The St. Louis County Court was founded in 1824, three years after Missouri became a state. A wealth of local information can be found in the records of this administrative court that for the first fifty years included both St. Louis City and County. The St. Louis County Court dealt, to a large part, with licensing; for example, licensing ferries, grocery stores, and taverns, but also allowances for bridges, road alignment, school establishment, commitments, and hospital payments for the indigent, including their names.

In addition, the court granted licenses to free negroes to allow them to live in the state beginning in 1835. These specific records included each free negro's age, height, personal appearance, and occupation—a relative gold mine! They also list those free negroes not granted licenses.

There was generally a smaller number of free blacks living in Missouri than in other states and most of them resided in the St. Louis area because of the greater opportunities afforded by a city. The 1830 federal census showed 569 free blacks living within Missouri. But the sentiment in Missouri early on appears to have been more pro-slavery which created a fear of what chaos might occur with free blacks living among the white population. Therefore, legislation was approved on 14 March 1835 by the Missouri General Assembly requiring all free negroes to register for a license within their county. If someone moved to another county, he or she would have to register in that county also. If a license was not approved, the free negro was told to leave the state.

This is a typical format for the information:

On this day [first and last name], age, height, appearance, and by occupation a appears in court and makes application for a license to authorize him/her to reside within the State of Missouri, and producing satisfactory evidence that he/she is of the class of free persons of color who may be licensed to reside within the said state, that he/she is of good char-

acter and behavior, and capable of supporting himself/herself by lawful employment. The court grant him/her a license to reside within the State aforesaid and order the same to be issued according to law." Book 1, p. 456

In extracting these names and information, every attempt has been made to copy the information exactly as it appears on the film. These records are available at the St. Louis County Library, Special Collections Department, on microfilm roll SLCCR-2. The first six rolls of this series, volumes 1–23 (1824–1877), are a typed transcription of the original records, plus indexing, prepared by the WPA.

U.S. Postage Rates

If you need to estimate a date for those old family letters, perhaps the stamp will help.

Before the use of adhesive stamps, letters were accepted by the postmasters around the country and marked "Paid" in hand or by various hand stamps.

The first U.S. stamps were issued in 1847. The 5 cent stamp paid for postage for a distance up to 300 miles; the 10 cent stamp was required for distances beyond 300 miles. The rapid expansion of postal services reduced the cost of mailing a letter. With the postal service's issues of 1851–1857, postage rates changed to 3 cents for prepaid letters up to 5,000 miles, and 5 cents if not pre-paid.

During the Civil War, the U.S. Postal Service issued a new set of stamps to prevent usage by the Confederate States. Stamps previously issued were "demonitized" in 1861 and became worthless. The new stamps were used as small change throughout the war years, due to the scarcity of metal coins.

Later, postage was based upon the weight of the letter, not the distance of the mailing. The following table summarizes the cost of a first class letter weighing one ounce or less.

The price of postage was raised from 2 cents to 3 cents during the war years of 1917–1919. Following the end of World War I, Congress reduced the rate back to 2 cents.

And if your letter has one of those "alphabet" stamps, here's the code for those:



Tax Assessment Lists for Collections Districts in the State of Missouri, 1862–1865

Submitted by Special Collections, St. Louis County Library

These twenty-two rolls of microfilm are comprised of records from the Internal Revenue Service. The first fourteen rolls are records from the St. Louis area.

In 1862 the state was divided into three assessment districts:

- 1. St. Louis
- 2. Missouri south of the Missouri River (excluding St. Louis)
- 3. Missouri north of the Missouri River.

Three more districts were created later in the Civil War years:

- 4. The area north and northwest of St. Louis
- The area south of Kansas City to the Arkansas border (There are no lists for District 5, and thus you will find none on the microfilm.)
- 6. The area of northwest Missouri including Kansas City


The districts were further divided into divisions. In St. Louis, there were thirteen divisions

broken down into wards which were in actuality the existing ten 1860 St. Louis City census wards, basically from South to North St. Louis. Division 11 included steamboats and corporations. Division 12 included South St. Louis County, e.g., Kirkwood, Glencoe, Carondelet. . . . Division 13 included North St. Louis County, e.g., St. Ferdinand, Central, Lowell. . . . The assessment lists within each division are alphabetical by first letter of the surname or corporate name.


The information in the lists included: date, name, residence, description of what is being taxed, valuation, type of license or product, and amount of tax due.

The assessment lists are divided into three categories: annual, monthly, and special. Entries in the annual and monthly lists are for taxes assessed or collected in those specific periods. The special lists augment incomplete annual and monthly lists and include special taxes, such as the special income tax of October 1864. The following is from the National Archives Microfilm Publications Pamphlet Describing M776:

"Monthly duties were placed on manufactures, articles and products ranging from ale to zinc. Monthly taxes were levied on gross receipts of transportations, companies, interest paid on bonds, surplus funds accumulated by financial institutions, and insurance companies, gross receipts from auction sales, and sales of slaughtered cattle, hogs, and sheep. Gross receipts from newspaper advertisements were subject to a quarterly tax. Annual licenses were required for trades and occupations, and annual duties were placed on the ownership of

carriages, yachts, billiard tables, and gold and silver plate.

An annual tax was levied on income in excess of \$600 and legacies and distributive shares of personal property were taxed. Stamp duties were imposed on legal and business documents and on medicines, playing cards, and cosmetics."

The following list is abstracted from Tax Assessment Lists for Collections Districts in the State of Missouri, Roll 1, to raise awareness of the possibilities for research with this microfilm set.
