## Confession of Christ

Must be made, by all admitted otherwise than by letter, at the time of the Communion following their admission by vote, and is to be made in the following manner :

[The candidates shall present themselves while the minister, or the choir, is reciting the following invitation:]

JESUS SAITH,

Come unto Me, all ye that labor and are heavy-laden, and I will give you rest ; take My yoke upon you, and learn of Me ; for I am meek and lowly in heart ; and ye shall find rest unto your souls ; for My yoke is easy, and My burden is light.

And the Spirit and the Bride say, Come ; and let him that heareth say, Come ; and let him that is athirst come ; and whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.

[Then the minister shall address the candidates as follows:]

DEARLY BELOVED,

You are here before God and many witnesses to confess the Lord Jesus Christ, and to dedicate *yourselves* to Him in the everlasting covenant of His grace. We trust that you appreciate the solemnity and the blessedness of this confession, and that He which hath begun a good work in you, will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ.

WE BELIEVE in God the Father Almighty, the Being of absolute perfection, the Creator, Preserver, and Governor of the universe ; Who so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son for its redemption :

And in Jesus Christ, His Son, our Lord ; Who was in the beginning with God, and was God ; Who became man and suffered to take away the sin of the world ; in Whom alone we have redemption, being justified freely, through faith in his blood ; Who arose

from the dead, and ascended on high, and sitteth at the right hand of the Father ; Whence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead, condemning the wicked to everlasting punishment, and ministering unto His people an entrance abundantly into His everlasting kingdom :

And in the Holy Ghost, the Comforter ; through Whom alone we, being by nature children of wrath, are renewed and sanctified ; by Whose inspiration the Scriptures are given ; Who with the Father and the Son, together one God, is supremely to be loved and served, and alone to be adored :

And in one Church on earth and in Heaven ; and in one Baptism ; and in one Communion of the body and blood of Christ ; and we look for the Resurrection of the dead, and the Life immortal. Amen.

This you truly confess and heartily believe ?

[The candidates shall assent by bowing.]

In the presence of God and this assembly, you do now freely and cordially confess the Father Almighty, your Maker and Preserver, the Lord Jesus Christ, your Saviour and Master, and the Holy Spirit, your Sanctifier and Guide, to be your God.

You do trust only in His sovereign grace and almighty power.

And you do promise that you will henceforth faithfully endeavor to keep His commandments, and follow Him in all things ; to walk with His disciples in love ; and, denying all ungodliness and worldly lusts, to live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world, looking for that blessed hope and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

This you truly confess and heartily engage ?

[The candidates shall assent as before.]

You who have already been admitted by baptism to a place in the covenant and Church of God, do thus, of your own accord, assume its full obligations and privileges ;

[Omitted if none have been baptized.]

and

you who have hitherto had no part among the people of God, we do now, in the name of Christ, affectionately receive into the congregation of Christ's flock, applying unto you the seal of the covenant.

[Omitted if all have been baptized.]

[Here the minister shall baptize all who have never been baptized, saying to each.]

M——— N———, I baptize thee into the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

[Then the minister shall continue as follows.]

We, then, as members of this Church,

[Here the members of the Church shall rise.]

affectionately welcome you, in the name of Christ, to His discipleship; to a part with us in the blessings and promises of His covenant; to a share in the duties, privileges, and glories of His Church; and to the fellowship of that great multitude which no man can number, who have confessed Him on earth, and who follow the Lamb whithersoever He goeth.

In token of our confidence and sympathy, and as a pledge of our brotherly-kindness and love, take the hand of welcome, and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how He said:

[Here the minister shall take each new member by the hand in turn, repeating to each some appropriate saying of Christ.]

[Then, the Church still standing, the minister shall continue as follows:]

And now, beloved in the Lord, whereas in former time *ye* were without Christ, being *aliens* from the commonwealth of Israel, and *strangers* from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world; now therefore, *ye* are no more *strangers* and *foreigners*, but *fellow-citizens* with the saints, and of the household of God; and are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ, Himself being the Chief Cornerstone.

For this cause

[Here all take the customary attitude of prayer.]

we bow our knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of Whom the whole family in Heaven and earth is named ; that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man ; that Christ may dwell in your *hearts* by faith ; that *ye* being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend, with all saints, what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height, and to know the love of Christ which passeth knowledge ; that *ye*, might be filled with all the fullness of God.

Now unto Him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us, unto Him be glory in the Church by Christ Jesus, throughout all ages, world without end. Amen.

The peace of God which passeth all understanding keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of His Son Jesus Christ our Lord ; And the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be amongst you, and remain with you always. Amen.



# Rules of the Church.

## OFFICERS.

1. The officers of this Church shall be a Pastor, two Deacons, a Clerk, a Treasurer, and a Superintendent of the Sabbath School, who, together, shall constitute a Prudential Committee.

2. The Pastor and Deacons are chosen for indefinite periods. The other officers are chosen, from the members of the Church, for one year, at the annual meeting of the Church. The Sabbath School Superintendent to be chosen by the Church and Sabbath School jointly.

## DUTIES.

1. To the Pastor pertains the duty of Moderator of business meetings in addition to the ordinary duties of Pastor and Teacher.

2. To the Deacons it belongs to assist in the administration of the Lord's Supper ; to distribute the charities of the Church ; and to aid the Pastor in the spiritual care of his flock.

3. The Clerk shall keep a true record of the transactions of the Church and of the Prudential Committee ; of the admission and removal of members, and of baptisms ; shall issue letters of dismission and recommendation, and at each annual meeting present a written report of the state of the Church, of its history during the year, and enter upon its permanent records all the written reports made to the Church.

4. The Treasurer shall receive all money belonging to the Church, pay out the same according to the vote of the Church, and make a report at the annual meeting of each year.

