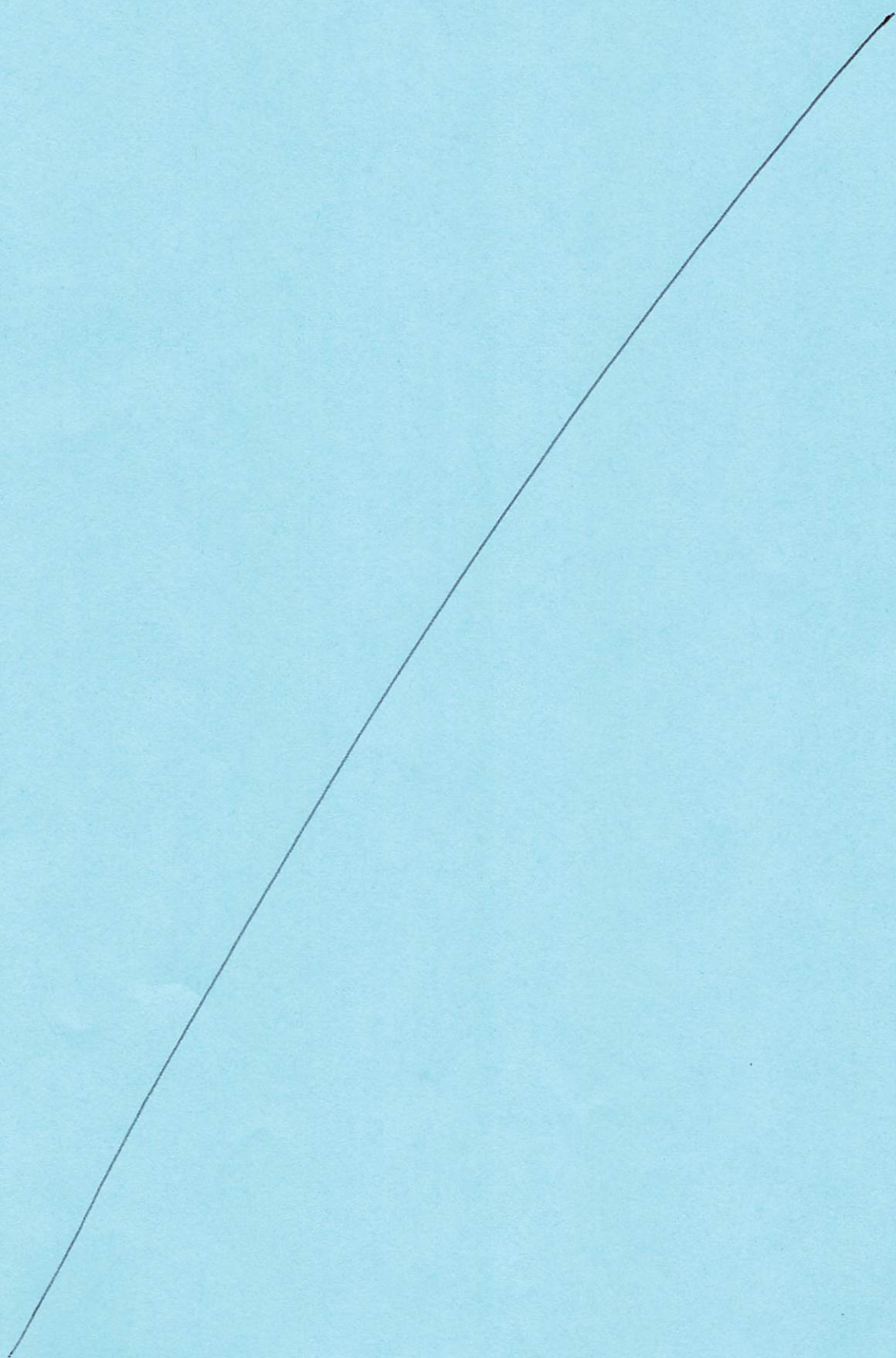
In genealogy, the only conclusive proof of a blood line is contained in a document. One very succinct definition of a genealogical document is: "A piece of written evidence, written by a person who, or in an era which, could not have foreseen this eventual use of it."

Undocumented genealogical publications are suspect and useless for reference. Today applicants to hereditary societies must prove, beyond any doubt, that he or she has a straight blood line descendency (in some cases, legitimate descendency through all generations) from the ancestor he claims.

A good genealogist works from the present to the past, collecting evidence for each generation. Examples of sound documentation are as follows:

- Birth or baptismal certificate
- Death certificate
- Marriage license
- Bible records of births, deaths, marriages
- Newspaper notices of death, birth, marriage
- Wills, probates, letters of administration, inventories, final accountings of administrators, census records which show the husband and wife in the same household for several successive decades after 1850. Lists of taxpayers, muster rolls.
- Deeds, mortgages, court records
- Diaries, journals, and letters depending upon the date they were written.
- City Directories

Published genealogies are seldom considered "documents," with a few exceptions, i.e., the published archives of a state, published church histories with lists of baptisms, births, marriages, burials, and the well-documented and annotated genealogy. ■