5. The Superintendent of the Sabbath School shall take charge of the School, admit scholars, appoint teachers, and present a written report to the Church at each annual meeting.

6. The Prudential Committee shall examine applicants for admission and report to the Church the names of such as they approve ; attend to the supply of the pulpit, when vacant, and look after the general welfare of the Church.

#### MEETINGS.

1. The Annual Business Meeting of the Church shall be on the Thursday preceeding the first Sabbath in May.

2. All the Weekly Prayer Meetings, on Thursday evenings, are also business meetings.

3. It is the duty of all the members of the Church to be present, as a rule, at these meetings of the Church.

#### ADMISSIONS.

1. Candidates for Church Membership, having been recommended by the Prudential Committee, and propounded two weeks, ordinarily, before the time of their public admission, are to be received by a vote of the Church at a regular meeting, on giving public assent to the Declaration of Faith and Covenant.

2. This Church receives members from other churches when they produce regular dismission and recommendations.

3. Members of other Churches are welcome to our communion ; but are expected, if worshiping with us for more than one year, to bring letters of dismission and recommendation to this Church.

#### DISMISSIONS.

1. This Church will grant dismissions and recommendations to members who are in regular and good standing to other Churches of Christ with which they may conscientiously wish to unite, when they apply in an orderly manner and in a Christian Spirit.

The dismission to take effect only when the letter of recommendation shall be accepted by the Church to which presented.

2. This Church deems it irregular for members to withdraw from it, and to unite in worship and communion with other churches, either on account of any offense or for better edification, without giving due notice to this Church and requesting a regular dismission.

3. This Church holds it to be the duty of every member who may remove from the town, to reside elsewhere, to apply, as soon as convenient, for a dismissal and letter to some Church of Christ in or near the place of his residence.

4. Applications should, ordinarily, be made, in writing, to some known officer of the Church.

#### **DISCIPLINE.**

1. Every member has a right to Church privileges unless forfeited by misconduct, and when thus forfeited, he can be deprived of them only by regular process.

2. Any member having cause of complaint against another should immediately seek to have it removed, in a Christian manner, according to the directions given in Matt. xviii: 15-17.

3. No proceedings shall be had against a member except upon a complaint made to the Church, in writing, explicitly stating the charges.

4. Any member accused before the Church shall be duly notified, of the charges, and be entitled to a fair investigation, and an opportunity for making his defense.

5. This Church considers immoral conduct, breach of express covenant vows, neglect of acknowledged religious duties, and an avowed disbelief of the Declaration of Faith to which the members have assented, as offenses subject to the censure of the Church.

6. The censures inflicted on offenders in this Church shall be private reproof, public admonition, suspension from Church privileges, or excommunication, according to the aggravation of the offense.

#### **AMENDMENTS.**

These Rules may be revoked or amended at any regular meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present; provided notice of the proposed change was given at the last preceding regular meeting, held, at least, one week before the time of voting on such resolution or amendment.

# Sketch and Catalogue,

SKETCH OF THE  
*Congregational Church, of Northfield and Tilton.*

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The town of Northfield was settled in 1760, and incorporated in 1780. There seems to have been less of the Puritan element among the first settlers than in some of the neighboring towns. Some years the town voted to raise money to hire preaching for a few Sabbaths, but no efficient efforts appear to have been put forth for many years to secure Congregational preaching. The Old Meeting-house was built in 1794. The Methodist Church was organized in 1806. The Rev. John Turner was the first Congregational Minister who preached in town.

Rev. Jotham Sewall and the Rev. Samuel Sewall preached a number of Sabbaths each in town. The Congregational people for many years worshiped with other denominations and aided in supporting the preaching, but they sought Church privileges at Sanborton Square, and at Canterbury.

The man who seems to have been used of God to encourage the people, and to stir them up to make a vigorous effort to have a permanent ministry established here, was the Rev. Mr. Page, an elderly minister, without charge, residing at Salisbury. He did this, notwithstanding they raised only one dollar and twenty cents for a day's preaching.

The matter from this time was made the subject of much prayer by a few godly ones found here at the time. A religious society was formed, and on the eighteenth of July, 1822, a Congregational Church was organized. Mr. Liba Conant, a young minister, who had just finished his studies, passing through the place was invited to preach on the Sabbath. Having given general satisfaction, the people invited him to remain a few Sabbaths with them. The N. H. M. Society hearing that the people were disposed to help themselves, furnished one hundred dollars to aid them in establishing a permanent ministry in the town.

On May 29, 1823, Mr. Conant was ordained as the first Pastor of the Northfield Congregational Church. He labored faithfully, and with a good measure of success for about fourteen years, or, till September, 1836.

The Rev. Hazael Lucas then supplied this Church one year, or, till September, 1837.

Rev. Enoch Corser, for twenty years Pastor of the Congregational Church at Loudon, was then engaged to supply this Church, who remained from September, 1837, through April, 1843. His labors were abundant, and very successful. In 1837, and during his ministry, the present Congregational Meeting-house was built and dedicated; the society being free from debt.


In 1841 an arrangement was made, by which the Congregational people in the South part of Sanbornton united with the Congregational people of Northfield, under the name of the Congregational Church of Northfield and Sanbornton Bridge; a judicious movement, as events have shown.

Mr. C. Curtis commenced preaching here, May 1, 1843, and remained through April, 1870; just twenty-seven years.

Rev. T. C. Pratt commenced his labors here, May 1, 1870, and closed them in June, 1875.

Rev. F. T. Perkins commenced his ministry here, September, 1875.

A Sabbath School was organized in Northfield, in 1821, which has continued to the present time, and has been the source of great good to the Church and community.
